COUGARS RETURN TO GESA FIELD, HOST STANFORD SATURDAY NIGHT

Washington State returns to Gesa Field after two weeks on the road to host Stanford Saturday night at 6 p.m. on the Pac-12 Network.

SERIES HISTORY

The Cougars trail the all-time series with Stanford 31-40-1 but have won the last six meetings after posting a 52-14 win at Stanford last season. The Cardinal lead the all-time series in Pullman 20-18 but the Cougars have won the last three meetings at Gesa Field including a 34-31 victory in 2021. Stanford's last win in the series came in 2015, 30-28 in Pullman.

ABOUT WASHINGTON STATE

Washington State enters the week with a 4-4 record including a 1-4 mark in Pac-12 Conference play. The Cougars are second in the country in passing (347.5) led by quarterback Cameron Ward who is fifth nationally in passing (316.5) and fourth in total offense (337.2). Wide receiver Lincoln Victor is third in the Pac-12 with 53 receptions while linebacker Kyle Thornton is fourth in the league with 60 tackles. Head coach Jake Dickert owns a 14-13 career record in his second full season, has led WSU to back-to-back bowl games.

COLLEGE GAMEDAY RECORD

Dating back to the middle of the 2003 season, ESPN College GameDay has had the WSU flag appear throughout the show. The streak reached 296 last week in Salt Lake City. The first appearance came in Austin, Texas (10/4/03) and the streak began two weeks later in Madison, Wisc. (10/18/03). Two flags – Ol' Crimson and Gray – have been flown in the background of the GameDay set. The Gray flag was added in 2014 after Whitey was retired in honor of Steve Gleason's "No White Flags." Appearance No. 217 was its first in Pullman (10/20/18), a 34-20 win over Oregon.

Cougar football games are broadcast live on the radio throughout the Pacific Northwest via the Washington State Sports Network from Learfield. The 20-station football network reaches from Alaska to British Columbia to Oregon and across the state of Washington and can be heard worldwide via the internet on the Varsity Network App and Sirius XM Satellite radio. Cougar football broadcasts begin two hours before kickoff, carry through the game and conclude with post-game coach and player interviews and the Coug Talk call-in show.

The Washington State Sports Network also features radio coverage of WSU men's basketball, baseball, women's basketball and women's volleyball, and the Cougar Coaches Show in the fall, winter and spring seasons.

Learfield manages corporate marketing opportunities and on-site promotions at WSU football and basketball games as well as oversees sales for all signage at Gesa Field, Friel Court at Beasley Coliseum and all Cougar competition sites.

- Ward added 2 pass TD in the win over No. 19 Wisconsin week two
- 5-TD games in wins (Northern Colorado, No. 14 Oregon State), 4 pass TD - 1 rush TD in each game
- Ward completed his first 12 passes against Northern Colorado, finished 20-of-26 for 327 yards, 4 TD
- In the win over No. 14 Oregon State, Ward went 28-of-34 for 404 yards, 1 rushing touchdown
- National Player of the Week (Walter Camp, Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Senior Bowl)
- Ward was the first Power-5 quarterback to start the season with 1300 pass yards, 13 TD and 0 INT in the first four games since Tua Tagovailoa in 2019
- Ward owns 9 games as a Cougar with a rushing TD and pass TD
- Ward rushed for 5 TD last season and 5 TD in 2023, his 10 career rush TD at WSU are 2nd-most by a Cougar QB since Ryan Leaf (11), dating back to 1996
- Ward is 5th in the NCAA in passing yards (316.5), 4th in total offense (337.2) and completions (216)
- Ward is in WSU Career Top-10; completions (6th, 536), passing TD (T9th, 39), pass yds (10th, 5,764)

HICKS EMERGES

- Redshirt-sophomore safety Jaden Hicks opened 2023 with a pair of big nights beginning with a 37-yard interception return for a touchdown to go along with seven tackles, a shared sack and two pass breakups in the week one win at Colorado State. In the win over No. 19 Wisconsin, Hicks tallied nine tackles, a tackle for loss, two pass breakups and forced a fumble to earn the best PFF defensive grade among power 5 players and the Bednarik Award National Defensive Player of the Week.
- Last season, named Freshman All-America, led Pac-12 freshmen with 76 tackles
- Enters week with 51 tackles, made career-high 12 tackles at UCLA with 2 TFL and blocked FG

RON STONE JR. COMES UP BIG IN WISCONSIN WIN

Edge Ron Stone Jr. was named the Bronko Nagurski Trophy National Defensive Player of the Week and Pac-12 Conference Defensive Player and Defensive Lineman of the Week after making five tackles including two sacks and forced fumbles on both sacks in the 31-22 win over No. 19 Wisconsin in Pullman week two. The redshirt-senior's second strip sack of the game was recovered and returned for a touchdown by the Cougars late in the first half.

- Enters the week 2nd on the team with three sacks and tied for team lead with 5.5 tackles-for-loss

STONE AND JACKSON STRIKE TWICE IN WIN OVER NO. 19 WISCONSIN

Sixth-year senior Edge's Ron Stone Jr. and Brennan Jackson delivered some huge moments in the 31-22 win over No. 19 Wisconsin week two. Stone Jr. recorded a pair of sacks and forced fumbles on both sacks with Jackson recovering both fumbles, returning the second two yards for a touchdown late in the first half.

- Jackson shares team lead with 5.5 tackles-for-loss, leads with 3.5 sacks, owns 34 tackles, 3 PBU

LINCOLN VICTOR HEATS UP

Senior wide receiver Lincoln Victor opened the 2023 campaign with a pair of big games beginning with career-highs of 11 catches for 168 yards in the win at Colorado State. The West Camas, Wash. native and Hawaii transfer two seasons ago delivered in the win over No. 19 Wisconsin, catching a one-yard touchdown and also threw a 39-yard completion, the longest by a non-quarterback since 2011. Victor added 119 yards and two touchdowns and completed a pass for a two-point conversion in win over Northern Colorado.

- 3 career 100-yard games, all this season; 168 at CSU, 119 vs. Northern Colorado, 161 at Oregon
- Victor's 16-catch game at Oregon was a WSU single-game record and Autzen Stadium record, tied for the most catches in a game in the country this season (Tory Horton - CSU at Colorado)
- Victor is 3rd in Pac-12 and No. 16 nationally with 53 catches, 3rd with 330 yards after the catch

WIDE RECEIVER DUO BREAKS OUT IN OREGON STATE WIN

Transfer wideouts Josh Kelly (Fresno State) and Kyle Williams (UNLV) have put up big numbers in their first season with the Cougs. In the win over No. 14 Oregon State, Kelly matched a career-high with eight catches for career-highs of 159 receiving yards and three touchdowns while Williams caught seven passes for a career-high 174 yards including a 63-yard touchdown on WSU's second play of the game.

DEAN JANIKOWSKI NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST, MORE THAN A KICK

Kicker Dean Janikowski, a redshirt-junior from Fallbrook, Calif. was named a semifinalist for the 2023 William V. Campbell Trophy by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. Celebrating its 34th year, the Campbell Trophy® recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. Off the field last season, Janikowski started a Pledge call "More than a Kick" where donations were made for each field goal and PAT by Janikowski and the donations went to children with cancer and helped others battling cancer in the Pullman community. Janikowski later started the Heather Janikowski Foundation and started another event called "Kicking with Cancer" with an annual goal of raising \$30,000 to support the Seattle Children's Hospital Can Research Center.

Punter Nick Haberer was named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List prior to the season and has delivered. The Ray Guy Award honors the nation's top collegiate punter in the FBS. Haberer, a junior from Sunshine Coast, Australia, was named to watch list prior to the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

Matt Chazanow is in his ninth season as the play-by-play voice for Cougar football, men’s basketball and baseball broadcasts. Joining Chazanow for his sixth season will be former Cougar quarterback Alex Brink who is the only WSU quarterback to win three Apple Cups and was later a seventh-round draft pick by the Houston Texans. Returning for her 12th season as the sideline reporter is Jessamyn McIntyre.

NEW COACHES

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR / QUARTERBACKS

Ben Arbuckle arrives in Pullman having spent the past two seasons at Western Kentucky, serving as the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach during the 2022 season. In his first season in that role, Arbuckle took the Hilltoppers to great heights as the team finished sixth in total offense (497.3 ypg) and 15th in scoring (36.4 ppg), while quarterback Austin Reed led the nation in passing yards (4,746) and was third in passing touchdowns (40).

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR / LINEBACKERS

Jeff Schmedding returns to the Pacific Northwest having spent the past two seasons at Auburn, most recently serving as defensive coordinator. In 2022, Schmedding oversaw the development of All-SEC First Team edge rusher Derick Hall, who totaled 60 tackles, 12 TFL’s and seven sacks. In his first season at Auburn (2021), the Tigers ranked 29th in rushing defense and 17th in tackles-for-loss. Schmedding spent the previous two seasons at Boise State as the defensive coordinator where in his first season leading the defense saw the Broncos claim the Mountain West Championship and finish in the top 25 nationally in team sacks (37) and scoring defense (20.6 ppg).

WIDE RECEIVERS

Nick Edwards arrives in Pullman having spent the 2022 season as an offensive assistant with the Atlanta Falcons, working alongside the offensive coordinator with gameplan duties. Edwards joined Atlanta’s staff after spending two seasons (2020-21) as the offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach at Cal Poly. Prior to his time at Cal Poly, Edwards spent three seasons (2017-19) as the wide receivers and running backs coach at Cal and three seasons (2014-16) at his alma mater, Eastern Washington, as the wide receivers coach where he coached Cooper Kupp and Kendrick Bourne.

EDGES

Frank Maile (MY-lay) joins Dickert’s staff having spent the past two seasons at Boise State where he served as the Broncos’ assistant head coach and defensive line coach. During the 2022 season, the Bronco defense led the way to a 10-4 overall record, including a victory over North Texas in the Frisco Bowl. The Broncos finished ninth nationally in total defense and 16th in scoring defense.

STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

Ben Iannacchione is no stranger to Dickert as the two worked together when both were on Craig Bohl’s staff at Wyoming during the 2018-19 seasons. Iannacchione comes to Pullman having spent the 2022 season as the head strength and conditioning coach at Akron. A former standout offensive lineman who played collegiately at Boise State, Iannacchione arrived at Akron after spending the 2021 campaign at Pitt after prior stops on the football staffs at Kansas (2020), Wyoming (2018-19), LSU (2011-15, 2016-17) and Youngstown State (2015).

LAST YEAR AT STANFORD

Nov. 5, 2022

Washington State def. STANFORD, 52-14

STANFORD, Calif. — Cameron Ward threw two touchdown passes and ran for a third, Nakia Watson rushed for 166 yards and a score and Washington State snapped a three-game losing streak with a 52-14 victory against Stanford on Saturday. "We needed a win like this," Ward said. "We needed this win to get going and get back." The Cougars (5-4, 2-4 Pac-12) scored touchdowns on their first three possessions and then put the game away with two more TDs in the final 2:09 of the first half. Jaden Hicks also returned a fumble 17 yards for a score in the second quarter as Washington State used four takeaways and 306 yards rushing to get over the frustration of the losing streak. "Winning is a magic elixir," WSU coach Jake Dickert said. "It has grown so much confidence and belief." Ward threw for 176 yards with a 7-yard TD pass to Anderson Grover and a 9-yarder to Donovan Ollie on fourth-and-3. Ward also had a 15-yard TD run. Tanner McKee threw for 236 yards and backup QB Ashton Daniels ran for two scores but Stanford (3-6, 1-6) kept giving the ball away and lost for the sixth straight time to the Cougars. "We had our opportunities, especially on the offensive side," coach David Shaw said. "You can't turn the ball over twice and expect to beat a team that you're comparable to. We turned it over four times." Watson set the tone for Washington State in his return from an injury, rushing for 65 yards on the second play from scrimmage to set up Leyton Smithson's 3-yard TD run and then scoring on a 41-yard run on the Cougars final play of the half following a fumble by Benjamin Yurosek that made it 42-7. "He was himself today," Dickert said. "He gave us a jumpstart and credit to our offensive line. He hit a big hole and he made some people miss. It just set the tone for what we could do." The Cardinal lost six of their first seven conference games for the first time since 2006 - the year before Jim Harbaugh arrived on The Farm to turn Stanford into a contender. But after a long run of success under Harbaugh and Shaw, things have turned in recent years and Stanford hasn't won more than four games in a season since going 9-4 in 2018. "As much as positivity can sometimes be contagious, negativity can be contagious," Shaw said. **THE TAKEAWAY** Washington State: After being held to 41 points during a three-game skid, the Cougars exceeded that total in the first half against the Cardinal. Now all they need is one win against Arizona State, Arizona or Washington to become bowl eligible for the seventh straight non-pandemic season. Stanford: The Cardinal were completely overmatched in this game. They trailed 21-0 before generating a first down, lost four fumbles in the first half and looked disorganized. Stanford was down its top three running backs for the game. The Cardinal had to rely on converted safety Mitch Leigber at times, as well as using Daniels as a running option.

WASHINGTON STATE def. Stanford, 34-31

PULLMAN, Wash. — Max Borghi scored on a 21-yard run with 1:30 left in the game as Washington State came back to beat Stanford 34-31 on Saturday in what was possibly the last game for WSU coach Nick Rolovich because of his refusal to get a COVID-19 vaccination. The state of Washington has set a deadline of Monday for all public employees - including the Cougars' coach - to be vaccinated against the coronavirus. Rolovich has applied for a religious exemption and his future with the team hangs on the answer. Rolovich, who is the highest paid state employee at more than \$3 million per year, has refused to be vaccinated for unspecified reasons, in defiance of Washington Gov. Jay Inslee's mandate. He is the only unvaccinated coach in the Pac-12. "I'm going to come to work tomorrow and get ready for BYU," Rolovich said after the game. "This is not in my hands." Borghi's winning score was set up by a 41-yard pass reception by Calvin Jackson Jr. Borghi finished with 89 yards rushing and two touchdowns. "It's good to get Max involved," Rolovich said. "I'm proud of him." Quarterback Jayden de Laura threw for 289 yards and three touchdowns for Washington State (4-3, 3-2 Pac-12), which won its third straight game and holds a five-game winning streak against Stanford. "He was really mistake-free," Rolovich said of his sophomore quarterback Austin Jones and Benjamin Yurosek caught touchdown passes for Stanford (3-4, 2-3) and Joshua Karty kicked three field goals. Quarterback Tanner McKee fired a 45-yard touchdown pass to Yurosek on Stanford's first possession. Karty added a pair of field goals as Stanford jumped to a 13-0 first-quarter lead. The Cougars came to life in the second quarter as de Laura threw touchdown passes of 32 yards to Travell Harris, 31 yards to Jackson and 10 yards to De'Zhaun Stripling for a 20-13 lead. Borghi powered over from the 2 late in the third quarter to lift WSU to a 27-16 lead. But the Cardinal replied with a 74-yard drive. McKee pushed into the end zone from the 1 early in the fourth, then ran in the two-point conversion to cut Washington State's lead to 27-24. After a Washington State punt, Stanford drove 85 yards and took a 31-27 lead on McKee's 8-yard scoring pass to Jones with 7:32 left in the game. Washington State got the ball back on its 30 with 3:26 left. De Laura marched them down the field and Borghi scored the winning points with 1:30 left. "Our guys showed great resilience in the second half," Stanford coach David Shaw said. "We played so well in the second half on defense, but we gave up explosive plays, and we gave up the opportunity to win the game." Running back Austin Jones said Stanford cannot dwell on the loss. "We gotta move forward, continue to push ourselves, and get back healthy. I know we've got the pieces we need to win games," Jones said. **THE TAKEAWAY** Stanford: After playing four of their first seven games on the road, the Cardinal play four of the next five at home. The Cardinal seemed to have control when they scored the first 15 points of the fourth quarter, but could not hold the lead. Washington State: The Cougars are playing the best football of Rolovich's two-year tenure.

JAKE DICKERT
HEAD COACH / SECOND YEAR

Washington State University Director of Athletics Pat Chun announced Nov. 27, 2021 that Jake Dickert had been named the Cougars' Head Football Coach. Dickert agreed in principle to a five-year contract in becoming the 34th head football coach in program history.

Dickert began the 2022 season, his first full year leading WSU, with three-straight wins, including a victory at No. 19 Wisconsin. The win was WSU's first in three meetings against the Badgers and WSU's first regular-season nonconference road win over a ranked team since 2003. The Cougars captured three of its final four games and reached a bowl game, the Jimmy Kimmel L.A. Bowl, for the seventh-straight season, the second-longest current streak in the Pac-12. Under Dickert's leadership, WSU again was strong defensively, finishing in the top four of numerous Pac-12 categories, including second in Red Zone defense and tackles-for-loss, third in scoring defense and turnovers gained, and fourth in sacks. WSU also led the Pac-12 in Red Zone offense. In 2022, WSU had 10 All-Pac-12 players, including first-team linebacker and third-team All-American Daiyan Henley, while safety Jaden Hicks garnered third-Team Freshman All-America honors. Henley was selected in the third round of the NFL Draft by his hometown Los Angeles Chargers.

Dickert spent the final five games of the 2021 regular season serving as the Cougar's acting head coach, leading WSU to a 3-2 record with wins over Arizona State, Arizona and a dominating 40-13 Apple Cup victory in Seattle before WSU earned a trip to the Tony Tiger Sun Bowl. The Apple Cup win snapped a seven-game skid to Washington and was WSU's largest margin of victory in series history.

Under Dickert's leadership, the Cougar defense was a huge spark in 2021, leading the Pac-12 with 29 takeaways, fifth-most nationally, while also leading the Pac-12 and tied for ninth nationally in turnover margin. Last season, 14 players earned All-Pac-12 honors including first-team selections in right tackle Abraham Lucas, kicker Dean Janikowski and EDGE Ron Stone Jr. while punter Nick Haberer was named a Freshman All-American. In the 2022 NFL Draft, offensive lineman Abraham Lucas was selected in the second round by the Seattle Seahawks and cornerback Jaylen Watson went in the seventh round to the Kansas City Chiefs.

Entering the 2021 season, Dickert was in his second year as WSU's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. In his first season in Pullman, the Washington State defense produced four All-Pac-12 Conference selections including linebacker Jahad Woods, who was second on the team with 31 tackles and led the team with 4.5 tackles-for loss. The Cougars led the league with eight forced fumbles and was fourth in rush defense (154.8), a 30-yard improvement from the previous season.

Dickert arrived at WSU after working three seasons at the University of Wyoming (2017-19) including the 2019 campaign as the defensive coordinator while working with the linebackers and safeties.

In 2019, the Cowboys were sixth in the country in red zone defense, No. 11 in the country in rush defense (107.1) and scoring defense (17.8), No. 40 tackles-for-loss (83) and No. 43 in total defense. Dickert saw four Cowboys earned All-Mountain West Conference honors led by second-team All-American linebacker and Butkus Award Finalist Logan Wilson while redshirt-freshman defensive end Solomon Byrd was named a Freshman All-American by the Football Writers Association of America.

Dickert originally joined the Wyoming football staff in February, 2017 and coached the safeties for the 2017 and 2018 seasons before he was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2019 where he started the season coaching the linebackers and later coached the safeties. In his three seasons at Wyoming, Dickert coached a pair of future NFL safeties including three-time first-team All-Mountain West Conference pick Andrew Wingard and saw four players earn All-MWC honors in 2019 while another earned 2019 Freshman All-America accolades on the defensive line.

In 2018, Wyoming's defense was among the best in the nation, finishing the season No. 19 in total defense (326.2), No. 25 in rushing defense (129.5), No. 28 in scoring defense (22.0) and No. 32 in pass defense (196.7). Dickert coached senior safeties Andrew Wingard and Marcus Epps as Wingard ended his career tied for the Mountain West Conference career tackle record with 454. Wingard earned First Team All-Mountain West honors for the third consecutive season after being named to the preseason watch lists for the Chuck Bednarik, Bronko Nagurski and Jim Thorpe Awards in both 2017 and 2018. Epps concluded his career as the only three-time team captain in the modern era of Cowboy Football, recorded 325 career tackles and was a finalist for the 2018 Burlsworth Trophy, which is awarded to the nation's most outstanding player who began his career as a walk-on. Epps was selected in the sixth round of the 2019 NFL Draft by the Minnesota Vikings where he played in seven games before playing in eight more with the Philadelphia Eagles. Wingard played in the 2019 East-West Shrine Game, was invited to the 2019 NFL Draft Combine and signed a free-agent contract with the Jacksonville Jaguars where he played all 16 games and made two starts as a rookie.

In his first season at Wyoming, Dickert help the 2017 Cowboy defense become one of the best

groups in the country as they led the countr in takeaways (38), ranked ninth in scoring defense (17.5), were first in fumbles recovered (18), second in interceptions (20), eighth in defensive touchdowns scored (4 TD), No. 13 in pass defense (174.9) and No. 23 in total defense (335.2). Dickert coached first-team All-Mountain West strong safety Wingard while the safety tandem of Wingard and Epps led the Pokes in interceptions in 2017, with five and four interceptions, respectively.

Before arriving at Wyoming, Dickert spent the 2016 season as the safeties coach and co-special teams coordinator at South Dakota State. Earlier in his career, Dickert was a part of Bohl's coaching staff at North Dakota State from 2008-10.

In his one season on the South Dakota State coaching staff, Dickert helped guide the Jackrabbits to the 2016 Missouri Valley Football Conference Championship and a No. 8 seed in the 2016 NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Playoffs, where they advanced to the FCS National Quarterfinals.

As defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Minnesota State, Mankato for the 2014 and 2015 seasons Dickert was part of a coaching staff that led the Mavericks to back-to-back Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) championships and consecutive NCAA Division II Playoff berths, earning their way to the 2014 National Championship Game. Minnesota State posted a combined record of 24-3 over that two-year span. Dickert's 2014 defense ranked second in the nation in scoring defense (12.9), fourth in turnovers gained, No. 12 in pass defense efficiency and No. 15 in total defense. In 2015, the Mavericks ranked fifth in the nation in scoring defense (16.1), third in rushing defense, seventh in pass defense efficiency and sixth in total defense. He coached 16 All-Conference players, three First Team All-Americans and a two-time Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference Defensive Player of the Year.

In his first season as a college defensive coordinator in 2013 at Augustana, Dickert's defense ranked No. 20 in the nation at the NCAA Division II level in scoring defense, giving up only 19.5 ppg. Augustana ranked second in the NSIC in pass defense, third in rushing defense and third in total defense. He coached five All-Conference players at Augustana.

In 2012, he served as the defensive backs coach at Southeast Missouri State. The Redhawks ranked No. 18 in the nation in turnovers gained (25) and No. 23 in interceptions (13). Southeast Missouri State ranked No. 2 in the Ohio Valley Conference in pass defense. Dickert also coached a First Team All-Conference strong safety at Southeast Missouri.

Dickert spent the 2011 season as the special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach at South Dakota, where the Coyotes ranked second in the Great West Conference in fewest passing yards allowed and interceptions. He coached three all-conference performers while at South Dakota and his special teams units ranked in the Top 10 in the nation in punting average and net punting and had an individual rank in the Top 10 in punt return yards.

He joined the North Dakota State coaching staff in 2008 as a defensive graduate assistant on Bohl's staff. In 2009 and 2010, he was elevated to serve as safeties coach for the Bison. The 2010 NDSU team advanced to the FCS National Quarterfinals. Dickert began his college coaching career in 2007 as a defensive graduate assistant at his alma mater, Wisconsin-Stevens Point.

He played football at Wisconsin-Stevens Point from 2002-06 where he earned All-Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) honors as a wide receiver his senior season of 2006 and was named his team's Wide Receiver of the Year both his junior and senior seasons. Dickert earned his bachelor's degree in secondary math education from Wisconsin-Stevens Point in 2007, and completed his master's degree in general education, also from UW-Stevens Point in 2009.

He and his wife, Candice, have three children, daughter Rylee and sons Jett and Jace.

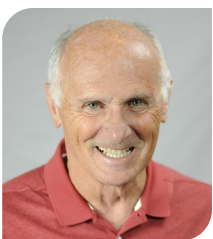

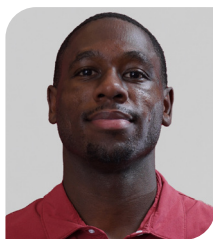
