


The Sumerians develop cuneiform writing and the Egyptians develop their hieroglyphic written symbols.


Tsai Lun from China invents paper.



The Chinese develop wooden block printing.









Johannes Gutenberg builds a metal printing press in Germany.

Frenchman Claude Chappe creates the first long-distance semaphore line.







American Joseph Henry builds the first electric telegraph.

Samuel Morse builds the first long-distance electric telegraph line.






Scot Alexander Graham Bell invents the first electric telephone.

Thomas Edison patents the gramophone.




Almon Strowger designs the first direct-dial telephone.





Guglielmo Marconi transmits signals by radio waves from Cornwall, UK to Newfoundland, North America.




John Logie Baird, from Scotland, transmits the first television signal.


The first cell-based communications which leads on to the development of mobile telephones.




Chester Carlson builds the first office-use photocopier.
