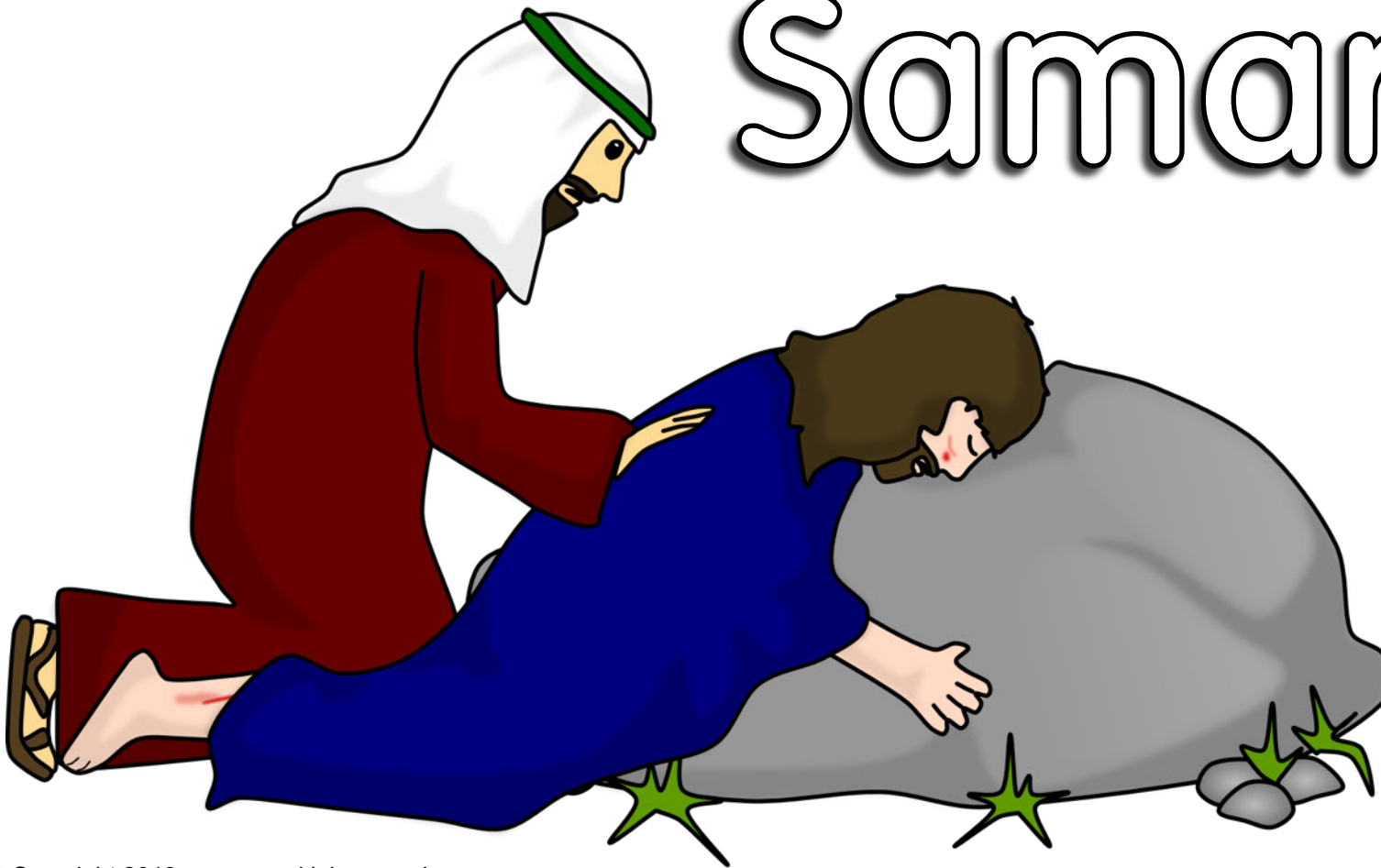
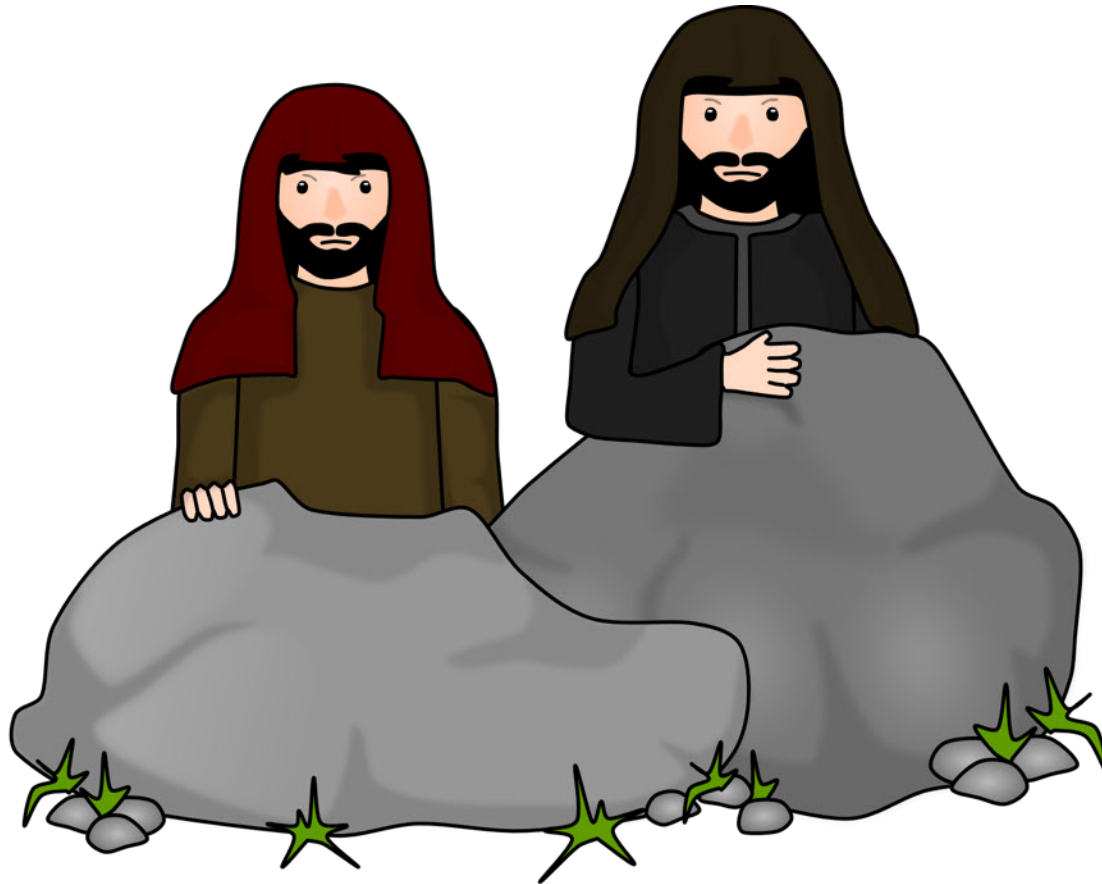


The Good Samaritan

Then, a Levite came walking by and saw the injured man.

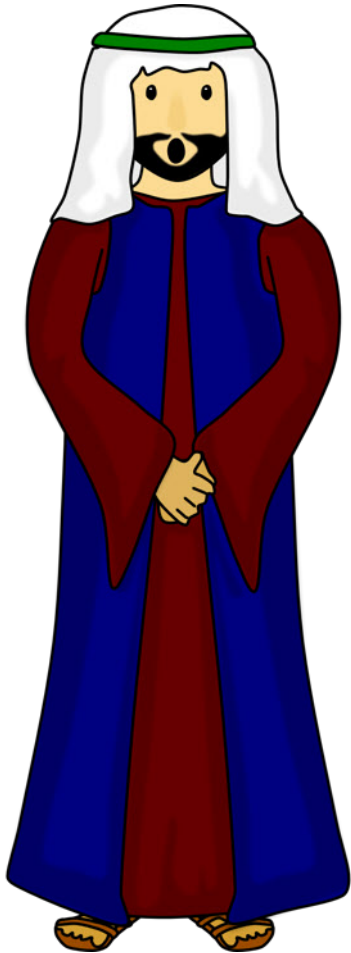

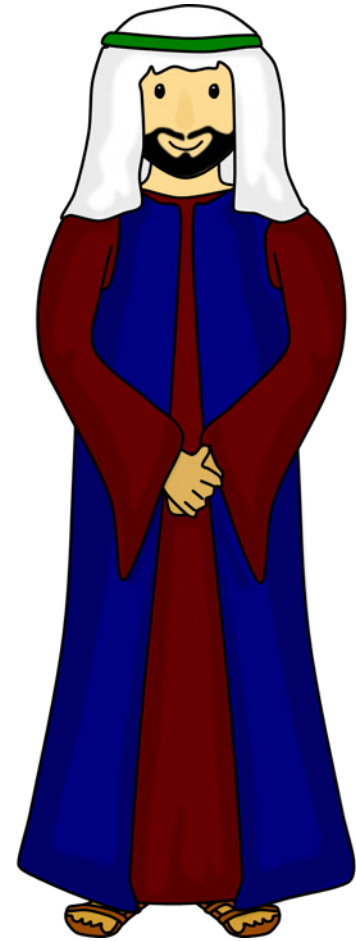


No, he passed on by.

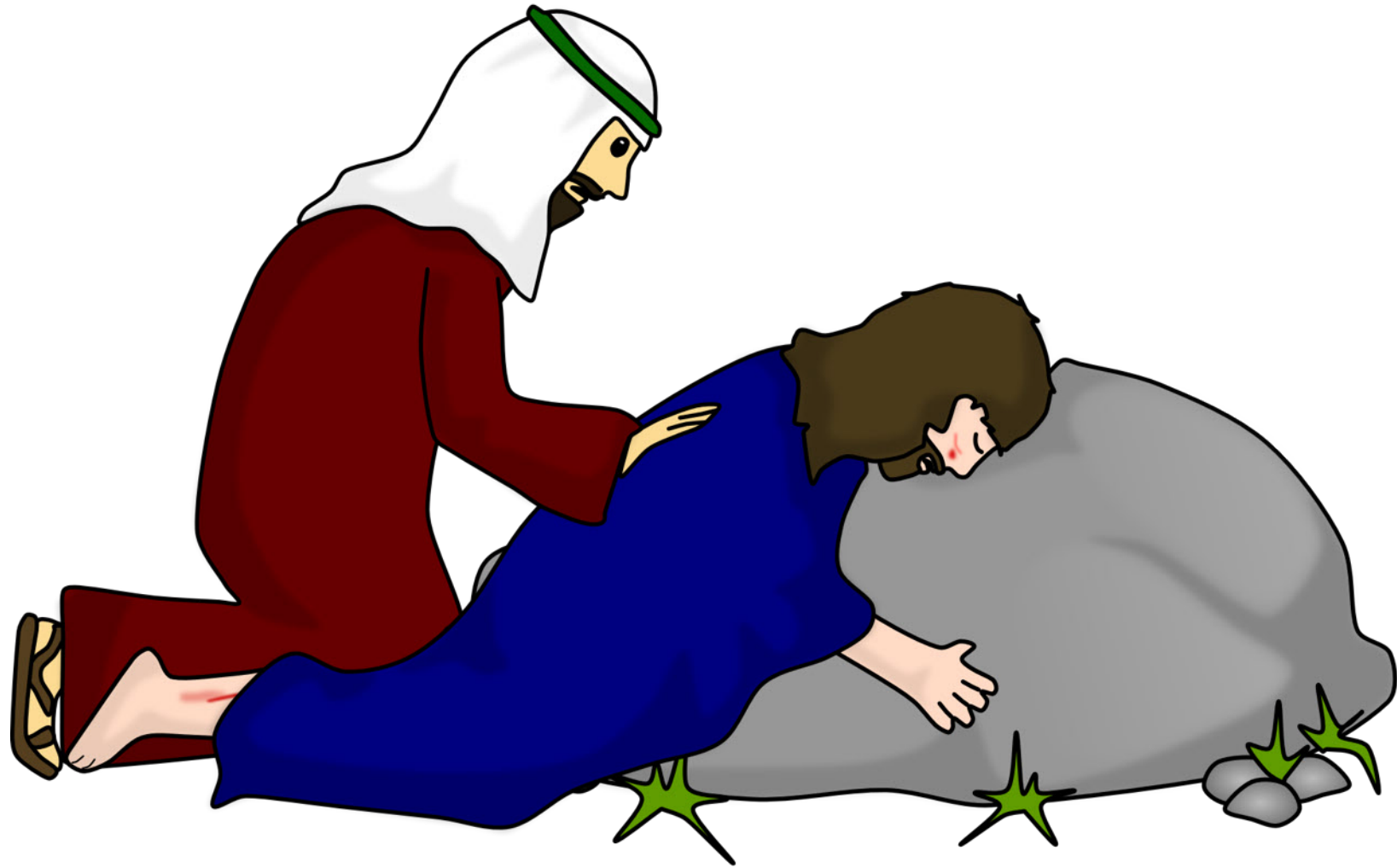
Then, a Samaritan came by.

He saw the dying man.



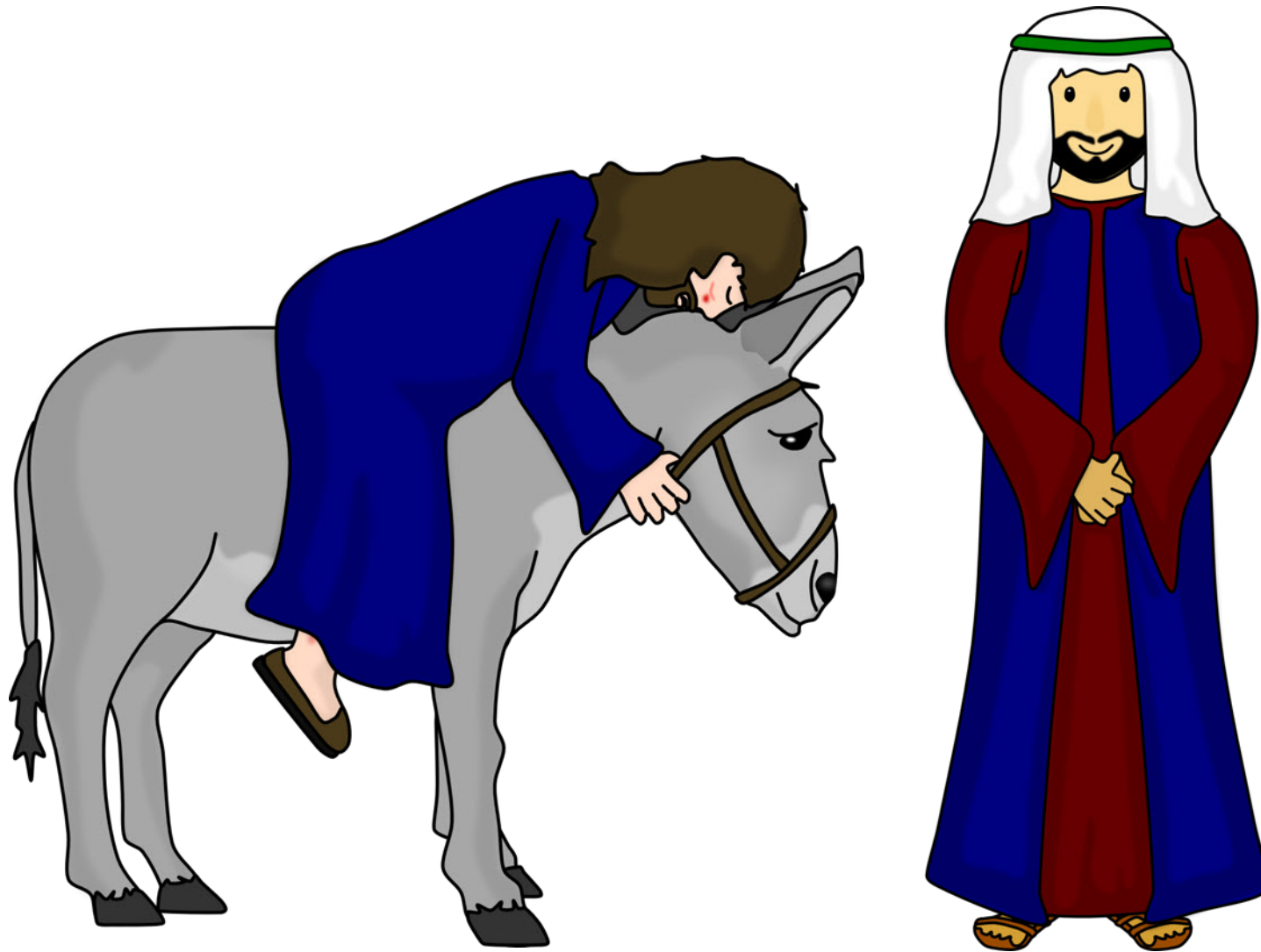
Did he help?



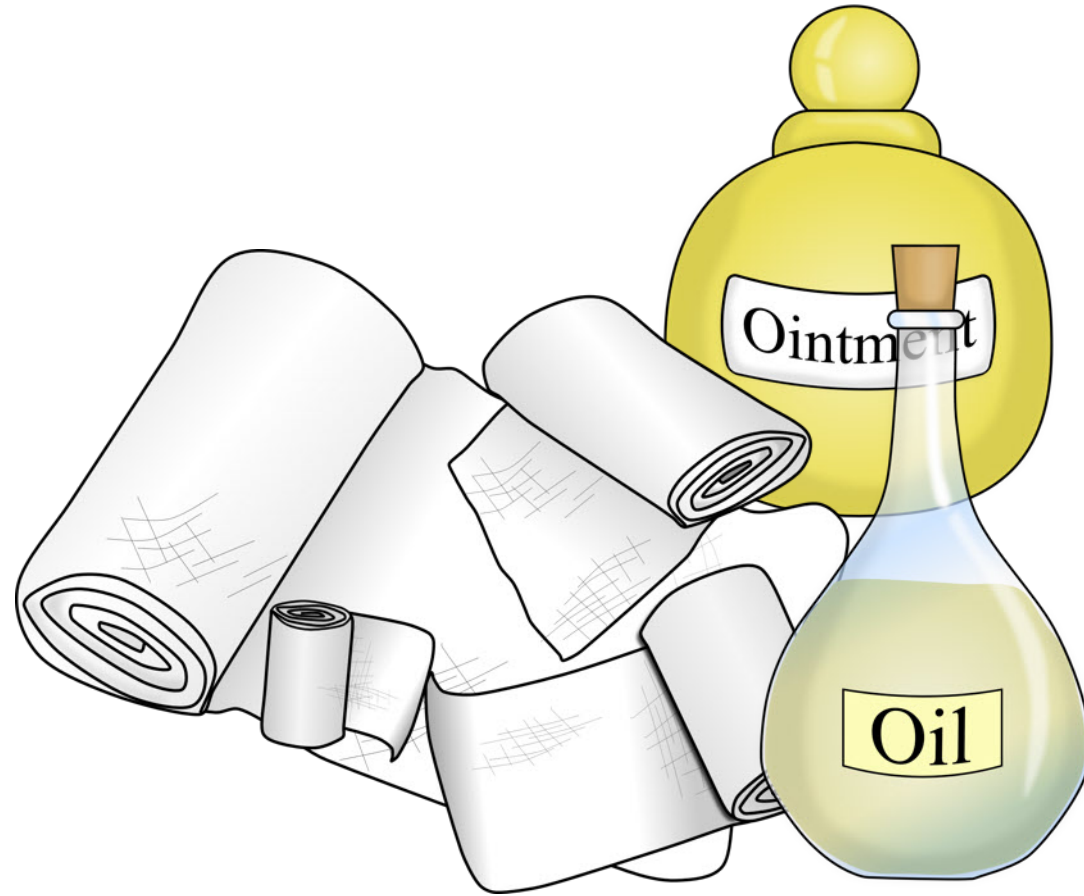
Yes! The Samaritan just couldn't leave the Jewish man to die.



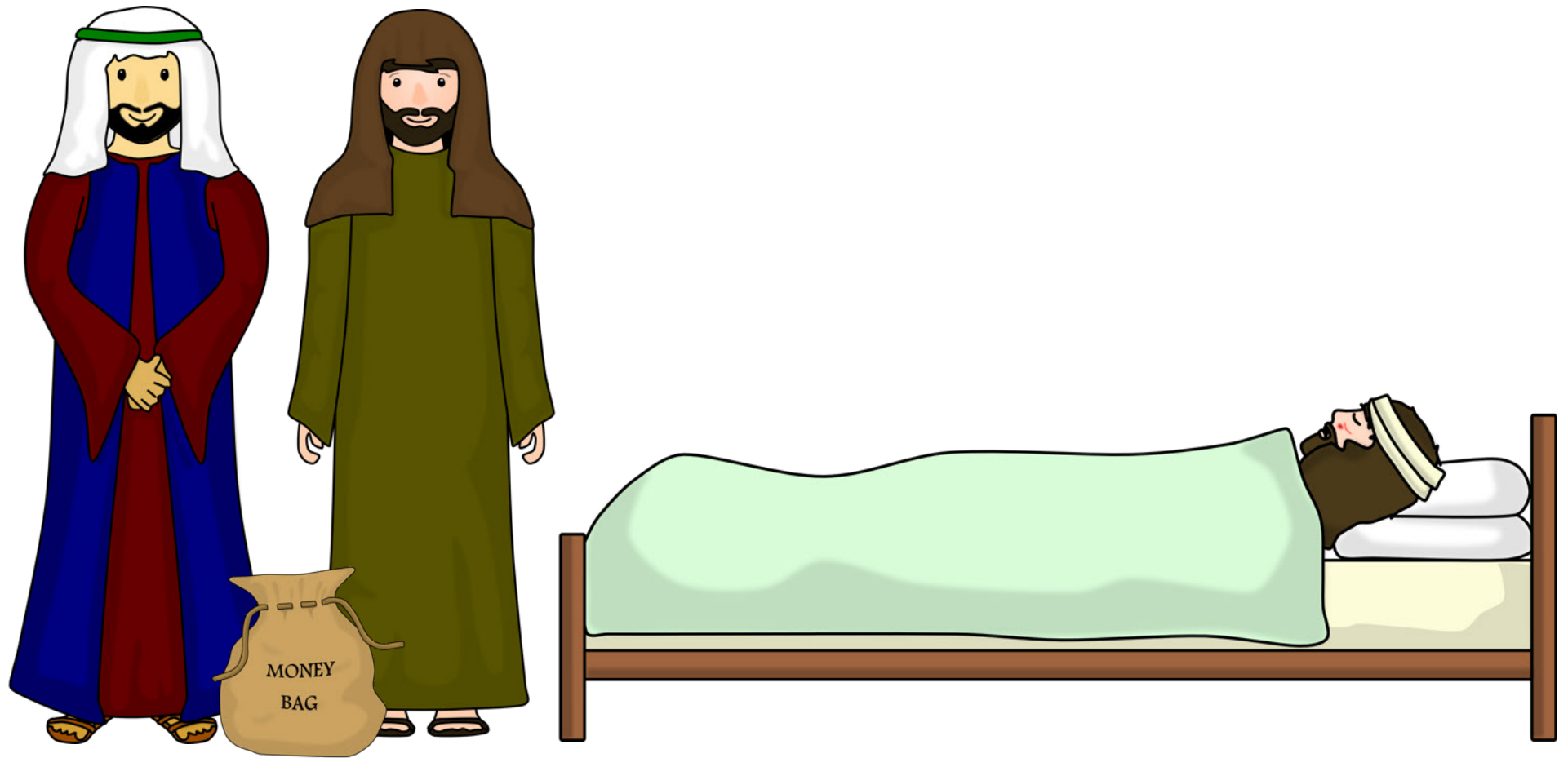
He put his cloak on the man...



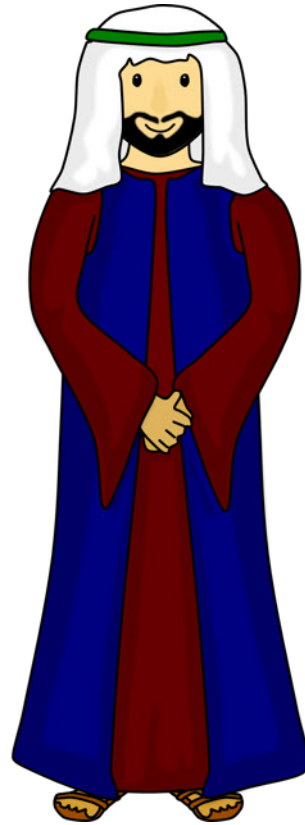
... and took him to an inn.
