As we enter into Holy Week, and reflect upon the death and burial of Jesus on Good Friday, I want to bring to your attention an important matter, which should be a concern for everyone. Have you given much thought to your own funeral? Particularly, have you explicitly made it clear that you want a Funeral Mass after you pass from this life? It may seem like a given, but I've heard the sad stories of devout Catholic parents, whose children no longer practice the faith, and then after they die, the children decide not to have a Funeral Mass. I've experienced it in our parish, and have also seen it with friends back home in Youngstown. Why is it important to have a Funeral Mass when you die?

The Mass is the one sacrifice of Christ, which was offered on the Cross, and which is now made present for us on our altars in the celebration of the Eucharist. The offering of the Eucharistic sacrifice is made for the benefit of either the living or the deceased. When offered for the dead, the Mass is particularly intended for releasing the soul from purgatory. Of course, we can offer several Masses for the dead, even years after they have died. But the Funeral Mass is a specific celebration laid out by the Church for the deceased, to be celebrated soon after death. There are specific rituals in a Funeral Mass, taking account of the presence of the body (such as the sprinkling of the body with holy water, or incensing it at the end). These are reminders that Funeral Masses are not primarily for the living who mourn, though it is a great consolation for them. Rather, the Funeral Mass is offered for the sake of the soul of the deceased, as we beg God to have mercy on them, to release them from purgatory, and to bring them into the glory of heaven. As we enter this Holy Week, and meditate more deeply on the death and resurrection of Christ, I plead with you, as your pastor: make sure that plans for a Funeral Mass are clear with your family and friends. Make sure they bring you to church one last time before your remains are committed to the tomb. Through the Church's rites of Christian burial, we express our faith in the death and resurrection of Jesus, and show our union with His own death. It's a good reminder for us to ponder during this week in which He goes to die for love of us.

We'll be seeing some visiting friars come and go in the coming weeks, starting this week. Father Humbert Kilanowski, O.P., who has been with us since mid-December while on his sabbatical from Providence College, will be leaving on Monday to go back to Providence. He has thoroughly enjoyed helping out at the parish over the last few months, the parish where he met the Dominican Order. We wish him well in the remaining months of his sabbatical, before teaching again in the fall.

I also received good news that we will be hosting a student brother this summer! We are pleased to welcome Br. Innocent Hillman, O.P., who is completing his second year of studies in Washington. Brother Innocent is originally from Virginia, and he will be working in the hospitals with Fr. Juan Macias, and also doing some work in the parish.

For the Sacred Triduum, please welcome Fr. Michael O'Connor, O.P., who will be visiting us from Mount St. Mary Seminary in Emmitsburg, Maryland. Father O'Connor will preach the Seven Last Words of Christ on Good Friday, as well as the homily during the Celebration of the Lord's Passion. Besides being a very gifted preacher, Fr. O'Connor is a very talented musician and composer (in fact, when you hear the chanting of the Passion according to St. John on Good Friday, we will be using the musical setting which Fr. O'Connor arranged!). He will also be singing the *Exsultet* at this year's Easter Vigil. For us friars ordained over the last few years, Fr. O'Connor was our professor and schola director at the Dominican House of Studies, so we are excited to have him here at St. Patrick's for the Triduum.

May you all have a blessed and fruitful Holy Week. On Tuesday, the diocesan Church will gather with Bishop Fernandes for the Chrism Mass at St. Paul the Apostle Church in Westerville at 3:30 p.m. All are invited to attend. I encourage you to come to our many liturgies at St. Patrick's during this week, to make a good confession, and to prepare your hearts for next week's great celebration, when the Lord rises in glory!

GOOD FRIDAY IS AN OBLIGATORY DAY OF FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Fasting is the limitation of food, allowing a person to eat one full meal and two smaller meals, with no solid food in between. The two smaller meals combined should not exceed the amount of the full meal. All Catholics ages 18-59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Abstinence prohibits the eating of meat (beast or fowl). All Catholics 14 years old and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.


