News from the Parish

Dear Family and Friends of St. Patrick's

"It is Jesus in fact that you seek when you dream of happiness; he is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you; he is the beauty to which you are so attracted; it is he who provokes you with that thirst for fullness that will not let you settle for compromise; it is he who urges you to shed the masks of a false life; it is he who reads in your hearts your most genuine choices, the choices that others try to stifle. It is Jesus who stirs in you the desire to do something great with your lives, the will to follow an ideal, the refusal to allow yourselves to be grounded down by mediocrity, the courage to commit yourselves humbly and patiently to improving yourselves and society, making the world more human and more fraternal."

St. John Paul II spoke these words as he addressed the young people at World Youth Day on August 19, 2000. His message was one of Christian authenticity. The Christian finds happiness in Christ. The Christian finds himself in Christ. The Christian lives for Christ. These perennial truths need to be preached to the whole Church but especially to our young people. At St. Patrick's this year, our youth ministry will focus on Christian authenticity with the theme "Alive in Christ and True to Self." We hope that our youth will continue to grow in virtue as they mature into Christian adulthood. Our Youth Ministry is not just a program or a time for recreation. Rather, it is a time for our youth to be formed in the discipline of following the person of Jesus Christ and living in the "heart of the Church." Consequently, we are going to make some changes to our youth group this year to better attain this end.

One change will be the emphasis on helping our youth to form true friendships and mentor relationships with the core team and staff. The core team will be called upon to lead and inform some of our high school formation nights with my guidance and the guidance of our two assistants, Eddie Cotter and Alyce Horwat. Our middle school youth will receive instruction and formation with two Thursday nights a month. This will include some study of Sacred Scripture and lessons in Christian anthropology especially as St. John Paul II taught. In addition to catechesis, our youth group will take some road trips and hopefully a senior retreat! We've been working hard to plan for a great year for our youth. If you're a youth reading this, I hope you will attend youth group this year. If you're a parent, please encourage your child to participate.

If you're an empty nester or a person without children, please pray for our youth and our dedicated staff and volunteers who give of their time because they believe in the message of St. John Paul II. We want our youth to live in a world that is more human, more fraternal, more charitable!

Here are a few logistical items to note for the year. We will have a parent meeting on Tuesday, September 8th at 7:00 p.m. in Patrick Hall. I'll give an overview of the year and answer any questions about both high school and middle school nights. Youth ministry kick off nights are Tuesday, September 15th for High School students and Thursday, September 17th for Middle School students. Please register your child for youth group by contacting Alyce at youthministry@stpatrickcolumbus.org. I look forward to serving our parish youth this year. Please continue to pray for me and for all of the Dominican priests at St. Patrick's as we seek to better serve you and help our parish grow as disciples of Jesus Christ.

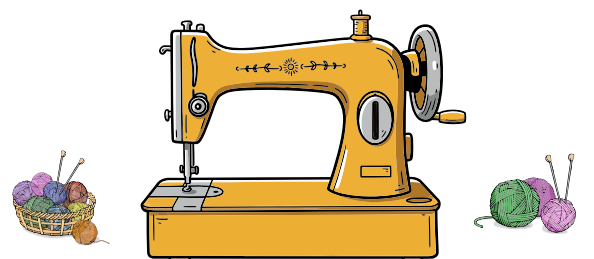

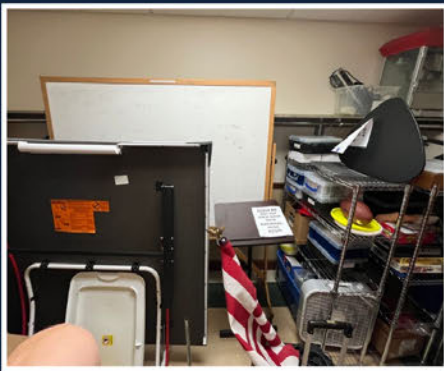

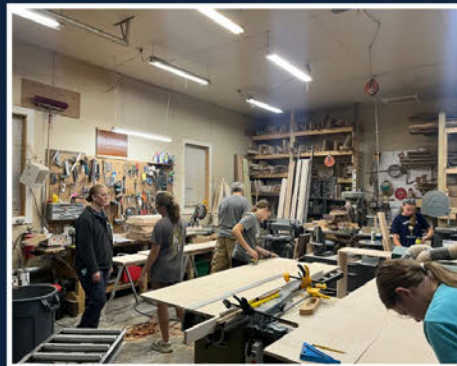
