

STANFORD FOOTBALL GAME NOTES



NO. 9 OREGON DUCKS 42 (5-0, 2-0 PAC-12) STANFORD CARDINAL 6 (1-4, 0-3 PAC-12)

STANFORD STADIUM (32,160) • SEPT. 30, 2023

TEAM

- Saturday's defeat against Oregon is the second in a row for the Ducks against the Cardinal, and the second largest win in the history of the rivalry for Oregon.
- The Cardinal fall to 1-4 through five games for the second consecutive season.
- Stanford's defense held Oregon without a first down in the first quarter. Only one time in the last 11 years has the Oregon offense failed to get a first down in a quarter (third quarter of the 2020 Rose Bowl vs. Wisconsin).
- The six yards of total offense allowed by the Stanford defense in the first quarter is the fewest for Oregon in a quarter since that third quarter of the 2020 Rose Bowl.
- It took Oregon until 9:28 remaining in the second quarter before recording a first down. The Ducks went three-and-out on its first two drives of the game.
- Stanford executed its longest drive of the season in terms of plays and time of possesion on the opening drive of the game. The Cardinal scored on its opening driving using a 15-play drive that took the first 7:42 off the clock in the opening quarter.
- The Cardinal held onto the ball for 35:36 on Saturday afternoon, the most time of possession it has had in a game since its win at Notre Dame on Oct. 15, 2022.
- Stanford ran the ball 46 times on Saturday, a new season-high for the Cardinal offense.
- A trio of Cardinal made their first collegiate starts: Justin Lamson, Tiger Bachmeier, and Fisher Anderson.

INDIVIDUAL

QB JUSTIN LAMSON

- Started at quarterback for the first time in his career.
- Finished the game 11-20 for 106 yards in the air and carried the ball 22 times for 32 yards.
- His 22 carries are tied for the seventh most in a game this season by an NCAA quarterback, and a new career-high.

WR MUDIA REUBEN

- Led Stanford receivers with four catches for 40 yards.
- His four receptions are a new career-high, eclipsing the three he had against Sacramento State.

TE BENJAMIN YUROSEK

• Recorded a season-long rush of 10 yards on a fourth-down conversion in second quarter.

LB GAETHAN BERNADEL

• Finished the game as the leading tackler for the Cardinal with seven total tackles.

LB SPENCER JORGENSEN

- Tied a career-high with six tackles, finishing tied for second on the team in tackles.
- His six tackles double the total he had through the first four games of the season.

LB ERNEST COOPER

• Recorded his first tackle of the season.

S MITCH LEIGBER

• Set a new career-high with six tackles, finishing tied for second on the team in tackles.
