
On 12th May 1820 Florence Nightingale was born.

Florence decided to become a nurse.




Florence became the superintendent at a women's medical centre in London.

People gave generously to the Nightingale Fund for the training of nurses.




The Crimean War ended.



Florence returned home as a heroine.




The Nightingale Training School was built.
