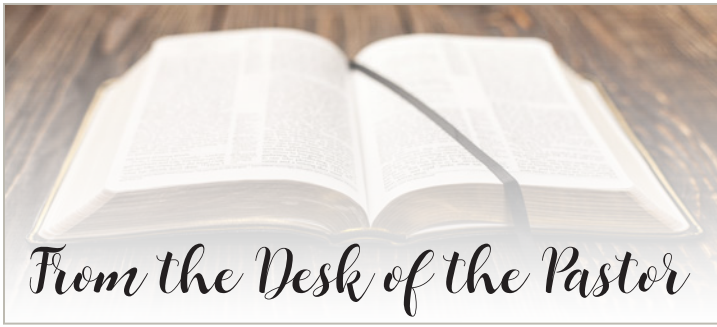

As we continue our celebration of the Easter season, and observe the 40 days that Jesus remained with His apostles on earth before His Ascension, we also remember one important thing: this world is not our true home. If Lent is a reminder of the suffering and pain that we face in this life, the Easter season is a foretaste of eternal life which awaits us in heaven, our true and lasting home. In the meantime, we live in this world, but as Jesus reminds us, we are not “of the world.” This means that we must face and address the problems and difficulties which this world brings, while always having an eternal perspective, keeping our eyes focused on heaven.

With this in mind, I was disheartened over the past week to hear such negative attacks against our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, amidst his calls for peace, as new wars and conflicts have arisen over the last few months. As the Holy Father said, “I am not a politician.” And it’s true: he’s a shepherd, the Vicar of Christ on earth. He is Christ’s representative in this world, but like all of us, he is not of the world. What he says is intended to be seen with an eternal perspective. As faithful Catholics, we must take his words seriously, respecting him as our teacher. It should be no surprise that a pope would call for peace, since he seeks to be a bridge builder (the literal meaning of the word “pontiff”), while also teaching about the dignity of the human person, and respect for human life at all its stages. If we study the teachings of all the popes over the last 110 years, we will find that they have all called for peace when wars were waged.

Certainly, since the Pope is not a politician, he is not one to formulate policy; the Church recognizes the need for civic leaders to make such decisions. Yet the Church teaches the truths of the Gospel so that nations and leaders will follow suit in the laws and policies they adopt. The Church seeks to steer people to make decisions with an eternal perspective, rather than acting according to the ways of the world or of this age (the literal meaning of the word “secular”). It’s also possible to have these discussions civilly, even if that means both sides have disagreements. Our dear Dominican brother, St. Thomas Aquinas, was known for engaging those he disagreed with in his theological arguments, taking their position, formulating his own answer, and offering his response to their objections. May we all continue to pray for peace in our world, to pray for our Holy Father, who carries a great burden as shepherd of the Universal Church, to pray for our civic leaders, that they may govern in wisdom and prudence, and to pray for the safety and protection of both military and civilians who are in harm’s way.

As we live as Christians in this world, but not of the world, I also want to invite you to a special catechetical presentation this upcoming Thursday on the topic of immigration. As we’ve watched the news in recent weeks, I’m sure that questions have arisen for many of us, especially as we desire to see the rule of law enforced in our country, while also respecting the dignity of the human person. Like the Holy Father, I am also not a politician, yet I must admit: it seems impossible to discuss this matter without it becoming political. A Sunday homily does not seem an appropriate place to bring this up, since the faithful come to Mass to worship God, and not to hear something that may be interpreted as a political speech (even if it is not intended to be political). However, because we live in the world, it is important for us as Catholics to be informed and act according to the Gospel as we face the challenges of our own day, while keeping our focus on the eternal. For this presentation, I’ve invited back a dear friend of our parish, Fr. Frassati Davis, O.P., who served here as our parochial vicar from 2021-2022. Father Frassati is now the pastor of St. Dominic’s in Youngstown, where he works with a largely Hispanic community in the inner-city. He comes with a unique perspective from his own ministerial experience, and I trust that he will have many valuable insights that can help us better understand this complex issue, while remaining grounded in sound Catholic teaching. His presentation, *Aquinas, Immigration, and Justice: Where Do Law and Mercy Collide?*, will begin at 7:00 p.m. in Patrick Hall. The presentation will not be recorded or broadcast, so if you want to hear Fr. Frassati’s talk, you will need to be here in person on Thursday evening.

This week is a time of great celebration for our parish, as 87 of our parishioners will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday. As we are one of the first parishes to implement the new diocesan policy on the age of confirmation (lowered to the ages of 9 or 10), our fourth, fifth, and sixth graders will all be receiving the sacrament. This will allow all the grades to be caught up. However, due to the sheer size of confirmandi this year, we had to split our Confirmation between two Masses on Saturday. Please pray for our confirmandi, that they may be strong in living the faith in this world, becoming witnesses of Jesus Christ. Strengthened with the Gift of the Holy Spirit, they will receive the graces necessary for the salvation of their souls!

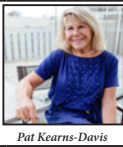
