SERIES HISTORY

All-time vs. Texas

• Overall (first meeting in 1981): 36-33-1 (.521)

• Stanford and Texas split a four-game set in Austin last season.

» Stanford took Game 1 with a 12-inning shutout, 1-0.

» Texas took the next two games, 4-3 and 9-0 before the Cardinal bounced back with an 11-1 victory in the finale.

• In the last visit to The Farm for the Longhorns, Stanford took the first two games, 5-4 and 5-3, but Texas split the four-game set with a 3-1 victory on Saturday and 12-4 win on Sunday.

• These two teams are 6-6 all-time against each other in the NCAA Tournament with the last such meeting coming in 2006—Stanford won the Austin Regional which included a 12-8 win over Texas.

• Mark Marquess has been the Cardinal head coach for every Stanford-Texas game.

Current Cardinal Against the Longhorns

• Sophomore southpaw Kris Bubic threw 4.1 scoreless innings in Austin last year (7 K's).

• Junior Quinn Brodey has gone just 1-for-16 (.083) in his career against Texas pitching.

• In last year's start at Texas, Chris Castellanos allowed seven runs in six innings.

• Colton Hock earned the win with a career-high 5.2 scoreless innings in relief in the opener last year. His eight strikeouts remain a career best.

• Reliever Keith Weisenberg also threw a career-high 4.2 innings, did not allow a run and struck out a career-best seven against the Longhorns last year.

• Lubbock, Texas, native Tyler Thorne has not allowed a run in two app vs. Texas (2.0 inn).

• Sophomore Brandon Wulff had his first two career hits at Texas last year (2-for-5 in series).

LAST WEEKEND

• In the opener against Kansas, Andrew Summerville and Will Matthiessen combined for Stanford's first one-hitter since 2003 to lead the Cardinal to a 6-0 victory at Sunken Diamond.

• On Saturday, more than 100 alumni returned to celebrate head coach Mark Marquess, and the current Cardinal delivered a second straight shut out as Stanford topped Kansas, 5-0.

• On Sunday, an early three-run blast from Brandon Wulff was all the Stanford pitching staff needed as the Cardinal closed out a dominant weekend with a 4-2 win and series sweep.

• Most recently, on Tuesday, Stanford's bats broke out behind four hits from Quinn Brodey and three doubles from Nico Hoerner in an 8-2 win over UC Davis at Sunken Diamond.

UP NEXT

▶ The Cardinal continues its stretch of 13 games in 18 days before a week-long spring break.

▶ Stanford is next on the road when it makes its longest road trip of the season to Houston, Texas to take on Rice. This will mark the fifth straight season Stanford has traveled to the state of Texas.

▶ Stanford begins conference play after its break with a three-game set against defending Pac-12 champion Utah on Pac-12 Networks.

CARDINAL NOTES

We're No. 1 🏆

- ▶ Stanford ranks atop the Pac-12 in fielding percentage after the first two weeks. Last year, the Cardinal ranked No. 1 in the nation in fielding percentage (.983), and set a school record, which eclipsed the previous mark set in 2005 (.977).
- ▶ Stanford has gone five straight games without an error. The Cardinal's 35 errors last season were the fewest in the country (295 teams), and also a program record. The previous Stanford standard for fewest errors in a season was 49, set in 2009.
- ▶ The 2016 Stanford pitching staff finished atop the Pac-12 in ERA (3.17), fewest hits allowed (412), fewest runs allowed (201), and fewest home runs (18) allowed.

Stanford Stats 📊

- ▶ At 6-2, this matches Stanford's best start after seven games since 2013.
- ▶ Since trailing 6-0 in the fifth inning at No. 8 Cal State Fullerton, the Cardinal is 6-0 with a 0.96 ERA, .344 batting average, and has outscored its opponents, 35-6.
- ▶ Stanford's pitching staff put together a string of 27.0 scoreless innings & allowed just two runs in a span of 40 innings last week. The bullpen had a 17.1 inn scoreless streak.
- ▶ Coach Marquess is 9 wins from becoming the fourth coach in Division I history with 1,600 career wins (fifth person ever).
- ▶ The Cardinal, which finished 31-23 in 2016, has posted a .500 season or better in 38 of the first 40 seasons under head coach Mark Marquess.
- ▶ Stanford is 27-2 since the start of last season when allowing two or fewer runs.
- ▶ Stanford is 6-0 this year when scoring more than three runs and has won nine straight games when scoring that many.
- ▶ The Cardinal is 27-4 when out-hitting its opponent since 2016.

Stanford Streaks 📈

- ▶ Stanford has won six games in a row for the first time since Feb/March of 2013 (9 gms).
- ▶ Stanford has won 12 consecutive games at Sunken Diamond for the first time since a 16-game streak in 2004 (Feb. 22-May 15, 2004).
- ▶ Matt Winaker and Brandon Wullf have each reached base in seven straight games.
- ▶ Junior Matt Winaker has played in 76 straight games. The last time he did not enter Coach Marquess' lineup was April 28, 2015 vs. SJSU).
- ▶ Winaker has gone 73 straight games without an error (last was May 3, 2015 at Oregon). Since then, he's been perfect on all 647 chances. For his career, Winaker has made just two errors in 114 games and 1,014 chances.
- ▶ Junior Quinn Brodey has started 72 consecutive games for the Cardinal — last time he was not in starting lineup was May 5, 2015 vs. Santa Clara.
- ▶ Senior Alex Dunlap's six-game hit streak is one off his career high. He is hitting .526 (10-of-19) at home this year.

Freshman Debuts 🧑

- ▶ Will Matthiessen has not allowed a run in 9.0 innings of work this season and has racked up two long-outing saves (3.0 inn vs. Kansas and 4.0 inn vs. UC Davis).
- ▶ Reliever Jack Little struck out the side in his inning of work at Fullerton.
- ▶ Andrew Daschbach started 2-for-2 with a double and RBI after his first two career at-bats—he was a pinch-hitter in both instances. He has started the last three games.
- ▶ Erik Miller threw seven scoreless innings in his first career start on Saturday.

Preseason Honors 🇺🇸

- ▶ Stanford was one of three teams with three players on the Golden Spikes Award preseason watch list (TCU, Florida)—junior Colton Hock, junior Quinn Brodey and sophomore Tristan Beck.
- ▶ Hock, Brodey and Beck were named preseason All-Americans by several publications.
- ▶ Hock was also named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year preseason watch list.

They're Back! 🙌

- ▶ Stanford returns all of its starting pitching and the majority of its bullpen.
- ▶ Stanford also returns every regular starter from 2016 except SS Tommy Edman.

- ▶ Eighteen Stanford baseball games will be broadcast on the Pac-12 Networks in 2017.
- ▶ More than half of Stanford's conference slate will be televised (16 of 30) as well as two non-conference mid-week matchups with rival Cal.
- ▶ The Cardinal will be the network's main showcase on Thursday Night Baseball four times, and will be featured in a rare Monday night showdown with their arch rival from Berkeley on May 15.

- ▶ Shortly after the 2016 season, head coach Mark Marquess announced that 2017 would be his final season.
 - » Most wins in Pac-12 history, fourth-most wins in Division I history
 - » Two national championships (1987, 1988) and 29 NCAA Tournament berths and 14 CWS
 - » Nine-time conference Coach of the Year, three-time national Coach of the Year
 - » 38 winning seasons in first 40 years, including six 50-win campaigns

 - » A "9" flag was raised on Feb. 25 and will fly at Sunken Diamond all season.
 - » Final season logo was created as well as #FinalSeas9n hashtag
 - » All season ticket prices end in 9, and Two for Tuesday ticket deals are now \$9 (was \$12).
 - » May 9 will have a 1977 theme and ticket prices based on his first season as head coach.

2017 Schedule 📅

- ▶ Stanford plays 30 of its 54 games at Sunken Diamond.
- ▶ Stanford opened with four straight road contests for the first time since starting with seven straight away from The Farm in 2001 (finished as national runner-up).
- ▶ The Cardinal play its first 16 games in just 23 days.
- ▶ 11-day break from March 12-23 for finals.
- ▶ Longest road stint this year is four games (five times).
- ▶ Longest home stand is eight games on two occasions—that includes a 25-day stretch from March 12-April 6 after Finals where Stanford doesn't leave The Farm.
- ▶ Stanford has 20 games against NCAA Tournament teams from last season.

Preseason Prognostications 📊

- ▶ Pac-12 coaches picked Stanford baseball to finish second in the conference in 2016.
- ▶ Oregon State was selected as the Pac-12 favorite. The Beavers earned 97 points and eight first-place votes, while Stanford garnered two first-place votes and 89 points.
- ▶ Stanford was also among the Top 25 in all five preseason national polls.
