History of the Pink Can: A Summary Based On Pink Cans: Small Change Brings Big Results (p. 8). Box 4-5-9: News and Notes from the General Service Office of A. A. Vol. 52, No. 5 / October November 2006. The Pink Can idea seemed to have originated in the Northern California Area in 1957. The purpose was to provide sufficient funds to purchase literature for expanding work in prisons. Individual contributions, although quite helpful, were not enough to keep up with the expanding responsibilities of the local Hospitals & Institutions Committees. Someone came up with the idea of passing a can during meetings and requesting spare change. It was explained that all monies collected would be used to buy literature for alcoholics in hospitals and prisons. In order to make the can “stand out,” a decision was made to paint the can pink. In short time, pink cans started appearing on literature tables and were being passed around at various meetings.
