THE OPENING TIP

Portland State plays its second and final Pac-12 opponent this Wednesday on the road when the Vikings travel to face Stanford in Palo Alto.

The Vikings (3-2) will be looking for their best all-around performance of the season in order to get a win over a quality opponent. Inconsistency on offense has, at times, held them back. Poor shooting was costly in a close loss to UC Santa Barbara last Friday. That was followed by a much better offensive performance in a win over Northwest Nazarene on Saturday.

PSU goes into the game averaging over 82 points per contest, but would like to improve their shooting line of .421/.259/.630. The Vikings face a Stanford team (3-3) that has played a rugged schedule including North Carolina, Wisconsin and Florida.

No doubt the Cardinal will be looking for revenge after an 87-78 loss last season to the Vikings at the PK80 Invitational. PSU came back from an 11-point second-half deficit. The Vikings forced 28 Stanford turnovers to spark the comeback win.

Portland State is now 1-2 in games away from home (0-1 in true road games). The Cardinal will be playing just their second home game (1-0).

COMING UP

Following the game at Stanford, Portland State will play four of its final five non-conference games at home. PSU hosts Portland Bible on Saturday at 7:05 p.m. On Dec. 5, the Vikings battle the University of Portland in a big cross-town rivalry game. It will be the first time the Pilots have played at PSU since 2015, although the Vikings have won the last two seasons at UP.

INTERVIEW POLICY

COACH PEERY: Coach Peery is available in his office each morning from 9-10 a.m. To schedule an interview, contact Mike Lund in the office of Media Relations.

PLAYERS: Media may interview players following practice. Practice will begin on time and then players will not be available until it concludes. Players are also not available on game day until following the game.

PRACTICES: Practice times most days are 11 a.m.-1 p.m. However, contact Mike Lund in the PSU Media Relations Office for confirmation. Interviews can also be coordinated through the Media Relations Office.

TICKETS

Season tickets begin at \$150 for general admission, \$250 for reserved seats. Tickets for all home games can be purchased at GoViks.com/tickets. Prices are \$14 for general admission and \$19 for reserved seats. Fans can also call the box office to purchase tickets at 1-888-VIK-TIKS (845-8457).

DIRECTIONS TO CAMPUS

The PSU campus is located in downtown Portland. It is bordered on the north by SW Market, on the east by SW 1st, on the south by I-405, and on the west by SW 13th.

• **TO PORTLAND STATE FROM THE AIRPORT:** Exit the Airport on Airport Way, heading east. Take I-205 South for approximately 3 miles. Exit on I-84 West and follow for approximately six miles. Move into the left lane of I-84 westbound as you approach the I-5 interchange. Take I-5 southbound and move into the left lane as you cross the Marquam Bridge. Merge with I-405, moving into the right lane. The 4th, 6th and 13th Avenue exits all lead onto the Portland State campus.

• **DIRECTIONS TO THE VIKING PAVILION:** The Portland State Vikings practice at the Peter W. Stott Center located at SW 10th and Hall on the PSU campus. To get to the Stott Center/Viking Pavilion, follow the directions to the PSU campus. On-street parking is available after exiting on 6th Avenue. A parking garage is also located on 6th Avenue between Hall and Harrison Streets. Walk three blocks west through the Park Blocks.

HEAD COACH BARRET PEERY

Barret Peery was named Portland State's Men's Basketball Coach on April 10, 2017. He quickly put his stamp on the Viking program, leading the team to 20 wins, national recognition and a post-season bid in the CIT in his first year.



Peery came to Portland State after two decades of collegiate coaching to lead the Viking program into a future that includes the opening of a brand new playing facility in 2018. One of those previous seasons was as a Viking basketball assistant coach (2002-03).

In addition to Portland State, Peery has been an assistant coach at high-profile programs like Utah and Arizona State, at a Big Sky school; his alma mater Southern Utah, and comes from Santa Clara where he was the Associate Head Coach. He has worked with Head Coaches Bill Evans (Southern Utah), Jim Boylen (Utah) and Herb Sendek (Arizona State, Santa Clara) at the Division I level, as well as Heath Schroyer at Portland State.

Peery had two head coaching stints to great acclaim at the junior college level. He compiled a career record of 178-30 in six seasons at College of Southern Idaho (2002-05, 85-19) and Indian Hills (IA) Community College (2011-14, 93-11). In 2014, Indiana Hills was the NJCAA runner-up, going 34-3 and winning regional and district titles.

Peery's teams routinely were among the top scoring in the nation. His 2012-13 squad averaged 97.9 points per game. In three seasons at Indian Hills, his teams went 60-1 at home and reached the number one ranking in the nation.

At CSI, Peery led his team to two national tournaments in three seasons and twice led the nation in scoring. The Golden Eagles placed fourth in the nation in 2006-07. Peery was the Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2007-08 after leading his team to a third straight SWAC title. CSI was ranked number one in the nation for the last four weeks of the regular season.

GAME NOTES: PORTLAND STATE vs. STANFORD

- **ALL-TIME SERIES:** Stanford leads the all-time series, 2-1. The two wins came in Palo Alto in 2001 and 2009. The Viking win came last year at the PK80 Invitational at Memorial Coliseum in Portland, 87-78.
- **LAST YEAR: NOV. 26, 2017, PORTLAND STATE 87, STANFORD 78:** The Vikings overcame a nine-point halftime deficit, and 11-point second-half deficit, to pull away for the win. Though the Cardinal out-shot and out-rebounded the Vikings, PSU made 18 steals, forcing 28 turnovers. Deontae North scored 22 points, Bryce Canda had 17, and Holland Woods came off the bench to score 13. Reid Travis scored 28 points with 14 rebounds for Stanford.
- **PORTLAND STATE vs. THE PAC-12 CONFERENCE:** Portland State is 7-53 all-time against current members of the Pac-12 Conference. Barret Peery is 2-2 as Viking Head Coach, with an 87-78 win over Stanford in the PK80 Invitational, a 106-81 win at Cal, and a 95-84 loss at Oregon last year. Then, an 84-57 loss at Oregon this year... PSU has wins over Oregon (2), Arizona State (2), USC (1), Stanford (1) and Cal (1) - all coming within the past 20 seasons.
- **COACHES:** Vikings Coach Barret Peery (Southern Utah, 1996) is in his second season on the Park Blocks and has a 23-16 career record. Peery is 1-0 against Stanford and 2-2 against Pac-12 schools... Peery's only other head coaching experience is at the junior college level where he was 178-30 in six seasons (2005-08, College of Southern Idaho; 2011-14, Indian Hills (IA) CC)... the Cardinal are coached by Jerod Haase (Kansas, 1997), who is in third second season. Haase is 36-36 at Stanford and 116-89 in seven seasons as a collegiate head coach. He is 0-1 against Portland State.

STANFORD CARDINAL

- Stanford is a member of the Pac-12 Conference, located in Palo Alto, CA.
- The Cardinal were 19-16 last season, reaching the second round of the NIT. Stanford was 11-7 in the Pac-12, placing third.
- Stanford has started the season 3-3, including 1-0 at home. The roster includes 11 freshmen and sophomores among 15 players.
- Sophomore forward KZ Okpala is the team leader with 17.7 points and 6.2 rebounds per game. Freshman guard Cormac Ryan averages 11.2 points, 4.2 rebounds and has a team-leading 14 three-point field goals.
- The Cardinal are averaging 67.0 points on .405 shooting from the field. They shoot .325 from three-point range and .706 at the free throw line.

SUSTAINABLE AND RECYCLABLE VIKING QUICK NOTES WINNING LINES

- Portland State is 3-2 on the season, 2-0 at home, 0-1 on the road, 1-1 at neutral sites.
- PSU was 20-14 in 2017-18, 8-5 at home, 10-6 on the road, 2-3 at neutral sites.
- In Big Sky Conference games, PSU was 9-9 (4-5 at home, 5-4 on the road).
- PSU was 9-6 in games decided by five points or less or overtime.
- The Vikings were 2-1 in overtime.

Home Court(s)

- Portland State opens the Viking Pavilion at the Peter W. Stott Center in 2018-19. The Stoller Family Court will be PSU's fifth (and hopefully final) home court since joining the Big Sky Conference in 1996-97. The main home court was the old Peter W. Stott Center. However, the Vikings also used the Rose Garden (now Moda Center) and Memorial Coliseum occasionally over the years. In 2017-18, PSU used Lewis & Clark College's Pamplin Sports Center as a home court while the Viking Pavilion was being completed. Here is the breakdown:
 - Viking Pavilion - 2 games, 2-0
 - Peter W. Stott Center - 233 games, 168-65
 - Rose Garden (Moda Center) - 28 games, 19-9
 - Memorial Coliseum - 19 games, 13-6
 - Lewis and Clark - 12 games, 7-5
 - 23rd season - 294 games, 209-85 at home overall
- Since the start of the 2006-07 season, PSU is 122-46 at home, including 71-38 in Big Sky Conference regular season and tournament games.
- Portland State has lost only eight non-conference home games in the last 12 seasons (51-8). PSU is 27-8 against Division I schools, and 24-0 against lower division schools over that span.

Big Sky Battles

- Portland State is 185-198 all-time in all Big Sky Conference games, including the Big Sky Tournament (12-13).
- PSU is 120-63 in home games, 59-125 in road games and 6-10 in neutral-site games.

And The Trivial

- Portland State is 29-30 all-time in overtime, including 2-1 in 2017-18.
- PSU is 2-17 against nationally-ranked opponents since joining the Big Sky Conference in 1996-97.
- The Vikings are 0-1 on television (0-0 home, 0-1 road) this season. Portland State is 23-52 in games televised in the Portland area since joining the Big Sky Conference in 1996-97. That includes a 9-7 home

- Portland State has won 34 straight games against lower division schools dating back to 2002. The Vikings are 46-1 against lower division schools in 22 seasons as a member of the Big Sky Conference and Division I (1996-2017).

WHO IS HOT

- **NU-COMERS:** Portland State newcomers JR G Michael Nuga and JR C Sal Nuhu are having a big impact off the bench for the Vikings... Nuga is averaging 12.4 points per game in just 17.0 minutes per night. He is shooting .558 from the field and .471 on three-pointers... Nuhu averages 8.8 points, 4.8 rebounds and has a team-leading six blocked shots while shooting .696 from the field, also in 17.0 minutes per game... Nuhu ranks third in the Big Sky Conference in field goal percentage while Nuga ranks 12th... Nuhu has made 12-13 shots (.923) in the last three games, averaging 11.7 points.
- **BESTIES:** SR G Derek Brown tied his career-high with 16 points against Northwest Nazarene. SO G Holland Woods had a season-best nine assists. SO C Brendan Rumel hauled down a career-high 10 rebounds.
- **VIKING DEFENSE:** Portland State has forced 100 turnovers (20.0), turning them into 120 points (24.0).
- **OFFENSIVE REBOUNDERS:** The Vikings have 90 offensive rebounds (18.0). They have converted them to 86 second-chance points (17.2).

WHO IS NOT

- **THREE-POINT SHOOTING:** Portland State had its best three-point shooting night of the season against Northwest Nazarene (11-26, .423). However, the Vikings are still only 35-135 (.259) from long range on the season.
- **PARDON ME:** The Vikings are averaging 26 fouls per game, including a season-high 36 against UC Santa Barbara.

CHEERING FOR BOO BOO: SO G Holland "Boo Boo" Woods is the Vikings' leader in scoring (14.0), assists (4.8) and steals (2.2). He ranks third in the Big Sky in both assists and steals.

- Woods, the Big Sky leader in assists last season (5.6), has led the Vikings in assists in 29 of 39 career games.
- Woods reached 200 career assists in 36 career games. He is now 32 assists short of reaching the Portland State all-time top 10 for assists.
- He had a season-high 22 points (7-12 FG, 2-4 3-pt, 6-6 FT), career-high seven steals and four assists in the win over Willamette.
- Woods went for 16 points, nine assists, three rebounds and two steals in a win over Northwest Nazarene.

FINDING HIS F-ORME: A lot is expected SR F Jamie Orme as he steps into the starting lineup this season. So far, he is delivering. Orme averages 11.6 points and a team-leading 6.6 rebounds per game.

- Orme had career-highs of 19 points and 13 rebounds for his first career double-double against Willamette.

NEW SEASON, NEW LOOK: Portland State Head Coach Barret Peery has four new starters in his lineup this season, along with returning starter SO G Holland Woods. Also tipping it off are SO C Brendan Rumel (three total starts in the previous two years), SR F Jamie Orme (one start last year), JR F Robert McCoy and SR G Derek Brown.

- In addition to McCoy, also new to the Vikings are JR Gs Michael Nuga and Juwan Williams, JR F Rashaad Goolsby, JR C Sal Nuhu and FR F Filip Fullerton.

IF YOU BUILD IT: The crowd of 1,424 that attended the first official game in the Viking Pavilion and Portland State's home opener against UC Riverside was the largest since a sellout crowd of 1,500 attended the Portland State/Oregon State game in the old Stott Center gym on Dec. 12, 2012... PSU had a crowd of 1,010 in the win over Willamette.

WHAT IS PEERY PRESSURE?

Portland State Head Coach Barret Peery emphasizes a full-court pressure defense that forces turnovers and creates transition opportunities. Then, on the offensive end, his team relentlessly attacks the offensive glass. The results proved out quite well in 2017-18. Here are the analytics of those two areas.

- The Vikings forced 18.1 turnovers per game and had a +5.4 turnover margin (1st in the nation).
- The Vikings averaged 14.5 offensive rebounds per game (2nd in the nation) while opponents averaged 10.2 offensive rebounds.
- In all, the difference in total turnovers (184) and total offensive rebounds (145) meant 329 extra possessions compared to opponents (9.7).
- It is no wonder the Vikings had 361 more field goal attempts and 199 more free throw attempts than their opponents last year and 85.2 points (3rd in the nation).

PEERY PRESSURE, PART II

In 2018-19:

- The Vikings have forced 20.0 turnovers per game and have a +5.6 turnover margin.
- The Vikings average 18.0 offensive rebounds per game while opponents average 8.8.
- In all, the difference in total turnovers (28) and total offensive rebounds (46) is 74 extra possessions compared to opponents (14.8 per game).
- As a result, PSU has 93 more field goal attempts than their opponents. Opponents have 28 more free throw attempts.

SEASON HIGHLIGHT REEL

- **Nov. 6: #14 Oregon 84, PSU 57:** The Vikings opened the season with their usual aggressive approach on defense and the glass, but suffered through a woeful shooting night in a loss to the 14th-ranked Ducks. PSU made only 21-73 shots from the field (.288) compared to 27-50 for Oregon (.540). SO G Holland Woods led the Vikings with 13 points and three assists.
- **Nov. 10: PSU 71, UC Riverside 64:** The Vikings held the Highlanders without a field goal for eight minutes late in the second half. PSU trailed by four with 8:24 to play but pulled away in the closing minutes leading by as many as 10. SR G Derek Brown scored 12 points with six rebounds and three assists.
- **Nov. 16: PSU 125, Willamette 61:** PSU needed little time to dispatch Division III Willamette, jumping to a 23-0 lead in the first five minutes and cruising to an easy win. SO G Holland Woods and JR G Michael Nuga each scored 22 points, while SR F Jamie Orme (19 pts, 13 reb) and JR F Robert McCoy (11 pts, 12 reb) each had double-doubles.
- **Peery Wins 200th:** Portland State Head Basketball Coach Barret Peery captured his 200th career victory on Saturday in a 125-61 win over Willamette. Peery, who is in his second season at Portland State, is currently 22-15 as Vikings' Head Coach. He also won 178 games in six seasons at the junior college level (93-11, Indian Hills CC (IA), 2011-14; College of Southern Idaho, 85-19, 2005-08). His composite record is 200-45.
- **Nov. 23: UCSB 76, PSU 69:** Portland State shoots .355 from the field, making only 3-23 three-pointers in the game. The Vikings also had 36 fouls, sending the Gauchos to the line 42 times. JR G Michael Nuga came off the bench to score 13 points for PSU.
- **Nov. 24: PSU 91, Northwest Nazarene 75:** Portland State jumped to a 23-5 lead in the first eight minutes and never looked back. The Vikings held the Nighthawks to .367 shooting and forced 20 turnovers. SR G Derek Brown scored 16 points with five rebounds. SO G Holland Woods had 16 points and nine assists.

2018-19 SEASON NOTES

PEERY WINS 200TH CAREER GAME

Portland State Head Basketball Coach Barret Peery captured his 200th career victory on No. 17 in a 125-61 win over Willamette. Peery, who is in his second season at Portland State, won his 22nd game as Vikings' Head Coach. He also won 178 games in six seasons at the junior college level (93-11, Indian Hills CC (IA), 2011-14; College of Southern Idaho, 85-19, 2005-08). His composite record is now 201-46.

THE VIKING PAVILION

Portland State University held Grand Opening ceremonies for the new Viking Pavilion at the Peter W. Stott Center on April 9.

The long-awaited arena and events facility became a first-class venue for the university and the Viking Athletics program. Viking volleyball opened the Pavilion for Viking Athletics with the first official sporting events in August. The first major athletics event was on Apr. 28 when PSU hosted a Grand Opening Gala (Wine and Roses). Numerous other campus events have taken place over the past six months.

The Viking Pavilion, a 141,700-square foot facility seats just over 3,000 people for basketball. Seating is more than double the size of the old Stott Center main gym. The facility also has a new weight room, locker rooms, academic center and administrative offices as well as the new OHSU Sports Medicine Center. A new Viking Athletics Hall of Fame display will be completed in October. Other additions include five new classrooms, new student lounges and a new cafe.

The \$52.1 million project, which was part renovation and part rebuild, was designed by Woofter Architects/Perkins+Will. Fortis Construction was the general contractor. \$19.1 million came from private gifts and PSU project funds, \$7.5 million was a sponsorship from OHSU, \$24 million are from state bonds and \$1.5 million are from student fees. None of the funding came from general operating funds or tuition dollars. Formal fund-raising began in 2013. An official ground breaking took place on April 23, 2016.

WOOD, GREELEY WILL REDSHIRT 2018-19 SEASON

FR F Trey Wood is scheduled to redshirt the 2018-19 season. The 6-9 recruit from Anthem, AZ had corrective surgery on his right shoulder in mid-October and will spend the season recuperating.

FR G Kyle Greeley, a 6-5 recruit from West Salem, will also redshirt the 2018-19 season.

JADEN NIELSEN-SKINNER SIGNS WITH VIKINGS

Portland State Basketball Head Coach Barret Peery has announced the signing of Jaden Nielsen-Skinner to a national letter of intent for the 2019-2020 academic year.

"Jaden is an individual that we targeted early on when we came to Portland State. We offered him quickly," said the second-year Head Coach. "He is extremely quick with the basketball and plays fast at both ends of the floor. I love Jaden's knowledge and feel for the game. He fits who we are both on and off the court."

A point guard at South Salem High School, Nielsen-Skinner is a two-time first team All-Greater Valley Conference selection. He averaged 22.3 points, 3.7 assists and 1.2 steals per game as a junior. During his sophomore season, he led South Salem to a third-place finish in the Oregon 6A State Tournament while averaging 18.7 points per game.

Beginning with his freshman season, Nielsen-Skinner has started every game of his high school career.

WOODS PICKED AS PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE

Portland State's Holland "Boo Boo" Woods, the Big Sky Conference Freshman of the Year in 2017-18, received another accolade before playing a single game of his sophomore season. Woods was named to the Big Sky's Preseason All-Conference Team today in a vote of league media.

In his first season as a Viking Woods averaged 10.5 points and a Big Sky-leading 5.6 assists per game. He also averaged 1.5 steals to rank fourth in the conference, and 2.7 rebounds. In addition, Woods had some big highlights throughout his freshman year:

- Eight points, five rebounds and five assists in a Thanksgiving Day game against #1-ranked Duke
- A 13-assist, 12-point performance in a 106-81 blowout victory over California on Dec. 21.
- A game-winning put-back shot to beat at Idaho on Jan. 6 with 0.6 seconds remaining.
- A school-record 10-10 field goal shooting performance, 29 points, nine assists and no turnovers to beat Eastern Washington on Feb. 3.
- A last-second three-pointer at Southern Utah to send the game to overtime and an eventual Viking win at Southern Utah on Feb. 22.
- Scored the last 11 points (and 18 overall with four assists) for Portland State in a Big Sky Tournament first round win over Sacramento State on Mar. 6.
- The fourth-most assists for a season in Portland State school history (191).
- Averaged 32 minutes per game at point guard as he led the Vikings to 20 wins (third-most in its Big Sky history).

VIKINGS PICKED FIFTH, SEVENTH IN BIG SKY POLLS

Big Sky Conference Coaches have picked the Portland State men's basketball team to finish fifth in this season's 2018-19 league preseason poll. Big Sky media tabbed the Vikings for seventh in the 11-team league. (Polls listed on page eight of this release).

VIKINGS WILL BE TELEVISED ON ELEVEN SPORTS FOUR TIMES

The Big Sky Conference released its Eleven Sports television schedule for 2018-19 and Portland State will appear in four of the 11 regular season games (Jan. 12 vs. Weber State, Feb. 16 vs. Southern Utah, Feb. 21 vs. Idaho State and Mar. 7 vs. Montana). All four games will air from the Viking Pavilion.

Eleven Sports also televises the Big Sky Conference Tournament quarterfinals and semifinals.

Eleven Sports Network is available on DirecTV channel 623, AT&T Uverse (Channel 1665), Verizon FiOS (Channel 597) and Google Fiber (Channel 251).

THE SCHEDULE

The Vikings return home after a season of playing off campus due to Viking Pavilion construction. In all, PSU will play 16 home games.

- Portland State will play three teams from the West Coast Conference, two teams from the Pac-12, two from the Big West and one from the Western Athletic Conference in the non-conference schedule. Portland State was 7-2 against teams from other Division I basketball conferences in the west last year (3-1 vs. West Coast Conference; 2-1 vs Pac-12; 1-0 against vs. Big West; 1-0 vs. Mountain West).
- PSU also plays three lower division opponents. The Vikings are 44-1 against lower division schools in the previous 22 seasons, including winning 31 in a row.
- Big Sky Conference play begins on Dec. 31 for the Vikings as Northern Colorado comes to town. That begins a new 20-game conference schedule. The league has dropped to 11 teams with the departure of North Dakota, creating a new, balanced home-and-home schedule. Due to the uneven number of teams the new league schedule also necessitates two Monday games, including Northern Colorado and a Feb. 11 game at Sacramento State.
- The Big Sky Conference Tournament takes place Mar. 13-16 at CenturyLink Arena in Boise. The format has changed to Wednesday through Saturday. The bottom six seeds will compete in first-round play on Wednesday. The top five seeds will earn quarterfinal round berths and open play on Thursday. Semifinals are on Friday, with the Championship on Saturday. The winner advances to the NCAA Tournament.

MORE TASTY VIKING TIDBITS

- Portland State is in its 23rd season as a member of the Big Sky Conference and Division I. PSU played basketball from 1946-1981 before discontinuing the program. Basketball was reinstated for the 1996-97 season. Portland State won Big Sky Conference regular season titles in 2004-05 and 2007-08. The Vikings won Big Sky Conference Tournament titles in 2007-08 and 2008-09, advancing to the NCAA Tournament.
- Former Viking Ime Udoka played seven seasons in the NBA. He started 75 games for the Portland Trail Blazers in 2006-07. Udoka is now an assistant coach with the San Antonio Spurs, and won an NBA title with the team in 2013-14.
- Julius Thomas (2006-10), who holds Portland State records for games played (121), field goal percentage in a season and career (.671/.663), and career wins (78), was a two-time Pro Bowler for the NFL's Denver Broncos. Thomas played on two Big Sky Conference Championship/NCAA Tournament teams (2007-08, 2008-09) at PSU. He went on to play one season of football at PSU (2010). Thomas competed in Super Bowl XLVIII in 2014. Thomas signed a free agent contract with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015 making him the highest paid tight end in the NFL, then moved on to play for the Miami Dolphins.
- Portland State's biggest star was Freeman Williams (1974-78), who still ranks as the second all-time leading scorer in college basketball history behind Pete Maravich. Williams, a Division I All-American in 1978, scored 3,249 points in his career.

2017-18 SEASON REVIEW

Under the guidance of first-year Head Coach Barret Peery, the Portland State basketball program put together one of its best seasons ever during its 22-year run in the Big Sky Conference. The Vikings finished 20-14 overall, posting the third-most wins in that span, and earned a berth in the CollegenInsider.com Post-season Tournament.

The Vikings started off the season strong, winning 10 of 13 non-conference games, and impressed during the PK80 Invitational Tournament, matching up favorably with some of the nation's best teams. PSU was noted for its pressure defense, putting the Vikings among the nation's leaders in steals, forced turnovers and points scored.

Despite a rash of mid-season injuries and illness, the Vikings were able to reach 20 victories, marking only the sixth time in school history that has occurred. Portland State pulled that off by compiling the most road wins in school history (10). In addition, PSU did not have a true home court and had to play off campus due to construction of the new Viking Pavilion.

WHAT THE VIKINGS ACCOMPLISHED IN 2017-18

Here is a look at the memorable moments and milestones for the Portland State Vikings in the 2017-18 season:

- 20 wins - the most by a Viking team since 2008-09 when it reached the NCAA Tournament... also the third-most wins in the Big Sky era (22 seasons) and third time PSU has reached 20 wins (six times in school history).
- 10-6 road record - Portland State had the most road wins and best road winning percentage in school history. Including neutral site games (12-9), the Vikings also had the most "away from home wins" in school history (11-9 in 2008-09).
- Head Coach Barret Peery had the most wins (20) and second-best winning percentage (.588) by a first-year coach at the Division I level in Portland State history.
- The Vikings beat two Pac-12 schools (Stanford, Cal) in the same season for the first time in school history.
- PSU's 10-3 non-conference record was its best in school history. The Vikings three losses came against prominent programs (Duke, Butler, Oregon).
- Comeback wins - Portland State had nine second-half, come-from-behind victories (four by double digits). Six of those were on the road, two at Memorial Coliseum.
- Portland State was 7-2 against teams from other Division I basketball conferences in the west (3-1 vs. West Coast Conference; 2-1 vs Pac-12; 1-0 against vs. Big West; 1-0 vs. Mountain West).
- Scoring - Portland State averaged 85.2 points per game this season, ranking as third-best in the nation.
- PSU was also nationally-ranked in steals (9.8, 2nd), turnover margin (+5.4, 1st), turnovers forced (18.1, 2nd) and offensive rebounds (14.5, 2nd).
- Portland State's CIT bid marked the seventh time in its 57-season basketball history that PSU has received a national post-season bid, and the second time PSU has been picked for the CIT (NAIA in 1955 and 1956; NCAA College Division in 1967; NCAA Division I Tournament in 2008 and 2009; CIT in 2014 and 2018).
- FR G Holland "Boo Boo" Woods was named the Big Sky Conference Freshman of the Year. SR G Bryce Canda and SR F Brandon Hollins were each selected as honorable mention All-Big Sky.
- FR G Holland Woods led the Big Sky Conference in assists in both season (5.6) and conference stats (5.6). SR F Brandon Hollins led the Big Sky in rebounding in conference games (9.7). SR C Ryan Edwards led the Big Sky in blocked shots in conference games (1.7).
- PSU led the Big Sky in scoring, assists, steals, turnover margin, offensive rebounds and assist-to-turnover ratio.

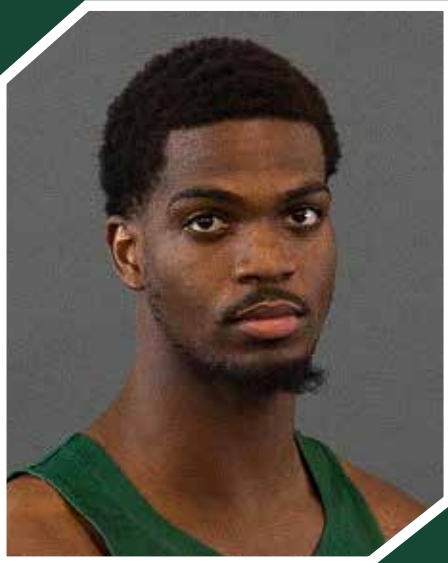
