

Tournament Talk ...

No. 1-seeded Stanford will travel to Athens, Ga., May 19-22 for the NCAA Team Championship. The Cardinal will face Harvard in the Round of 16 at 9 a.m. on Thursday morning. Only two seeded teams fell in the first weekend of play, with No. 16 Tennessee dropping a 4-1 decision to Harvard and No. 9 Miami (Fla.) falling to California, 4-3. If Stanford advances past Harvard, the Cardinal will face the winner of the Georgia-California match-up in the quarterfinals on Friday at 11 a.m. Semifinals begin at 11 a.m. on Saturday and the NCAA Championship will be played at 1 p.m. on Sunday. Individual play will begin after the team competition next Monday.

Individual Items ...

Seven Stanford players were offered bids to the 2005 NCAA Singles Championship (Alice Barnes, Erin Burdette, Whitney Deason, Lejla Hodzic, Amber Liu, Theresa Logar and Anne Yelsey), and two pairings will also compete in the 2005 NCAA Doubles Championship (Barnes/Burdette and Liu/Yelsey). The individual tournament kicks off in Athens, Ga., on Monday, May 23, after the team championship concludes on May 22. This is only the second time in the 24-year history of the NCAA Women's Tennis Championship that seven players from one school have been selected to compete for the singles title. The only other one school received seven bids was in 1982, the first year of the NCAA Tournament, when seven UCLA players were invited to the championship.

Ranking Report ...

Stanford remains the top team in the nation with an unblemished 23-0 overall record. Stanford has been ranked No. 1 by the ITA for the entire 2005 season and was ranked No. 1 for the final 12 weeks of the 2004 season.

Home Court Habits ...

Stanford has not been very friendly to its foes at the Taube Tennis Center. The Cardinal has won 85-straight matches on its home court, dating back to 1999 and Stanford has won its 13 duals at home this season.

Picture Perfect ...

Stanford's last perfect season was in 2004, when the Cardinal finished 29-0 and won its 13th NCAA Team Title. Last year was the second perfect record in head coach Lele Forood's tenure: she finished her first year with a 30-0 mark in 2001. Stanford has posted eight unblemished seasons in its history.

Pac-10 Pride ...

No. 1 Stanford claimed its 18th-straight Pacific-10 Conference title after tallying a perfect 7-0 league record (the Cardinal's dual with Washington in February was rained out). Alice Barnes and Anne Yelsey captured the conference doubles title in Ojai with four-straight wins, and Barnes was the singles runner-up with a three-set loss in the final against USC's ninth-ranked Nicole Leimbach.

Winning Ways...

The Cardinal tallied 10 shutouts this year and another seven wins with only one point given up. Stanford owns a 52-match win streak and has won its last 85 home matches. The Cardinal has won 193-of-199 matches over the past seven seasons.

Streak Stats ...

Stanford has won 85-straight duals at home, but the Cardinal has also built its overall win streak to 52-consecutive duals. Stanford's last loss was in the NCAA Championship match against Florida in 2003. Since then, the Cardinal posted a perfect 29-0 season in 2004 and has amassed a 23-0 record this season.

NCAA Tournament ...

The Cardinal has claimed 13 NCAA titles and 14 collegiate titles. Stanford has won the NCAA Championship in three of the last-four seasons, including the 2004 crown. The Cardinal has played in the title match in each of the last six seasons and boasts an 90-11 (.891) all-time Tournament record. Stanford also won six-straight NCAA titles from 1986-91.

Postseason Potpourri ...

Stanford has competed in postseason action for the past 31 years and has earned a berth into the NCAA Tournament in every year of the tournament's 24-year existence. Stanford has advanced to the final match in 18 of its last 23 NCAA Championship appearances.

Coaching Corner ...

Head coach Lele Forood has led Stanford to three national titles and one runner-up finish during her first four years with the Cardinal. She owns a 134-3 (.978) all-time record in five seasons. Assistant coach Frankie Brennan was named the Northwest Region ITA Assistant Coach of the Year. The ten-year veteran has helped the Cardinal to 274 wins and five NCAA titles over the past decade.

Player Points ...

Stanford players have tallied 12 singles and four doubles NCAA titles. As a sophomore last season, Amber Liu claimed her second-straight NCAA singles title. No women's tennis player has ever won three NCAA Singles Championships.

Conference Honors ...

Head coach Lele Forood was named the Pacific-10 Conference Coach of the Year, as voted by the league's coaches, for the second-straight season. Juniors Alice Barnes and Amber Liu both earned First-Team All-Pac-10 accolades, while senior Erin Burdette and sophomore Theresa Logar garnered second-team honors.

Stanford took the early 1-0 lead with a pair of wins in doubles play. All-Americans Alice Barnes and Erin Burdette played at the No. 2 spot and posted the first win of the day with an 8-1 victory over Army's Megan Noble and Christine Ong. Whitney Deason and Theresa Logar picked up the second win to clinch the doubles point for Stanford, as the duo scored an 8-2 victory over Amanda Paluch and Pam Chavez. On court one, Amber Liu and Anne Yelsey were leading Marissa Limsiaco and Amy Morgenstern when the match was called.

Stanford only needed three wins to down the Black Knights in singles, and the Cardinal earned them quickly. Yelsey posted a 6-0, 6-0 win over Lyndsey Nott on court six and Logar followed with a 6-0, 6-1 victory over Noble on court four, and Liu added a 6-1, 6-1 victory over Limsiaco moments later to secure the Stanford victory. Head women's tennis coach Lele Forood, the 2003 Wilson/ITA National Coach of the Year, is in her fifth year at Stanford. Last season, she won her third NCAA team title in four years. The Cardinal also posted one runner-up finish during her tenure. After serving as an assistant and associate head coach at Stanford for 13 years, Forood has made the most of her time with the Cardinal women's tennis team, guiding them to a 134-3 record. The Cardinal has won 193 of its last 199 matches over the past seven seasons and owns a 52-match win streak heading into the NCAA Round of 16.

Last season, Forood led the Cardinal to a perfect 29-0 record, the school's 13th NCAA Championship and Stanford's 17th-straight Pac-10 title. Amber Liu was crowned the 2004 NCAA Singles Champion and doubles pair Erin Burdette and Lauren Barnikow were named the ITA and Pac-10 Doubles Team of the Year.

In Forood's fourth year, Stanford posted a 6-0 record in the NCAA Tournament with five-straight 4-0 wins and a 4-1 victory over UCLA in the title match. Forood guided the Cardinal to its 13th NCAA Team Championship in the 23-year history of the event and its eighth undefeated season in school history. Stanford posted a 29-0 record, the second undefeated season in her tenure.

Forood became the first female head coach to win the NCAA team title in 2001. The championship was the first for Forood, who was an assistant coach for five national title runs from 1989-1991 and in 1997 and 1999. She guided the Cardinal to a stellar 30-0 mark in her first complete season at the helm, as well as the 2000 Pac-10 Championship and a final No. 1 ranking. That year marked the seventh perfect season and first in over 10 years.

Forood replaced one of Stanford's all-time great coaches in Frank Brennan, who retired in June 2000 after 21 years and 10 national championships.

She was an assistant coach for 10 years before being promoted to associate head coach in March of 2000. In 1997, Forood's efforts in helping lead the Cardinal to the NCAA title were recognized as she was named the Division I National Assistant Coach of the Year by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association.

An All-American at Stanford 1976, the first year they started the All-American accolades, Forood was a National Collegiate singles finalist as a freshman and a semifinalist during her sophomore campaign. Competing internationally, she captured the gold medal in both singles and doubles at the 1975 Pan American Games. She was also the 1975 national amateur singles and doubles champion. Forood was ranked as high as 30th on the women's professional tour, and she had an impressive victory over Wimbledon Champion and second-seed Virginia Wade at the 1977 U.S. Open. At the 1976 U.S. Open, Forood teamed with Rachel Giscafre to reach the doubles semifinals.

Forood was a member of the Board of Women's Tennis Associates from 1979-1987 and served as its secretary-treasurer from 1983-87. She has been extremely active in promoting WTA events, and was the recipient of the prestigious WTA Player Service Award in 1983. After the tour and before coming back to Stanford, she promoted the first professional women's tour event in France from 1986-1988 at Strasbourg.

Frankie Brennan, the 2005 Northwest Region ITA Assistant Coach of the Year and son of legendary former head coach Frank Brennan, is now in his 10th year as an assistant coach on The Farm. In the last nine years, Brennan has tutored 15 student-athletes to 36 All-America awards, has helped the Cardinal to a 274-12 record, as well as, 10-straight Pac-10 titles, five national championships and three runner-up finishes in the NCAA Tournament. In 2003, he was honored as the ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year.

Brennan was a two-time All-Conference player for the University of Redlands, where he helped the team to a Final Four appearance in 1993 and a fifth-place national finish in 1994. Brennan was head coach of the women's tennis team at the University of Redlands in 1995 before coming to work for his father in 1996. He has also worked for the United States Tennis Association, assisting in the Area Training Center and serving as a USTA zonal coach. Brennan has also been a hitting partner for Venus Williams and other top professionals over the last four years at the Bank of the West Classic. Brennan also played a few years on the satellite circuit.

Brennan prepped at St. Francis and Los Altos High schools, where he was a four-year letterwinner in both tennis and football. He finished his senior year on the East Coast at Mt. St. Joseph High School in Vermont where he was a standout running back on their State Championship football team.

A third generation coach, Brennan and his family have been involved with coaching tennis for years. His grandfather was Billie Jean King's coach for 18 years as well as the personal instructor to former president Jimmy Carter and his family while he was in the White House. In May of 2002, Inside Tennis named the "Brennan Clan," Frank Sr., Jr. and III, to their top-10 list of "Guys Who Have Lent A Hand" to women's tennis.

Brennan resides in Mountain View, Calif., with wife, Shauna, a speech pathologist in the Hillsborough School District, eight-year old daughter, Madeline, and dog, Tide. They welcomed a baby girl, Francesca, into the family last year.


