## Stanford Cardinal (15-8, 4-2) at UCLA Bruins (12-14, 4-5)

Three straight come-from-behind victories, including a dramatic win at #11 Cal, have supplied Stanford with a healthy dose of momentum heading into its first Pac-12 road trip of the season. The Cardinal makes the trip to Los Angeles this week to take on UCLA, Thursday-Saturday. All three games can be seen on the Pac-12 Networks.

#### SERIES HISTORY

#### All-time vs. UCLA

- Since 1959: 157-106 (.590) | Streak: UCLA, 2
- Last Year: W (6-1), L (0-9), L (3-9)
- Stanford lost two of three to No. 3 UCLA at Sunken Diamond last year.
- Prior to last season, Stanford won six of the previous seven series between these teams.
- The Cardinal has won two straight series against the Bruins in Los Angeles. The last time UCLA won a series over the Cardinal in LA was in 2010 when the Bruins were ranked No. 2.

## **Current Cardinal Against UCLA**

- Bryce Carter hit .333 and scored two runs in the three-game set with UCLA last season.
- Beau Branton went 5-for-11 (.455) against the Bruins last year.
- Thursday starter Chris Castellanos has a career 10.38 ERA against UCLA in two appearances, including a start in 2015.
- In six career games against the Bruins, Tommy Edman is just 2-for-27 (.077).
- Brett Hanewich threw a complete game and earned the win in his only career appearance against the Bruins. He allowed just one run and three hits, and struck out a career-high nine batters last year.
- Jesse Kuet is 5-of-13 (.385) all-time against UCLA.
- Tyler Thorne has thrown 3.1 scoreless innings in two appearances over the last two years.

## LAST **TIME OUT**

- Stanford took two of three from USC. The Trojans won Game 1, 1-0, and scored first in the final two games. But Stanford came back from an 8-2 deficit on Saturday with the game's final nine runs, and then scored the final eight runs on Sunday to win, 8-1.
- On Tuesday at No. 11 Cal, Stanford came from behind four times, including a dramatic three-run ninth inning where the Cardinal was down to its last strike. Freshman Brandon Wulff tied the game with a single up the middle, and senior Jonny Locher followed with a game-winning home run to earn an 8-6 win.

## UP **NEXT**

- Stanford's overnight trip at UCLA, April 7-9 is its first since Feb. 25-28 at Texas.
- Including Los Angeles, Stanford will spend three of the next four weekends on the road.
- The Cardinal is on the road for 11 of its next 15 games, including road trips to Arizona (April 15-17) and Oregon State (April 29-May 1).
- Stanford hosts San Jose State at Sunken Diamond on Tuesday at 5:30 p.m.

Stanford's nickname is always singular: Cadinal. Thanks!

#### CARDINAL NOTES

#### We're No. 1 🤞

- Stanford entered the week ranked No. 1 in the nation in fielding percentage (.988).
- The Cardinal have made the second-fewest errors in the country (295 teams) with just 13 in the first 23 games.
- The Cardinal has allowed the fewest runs in the nation this year (70).
- In addition to those two categories, Stanford pitching also entered the week atop the Pac-12 in ERA (2.50), opposing batting average (.216), and fewest hits (160), walks (69), doubles (24), and home runs (5) allowed.
- Most of those numbers aren't even close:
  - Stanford's ERA is nearly a half-run better than No. 2 Cal (2.96).
  - Stanford has allowed nearly 100 fewer runs than UCLA and Washington State (160).
  - Stanford has allowed nearly 100 fewer hits than UCLA (247).

## Stanford Stats III

- Stanford is also No. 8 in the NCAA in WHIP (1.10).
- Stanford is 12-1 when holding its opponent under three runs, and 3-7 when its opponent scores three or more.
- The Cardinal is 8-1 this year when scoring first and 8-0 when hitting a home run.

## Stanford Streaks 📈

- Sophomore Matt Winaker has reached base in 10 straight games—the longest streak of the season for a Stanford player.
- Sophomore Mikey Diekroeger has three straight multi-hit games and is 8-of-13 in those games with eight runs, four doubles and a game-winning home run (April 2 vs. USC).
- Junior shortstop Tommy Edman has played in 112 straight games (started 109 in a row).
- Three-game sweep of Kansas was Stanford's first since May 24-25, 2015 at Utah.
- Stanford has won its first two Pac-12 series for the first time since 2013 (also against Washington State and USC).

## Closing the Door

- Stanford's bullpen has an ERA of 1.71 and opponents are hitting just .202.
- The reserves also have 97 strikeouts (compared to just 36 walks and 64 hits) in 89.2 inn.
- Seven different pitchers have an ERA under 2.00 coming out of the bullpen this year.
- Stanford is 13-0 when leading after seven innings this season.

## Fab Freshmen 🚳



- Tristan Beck leads the team in wins (4), Nico Hoerner has started every game, Duke Kinamon has started 10 in a row, and Brandon Wulff went 3-for-3 with 4 RBI on Sunday.
- Beck became the second Stanford freshman to start Opening Day since Mike Mussina in 1988 (teammate Cal Quantrill was the other in 2014).
- In all, head coach Mark Marquess added 11 freshmen in his latest recruiting class.
- Three pitchers (one lefty), four infielders, three outfielders and a catcher. Six are from the homestate of California, three from Georgia and one apiece from Colorado & Nevada.

## Pac-12 Pitchers of the Week 👋



- Stanford won the first two Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week awards this season.
- Colton Hock earned the award on March 1 after throwing 5.2 scoreless innings in relief in the longest recorded shut out in the program's history (since 1959)—Stanford won at #23 Texas, 1-0 in 12 innings, on Feb. 25. Hock finished with a career-high eight strikeouts and allowed just three hits.
- Tristan Beck earned the conference honor in the first week—he was the first Stanford hurler to win the award since 2013 MLB first overall pick Mark Appel in May of 2013.

## TV Games

- Eighteen Stanford baseball games will be broadcast on the Pac-12 Networks in 2016.
- Eleven of the 18 will feature the newly-renovated Klein Field at Sunken Diamond and and 14 will be Pac-12 matchups.
- Only USC and Arizona State will have more televised games on the network (19).
