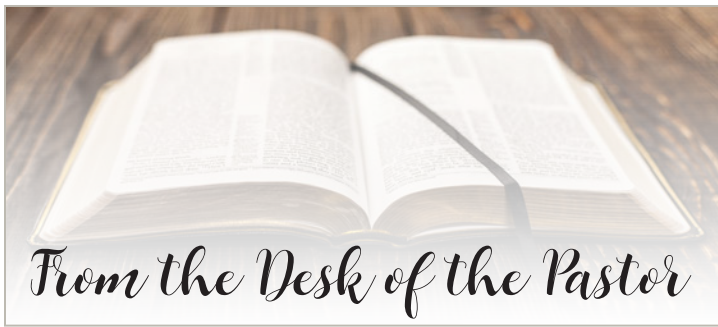

Dominican
Friars



What a beautiful sight it was last Saturday to see 87 of our young parishioners receive the Sacrament of Confirmation! With so many children being confirmed (from grades 4-6), we had to have two Masses with Bishop Fernandes! As the second Mass began, and I saw all the kids processing in, I was brought to tears, as so many of our young people were receiving the Gift of the Holy Spirit that day! This day was such an important moment for our parish and for the Diocese of Columbus, as we became one of the first parishes in the Diocese to implement the new age of Confirmation (around the ages of 9-10; thus the reason for three grade levels receiving the Sacrament this year). More importantly though, it was an outpouring of grace upon our parish!

The lowering of the age of Confirmation to 9-10 years old was greatly welcomed here at St. Patrick's. Personally, I am so grateful, as it counters everything I learned about the Sacrament when I was in junior high and high school. If you're like me, Confirmation was administered around 8th or 9th grade (and where I grew up, this was not without controversy: when the Diocese of Youngstown lowered the age of Confirmation from 11th grade to 8th grade a few years before I received it, many people said that 8th grade was "too young - the kids aren't ready yet"). Such thinking comes from a mistaken understanding of Confirmation, seeing it as the moment when one becomes an "adult" in the Church, or an individual's own personal commitment to the faith (since the commitment at baptism can be questionable, because it was made by the child's parents). To top all this off, teenagers preparing for Confirmation would need to complete service hours before receiving the Sacrament, as if Confirmation was something to be earned!

None of this is part of the Church's teaching on the Sacrament of Confirmation (nor was it part of our Confirmation curriculum at St. Patrick's before making the change from 6th grade to 4th grade). Confirmation is a strengthening of the grace received at baptism, given at some point following baptism. For Eastern Catholics, it is administered by the parish priest immediately after baptism, when the children are still infants. For Western Catholics, the tradition of waiting a few years, so that the local bishop could administer the Sacrament to several children at once, became the custom. But it wasn't intended to be held off until a child is too old, when temptations became more and more prevalent. Nor was it meant to be seen as some rite of passage from childhood to adulthood. Our bishop sees the need for the Sacrament to be received earlier, since in our present culture, our children are hit with so many temptations earlier and earlier. As 87 of our children

receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, let us pray for them, that the Gift of the Holy Spirit may strengthen them as they live their faith, respond to their own personal vocation, and proclaim Jesus Christ to others!

I am incredibly grateful to Sr. Marta Gawron, O.P., our Director of Religious Education, for overseeing our Confirmation preparation in her first year in this position. This was no small undertaking, with three grades receiving the Sacrament this year. I am also incredibly grateful to our dedicated team of catechists who prepared the children: Shannon Rainer, Chris Platek, and Mark Wolf (6th grade); Molly Kraker, Nathan Benge, and Jane Haninger (5th grade); and Lorraine Vance and Lyndsey Paxton (4th grade). Before Holy Week, the confirmandi had their personal interviews with the friars, and it was clear that they were well prepared. We have our catechists to thank for that! Thank you as well to all the parents and sponsors who supported our children in their preparation for Confirmation.

I'm happy to report some very good news on behalf of our Dominican community: Fr. Juan Macias Marquez, O.P. has been named the new Chaplain of St. Charles Preparatory School! Since he came to St. Patrick Priory in December 2024, Fr. Juan Macias' primary ministry has been as a hospital chaplain at Riverside and Ohio State hospitals. However, as the chaplaincy at St. Charles became vacant, Bishop Fernandes wanted to ensure a priestly presence at the high school, and so he assigned him as the new chaplain. This is certainly exciting for the number of boys from our own parish who attend St. Charles. However, it is also significant for the history of the Dominican friars in Columbus. For the first time in 61 years (when Aquinas High School closed), we now have a Dominican friar working in a boys high school in Columbus! Saint Charles keeps a display of Aquinas memorabilia in one of its hallways, as a way to remember the legacy of Aquinas High School - but now the legacy of Aquinas High School will continue with the presence of a friar at St. Charles! May God bless Fr. Juan Macias as he begins this new ministry. He will still be available to help on occasion at St. Patrick's, while continuing to develop our parish's video and digital presence. He will also be covering Spanish Masses and confessions on weekends at St. Mary Magdalene Parish on the West Side.

We're happy to welcome Fr. Michael Haemmerle, the diocesan vocations director (and a son of the parish) this weekend, as he preaches at all the Masses. He will also be in Patrick Hall between Masses, as the Office of Vocations hosts this month's Donut Sunday.
