

Gender Biases in Artificial Intelligence by Dr Amal Tawakuli (hybrid)

We must address discrimination and bias in Artificial Intelligence (AI). During the public trials of ChatGPT, it was highlighted that the language model generates sexist responses. This issue, however, is not new to Artificial Intelligence (AI). Several AI models and networks have exhibited sexism and other discriminatory traits in their output affecting the lives of millions of people. The urgency of addressing gender bias in AI, however, is becoming more evident and pressing with the widespread adoption of AI solutions across different aspects of our lives. In this talk, we will discuss sexism in AI with real-world examples. We will highlight the causes of the problem, including the root cause. We will then present solutions and conclude with a road map towards fair AI.



Gender Biases in Healthcare by Dr. Maya Dusenbery and Prof. Marie Friedel (hybrid)

Gender biases in healthcare refer to unequal treatment or differential care for men and women. These biases can manifest in various ways, including in the diagnosis, treatment, and management of medical conditions and the research conducted on healthcare. For example, when doctors do not take a woman's symptoms seriously, she may not receive a correct diagnosis for many years. A 2019 analysis in Denmark found that in 72% of cases, women waited longer on average for a diagnosis than men. The idea that heart attacks mainly occur in males — and a lack of awareness about how they affect females — contributes to the higher rates of females dying from heart attacks. This talk will discuss how these biases may affect our daily lives.

The Mental Health crisis of our youngsters through a social media lens by Associate Professor Catherine Van de Heyning

Growing research finds that the more time spent on social media, the more likely a person will experience mental health symptoms like anxiety, isolation, and hopelessness. In addition, the mental health of young people has been significantly impacted by the COVID-19 crisis. Prevalence of symptoms of anxiety and depression has risen dramatically among young people and remains higher than pre-crisis levels even with the partial re-opening of the economy, and compared to other age groups, even as economies partially re-open. With adequate support and timely intervention, young people experiencing mental distress may be able to bounce back as we recover from the COVID-19 crisis. This will require a scaling up of existing mental health support in education systems, workplaces and health systems, and comprehensive policies to support young people to remain in education, or to find and keep a job.

Schengen, which lies on the banks of the Moselle River, is undoubtedly the village best known for its European status due to the Schengen Agreement and the Schengen Implementation Convention, which were signed in 1985 and in 1990 on the passenger boat M.S. Princesse Marie-Astrid. The winegrowing village was chosen due to its common border of France, Germany and the economic union Benelux (the first five signatories of the agreement).

Today, the Schengen area allows more than 400 million Europeans to travel freely between member countries without going through border controls.



Clervaux Castle is perched on the slopes of a rocky promontory above the city. Its origins date back to the 12th century, but it was built in successive stages. After its entire destruction on December 17th 1944 during the Battle of the Bulge in the Second World War, the government of Luxembourg acquired the castle and restored it completely.

Since the 1970s, the castle has been home to various institutions:

The Museum of the Battle of the Bulge opened its doors in 1974, the west wing of the castle houses the Museum of models of the Castles and Palaces of Luxembourg, and in the east wing you can visit the world-famous photo exhibition "The Family of Man", UNESCO World Heritage Site.

After this visit, a nice lunch awaits you at Hotel Koener in Clervaux. Please indicate on the registration form if you wish meat, fish or vegetarian food. Heading back to Luxemburg, you will pass by several castles such as Vianden. The castle was built between the 11th and 14th century on the foundations of a Roman castle and a Carolingian refuge and for a long time belonged to the Grand Ducal family, before passing into state ownership in 1977. Since then it has been restored to all its former glory. Today, Vianden castle is one of Europe's leading historical monuments.

Based in Betzdorf, a small village near Luxembourg, and founded in 1985 as Société Européenne des Satellites, SES is a Luxembourg satellite telecommunications network provider supplying video and data connectivity worldwide to broadcasters, content and internet service providers, mobile and fixed network operators, governments and institutions.

SES is one of the world's leading satellite owners and operators with over 70 satellites in two different orbits, geostationary orbit (GEO) and medium earth orbit (MEO). These include the well-known European Astra TV satellites.

The visit will take one hour and a half with comments in English. They include the history of the company, the social and humanitarian impact and the promotion of women participation within the company. A snack will be offered on site.

These towers symbolise the cultural richness of the Terres Rouges and are witnesses of an era that transformed the country and played a major role in its economic emergence and the lives of its inhabitants. This site is the pinnacle of the region's identity and fascinating history. The closure of the country's last remaining blast furnace in 1997 marked the end of an era. It was time to turn the page: this transition made room for new technology in the future. The fact that Belval is such a growing and flourishing place today is largely due to its magnificent past. Discover this piece of history with projections and a visit to the various sites.

Explore the impressive interior of Blast Furnace A while learning about the steel industry in Luxembourg and the Greater Region. Discover the functioning of the blast furnace and the steel production process, as well as the significance of the sector for the national economy. You will also be able to climb up to the viewing platform and enjoy the spectacular view over the Belval urban quarter and its surroundings. The individual faculties and research centres of the University of Luxembourg have their premises on parts of the former industrial site, which are being retained and uniquely integrated into the new concept.

Chiche! was born when a group of friends decided to create a social restaurant with the objective to foster social inclusion by empowering women and men from Luxembourg and abroad through work. So, it hires people of all origins who have a hard time finding a job but who generally have fabulous skills.

"Chiche" has a triple meaning: pois chiche is the French word for chick-pea, one of the cornerstones of Mediterranean cuisine and the main ingredient of the falafel, the restaurant's signature dish.

It is also - phonetically - the Arabic word for skewer (brochette).

Finally "chiche" is a French expression for "taking up a challenge" and creating a social impact, so Chiche! means sustainable and economically viable restauration with only non-professionals from 16 different countries - quite a challenge indeed!

GETTING AROUND

Findel Airport to hotels

You can either take a taxi or go by bus.

Taxis in Luxembourg are quite expensive. The ride from the airport to the hotels will be about €31, but you can get a rebate of 10 % with Web Taxi using code ZONTA23 (book taxi at www.webtaxi.lu) - You can pay cash or by debit/credit card.

Public transport in Luxembourg is free of charge.

Buses 29 and 223 will take you to your hotels on Boulevard d'Avranches and rue du Laboratoire.

Bus 29 to Hesperange – Cité um Schlass
Leaves from platform 3 and runs every 10 minutes
Ride to hotels takes 16 minutes minimum depending on traffic

You need to get off at **Verlorenkost – Al Molkerei**
Sofitel Grand-Ducal is virtually opposite the bus-stop

Bus 223 to Bonnevoie – Lycée Bouneweg PE
Leaves from platform 3 and runs every half hour
Ride to destination takes 15 minutes minimum depending on traffic
You need to get off at **Verlorenkost – Al Molkerei**
Novotel is round the corner from Sofitel Grand-Ducal on rue du Laboratoire

Hotels to Findel Airport by bus

Bus 29 to Senningerberg – Charlys Gare
Leaves from platform 1 Verlorenkost Al Molkerei
It runs every half hour on a Sunday.
Ride to the airport takes 16 minutes minimum depending on traffic
Arrives at platform 4

Bus 223 to Junglinster
Leaves from platform 1 Verlorenkost Al Molkerei and runs every half hour
Ride to the airport takes 16 minutes minimum depending on traffic
Arrives at platform 4

Gare Centrale to hotels

You can take either a bus or a taxi to your hotel or you walk.

Bus 29 to Senningerberg – Charlys Gare
Leaves from platform 1 at Gare Centrale and runs every ten minutes.

It will take less than two minutes on bus 29 to get to your destination.

You need to get off at Verlorenkost – Al Molkerei, which is very close to the hotels.

Taxis to the hotels will be about €10.
Walking will take you about 15 minutes.

Hotels to Gare Centrale

You can take either a bus or a taxi to the station, or you can walk.

Bus 29 to Hesperange – Cité um Schlass
Leaves from Verlorenkost – Al Molkerei, platform 4
On Sundays bus 29 runs every half hour.
Ride to the station takes 6 minutes depending on traffic

Taxis to the station will be about €10.
Walking will take you at least 15 minutes.

Hotels to Neumünster Abbey

You can either walk or take a taxi to the venue located in the Grund. Public transport is not an option here.

There are two routes you can take:

You take the stairs on Boulevard d'Avranches into the Grund. They are located about 200m from Sofitel Grand-Ducal, when you cross the road and then keep right.

You go down to Montée de la Pétrusse, you follow this road until you get to rue St Ulric, then you turn right into rue Münster. After the bridge you turn left and keep left for about 5 minutes until you reach the Abbey at 28 rue Münster.

This route will take at least 13 minutes.



OR

You walk down Boulevard d'Avranches towards the city centre. You turn right onto Boulevard Roosevelt, you cross the bridge and enjoy the view. Once you are across the valley, you turn right into Cité Judiciaire, you cross the courtyard and you take the lift to the Grund (Ascenseur Plateau du St Esprit).


Then you walk straight into rue Münster, and after the bridge you turn left and keep left for about 5 minutes until you reach the Abbey at 28 rue Münster.

This route will take at least 20 minutes.

Going by taxi will set you back about €10.

We strongly recommend you download our national mobility app - mobiliteit.lu - and check for updates.
