

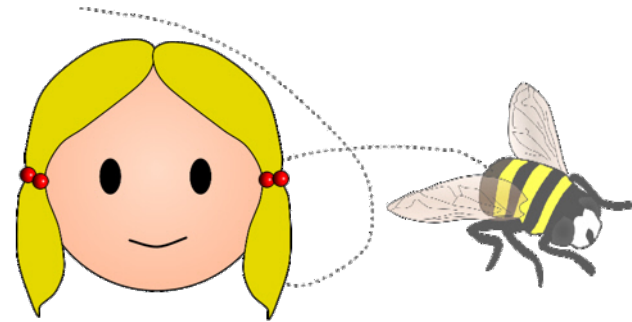
# Metaphors

Peter ate too much.

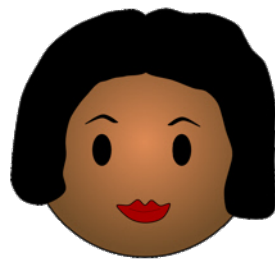
He *was such a pig!*



Little Jess *was a busy bee.*



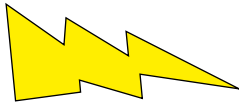
The *cotton-wool*  
*clouds* filled the sky.



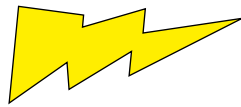
Rita *is a breath of fresh air.*

She sings like an angel.

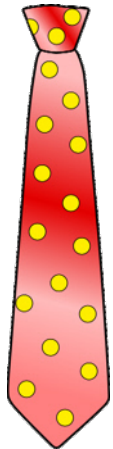
# Adjectives

Dad's *spotty* tie.

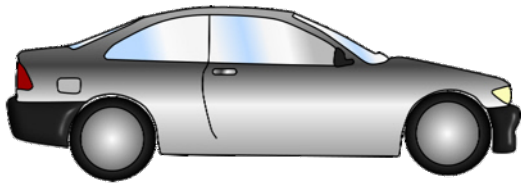


The cakes were *delicious*.



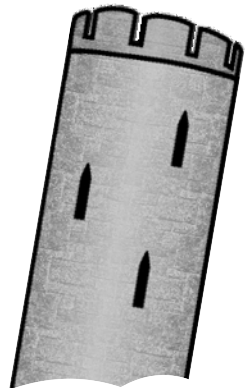
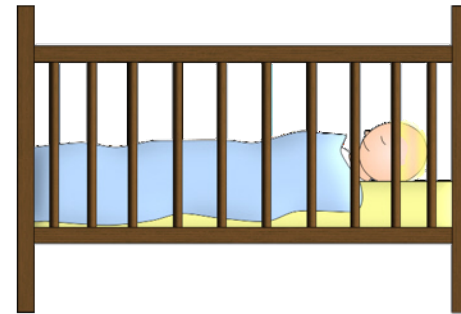
# Adverbs

Adverbs modify verbs, adjectives or other adverbs.

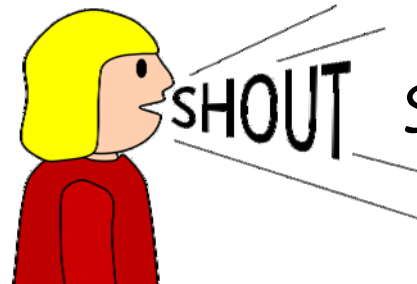


The man drove the car *slowly*.

The baby is sleeping *soundly*.



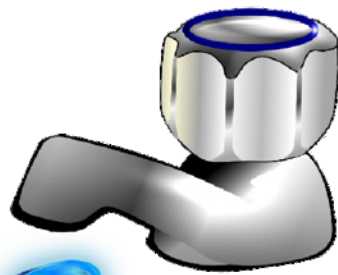
The tower *almost* fell down.

# Onomatopoeias

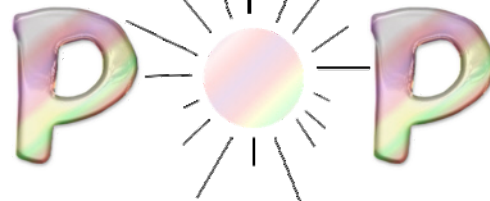
Words that sound like the things they describe.

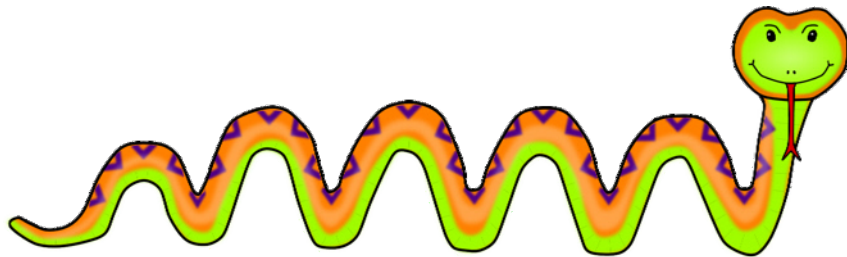


# Alliteration
