News from the Parish

We are at that time of year when it seems that everything starts up again. The reprieve of summer has sped by too quickly (as it always does), schools have begun the academic year, college students have returned to town, and a whole host of groups are kicking things off. Of course, that's true here at St. Patrick Church as well! We just had our Ministry Fair two weeks ago as a way to promote the many groups in our parish, and the coming weeks will be rife with activities and initial meetings.

In fact, one of these parish ministries is starting up again today! This afternoon, after the 12:00 Noon Mass, we will have our first class for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, or OCIA for short. If you're wondering what that even is, a very simple definition would be the program of classes that someone takes in order to become Catholic.

While there is truth in that definition, OCIA is not merely about intellectual formation or simply taking classes. To be clear, I am *not* saying that intellectual formation is something unimportant—that would be absurd coming from a Dominican friar! Rather, the essence of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is an encounter with the person of Christ and the transformation of one's soul. The ritual book for OCIA describes it as the process by which adults, after "hearing the proclamation of the mystery of Christ as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts, consciously and freely seek the living God and undertake the journey of faith and conversion." Yes, this journey is one that includes intellectual formation and coming to know the truth of the Catholic faith, but it's all for the sake of forming a relationship with the Triune God *in medio Ecclesiae*—"in the midst of the Church."

Throughout the world, there has been anecdotal evidence in the last year or two of an uptick of those inquiring about Catholicism and entering the Church through OCIA. We experienced that this past Easter at St. Patrick's, and, by the grace of God, it appears that we may have another big OCIA class this coming year! Please pray for all those who have been inquiring about OCIA at our parish in recent months, as the journey has been a long and circuitous one for many of them. Of course, the journey has also been different for each person: Some are unbaptized, some are non-Catholic Christians, and some are baptized Catholics who need to complete their sacramental initiation.

If you or someone you know is interested in OCIA, or even simply in learning about Catholicism, please reach out to me! Even if someone is just at the first stages of interest and inquiry,

they are welcome to attend the OCIA classes. As mentioned above, our classes will be on Sunday afternoons (which is a change from previous years) from 1:30 to 3:00 p.m. in Aquinas Hall. Furthermore, it's not as if everyone must commit to becoming Catholic next Easter by starting in OCIA this fall. For some, the journey might take a little longer, and that is perfectly fine.

To conclude, Pope Leo XIV gave some wise advice in an address to young French neophytes and catechumens just over a year ago. He said that "we are not born Christians; we become Christians when we are touched by God's grace. However, this 'touch' is expressed through our carefully considered choice and our personal journey. Without these genuine requirements, we will bear the label of Christian, but Christians of convenience, habit, or comfort. We become authentic Christians when we allow ourselves to be personally touched in our daily lives by the word and witness of Jesus." Whether we have been Catholic our whole lives or are just starting the journey toward entering the Church, let us live by that standard of authenticity, of a daily encounter with Christ the Lord.
