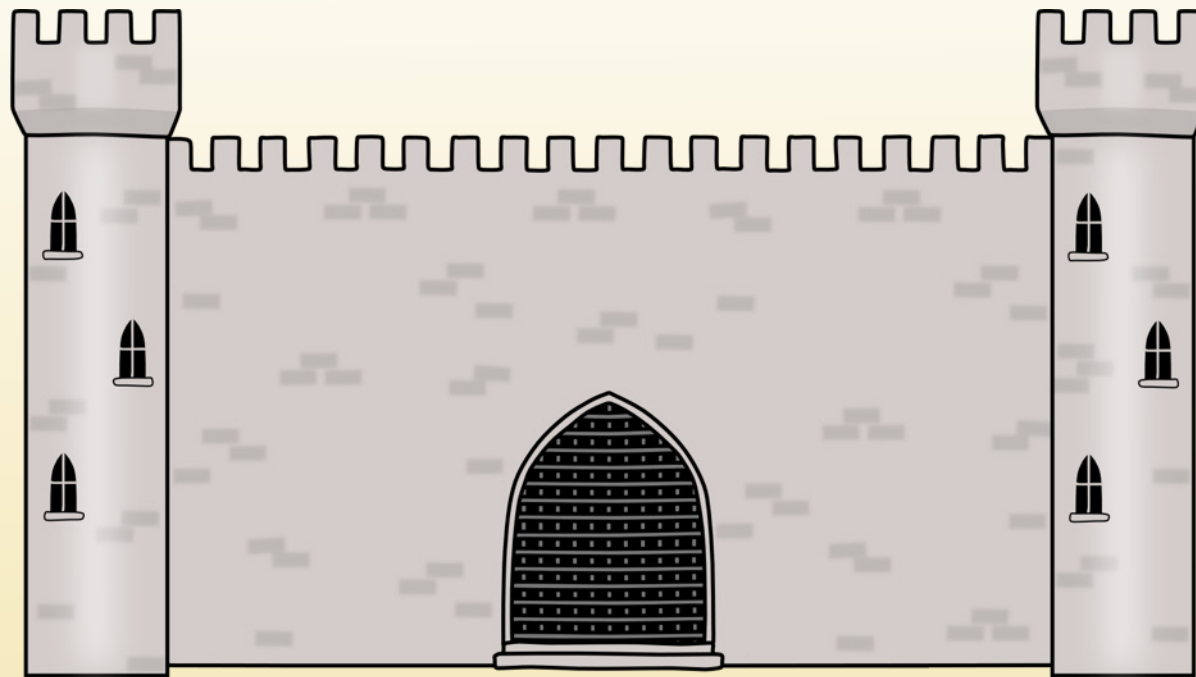
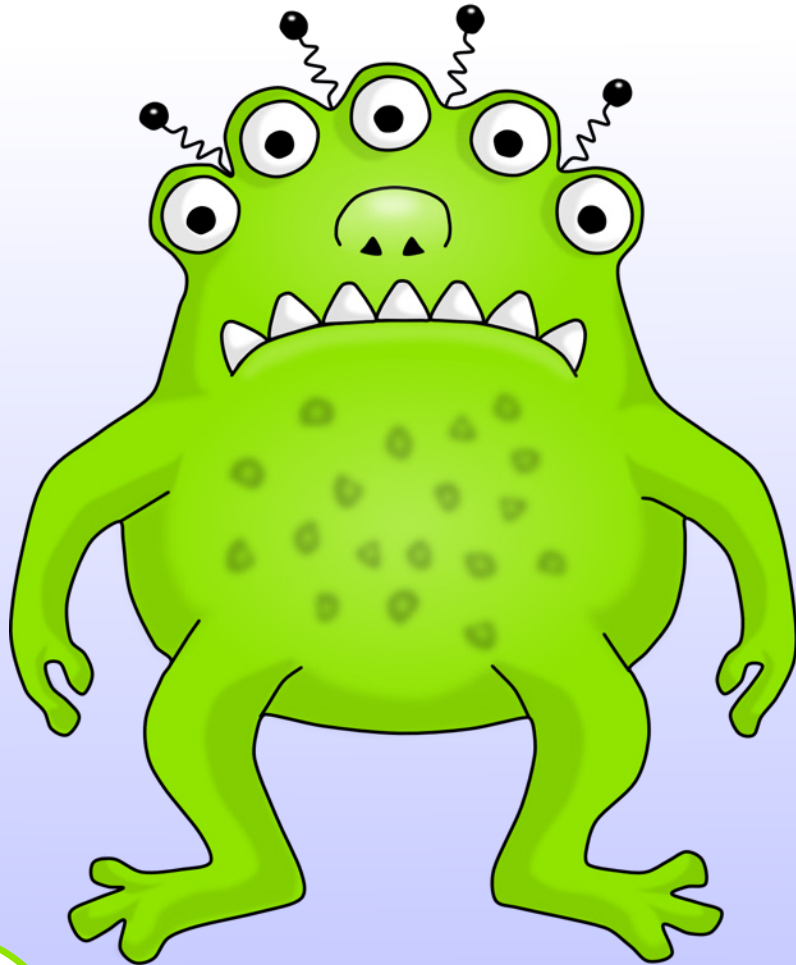


# Historical Fiction

or on other planets.

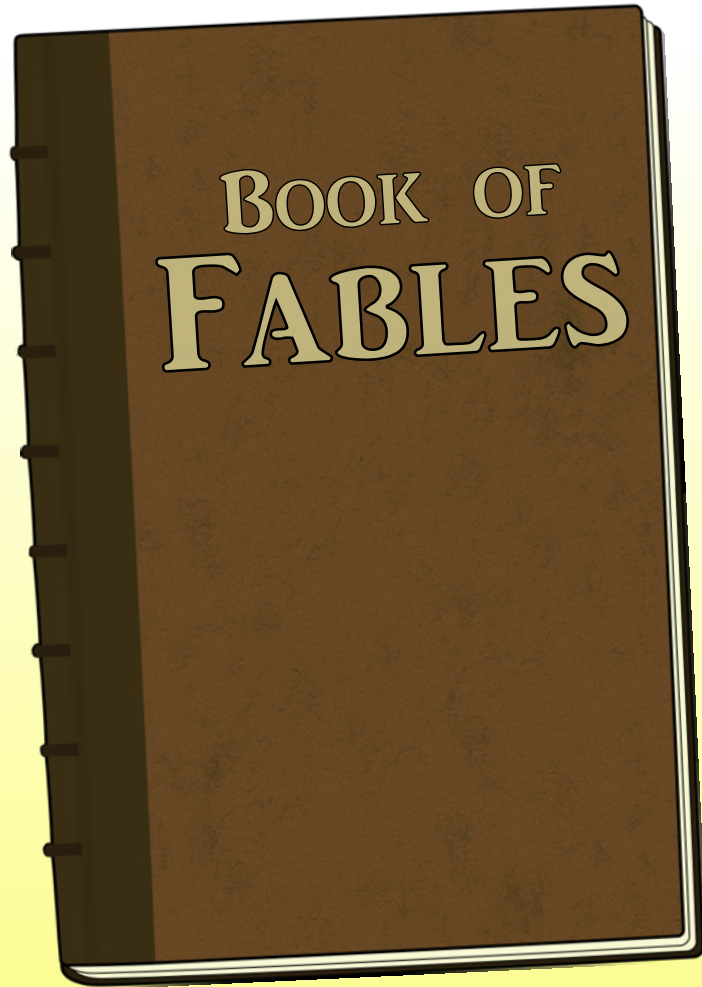
# Fairytale

# Fable



A tale or narrative that demonstrates a useful truth or lesson. Often features animals that speak like humans.

# Horror



Fiction which has events that make the characters and the reader feel fear, suspense or dread.

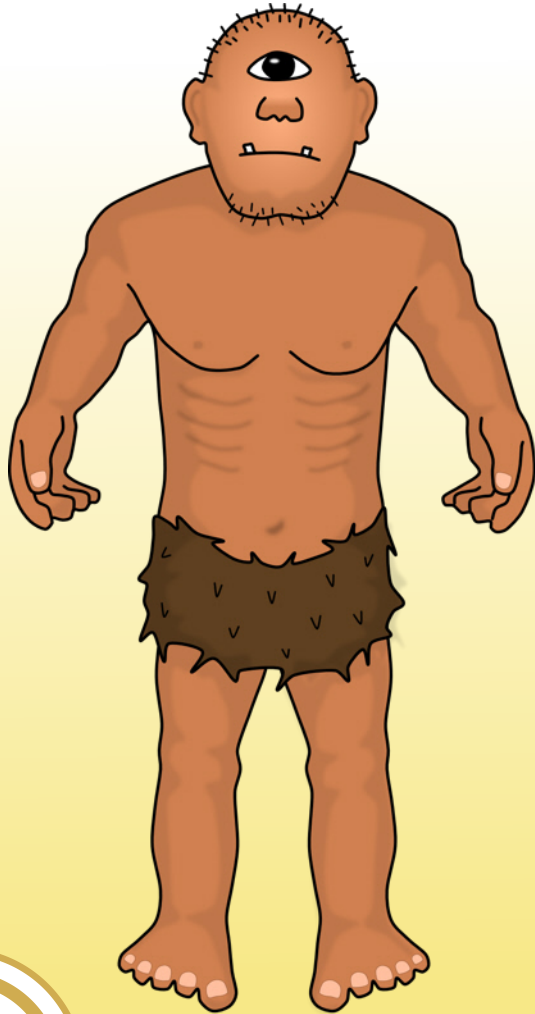
# HUMOUR



Fictional texts that are full of fun and excitement to entertain the reader.

Humour can be used in all fiction genres.

# Myths and Legends



Traditional tales or narratives, sometimes slightly based on history, that show human behaviour or natural events using symbolism. They often tell about the actions of gods or fantasy creatures.



# Mystery/Detective



Fiction that deals with  
the solution of a crime  
or the unravelling  
of secrets.



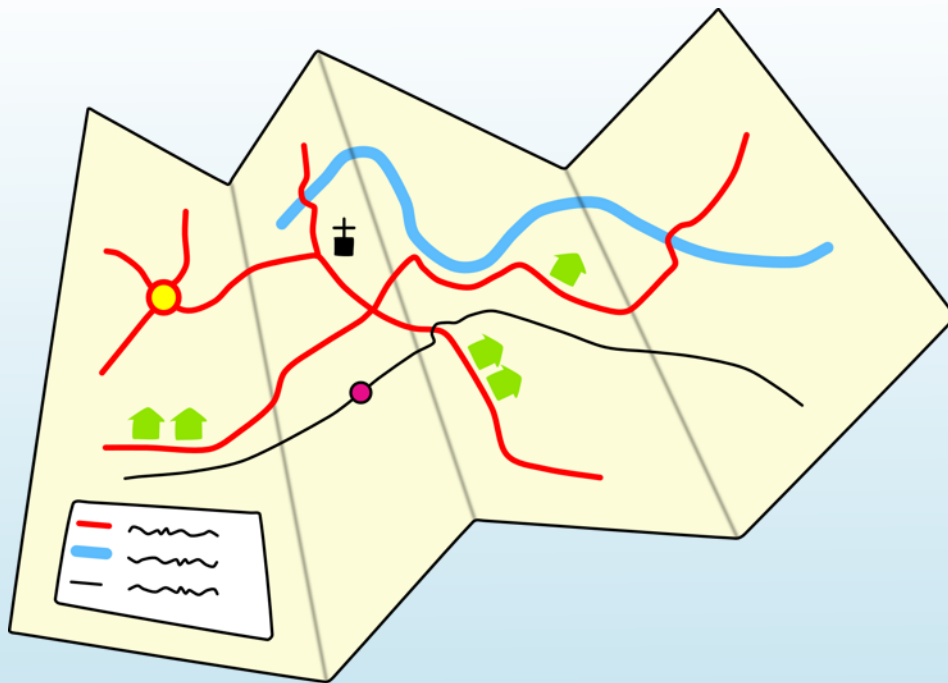
# Romance

two people who find love.

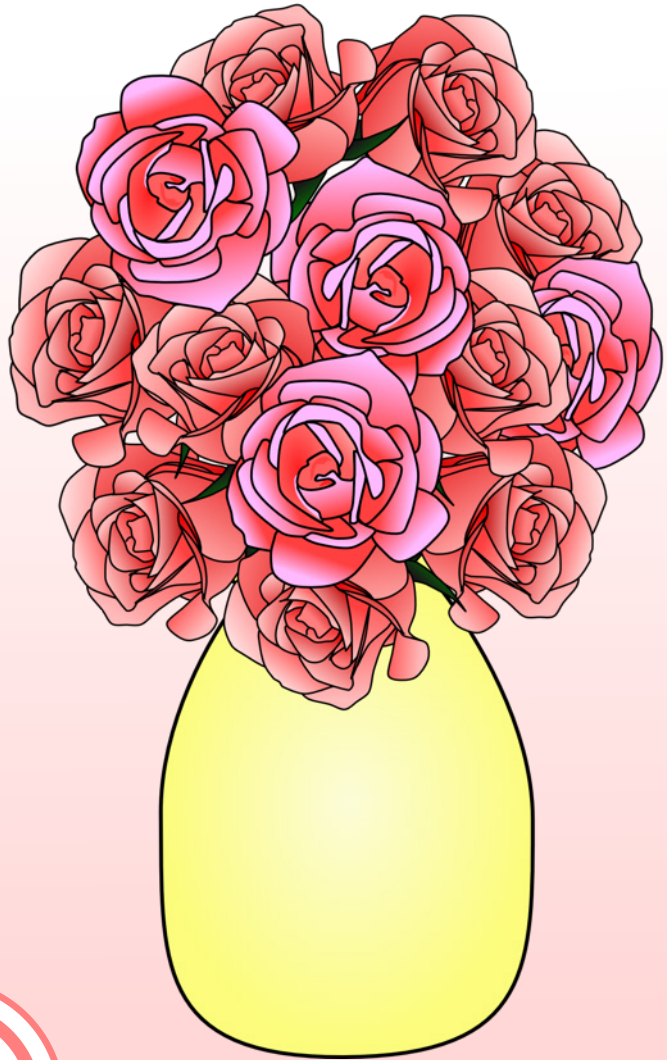
Romance nearly always
