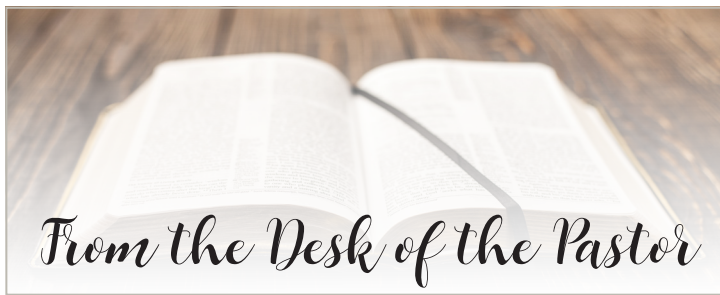

From the Desk of the Pastor

This past week marked an important milestone for me: Monday was five years since I arrived at St. Patrick's. I like to joke with the friars that "I'm still on my deacon assignment," as I came here in 2021 as a transitional deacon, arriving three days after my ordination. When I was ordained a priest in May 2022, the Provincial decided to keep me here as a parochial vicar. Then in 2024, I was named pastor, and I can't believe that the first two years in that office have gone by so quickly. In addition to being pastor, last November, the Dominican community elected me their prior. It's been a very full five years, and I've worn many hats during that time. I pray that the Lord continues to bless my ministry here, and that I'm blessed with many more years to come!

C.C.D. begins today, and it's a chance to say "Welcome Back!" With Labor Day now behind us, many families are back from summer vacations, and our parish ministry schedule now kicks into full gear this week. It will be great to see so many families here each week with classes for their children now in session. It's also an exciting moment for our C.C.D. program, as we implement a new curriculum for our junior high and high school levels, using a program developed by *Ruah Woods* in Cincinnati. In addition to C.C.D., our high school and junior high youth ministry programs kick off this week, with an exciting year ahead under the direction of Fr. Cornelius. Also this month, we've been having our altar boy trainings, and I'm happy to report that we have over 80 boys in the program! There are many blessings happening for the youth of our parish as this new ministry year begins.

As we swing back into our regular schedule of parish activities, I want to remind families about *The Appeal*, our annual campaign for diocesan ministries. When you came to Mass this morning, you may have seen *The Appeal* thermometer in front of the St. Patrick shrine, showing our progress. We have raised about 2/3 of our goal; after that, any money raised comes back to the parish as a rebate. This year, I'm looking to use the rebate to help fund security upgrades (a new perimeter fence and cameras), as well as upgrades to our parish center elevator. If you haven't made a pledge or donation yet, I encourage you to do so today.

Over the summer, we've been working on a number of improvements throughout the parish center, and one of those improvements has been adding wall speakers in the Gallery, as well as ceiling speakers in the area around the St. Patrick shrine and the corridor between the library and Patrick Hall. If families have a little one who needs a little walk or respite during Mass, these speakers will allow families to hear the Mass in the Gallery and surrounding areas with greater ease (since previously, we

only had one speaker in the Gallery). The Gallery was built to be a sacred space, complete with the baptismal font and shrines. For families needing to bring their children out of the church for a time during Mass, the Gallery is available as a place that is conducive to prayer and devotion, while allowing you to hear the readings, the homily, and the prayers of the Mass.

Also, in case you weren't here last weekend, I want to direct your attention to my article in last week's bulletin about the restoration of the ambo to the north side of the sanctuary, which was done for theological, liturgical, and an upcoming practical reason (the new church lighting).

IN REMEMBRANCE SHEILA TUTTLE

Sheila is survived by her husband of 40 years, Tom; their seven children: Lauren (Josh), Matt (Brynn), Joe, Caitlin (Austin), Collin, Aidan (Alyssa), and Quinn; eight grandchildren; and several brothers and sisters, nephews and nieces, and other members of her large extended family.
