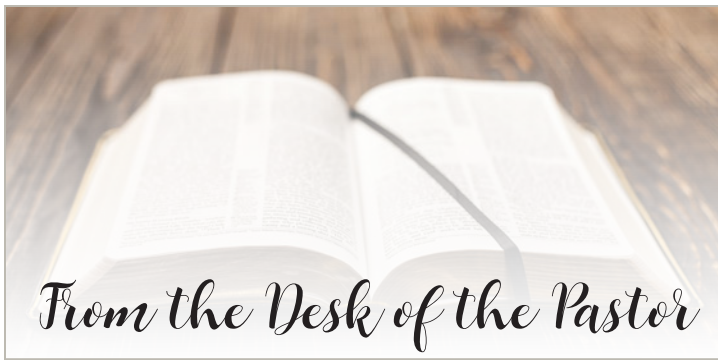

From the Desk of the Pastor

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is one of my favorite feast days of the year! It helps when the prayers of the Mass for this feast were written by St. Thomas Aquinas (Yes, we Dominicans will claim this as one of “our” feasts!). And the Corpus Christi Procession is a true testimony to our faith, as we bring Jesus into our streets and bless the city with His Eucharistic presence. Last year, we added another Benediction during the Procession on the front steps of the priory, and with that, the Blessed Sacrament blessed the city of Columbus! Today, we will add yet another Benediction, this one in front of the Lourdes grotto. This will give us two stations – by the Grotto and the front steps of the priory – before we make our return to the church for the final Benediction. Yet it is also a reminder how, from every Mass, we are called to go forth and bring Jesus to a world that hungers for Him. The stop in front of Our Lady reminds us that she is interceding for us, and the stop in front of a Dominican priory is a reminder that St. Dominic is praying for us too!

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is also a chance for us to ponder anew the mystery of divine worship. What exactly does it mean to worship God? In many Christian denominations, worship is characterized by music and preaching. In many places these days, the music can be quite emotional, becoming more like a concert rather than an act of worship. So too can preaching be emotionally charged, but when you break it apart, we find little substance there.

We as Catholics also worship God with music, and the homily is an integral part of the Mass, even required on Sundays and holy days. At a Dominican parish, we friars strive to preach the best homilies, sharing with you through our preaching the fruits of contemplation that we receive in prayer and study. Yet in the Catholic Church, at the heart of divine worship is sacrifice, namely the holy sacrifice of the Mass. At every Mass, the one sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross is now re-presented for us sacramentally on the altar. In the priest’s offering of the Body and Blood of Christ, we unite our own joys and sufferings with those of the Lord Jesus. Our sacrifices become part of His sacrifice. We become more fully united with Him, which culminates in receiving His Body and Blood in Holy Communion. Yes, we sing at Mass; yes, we come to hear preaching, which lift our minds and hearts to Almighty God, allowing us to enter into the mystery of divine worship. But ultimately, we come to offer sacrifice, to participate in the one, eternal sacrifice of Jesus Christ for the salvation of the world.

On this Solemnity of Corpus Christi, I want to take an opportunity to offer a word of encouragement for everyone as you come here to St. Patrick’s and offer right and fitting worship to God. We are blessed with so many young families at our parish, and it is great witness every weekend to see our little ones at Mass. Even the tiniest baby can offer worship to the Creator of the Universe! Yet moments come every day for parents when their young children are in need, and those needs lead to crying, whether they are at Mass or not. There can be moments when it is temporary, and the child will quickly be at ease; other times, the child may be inconsolable. Every moment and situation is different.

I want to encourage parents of young children to continue bringing your children to Mass! You are forming them in their faith, and that begins with instilling in them the need for divine worship. You make many sacrifices in raising your children and nurturing them in the faith. Know that the Church and our parish are here to support you in your great vocation as fathers and mothers!

As part of this encouragement, when the times come that your child is having difficulty at Mass, consider the best practices to help them be at ease. I’ve heard it said by some families that sitting closer to the front is actually better if you have young children, since it keeps the children engaged and focused during the celebration of the sacred liturgy. Don’t be afraid to move up close; there are usually plenty of seats there! If children start getting fussy, perhaps a quick walk to the back of the church is all they need to settle down. If that won’t work out, the Baptismal Gallery is designated as a sacred space, and is a place where you can take your children and still hear the Mass. While we had Aquinas Hall open for a number of years after the pandemic, it was becoming apparent that the space was not the most conducive for divine worship, while the Gallery can be thought of as an extension of the church. It can accommodate a parent with a small child, while also fostering divine worship. At present, we are working on improving the sound system in the Gallery with extra speakers. I also want to assure parents that if you need to take your child out of Mass for a time, this is not affecting your Sunday obligation. Caring for a child in need is a just cause for stepping away from Mass, and while it may not make it the greatest experience of Mass, what is important is that you lift your hearts and minds to God in worship from the start – even if you have to take a step out of that worship for a short time. If you are in the Gallery, please keep an eye on your children at all times – both for their safety, and also for the protection of the sacred items in the Gallery.

For those who do not have young children, and who may have difficulty hearing the words of the Scripture readings or the homily when a child lets out a loud cry, I offer the same encouragement. Remember that you are coming to Mass first and foremost to take part in sacrifice. Obviously, we all want to hear the different parts of the Mass so that we can be engaged with the mystery unfolding before us. Parents who take a crying child out of Mass for a short time offer a great courtesy to the others in the congregation who

desire to hear all the words of the sacred liturgy. Yet if a moment comes when we miss a word, or we get distracted because of something out of our control, let that be a moment to recall that we are at Mass to offer worship, to take part in the Lord's holy sacrifice. Right worship begins in our hearts. Pray for any children having difficulty at Mass, pray for their parents, and offer any discomfort or distractions to the Lord's sacrifice.

Ultimately, all of us are called to charity. The Eucharist is the sacrament of charity, and coming to Mass must be a moment that helps us grow in that love for God and for our neighbor. May we always show charity to others, considering their needs, while also keeping our hearts and minds foremost on God!
