

Ristorical Fiction

A story based on science, usually set in the future or on other planets.






A story about fairies or other magical creatures, usually for children.

Fiction which has events that make the characters and the reader feel fear, suspense or dread.




Fictional texts that are full of fun and excitement to entertain the reader.

Humour can be used in all fiction genres.



Mystery/Detective






Fiction that tells of the relationship between two people who find love.


Romance nearly always has a happy ending.
