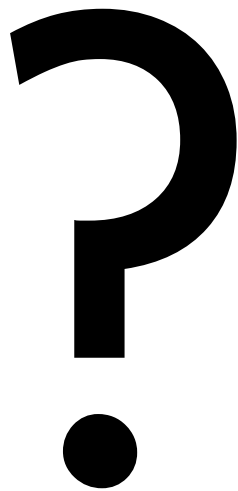


Punctuation marks and uses cards

spoken words.


