Series History » Stanford has won 97-percent of its matches against Oregon and Oregon State, owning a 48-1-1 record against its Pac-12 rivals. The Cardinal have never lost to the Ducks (22-0-1), with the lone tie coming in a scoreless draw in 2007.

Stanford has won 17-straight against Oregon State, with the last loss coming in a 1-0 defeat on Oct. 26, 2003 in Corvallis, Ore. Stanford leads that series 26-1-0.

Opening Act » Stanford avenged its lone loss of the 2019 championship season with a 2-1 victory over Pepperdine on Feb. 15. The Cardinal scored two goals in the final seven minutes for the comeback victory over the Waves, with Sierra Enge (83') and Civana Kuhlmann (87') hitting the back of the net.

The victory was the 10th-straight in a season opener for Stanford and extends its unbeaten streak on matchday one to 14 years.

Kuhlmann's Comeback » Against Pepperdine, redshirt junior Civana Kuhlmann made her first appearance for Stanford in an official game since Nov. 30, 2018. Kuhlmann suffered a season-ending injury in an exhibition against Missouri to open the 2019 season and returned to the Stanford lineup for the first time in 816 days.

The Centennial, Colo., native scored the game winner for the Cardinal off a penalty kick attempt in the 87th minute – the ninth game-winning goal of her career. Kuhlmann ended the match with a team-leading four shots off 52 minutes.

Late Winner » Civana Kuhlmann's game-winning goal against Pepperdine on Feb. 15 came in the 87th minute (86:19) to conclude Stanford scoring twice in the final 7 minutes to overcome a 1-0 deficit. Kuhlmann's game winner is the latest game-winning goal Stanford has scored in regulation since Oct. 13, 2017. Kyra Carusa scored on a low cross at 85:09 in a 1-0 victory against Washington. Michelle Xiao and Tierna Davidson were both credited with assists.

The Schedule » The season was moved to the spring of 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Pac-12 announced the spring season will feature a slate of 12 matches, with one rivalry match that will not count towards the conference standings during the week of March 19-21. Stanford will face Oregon State (away, Feb. 28) and Oregon (home, March 28) in nonconference matches on top of Wednesday's match against the Dons. Programs must play a minimum of seven games to win the Pac-12 title, and a minimum of six game to be eligible for the NCAA Tournament.

Cagan is the Place to Be » Stanford has solidified Cagan Stadium as one of the best homefield advantages nationally. Within the friendly confines of Cagan Stadium, the Cardinal is 51-1-2 since the start of 2016 — including 26-straight victories at home.

Ones to Watch » Stanford had three players named to the preseason watch list for the MAC Hermann Trophy, the highest honor in collegiate soccer. Forwards Civana Kuhlmann and Madison Haley, as well as defender Kiki Pickett, were named to the preseason watch list. Stanford is one of five schools nationally to have three players land on the watch list. Kuhlmann returns after missing the 2019 season with an injury, while Haley and Pickett earned All-American honors during the Cardinal's run to a national title.

Leaders of the Pac » By a vote of Pac-12 coaches, Stanford was picked to win the conference while garnering five first-place votes. The Cardinal's 115 total points was ahead of UCLA (110) and USC (108). Stanford enters the season having won the last five Pac-12 titles. entered 2019 as the four-time defending Pac-12 Conference champion with a 116-7-5 record in that span, including a 51-1-2 clip in Pac-12 play. Stanford rides a 40-game unbeaten streak in Pac-12 play into 2019 with the last defeat in conference action coming on Oct. 6, 2016, at USC.

Third Star Earned » Stanford put together one of the most remarkable seasons in program history in 2019. The Cardinal won its second national title since 2017, while putting together a 24-1 record. Stanford defeated No. 2 North Carolina in the College Cup Final on penalty kicks, 5-4. Catarina Macario became a back-to-back winner of the MAC Hermann Trophy, while lead the Cardinal attack to a record-breaking season. Stanford scored 102 goals on the year, led by Macario's 32 — also a program record.
