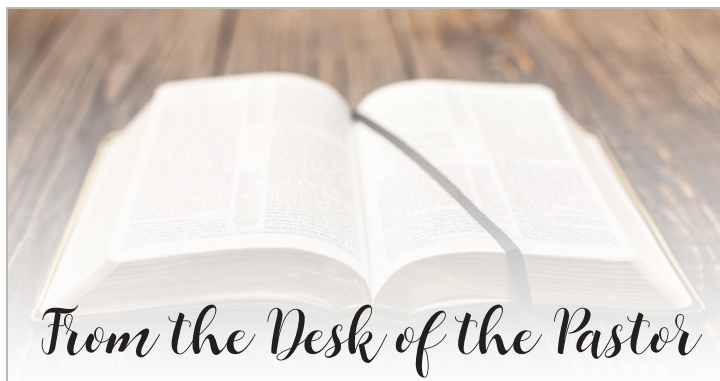

From the Desk of the Pastor

The Dominicans had a wonderful celebration for St. Dominic Day, starting with our Dominican Rite Mass on the traditional Feast of St. Dominic, and a beautiful Mass on August 8th for the solemnity on the new calendar. Several friars concelebrated, the Sisters attended, and the Lay Dominicans were present as part of their annual Day of Reflection. We were also blessed to have a Franciscan preacher (Fr. Brian Stacy, O.F.M. Cap., the pastor of Christ the King and St. Thomas Parishes), which is a long-standing tradition in which Dominicans and Franciscans exchange pulpits on the feast days of our respective founders.

As a Dominican parish, we are also thrilled to share some exciting news about a Dominican vocation from our parish. Congratulations to Isabella “Ella” Williams, who has been accepted as a postulant for the Dominican Sisters of Mary, Mother of the Eucharist in Ann Arbor, Michigan. Ella is the daughter of Ross and Elizabeth Williams (and the granddaughter of John and Deb Schlater). She was baptized and grew up at St. Patrick’s, and was greatly involved in our high school youth ministry program. She took part in different ministry opportunities for a couple years after her high school graduation in 2023. Following a year of studies at Franciscan University of Steubenville, the Lord is now leading Ella to the convent, where she will begin her formation as a Dominican Sister. We are so proud of Ella, and will be praying for her as the Lord calls her to this vocation. Ella will be entering the postulancy this Saturday, so please keep her in your prayers. Congratulations, Sr. Isabella!

You may have seen some signs or messages lately from “Little Margaret’s Charity: Outreach,” and wondered what this name is all about, and how it is related to our long-standing parish organization, “Little Margaret’s Charity.” You may wonder: Is this something new, or a change to Little Margaret’s Charity? Well, sort of. Over the last several months, the Service Committee of our Pastoral Council have been working with Catholic Social Services, while also working to develop service opportunities here in the parish. However, we wanted a catchier name than “Service Committee.” For several years, our Little Margaret’s Charity has helped lead the charitable activity of our parish, with projects like the Giving Tree, while also providing monetary assistance to local charities, pro-life ministries, as well as parishioners seeking emergency assistance. However, we have been looking for ways to have Little Margaret’s Charity oversee works of mercy, service projects, and direct volunteer activity. And so,

why not bring the two things together! So, when you see the organization “Little Margaret’s Charity,” it will refer first of all to the long-standing parish organization which assists local charities, pro-life ministries, and parishioners in need (donations made to Little Margaret’s Charity, as well as funds to the fifth Sunday second collection, will continue to go here). When you see the organization “Little Margaret’s Charity: Outreach,” this refers to the works of mercy, service projects, and direct volunteer activity organized by the Service Committee of Pastoral Council, placed under the umbrella of the existing parish organization that bears St. Margaret’s patronage.

Little Margaret’s Charity: Outreach (LMC: Outreach, for short) is just one of many ways that you can volunteer in the life of our parish. This weekend, you have an opportunity to learn about all the ways you can get more involved! I invite you to stop in Patrick Hall after all Masses this weekend and visit our Ministry Fair, organized by the Ministry Committee of the Pastoral Council. There’s a place for you and a way for you to get involved at St. Patrick’s. We are a parish with so many dedicated parishioners, and the volunteer activity of our parish makes all the many parish programs possible. Talk to ministry leaders at the Ministry Fair, and find out the many ways that you can help.

Speaking of the dedication of our parishioners, I also want to give you an update on *The Appeal* for 2026. As of publication time, we currently have \$122,395.41 pledged of our parish goal of \$184,423.80. That is an incredible amount pledged, which is over 66% of our goal, and is getting us ever nearer to our goal (only \$62,028.39 to go!). However, the 66% of our goal already pledged comes from 135 registered households in the parish, which reflects 13% of parishioners. Can we get both of these numbers: goal and parishioner participation, to 100%? If you haven’t made your pledge or donation to *The Appeal* yet, please do so today, and help us reach our diocesan goal. More importantly, it is my hope to engage more families in the parish to help with this annual campaign, which supports diocesan charities, seminarian formation, and Catholic education, among other things. Yet every dollar we raise above our goal comes back to the parish as a rebate, to support with our own needs. This year, my intention is to direct our rebate to help upgrade security measures (a new perimeter fence and new security cameras), as well as projected maintenance needs for the parish center elevator. I encourage you to pray and consider what the Lord may be asking you to give to support *The Appeal* as we reach closer to our goal.

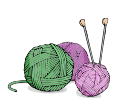
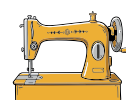

Mary Jo Fetch is a parishioner who paints daily and has dedicated her art to the **Blessed Virgin Mary.**

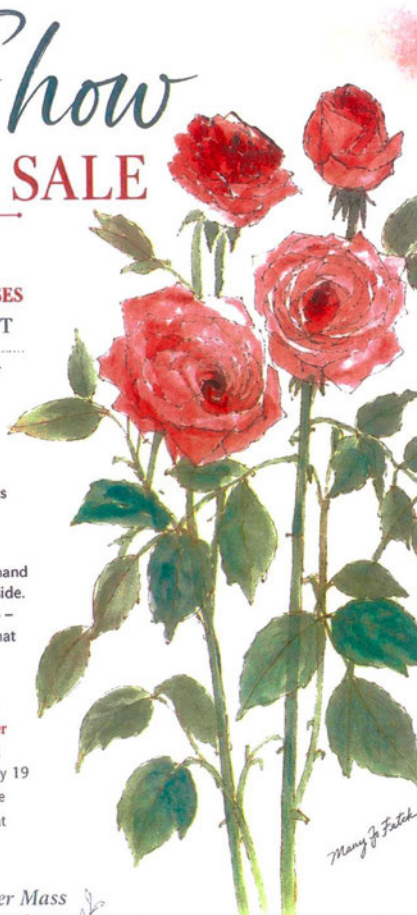

Poor Box: Funds dropped in the poor boxes in the church also support the various causes of Little Margaret's Charity.

Donations to Little Margaret's Charity through the 5th Sunday Collection and the Poor Box support parishioners in need, as well as a number of Pro-life organizations, including Ohio Right to Life, Greater Columbus Right to Life, Women's Care Center, PDHC, and Bethesda Healing Ministry.
