CALIFORNIA GOLDEN BEARS

CAL HOSTS STANFORD IN 125TH BIG GAME

ABOUT THE SERIES

- This will be the 125th all-time meeting between California and Stanford with the first game played on March 19, 1892, on a field at the corner of Haight and Stanyan Streets in San Francisco.
- The Cardinal lead the series 65-48-11, but the Bears have won two of the last three matchups, including a 41-11 demolition of Stanford in their most recent meeting on The Farm on Nov. 20, 2021, that was Cal's largest margin of the victory against the Cardinal since a 41-6 win in Berkeley in 2004.

BEARS VS CARDINAL

- The Bears defeated the Cardinal, 41-11, in their most recent meeting Nov. 20, 2021, at Stanford Stadium. Cal's offense registered three plays of at least 75 yards, including the longest pass play in Big Game history, an 84-yard touchdown pass from Chase Garbers to Trevon Clark in the second quarter. Marcel Dancy added a 76-yard touchdown run and Christopher Brooks reeled off a 75-yard run of his own as Cal opened up a 27-3 lead with 1:26 to play in the third quarter. The Bears' 636 total yards were a Big Game record.
- Cal brought the The Axe back to Berkeley for the first time in 10 years in 2019, defeating Stanford 24-20, on The Farm behind a game-winning 16-yard touchdown run with 1:16 to play from quarterback Chase Garbers. Trailing 20-17 with 2:23 to play after a Cardinal field goal, the Bears went on a 75-yard drive capped by the Garbers run to the left corner of the endzone. Garbers finished 20-of-30 passing for 285 yards and a touchdown along with 89 rushing yards and the game-winning score.

SENIOR DAY

- Cal will celebrate the careers of 17 seniors prior to the 125th Big Game on Saturday with the list including Nick Alftin, Matthew Cindric, Ben Coleman, Odua Isibor, Demetric Jackson, Darius Long Jr., Dario Longhetto, Jack Plummer, Ryan Puskas, Gunnar Rask, Daniel Scott, Jamieson Sheahan, Jackson Sirmon, Kyle Smith, Raymond Woodie III, Monroe Young and Slater Zellers.

FAB FRESHMEN

- Redshirt freshman wide receiver J.Michael Sturdivant sits atop of several stat categories among freshman wide receivers across the country. The Highland Village, Texas product leads the nation's freshmen in receptions (55) and receptions per game (5.5), is tied for second in touchdown receptions (6), third in receiving yards (615) and fourth in receiving yards per game (61.5). Sturdivant has twice tallied career bests of eight catches against Washington on Oct. 22 and at USC on Nov. 5, while he also had career highs of 104 yards receiving and two touchdown catches against the Huskies.
- True freshman running back Jaydn Ott ran for 274 yards and three touchdowns on 19 carries in Cal's 49-31 win over Arizona on Sept. 24. Ott leads all Pac-12 freshmen and ranks fourth nationally in rushing yards (745) while he tops the conference's freshmen and is sixth nationally in rushing yards per game (74.5). Named a midseason true freshman All-American by College Football News, The Athletic and On3, Ott also leads all Pac-12 freshman and ranks fifth among first-year players nationally in all-purpose yards per game (96.4), tied for fifth in total touchdowns (9) and tied for sixth in rushing touchdowns (7).
- Defensively, the Bears have seen an immediate impact from true freshman cornerback Jeremiah Earby and defensive end Nate Burrell. Earby, who was named a Midseason Freshman All-American by 247Sports, The Athletic, and On3, has played in all 10 games with five starts. Earby is eighth on the team in tackles (26) and returned a fumble 33 yards for a touchdown at Oregon State last Saturday.

TAKERS

- California has at least one takeaway in 22 of the last 23 games and had a streak of 19 consecutive games to tie for the longest stretch in the nation before it was broken against Washington on Oct. 22.
- The Bears are tied for second in the Pac-12 and tied for 12th nationally in turnover margin (.80), as well as tied for fourth in the Pac-12 and tied for 35th nationally with 10 interceptions.

PLUMMER'S BIG NIGHT

- Quarterback Jack Plummer had his most productive game as a Golden Bear on Nov. 5 at then-No. 9 USC. The transfer from Purdue completed 35-of-49 passes for 406 yards and three touchdowns, becoming the first Cal quarterback to throw for more than 400 yards in a game since Davis Webb had 425 yards at Washington State on Nov. 16, 2016.

TOP OF THE PAC

- WJeremiah Hunter has been among the leaders of Pac-12 wideouts all season. Hunter is currently fifth in the conference in receiving yards per game (78.8), seventh in receiving yards (709), eighth in receptions per game (5.2) and tied for eighth in receptions (47). Hunter is also fourth in the Pac-12 and 13th nationally with a 10.2 punt return average on 13 punt returns for 133 yards.
- J.Michael Sturdivant is fifth in the Pac-12 in receptions (55), tied for fifth in touchdown receptions (6) and sixth in receptions per game (5.5).
- Jamieson Sheahan is second in the Pac-12 and No. 15 nationally with a punting average of 45.4 yards that is only 0.2 behind single-season school record holder Bryan Anger's 45.6 in 2010.
- On the defensive side of the ball, Jackson Sirmon has made his presence known in his first season as a Bear. The transfer from Washington is currently third in the Pac-12 and 44th nationally with 86 tackles and 8.6 tackles per game.

LOTS OF NEW FACES

- A total of 58 players on that began the season on an 113-player roster had never participated in a game for the Golden Bears including 35 that were beginning their first season overall at Cal. The Bears ranked 12th in the Pac-12 and 127th of 131 FBS schools on Phil Steele's experience chart heading into the campaign.
- Cal has a total of 33 Bears who have played for the first time at Cal in 2022, while 23 have made their first start for the Blue and Gold.
- Cal's roster includes nine who players who transferred after previously being on a roster at another four-year school – Xavier Carlton (Utah), Odua Isibor (UCLA), Demetric Jackson Jr. (Chattanooga), Tyler Jensen (Louisville), Spencer Lovell (Arizona State), Kenden Robinson Jr. (Northern Iowa), T.J. Session (Montana State), Jack Plummer (Purdue) and Jackson Sirmon (Washington).

2022 SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

- Cal plays seven home games in 2022 with five already in the books against UC Davis (Sept. 3), UNLV (Sept. 10), Arizona (Sept. 24, Homecoming), Washington (Oct. 22, Hall of Fame Game) and Oregon (Oct. 29, Cam Jordan Bobblehead), while games remain against Stanford (Nov. 19, 125th Big Game/40th Anniversary of The Play/Senior Day) and UCLA (Nov. 25, Joe Roth Game/Joe Starkey Day).
- Cal's 2022 road schedule included the first trip to Notre Dame that was the first meeting between the teams in 55 seasons, as well as conference road trips to Washington State (Oct. 1), Colorado (Oct. 15), USC (Nov. 5) and Oregon State (Nov. 12).

STARKEY'S FINAL PLAY

- Legendary Hall of Fame broadcaster Joe Starkey, best known for his "the band is on the field" call of "The Play" in 1982, will retire as Cal's football radio play-by-play announcer following the 2022 campaign.
- In Starkey's 48th and final season on the mic, the 2022 Golden Bears have traveled to Notre Dame to face the Fighting Irish for the first time in 55 years, and will celebrate the 125th Big Game and 40th anniversary of The Play in Berkeley on Nov. 19 before hosting Joe Starkey Day for the regular-season finale in Strawberry Canyon against UCLA on Nov. 25.
- Starkey has also had an array of broadcasting duties with professional sports organizations during his career that he mostly fulfilled in conjunction with his Cal duties, highlighted by a 22-year stint on the San Francisco 49ers' radio broadcast team (1987-2008) that included the final 20 campaigns as the play-by-play voice. The 49ers won their most recent three Super Bowls (XXIII, XXIV, XXIX) during Starkey's tenure with the team as he described plays for Pro Football Hall of Famers Joe Montana, Jerry Rice and Steve Young, among others.

PROMOS AND GIVEAWAYS

- Cal football fans have plenty of exciting reasons to be in attendance at California Memorial Stadium in 2022. The long list is highlighted by special giveaways including a Replica Axe for the first 10,000 fans through the gates for the 125th Big Game against Stanford.
- In addition, the Bears will celebrate the 40th anniversary of The Play at the 125th Big Game on Nov. 19 against Stanford as well "Joe Starkey Day" on Nov. 25 against UCLA when longtime radio broadcaster Joe Starkey, who will retire at the end of the season after 48 years calling Cal games, will be honored.
- Special ticket offers are available to youth sports organizations for the Nov. 25 regular-season finale against UCLA.
- The home schedule has also included traditional events such as the already played Homecoming (Arizona) and Cal Athletics Hall of Fame games (Washington), as well as the Cam Jordan Bobblehead game (Oregon).

PLUMMER HAS STARTED FIRST 10 GAMES IN FIRST SEASON AT CAL

- Jack Plummer transferred to Cal from Purdue in January of 2022 and has started each of Cal's first 10 games, completing 235-of-374 passes (62.8%) for 2521 yards with 16 touchdowns and six interceptions for a 129.8 rating
- Plummer ranks third in the Pac-12 and 16th nationally in completions per game (23.50) and has completed at least 20 passes in eight of 10 games including each of the last six
- Plummer completed 35-of-49 passes (71.9%) and threw for a Cal career-high 406 yards at USC, which was the second-highest total of his collegiate career behind only the 420 he threw for as a redshirt freshman at Purdue against Maryland on Nov. 12, 2019, with three touchdowns and one interception while compiling a 157.2 rating with Plummer's completions a career high, his completion percentage a Cal career high, and his touchdown passes equaling his career best at Cal for the fourth time
- Kai Millner threw the first two touchdown passes of his career when he relieved Plummer in the fourth quarter against Oregon and finished the contest 8-of-11 for 114 yards with the two touchdown passes and no interceptions for a 219.8 rating (all career highs)
- Millner is the only other quarterback besides Plummer of the six on the Cal roster to have taken a collegiate snap, getting in a total of three games all off the bench in 2022 (UC Davis, at Washington State, Oregon) and completing 9-of-15 passes for 120 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions for a 171.8 rating

JAYDN OTT RANKS AMONG PAC-12'S BEST AND TOP FRESHMAN IN NATION

- Jaydn Ott ranks among Pac-12 leaders in overall rushing yards (745, #5), total touchdowns (9, #5T), rushing yards per game (74.5, #6), all-purpose yards per game (104.22, #6), rushing touchdowns (7, #6T) and rush yards per carry (5.36, #9)
- Ott also leads all Pac-12 freshmen and ranks among the top freshmen in the country in all-purpose yards per game (#2), overall rushing yards (#4), total touchdowns (#5T), rushing yards per game (#6) and rushing touchdowns (#8T), while he is second in the Pac-12 and fourth nationally in rush yards per carry (#4)
- Ott rushed for 274 yards and three touchdowns on the ground against Arizona on Sept. 24 to earn Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week honors among others with the rushing yards the third-most in an FBS game this season, the most ever by a Pac-12 freshman and the third-most ever by a Cal player
- Ott posted the second multiple-rushing touchdown game of his career when he had two scores on the ground at USC as well as a career-high-tying seven receptions and a career-high 70 yards receiving
- Ott has picked up Pac-12 Freshman of the Week honors three times in 2022 against Arizona as well as in each of the first two games of his Cal career against UC Davis (17-104 rush; 2-26-1TD receiving) and UNLV (7-52-1TD rush; 3-16-1TD receiving)
- DeCarlos Brooks is Cal's second-leading rusher over the first 10 games with career highs of 56 rushes and 222 yards rushing as well as his first career touchdown, while Damien Moore is Cal's active career leader with 160 rushes and 813 yards rushing while adding six touchdowns on the ground in 24 games

- Former ILB Andy Alfieri and OLB Jeffrey Johnson switched to tight end in the spring of 2022 and have seen limited action at the position along with Nick Alftin who also briefly spent time as an outside linebacker in 2019 and blocked a pair of punts on special teams in 2021

YOUNG RECEIVERS CONTINUE TO IMPRESS

- The trio of J.Michael Sturdivant (55-615, 6 TD), Jeremiah Hunter (47-709, 3 TD) and Mavin Anderson (30-323, 3 TD) has combined for 132 receptions, 1647 yards receiving and 12 touchdown catches
- Sturdivant leads the nation's freshmen in receptions and receptions per game (5.5), while ranking among the nation's top rookies in touchdown receptions (#2T), receiving yards (#3) and receiving yards per game (61.5, #4)
- Sturdivant is also among Pac-12 overall leaders in receptions (#5), receptions per game (#6), receiving yards (#11) and receiving yards per game (#13)
- Sturdivant has at least one touchdown catch in five of his last seven games
- Sturdivant has twice had a career-high-tying eight receptions against Washington and at USC, while adding career highs of 104 yards receiving and two touchdowns against the Huskies including a 48-yard scoring catch that is the longest reception of his career
- Hunter is among Pac-12 leaders in receiving yards per game (78.8, #5), receiving yards (#7), receptions per game (#8, 5.2) and receptions (#8T)
- Hunter has had a pair of 100-plus yard receiving in games in 2022 with a career-high 109 at Washington State and 102 at USC with a career-high-tying six receptions in each as well as during the season-opener against UC Davis and his most recent contest at Oregon State
- Hunter has Cal's longest two receptions of the season that came in back-to-back games on a 57-yarder against Washington followed by a 58-yarder at USC, both on passes from Jack Plummer
- Monroe Young (19-205 2 TD) has career highs in all receiving numbers and the first two touchdown receptions of his career against Oregon and at USC
- Justin Richard Baker (1-55, 1 TD) picked up his first career touchdown reception against Oregon, while Mason Starling (7-70), Tommy Christakos (4-43) and Mason Mangum (1-31) also have receiving stats

OFFENSIVE LINE HAS SEEN NINE STARTERS. FIVE DIFFERENT STARTING LINEUPS

- Cal has had nine different players start at least one game on the offensive line in 2022 and five different groups of starters over the first 10 games
- Brian Driscoll is the only player to have started all 10 contests while no Bears have started all 10 games at the same position
- The first three contests were started by Ben Coleman (LT), Driscoll (LG), Matthew Cindric (C), Spencer Lovell (RG) and Brayden Rohme (RT)
- Cal made its first changes to the starting offensive line (LT Coleman, LG Cindric, C Driscoll, RG Sioape Vatikani, RT T.J. Session) prior to its fourth game of the campaign against Arizona with only Coleman staying in the same position and it paid dividends with the Golden Bears racking up seven offensive touchdowns, 49 points, 354 yards rushing and 599 yards of total offense against the Wildcats
- Coleman earned Pac-12 Offensive Lineman of the Week honors for his performance against Arizona when he played in all 70 offensive snaps, had the highest grade from the Cal coaches (93%) and three pancake blocks
- Cal started its third group on the offensive line (LT Rohme, LG Coleman, C Driscoll, RG Vatikani, RT Session) for back-to-back home games against Washington and Oregon before replacing Session at the starting right tackle spot at USC with Ender Aguilar, who made his first career start against the Trojans
- Everett Johnson made his first start of the season and second of his career against Arizona when he replaced an injured Coleman at left guard
- Cindric suffered a season-ending injury at Colorado prior to the third lineup
- Cindric is a semifinalist for both the prestigious Campbell Trophy and Wuerffel Trophy after being recognized for numerous 2022 preseason honors including All-Pac-12 third-team (Athlon), fourth-team (Phil Steele) and honorable mention (Pac-12 Media), while he was also on watch lists for the Rimington Trophy and Wuerffel Trophy
- In addition, Cindric is one of Cal's three team season captains and was one of two Cal representatives at Pac-12 Football Media Day
- Coleman was honored in the 2022 preseason as an All-Pac-12 third-team (Athlon, Phil Steele) and honorable mention (Pac-12 Media) pick
- Cal has 10 different players on its 2022 roster who have combined to make 96 career starts on the offensive line in Cindric (33), Coleman (20), Rohme (13), Driscoll (10), Vatikani (7), Session (5), Lovell (3), Aguilar (2), Johnson (2) and Bastian Swinney (1)
- Cal bolstered its 2022 group up front with the additions of transfers Lovell (Arizona State) and Session (Montana State)

NEW PLAYERS HAVE EMERGED ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

– The defensive line has battled through the loss of four players for the entire 2022 campaign due to season-ending injuries to DE Akili Calhoun, DL Brett Johnson and DE Derek Wilkins, as well as the absence of NG Stanley McKenzie, who is not with the Golden Bears in 2022

– Ethan Saunders, who is the only defensive lineman currently available to have started at least one game prior to 2022, is also the only Cal player to have started all 10 games on the defensive line in 2022 and leads all defensive linemen with 28 tackles, while adding 1.0 tackle for loss (-6 yards) and 0.5 sacks (-5 yards)

– A trio of Golden Bears (Nate Burrell, Ricky Correia, Darius Long Jr.) have made their first collegiate starts on the defensive line with Correia (six starts) and Burrell (five starts) each having played in all 10 games while Long Jr. has played in nine including his lone career start at Notre Dame

– Correia is second among Cal defensive linemen with 27 tackles while adding 0.5 tackles for loss (-3 yards), while Burrell has contributed 18 tackles, one fumble recovery and one quarterback hurry, and Long Jr. nine tackles, 1.0 tackle for loss (-4 yards) and one pass breakup

– Jaedon Roberts (13 tackles; 0.5 tackles for loss, -1 yard; 1 quarterback hurry) has also played in all 10 games all off the bench, while Calhoun (4 games, 3 tackles), Gunnar Rask (5 games, 2 tackles, 1 QBH) and Ieremia Ieremia (3 games) have also seen action

– Jackson Sirmon has started all 10 games and is the team's leader in tackles (86), second in tackles for loss (4.5, -15 yards) and third in sacks (2.5, -11 yards), while also contributing one interception that he returned one yard at Colorado, four pass breakups and one forced fumble

– Sirmon's 86 tackles third in the Pac-12 (#39T NCAA), while his per-game average of 8.6 is fourth (#44T NCAA)

– Sirmon has at least eight tackles in seven of 10 games including three in double figures with a career-high 15 stops at Notre Dame, 13 against Oregon and 11 vs. Washington

– Oluwafemi Oladejo is second on the team with a career-high 63 tackles including a career-high 13 in his most recent contest at Oregon State to mark his fourth double-digit tackle game of the season after previously collecting 12 at Notre Dame, 11 vs. Oregon and 10 against UNLV

– Oladejo has also contributed 3.0 tackles for loss (-10 yards), one interception that he returned 26 yards, one pass breakup, two quarterback hurries and one fumble recovery while playing in all 10 games with eight starts including six at inside linebacker (all career highs)

– Myles Jernigan moved from inside linebacker to outside linebacker following the 2021 season and has played in all 10 games including starts in each of the last nine, and contributed 41 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss (-17 yards), a team-high-tying 3.0 sacks (team-high-tying -16 yards), a team-high three quarterback hurries, one fumble recovery and one forced fumble

– Utah transfer Xavier Carlton has made an immediate impact in his first season at Cal having played in all 10 games with five starts and registering 25 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss (-19 yards), a team-high-tying 3.0 sacks (team-high-tying -16 yards), one pass breakup, one quarterback hurry and one fumble recovery

– Orin Patu has played in all 10 contests off the bench and contributed key plays against both Arizona (three-yard sack, tackle for loss and forced fumble) and Oregon (first career interception, five-yard tackle for loss) among his totals of six tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss (-8 yards), 1.0 sack (-3 yards), one interception, one quarterback hurry and one forced fumble

– Henry Ikahihifo has played in all 10 games off the bench and registered five tackles including a key 13-yard fourth-quarter sack and tackle for loss to help secure Cal's win over UNLV

– Braxten Croteau has played in 34 career games with 10 starts including seven games played and one start in 2022 (10 tackles; 1.5 tackles for loss, -7 yards)

– Sixth-year senior Daniel Scott, the only player who has been on Cal's roster for Justin Wilcox's entire tenure, has played in 47 career games with 26 starts including each of the last 23 contests and has career totals of 181 tackles, 6.0 tackles for loss (-40 yards), 1.0 sack (-27 yards), six interceptions that he has returned for 25 yards and one touchdown, six pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery

– Scott shares the team lead in 2022 with two interceptions that he has returned for 19 yards and is fourth on the squad with 59 tackles while adding 1.5 tackles for loss (-3 yards), three pass breakups and two quarterback hurries back-to-back on key fourth-quarter plays against UNLV

– Craig Woodson has started all 10 games and is third on the team with 61 tackles including double-digit outings in back-to-back games against Washington (10) and at USC (career-high 11), while adding 3.0 tackles for loss (-8 yards), a team-high-tying two interceptions that he has brought back 41 yards including one for a 39-yard touchdown against UC Davis, three pass breakups and a forced fumble

PRIMARY SPECIALISTS IN THIRD SEASON TOGETHER

– Cal has all three of its primary specialists together for the third consecutive season in 2022 with long snapper Slater Zellers (39), placekicker Dario Longhetto (32) and punter/holder Jamieson Sheahan (26) each playing in at least all 26 games possible since 2020 and a total of 97 career games at Cal

– Sheahan is second in the Pac-12 and 15th nationally with a 45.4 yards per punt average that is just 0.2 yards per punt below Bryan Anger's school-record 45.6 in 2010 with 17 of Sheahan's 54 punts for a total of 2452 yards having traveled 50 or more yards including a career-long 65-yarder against UC Davis, while he has forced opponents into 16 fair catches and pinned opponents inside their 20-yard line on 16 occasions

– Longhetto has made 9-of-15 field goals and 26 of 27 extra points in 2022 to rank second on the team in scoring with 53 points and is Cal's active career scoring leader (138, 24-35 FG, 66-68 PAT)

– Zellers has played in each of the past 39 Cal games over the last three-plus campaigns and is a member of the Patrick Mannely Long Snapper Award Preseason Watch List in 2022 for the first time in his career as well as the No. 1 draft-eligible long snapper for the 2023 NFL Draft according to Phil Steele

– Michael Luckhurst has played in each of Cal's first 10 games in his first season at Cal in 2022 and made his first goal try from 36 yards at Oregon State, while also kicking off 33 times for 2059 yards, registering a 62.4 average and 17 touchbacks

– Jeremiah Hunter has 13 punt returns for 133 yards while ranking fourth in the Pac-12 (#13T NCAA) with a 10.2 yards per punt return average

– Justin Richard Baker has added three punt returns for 37 yards and a 12.3 average including a 26-yarder at Colorado that is Cal's longest of the season

– Ashton Hayes has returned eight kickoffs for 152 yards and a 19.0 average (all team highs) including six for 115 yards the first time he returned kicks at USC, while Mavin Anderson has seven kickoff returns for 101 yards

Justin Wilcox is in his sixth season as the Travers Family Head Football Coach at Cal in 2022. Wilcox signed a contract extension through the 2027 campaign this past January.

"I appreciate the opportunity to be the head football coach at Cal and am excited about the future of our program," Wilcox said in the announcement of his extension. "I have thoroughly enjoyed every minute I have spent with the extraordinary young men who have been in our program. We are in a great position and strongly aligned with our university thanks to the leadership of Chancellor Carol Christ and our Director of Athletics Jim Knowlton. I thank both of them for their continued trust and confidence in me to lead a football program that will make the entire Cal community proud. We have very high expectations. I think we've earned the right to expect more, and that's exactly what we're going to do."

Wilcox has compiled a long list of accomplishments and signature wins in his first five-plus seasons as the head coach at Cal including landmark victories over Stanford and USC in the final month of the 2021 campaign. The victory over the Trojans in Cal's 2021 season finale was the Golden Bears' first home win over USC since 2003 but its' second in the last four seasons against the Trojans under Wilcox, who also led Cal to a road victory at USC in 2018. The back-to-back road wins in the Big Game at Stanford in 2019 and 2021 made Wilcox only the fifth Cal head coach to be victorious at least twice in a row on The Farm, and along with Jeff Tedford, one of only two in the last 70 years since Pappy Waldorf won three straight from 1947-51. Cal has won two of three games against the other California schools in the Pac-12 in each of the last two full football seasons not affected by COVID with the Bears adding a win over UCLA to their 2019 win at Stanford and a victory over USC to their 2021 victory at Stanford. Cal has a chance to extend the streak to three in 2022 with home games against Stanford and UCLA remaining on its schedule.

Cal's current 3-7 record in 2022 has come for an inexperienced team that started the season with 58 of the 113 players on the roster having never participated in a game for the Golden Bears including 35 in their first season overall at Cal. The Bears ranked 12th in the Pac-12 and 127th of 131 FBS schools on Phil Steele's experience chart heading into the campaign. A total of 33 Bears have played for the first time at Cal in 2022, while 23 have made their first start for the Blue and Gold.

Cal ranks among the nation's top teams in nearly every turnover statistical category in 2022, including a tied for second-place showing in the Pac-12 and tied for 12th-place national ranking with a +0.80 turnover margin. The Bears' eight turnovers lost are tied for the third-fewest in the Pac-12 and tied for 11th nationally, while their 16 turnovers gained are tied for third in the Pac-12 and tied for 42nd nationally. Cal has at least one takeaway in nine of the first 11 games of the 2022 campaign. The Bears have also taken care of the football with its single fumble lost tied for first both in the Pac-12 and nationally.

Wilcox's team came on strong in the second half of the 2021 season with four victories in its final six contests including arguably its most impressive performance of the season in a 41-11 Big Game win that marked Cal's largest margin of victory against Stanford since 2004. The 10 turnovers by the Bears' 2021 offense were the fewest ever by a Cal team playing a full schedule with the previous low 13 by Wilcox's 2019 squad. Cal lost only two fumbles to rank tied for second nationally and led the Pac-12 for fewest fumbles. The Bears were also second in the Pac-12 and 11th nationally in turnover margin (+10, 0.83), while their 10 total turnovers lost were second in the Pac-12 and tied for seventh nationally. Wilcox's defense shone in the second half of the 2021 season by holding four of its final six opponents to 14 points or less. The Bears finished the campaign second in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (22.2 ppg), fourth in total defense (366.7 ypg) and fourth in rushing defense (137.2 ypg).

Wilcox's 2020 squad was just getting on track when COVID ended the often-delayed season after four games with the Bears' final performance including a second-half shutout of eventual Pac-12 champion Oregon in an inspiring 21-17 home victory over the Ducks.

Wilcox began the 2019 season with four straight victories to move the Bears into the No. 15 spot in the AP Top 25 and No. 16 in the Coaches Poll. The victories included road wins at then-No. 14/12 Washington and Ole Miss, with the latter the first road triumph by a Pac-12 school at an SEC foe since 2010. The two signature victories helped the Bears to a 4-2 mark in true road games to give Cal back-to-back winning seasons on the road for the first time since 2004.

Wilcox guided the Bears to the Cheez-It Bowl and a 7-6 overall record in his second campaign in 2018 with the bowl appearance Cal's first in three seasons and first in a Pac-12 affiliated bowl since 2011. Cal reached a high point of 7-4 after winning four of five Pac-12 games during one stretch highlighted by signature victories over eventual Pac-12 champion and then-No. 15/13 Washington, as well as at USC. Cal also started the season with a 3-0 mark and in Week 5 made its first appearance since 2015 in the AP Top 25 at No. 24.

The highlights of Wilcox's first season as the head coach in Berkeley in 2017 included a 3-0 start and non-conference wins over Power 5 programs North Carolina and Ole Miss, as well as a 37-3 victory over then No. 8/9 Washington State in an ESPN nationally-televised Friday night home game. The victory against the Cougars snapped Cal's 17-game losing streak to top-10 teams, was the Bears' first victory against a top-10 team since 2003 and only its second top-10 win dating back to 1977. Cal added a Pac-12 victory over Oregon State and finished 5-7 overall.

Peter Sirmon (DC/ILB)

Sirmon is in his fifth season at Cal and his third campaign as the team's defensive coordinator in 2022, while he also continues to work with the inside linebackers for the fifth consecutive season.

Sirmon started at Cal in 2018 as the Golden Bears' inside linebackers coach before adding co-defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator duties to his role in 2019. He also served as the team's recruiting coordinator for three seasons from 2019-21. Sirmon's defense has a knack for taking the ball away and has at least one takeaway in 22 of the last 23 games. Through the first 10 games of 2022, his defense is tied third in the Pac-12 and tied for 42nd nationally with 16 turnovers gained. His 2021 defense finished the campaign second in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (22.2 ppg).

**Terrence Brown (DB)**

Brown is in his first season at Cal in 2022 and shares duties with Tre Watson coaching the Golden Bears' defensive backs. Brown was among a group of 30 coaches on 247Sports' 30Under30 list in both 2019 and 2020.

**Andrew Browning (DL)**

Browning is in his fourth season as the defensive line coach at Cal in 2022 and his fifth campaign with the program having also served in a quality control role on the defensive side of the ball in his first season with the Golden Bears in 2018.

**Geep Chryst (TE)**

Chryst is in his second season as the tight ends coach at Cal in 2022 after having spent the majority of the previous three decades coaching in the NFL most recently as the tight ends coach with Denver (2017-18).

**Vic So'oto (OLB)**

So'oto in his first season as the outside linebackers coach at Cal in 2022 after spending the previous two seasons in 2020 and 2021 on the USC coaching staff following a prior four-year stint at Virginia (2016-19).

**Aristotle Thompson (RB)**

Thompson is in his third season as the running backs coach at Cal in 2022 after spending the previous 11 campaigns in the same role at Cal Poly. Cal's run game has shown moments of brilliance under the guidance of Thompson highlighted by 354 yards rushing in a 49-31 win against Arizona this season including 274 from freshman running back Jaydn Ott that were the third-most in school history and the most ever by a Pac-12 Freshman. Ott currently ranks among Pac-12 leaders in overall rushing yards (745, #5), total touchdowns (9, #5T), rushing yards per game (74.5, #6), rushing touchdowns (7, #6T), rush yards per carry (5.53, #9) and all-purpose yards per game (96.40, #9).

**Burl Toler III (WR/RC)**

Toler III is in his eighth season on the coaching or football staff at his alma mater Cal in 2022, as well as his fifth as a full-time assistant coach and fourth working with the wide receivers. He is also in his first campaign as the team's recruiting coordinator in 2022. Toler is working with a talented wide receiver group in 2022 led by the trio of J. Michael Sturdivant, Jeremiah Hunter and Mavin Anderson. Sturdivant leads the nation's freshmen in leads the nation's freshmen in receptions (51), while he is among leaders in receptions per game (5.7, #2), touchdown receptions (6, #2T), receiving yards (570, #4) and receiving yards per game (63.3, #4).

**Tre Watson (DB)**

Tre Watson is in his second season as a defensive backs coach at Cal in 2022 and shares the duties with first-year defensive backs coach Terrence Brown. In 2020, Watson was among a group of 30 coaches listed in 247Sports' "30Under30".

**Brian Johnson (AP)**

Johnson is in his second season at Cal in 2022 after spending the previous 11 campaigns on staffs at FBS schools and in the NFL. Johnson has coached 76 players that have been selected in the NFL Draft including 11 first rounders.

GAME 1: CAL PUTS AWAY UC DAVIS FOR SEASON-OPENING WIN

BERKELEY – AJack Plummer threw three touchdown passes in his debut for California and Craig Woodson returned an interception for a score to lead California to a 34-13 victory over UC Davis on Saturday.

The Golden Bears (1-0) shook off a rough start on offense with minus-1 yard in the first quarter to improve to 11-0 all-time against the Aggies (0-1).

"Getting out there on the field the first time, I'm sure there was a little bit of nerves going on," Cal coach Justin Wilcox said. "A good thing was, as we talked about on the sideline after the first quarter was over, it was like , 'Guys, it probably couldn't have gone too much worse. ... We got that out of us and then settled down and moved the ball down the field."

Plummer threw TD passes of 3 yards to Jeremiah Hunter and 8 yards Jaydn Ott in the second quarter, and a 14-yarder to Mavin Anderson in the fourth quarter of his first appearance since transferring from Purdue.

Plummer finished 23 for 35 for 268 yards.

"I think we just got into a little bit of rhythm, did a little tempo," Plummer said. "I think once we started to kind of see ourselves move that kind of gave us a little confidence and got them on their heels a little bit."

Woodson helped take control of the game when he intercepted Miles Hastings on the opening drive of the second half and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown that made it 24-7.

Hastings threw a 4-yard touchdown pass to Chaz Davis in the first quarter Ulonzo Gilliam Jr. scored on a 60-yard run in the third quarter for the Aggies.

Hastings finished 32 for 50 for 242 yards with two interceptions.

"It's not about being perfect, it's about being excellent," coach Dan Hawkins said. "But we played hard. Guys battled. Thought we had a good camp. But it's a tough road so we got to learn from it, flush it and move on."

GAME 2: LATE STAND LEADS BEARS PAST UNLV

BERKELEY – Jaydn Ott scored two touchdowns, one on the ground and one through the air, and California's defense stiffened late to lead the Bears to a 20-14 victory over UNLV on Saturday.

Cal (2-0) made three fourth-down stops in the second half, including a fourth and goal opportunity for the Rebels from the Cal 8 with 2:46 remaining that preserved Cal's six-point lead.

UNLV got the ball back one more time with 1:03 remaining, but Isaiah Young intercepted UNLV quarterback Doug Brumfield deep in Cal territory on the game's final play. That clinched the Bears' first 2-0 start since 2019 as they turn their attention to next week's game at Notre Dame, the marquee opponent on Cal's schedule.

"I think it's huge for us, giving us a little bit of confidence and momentum going into a tough game," Cal safety Daniel Scott said. "We've got to keep building. At the end of the day, we're 2-0 and that's the best part about it."

Jack Plummer threw for 278 yards and a touchdown as the Golden Bears got off to a fast start on offense. But after taking a 20-7 lead on a Dario Longhetto field goal midway through the third quarter, Cal's offense stalled and UNLV (1-1) grabbed momentum.

Aidan Robbins rushed for 84 yards for UNLV, including a 31-yard score in the third that brought the Rebels to within 20-14.

Three times Cal drove to UNLV's 10-yard line or deeper and didn't get touchdowns. The Bears settled for two field goals and Plummer was intercepted on the third drive.

"The goal, No. 1 , is to win the game, and it carries more weight than any other goal," California coach Justin Wilcox said. "We also recognize where we need to be better."

After being held to minus-1 yard of offense in the first quarter last week against UC Davis, the Bears led 14-0 after the first on Saturday. Plummer completed his first eight passes and found open receivers against a UNLV secondary that also was called for pass interference three times in the game.

Ott scored on a 2-yard run and added a 12-yard touchdown catch later in the first, taking a short pass in the flat and making a leaping dive into the end zone on fourth-and-2 to give Cal a 14-0 lead.

Kyle Williams got UNLV on the board with an 11-yard touchdown catch on the first play of the second quarter, but Dario Longhetto's 20-yard field goal gave Cal a 17-7 lead at halftime.

GAME 3: BEARS FALL SHORT TO NOTRE DAME IN SOUTH BEND

SOUTH BEND, Ind. – Drew Pyne passed for two touchdowns and 150 yards in his first career start and Notre Dame overcame numerous mistakes to beat California 24-17 Saturday to give Irish coach Marcus Freeman his first victory.

The Irish (1-2) outscored Cal (2-1) 10-0 in the fourth quarter to avoid becoming just the third Notre Dame squad to start a season 0-3. The Irish (1-2), who started the season ranked No. 5, had blown leads three times, made sure there was no second-half letdown this time.

It wasn't over until the last play as officials overturned two plays that appeared to be game-clinching turnovers for the Irish, giving the Bears a last-second shot. On fourth-and-13 from the Notre Dame 35, Cal's Jack Plummer threw the ball into the end zone. The ball bounced off several players and Bears receiver Jeremiah Hunter nearly pulled it in, but the ball landed on the grass.

It was a familiar feeling for the Bears, who had five losses by seven points or less last season.

The Irish opened a 24-17 lead with 9:16 remaining on a 6-yard pass from Pyne to Michael Mayer, just Mayer's second catch of the day. The touchdown was set up when Pyne threw a short pass to tailback Audric Esitime, and he sprinted for a 36-yard gain before tripping at the 6-yard line.

The Bears drove to the Notre Dame 22 midway through the fourth quarter but couldn't get any closer. Plummer threw three straight incompletions, then was sacked by Isaiah Foskey for a 10-yard loss with 6:30 left.

Cal got the ball again on their own 7-yard line, but on third-and-10 Jack Plummer was sacked for a 5-yard loss. It looked as though Notre Dame had put the game away when cornerback Clarence Lewis picked off a pass from Plummer, but the Bears got one more chance when J.D. Bertrand was called for targeting.

Pyne, playing because Tyler Buchner sustained a season-ending shoulder injury last week, was 17-of-23 passing. In addition to the scoring pass to Mayer, Pyne threw a 21-yard TD pass to Tyree. Tyree, who had only 12 touches through the first two games, rushed for 64 yards on 17 carries and had five catches for 44 yards. Estime added a 1-yard run and 76 yards rushing on 18 carries

Plummer was 16 of 37 for 184 yards passing, including an 18-yard TD pass to J. Michael Sturdivant. Jaydn Ott was held to 33 yards on 13 carries.

GAME 4: OTT LEADS CAL TO 49-31 WIN OVER ARIZONA

BERKELEY – Jaydn Ott ran for 274 yards and three touchdowns and the Cal football team opened Pac-12 play with a 49-31 victory over Arizona on Saturday at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium.

Ott scored on a 73-yard run on the second play from scrimmage, an improbable 18-yarder in the third quarter after he had appeared to be stopped for a short gain, and then another 72-yarder to ice it late in the fourth.

"Every time I touch the ball, I feel like I'm going to score," Ott said. "That's my mentality."

It was the most rushing yards in a single game by an FBS player this season and the third-most in Cal history, trailing only Jahvid Best's 311 against Washington in 2008 and Jerry Drew's 283 against Oregon State in 1954.

"That's explosive," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "We've been talking about it for a long time. You've seen it in flashes. We saw it a bunch today. He's a dynamic guy and has the ability to take it to the house from a lot of spots."

Jack Plummer added three touchdown passes for the Golden Bears (3-1, 1-0), who won their sixth straight home game. It's their longest winning streak at Memorial Stadium since a nine-gamer in 2008-09.

Cal also ended a six-game skid against Arizona (2-2, 0-1) by beating the Wildcats for the first time since 2009.

A year after Arizona beat COVID-depleted Cal 10-3 at home for its only win in 2021, the teams exceeded that point total after both teams scored touchdowns on the opening drive.

It was a back-and-forth, high-scoring affair in the first half with Ott scoring on a 73-yard run on the second play from scrimmage to set the tone.

The Wildcats scored on four of their first five drives of the game, getting two short TD runs by Jonah Coleman and Michael Wiley and a 24-yard TD pass from de Laura to Tetairoa McMillan.

Plummer threw a 16-yard TD pass to J. Michael Sturdivant in the second quarter and gave Cal the lead early in the third when he found Keleki Latu from 3 yards out on fourth-and-1.

Ott added his second TD midway through the third quarter. He ran into a group of defenders at the 13 yet managed to keep his feet and snuck out of the scrum to run it into the end zone to make it 35-24.

Ott added his second breakaway run late in the fourth quarter.

PULLMAN, Wash. – Wide receiver Jeremiah Hunter had six receptions for a career-high 109 yards but the Cal football team fell to Washington State 28-9 on Saturday afternoon.

J.Michael Sturdivant also had a career-high in receiving yards with 71 and quarterback Jack Plummer completed 23 of 33 passes for 273 yards for the Bears (3-2, 1-1 Pac-12).

After a scoreless first quarter, Washington State scored a touchdown early in the second before Cal answered with a 42-yard field goal by Dario Longhetto. The Cougars extended their lead to 14-3 early in the third quarter but the Bears came right back again, stringing together a 90-yard touchdown drive that culminated on Jaydn Ott's 2-yard run. Cal's two-point conversion failed and it was 14-9 early in the fourth period.

Washington State added two fourth-quarter touchdowns to pull away.

The Bears' defense held the Cougars to just 103 yards of offense in the first half. It marked the fourth time in five games this season Cal has held its opponent to just seven first-half points.

Ott, who ran for 274 yards and three touchdowns last week against Arizona, had 69 yards on the ground against the Cougars but set career-highs with seven catches for 41 yards.

Cal's defense also had its 18th straight game with at least one takeaway, which is tied for the longest active streak in FBS. Safeties Craig Woodson and Daniel Scott each had interceptions for the Bears.

The Bears have a bye next week before resuming their schedule on Oct. 15 at Colorado.

GAME 6: BEARS FALL IN OVERTIME AT COLORADO

BOULDER, Colo. - J.T. Shrout threw a 22-yard touchdown pass to Montana Lemonious-Craig in overtime, powering Colorado to a 20-13 upset of California in interim coach Mike Sanford's debut Saturday.

Jack Plummer had Mason Starling wide open for the score on first-and-goal from the 10 on Cal's ensuing possession but strong safety Trevor Woods arrived just after the pass and poped the ball loose.

When Plummer's fourth-down pass fell incomplete, the students stormed the field to celebrate Colorado's first win of the season.

Sanford inherited a team that was off to just the fourth 0-5 start in school history, one that cost Karl Dorrell his job. Sanford placed an immediate emphasis on physicality and takeaways, which paid off on Colorado's first defensive series with Tyrin Tyler's sliding interception, the Bears' first turnover in four games.

Dario Longhetto, who was wide left on field-goal tries going both ways, missing from 54 yards in the first quarter and 48 in the second, was good from 34 yards as time expired in the fourth quarter to send the game to overtime. Cal (3-3, 1-2 Pac-12) won the toss and chose to start out on defense.

The Buffs (1-5, 1-2) were setting up for Cole Becker's 40-yard field goal in the extra period when a prolonged review showed that Lemonious-Craig's right cleat was down just before he was shoved out of bounds by nickel back Collin Gamble.

Instead, Becker lined up for the extra point and gave Colorado its biggest lead at 17-10.

The only scoring in the first half came on Becker's 31-yard field goal with four minutes left in the second quarter following a penalty that wiped out Jordan Tyson's 11-yard touchdown catch from Owen McCown.

Shrout replaced McCown on Colorado's fourth possession after halftime and drove the Buffaloes to their first touchdown, a 1-yard run by Anthony Hankerson with 14:25 remaining that gave CU a 10-7 lead.

The big play on the drive was Jordan Tyson's 37-yard heave to Lemonious-Craig on a trick play.

J.Michael Sturdivant's diving 14-yard touchdown catch from Plummer had put the Bears up 7-3 with 5:49 left in the third quarter.

Colorado's defense limited the Bears to 103 yards of offense in the first half after allowing Arizona to pile up 400 yards by halftime in their last game.

Lemonious-Craig finished with eight catches for a game-high 119 yards.

BERKELEY – The Cal football team held Washington's high-powered offense well below its offensive averages but ultimately fell to the Huskies 28-21 on Saturday evening at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium.

The Huskies entered the game ranked fifth in the country in scoring average (42.1 points per game) and ninth in total offense (528 yards per game). Washington totaled 476 yards against the Bears.

Cal quarterback Jack Plummer threw three touchdown passes in the second half for the Golden Bears (3-4, 1-3 Pac-12), including two to J.Michael Sturdivant. The Bears got within 28-21 with an 8-yard strike to Mavin Anderson on 4th down with 6:11 to play.

GAME 9: BEARS' COMEBACK BID FALLS JUST SHORT AGAINST NO. 9 USC

LOS ANGELES – Jack Plummer became the first Cal quarterback in six years to throw for over 400 yards in a game but the Cal football team's comeback effort fell just short in a 41-35 loss to No. 9 USC on Saturday night at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum.

Plummer completed 35 of 49 passes for 406 yards, including touchdown throws to Monroe Young, Mavin Anderson and Jeremiah Hunter. Cal put together a stirring comeback bid in the second half, and when freshman running back Jaydn Ott rushed for his second touchdown of the game with 2:31 to play - followed by a successful 2-point conversion - it trimmed USC's lead to 41-35. But USC's was able to barely stay in front and close out the game.

The Trojans built a 27-7 lead early in the third quarter, but Cal's offense got rolling, beginning with Young's 2-yard scoring catch. It was the second straight game in which Young has caught a touchdown pass - the first two touchdowns of his career.

Cal cut it to 34-21 with 12:56 left on Anderson's 47-yard TD catch and then recovered an onside kick. The Bears took advantage on a 3-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to Hunter to make it 34-27 with nine minutes remaining.

The teams exchanged touchdowns, with Ott's final score cutting the deficit once again back down to six points. But this time the Trojans recovered the Bears' onside kick and were able to notch a first down and run out the clock.

Plummer's passing explosion was Cal's most prolific aerial performance since Davis Webb threw for 425 yards at Washington State on Nov. 16, 2016.

Young finished the game with career-highs of five catches and 66 yards.

GAME 10: BEARS FALL TO OREGON STATE

CORVALLIS, Ore. – Freshman cornerback Jeremiah Earby scooped up a fumble and returned it 33 yards for a touchdown, but that was the only time the Cal football team found the end zone Saturday in a 38-10 setback against Oregon State.

Earby's TD with 2:33 remaining in the second quarter cut the Beavers' lead to 21-7 and gave the Bears a dose of momentum heading into halftime. But Oregon St. scored 10 unanswered points in the third quarter to put the game away.

Freshman kicker Michael Luckhurst attempted his first career field goal and converted from 36 yards away.

A week after scoring 35 points in a loss at USC, Cal (3-7, 1-6 Pac-12) was limited to 156 total yards and didn't score an offensive touchdown.

With the loss, the Bears were eliminated from bowl contention.

Sophomore Oluwafemi Oladejo led Cal's defensive effort with a career-high 13 tackles.

Saturday marked the Bears' final road game of the season. Cal has two games remaining, beginning with the 125th Big Game against Stanford next Saturday at 2:30 p.m. The game will air on the Pac-12 Network.

California Memorial Stadium is located along Piedmont Avenue between Bancroft Way and Stadium Rim Way on the University of California campus in Berkeley. For GPS purposes, use 2227 Piedmont Avenue in Berkeley for the address. Public transportation is highly recommended when visiting and there are multiple options. Visit bart.gov, acransit.org and 511.org for more information.

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

All credentials for 2022 Cal football home games must be requested online through sportssystems.com/CalFootball. Only media who cover the Golden Bears on a regular basis will be considered for season credentials. Note that it is not always possible to accommodate all requests, and no one under 18 years of age will be issued a credential without prior approval. All single-game requests should be made as far in advance as possible to help ensure space availability both in the press box and on the field. Credentials requested within seven days of a game, as well as all field photo passes, will be held for pick up at Media Will Call. Any questions about Cal football credentials can be directed to Kyle McRae.

INTERNET ACCESS

Both wireless and wired ethernet connections are available in the press box and field-level photographer work room. Wireless service is available through the Cal Visitor wireless network (no password required).

MEDIA GROUP TEXT AND EMAIL LISTS

Contact Kyle McRae to be placed on the Cal football media group text and email lists to receive relevant and updated Cal football information.

MEDIA PARKING (GAMEDAY)

The Underhill Garage located near the corner of Channing Way and College Avenue serves as the football gameday media parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about four blocks from California Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to Media Will Call near Gate 5 or use a media shuttle that begins three hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available postgame from the corner of Bancroft Way and Warring Street (south end of Warring Alley near Gate 5) to the Underhill Garage. Parking passes must be requested in advance through sportssystems.com/CalFootball and can be emailed directly. They are not available for pick up on gamedays. Television broadcast crews should order parking passes in advance by sending the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the University of California website (pt.berkeley.edu). Request the Underhill Garage for football gamedays and the Witter Lot (just east of California Memorial Stadium) for set days.

MEDIA PARKING (NON-GAMEDAY)

For media covering Cal football on non-gamedays, see the parking/public transportation options listed below. Parking in the vicinity is limited and available on a first-come, first-served basis. Please be sure to read all signs at each parking location for further information.

Stadium Parking Garage – Paid parking near the corner of Gayley Road (where Piedmont Avenue becomes Gayley Road) and Stadium Rim Way just north of the stadium

Street Parking – Paid and two-hour free parking may be available on streets near the stadium

Witter Lot – Paid parking near the corner of Centennial Drive and Stadium Rim Way just east of the stadium

Underhill Garage – Paid parking on corner of Channing Way and College Avenue

Public Transportation – Public transportation (BART, AC Transit) is detailed earlier in this section.

MEDIA WILL CALL

Media Will Call is located adjacent to Gate 5 at California Memorial Stadium. It opens four hours before kickoff and remains open through the end of the first quarter. Identification is required to pick up credentials or tickets. Media who arrive after the end of the first quarter should contact Kyle McRae or Keeler McJunkin.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Field photographers/videographers must wear a photo vest at all times, in addition to a photo credential. Photo credentials are not distributed in advance and must be picked up on the day of the game at Media Will Call. Photo vests are also distributed at Media Will Call and should be returned following use to the receptacle on the field behind the visitor (west) bench and near the entrance to the photographers work room in front of Section EE.

NCAA rules limit photographers/videographers to shooting outside the restraining line surrounding the playing field and restrict photographers from entering the team areas inside the 20-yard lines.

In addition, photographers and videographers are welcome to use the photo deck located on level six of the Peter E. Haas Press Box and work from the main press area on level seven.

PHOTOGRAPHERS WORK ROOM

A photographers work room is available on the field level at California Memorial Stadium (entrance on west side at approximately the 20-yard line on the north end of the field). Power and ethernet access are available, as well as limited desk space on a first-come, first-served basis. Additional photographer work stations are available on level seven of the press box. Pregame meals and drinks for photographers and videographers are available on the south end of level seven in the press box.

PHOTOS

Requests for photos can be made through the Athletic Communications Office. Photos of all 30 teams can also be purchased through Cal's official photographer by visiting klcfotos.com/calbears.

PLAYER/COACH/STAFF INTERVIEWS

All football player, coach and staff interviews must be coordinated through Kyle McRae.

PRACTICE MEDIA COVERAGE

Cal is scheduled to practice at California Memorial Stadium throughout the 2022 season. Kyle McRae will distribute specific practice and media availability schedules as well as policies regarding non-gameday coverage of the team. Weekly updates are normally distributed each Monday throughout the season.

PRESS BOX

The media level of the Peter E. Haas Press Box at California Memorial Stadium is on the seventh floor. The photo deck is on level six.

TELEPHONE/VISITING RADIO PHONE LINES

ISDN and dial lines, as well as dry pairs to the visiting team locker room and visiting team interview room, are available for complimentary use for the official visiting team radio network. All other telephone lines, both in the press box and inside the television compound, must be requested at least one week in advance through Kyle McRae.

BIG GAME HISTORY

THE STANFORD AXE

The Stanford Axe, the trophy awarded to the winner of the Big Game every year, actually made its debut on the eve of a baseball game between the rival universities on April 13, 1899. On that afternoon at a pre-game rally, a group of Stanford students introduced the instrument to decapitate a straw man adorned in California blue and gold, much to the delight of the Indian faithful who chanted "Give 'em the axe" while the proceedings continued.

The next day, Stanford rooters taunted their Cal counterparts by cutting pieces of blue and gold ribbon with The Axe and using it to chop at a designated piece of wood whenever the Indians made a good play.

Cal rallied for an upset over Stanford and the Golden Bears' fans were so overcome with emotion that a group of Cal men wrestled The Axe away from the Stanford students and smuggled it across the bay via ferry. The Axe was placed in a safe at a Berkeley bank, to be removed once a year for the Axe Rally.

By 1933, both sides decided that The Axe would make an ideal Big Game trophy. It was mounted on a plaque that lists the scores of each game since 1933.



BIG GAME HISTORY

The 2022 Big Game will be the 125th and The Play – a 1982 five-lateral kickoff return for a touchdown that is arguably the most iconic moment in college football history – will celebrate its 40th anniversary. The rivalry between the Bay Area's Pac-12 schools dates back to 1892 and is the sixth-longest active running series between two Football Bowl Subdivision teams. The series is also the sixth-longest series overall between two FBS squads and the second-longest in the West. Stanford leads the all-time series, 65-48-11.

The status of the rivalry as one of the nation's truly great sporting spectacles was established in the very first game, when Stanford upset Cal, 14-10, on March 19, 1892, in a contest played on a field at the corner of Haight and Stanyan streets in San Francisco. Stanford manager Herbert C. Hoover, later to become the 31st president of the United States, and his Cal counterpart counted the gate receipts and reported a then-staggering sum of \$30,000.

The game continued to grow in popularity with capacity crowds becoming the norm. In 1923, the Golden Bears opened California Memorial Stadium with a 9-0 win over Stanford to cap an undefeated season. Stanford and Cal had also previously opened Stanford Stadium in 1921 with the Bears winning, 42-7, en route to the Rose Bowl.

Cal achieved great success in the series under Pappy Waldorf, who retired with a 7-1-2 record against Stanford from 1947-56. The 1949 game was highlighted by Jim Monachino's 84-yard run – still the longest rush and tied for the longest play ever by a Cal player in Big Game history.

The series has been a remarkably close rivalry, with the Big Game having been determined by a touchdown or less 54 times.

Five Big Games have been won on the final play, starting with the 1972 meeting in Berkeley. Cal faced fourth down from the Stanford seven-yard line with three seconds to go. But Vince Ferragamo completed a touchdown pass to a diving Steve Sweeney, giving the Bears a 24-21 win.

Two years later, Stanford's Mike Langford booted a 50-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Cardinal to a 22-20 decision over the Bears.

In 1982, Cal won on the five-lateral, 57-yard kickoff return that will forever be remembered simply as The Play. Trailing 20-19, the Bears received Stanford's kickoff with just four seconds remaining and proceeded to travel the length of the field, marching through the Stanford Band to produce an improbable 25-20 victory.

The Cardinal prevailed in 1990 by scoring nine points in the final 12 seconds. John Hopkins connected on a 37-yard field goal as time ran out for a 27-25 win.

For the 100th Big Game, the teams donned uniforms representative of the ones they wore more than a half-century earlier. On the night prior to the contest on Nov. 21, 1997, a gala event dubbed the "Big Auction" raised more than \$1 million in scholarship funds for each school.

In 2000, Cal and Stanford played the first overtime game in the history of the series, with the Cardinal emerging 36-30 winners when Randy Fasani found Casey Moore for a 25-yard score in the extra period. The Bears won in 2019 and 2021, breaking a nine-game losing streak to the Cardinal in the first victory. Chase Garbers was the winning quarterback in both contests, scoring the game-winning touchdown with a 16-yard run with 1:19 remaining in the game in 2019 before leading the Golden Bears to a 41-11 blowout win keyed by an 84-yard touchdown connection with Trevon Clark two years later.
