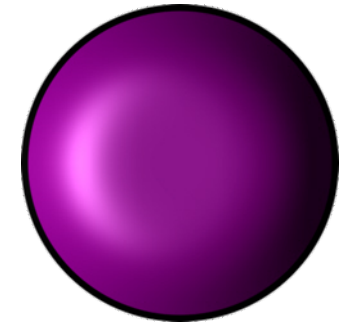
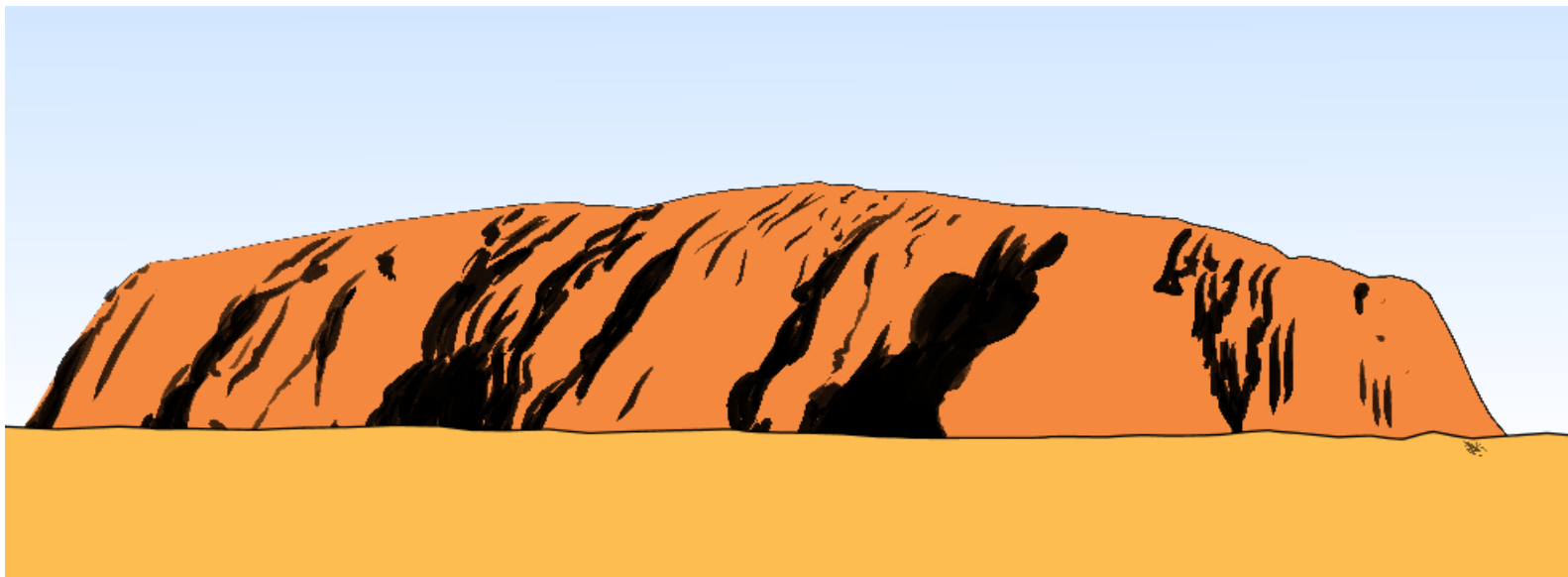


Full stop

Used at the end of a direct question.

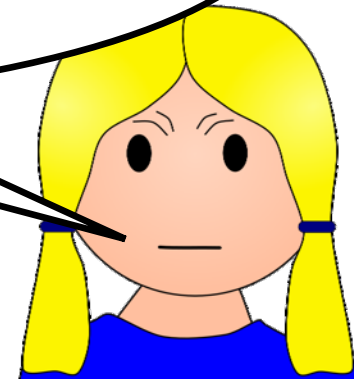

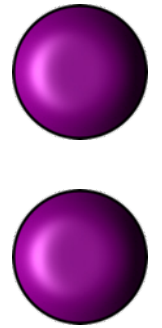
Exclamation mark !

Used at the end of a strong declaration, interjection or command.

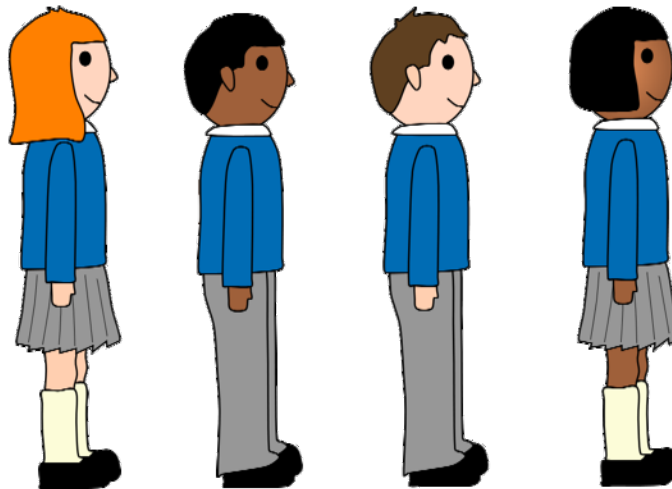
Don't do that again!



Colon

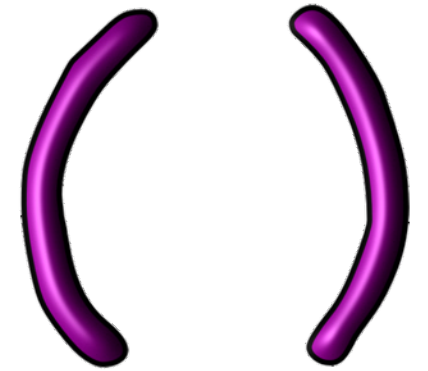


Used before a list or explanation and follows a clause that can stand alone.

Used to include additional information that needs saying.

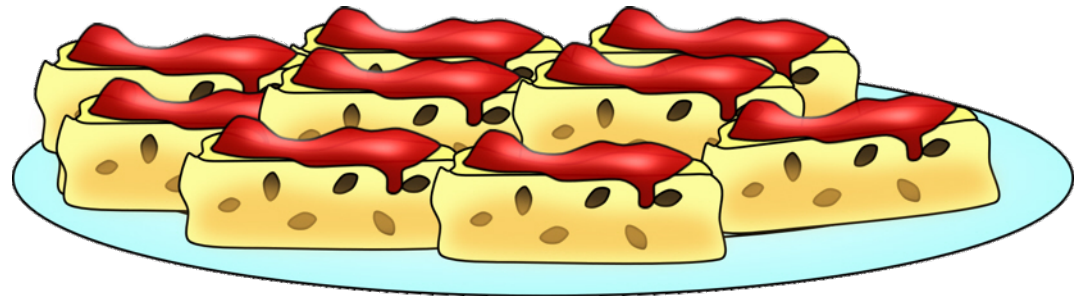
She put the bear (the brown one) into the bag.



Comma

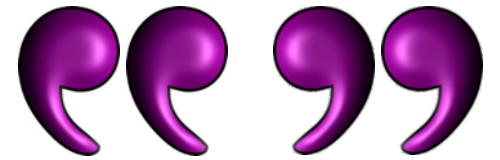


Used to separate three or more items
in a list.

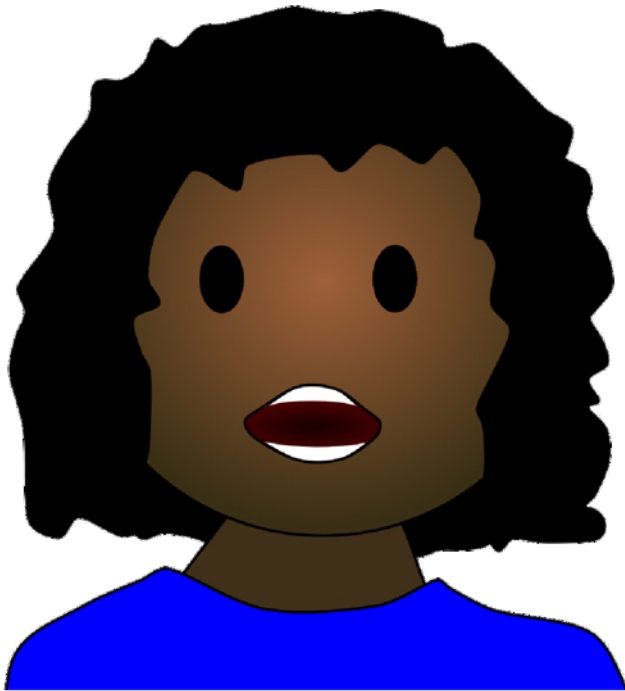


She bought flour, butter, sugar

Used to show spoken words.

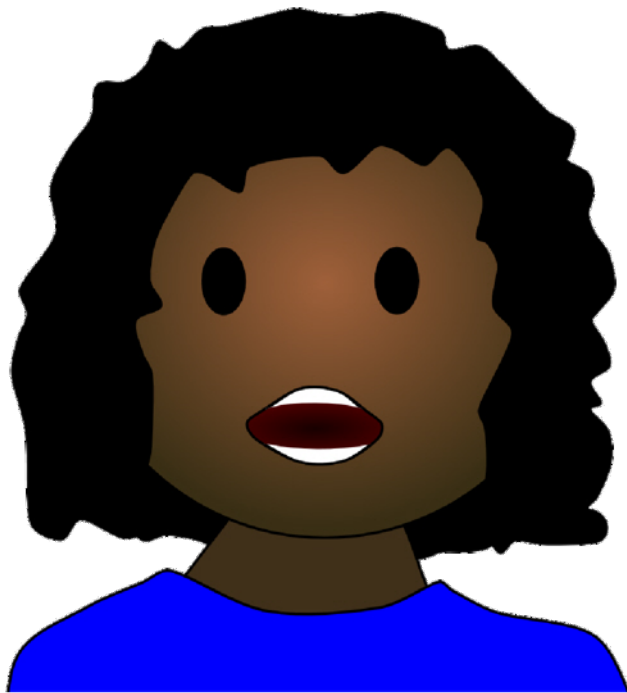

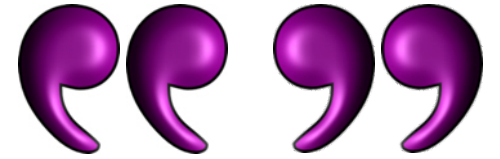

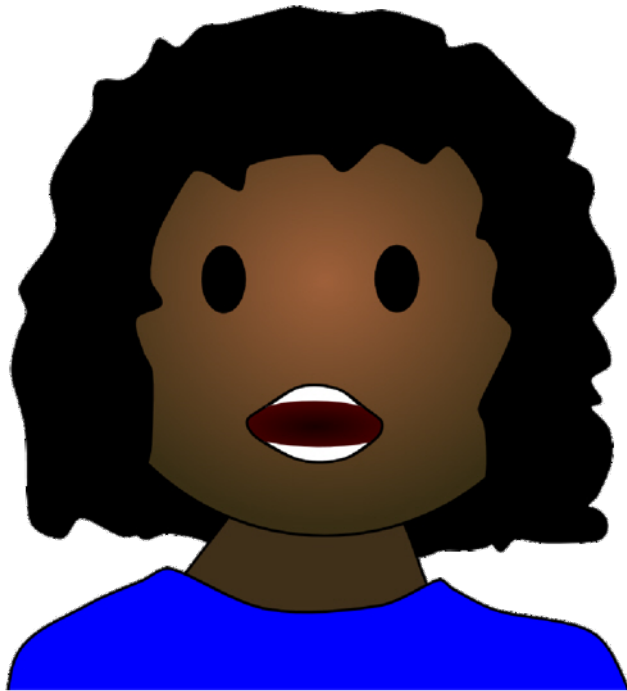
