QUICK HITS

- The Terriers enter the road swing coming off a dominant 94-35 victory against Carver College on Tuesday
- 12 different players scored in the win, as Fletcher Magee (18), Cameron Jackson (11) and Ryan Larson (11) each scored in double figures
- Wofford shot 57.5% from the floor and 53.3% from 3-point range, improving its season percentages to 46.3% from the floor and 38.4% from beyond the arc
- 14 players entered the game against Carver, as Drew Cottrell and Alex Michael got their first collegiate appearance in the win
- Taking care of the ball has been an early theme this year for the Terriers, committing just 9.3 turnovers per game while forcing 17.7
- Wofford has struggled a bit from the free throw stripe, going just 20-32 (62.5%)
- Strong starts have been the key in the two Wofford victories, outscoring High Point and Carver 97-48 in the first half
- After hitting three 3-pointers against North Carolina, Fletcher Magee has hit five in each of the last two games, totaling 364 for his career
- Wofford head coach Mike Young is the program's all-time wins leader, picking up his 150th SoCon win last season

MIKE YOUNG

HEAD COACH • EMORY & HENRY, 1986

- Wofford's All-time wins leader after passing former coach and current Athletic Director Richard Johnson in 2016-17.
- Young holds an overall record of 270-240 and is 157-124 (.559) in SoCon games.
- Young guided the Terriers to victories over Georgia Tech and No. 8 North Carolina last season.
- Young picked up career victory 250 against Bob Jones (11/8/17) and his 150th SoCon win against Chattanooga (1/20/17).
- In 2018-19 the Terriers were picked to finish second by both in both the coaches' and media preseason polls.
- At Wofford, Young has coached 21 all-conference players, including reigning SoCon Media Player of the Year in Fletcher Magee.
- He has led Wofford to three regular season titles and four SoCon Tournament Championships and NCAA Appearances.
- He was a 3x SoCon Coach of the Year and the 2009-2010 Hugh Durham National Mid-Major Coach of the Year.
- Second All-Time in wins by a SoCon Coach, trailing just Bob McKillop of Davidson.
- Young has signature wins over Auburn, Cincinnati, Clemson, Georgia, Georgia Tech, North Carolina, N.C. State, Purdue, South Carolina, Virginia Tech, Xavier and Wake Forest.

ON THE BENCH



JAY MCAULEY

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH • GEORGIA, 2006

- McAuley enters his second season as the Associate Head Coach at Wofford, helping guide the Terriers to a 21-13 record and a SoCon semifinal appearance in 2017-18.
- He was previously at Furman for four seasons, and Wofford for two seasons (2008-2010) and was a part of Wofford's first SoCon title. The Terriers went 26-9 on the season and 15-3 in Southern Conference play en route to winning both the regular season and tournament titles in the 2009-10 season.
- Prior to Furman, McAuley spent three seasons at Gardner-Webb on Chris Holtmann's (currently head coach at Ohio State) staff.
- McAuley, a Marietta, Ga. native, played four seasons at the University of Georgia and was on the 2008 team that won the SEC Tournament. He played in 17 games his junior season and was a co-captain in his senior campaign.



- In five years coaching at Wofford, Giltner has helped guide the Terriers to their third and fourth Southern Conference Tournament championships and NCAA Tournament appearances. Giltner was also a part of the previous two championships as a player, helping the program win its first as a sophomore in 2009-10, and it's second as a junior in 2010-11.
- Works primarily with Wofford's guards and has coached Eric Garcia, Fletcher Magee, Nathan Hoover and Storm Murphy to Socon honors. In 2016-17, Giltner coached three guards to All-Conference accolades. Fletcher Magee and Eric Garcia were both named First-Team All-SoCon as Wofford was the only conference team to place two players on the First-Team. Nathan Hoover was named to the All-Freshman team, Wofford's fifth All-Freshman team member in the last six seasons.
- He spent the 2012-13 season playing professionally for Keflavik in Reykjanesbaer, Iceland.



WILL MURPHY

ASSISTANT COACH • WAKE FOREST, 2013

- Murphy enters his second season with the Terrier. Murphy was hired on June 16, 2017 as the Director of Basketball Operations and was elevated to Assistant Coach in October of 2017.
 - Murphy began his career at his alma mater, Wake Forest. Last season, he was the Director of Player Development for the Demon Deacons.
 - Prior to his stint as the Director of Player Development, Murphy spent three seasons as the Video Coordinator and Director of Technology and Scouting.
- Murphy, a native of Murfreesboro, Tennessee, spent three and a half seasons as a student manager for the Wake Forest staff before joining the active roster as a walk-on guard in December of 2012.



SCOUTING WOFFORD

Wofford has opened up the 2018-19 season, going 2-1. Most recently, the Terriers dominated Carver College on Tuesday night. Depth has been a strong suit of the Terriers thus far, with 14 players appearing in the first three games. Down low, Matt Pegrum and Chevez Goodwin anchor the defense off the bench, while guards Tray Hollowell, Donovan Theme-Love and Ryan Larson all provide depth at the point and shooting guard positions. Starting point guard Storm Murphy is averaging five assists and 11.7 points per game thus far.

SCOUTING STANFORD

Stanford has started off the season 2-1, most recently falling to North Carolina 90-72 in Chapel Hill. In the early part of the season, three Cardinal players are averaging double figures, led by KZ Okpala's 22.7 points and 7.3 rebounds per game. Stanford has turned the ball over at a rate of 14.7 per game. Defensively, Stanford averages 9.0 steals per game compared to its opponents who are averaging 5.0 steals per game.

Men's Basketball Comes Up Short in Season Opener at Stanford

PALO ALTO, Calif. – The Wofford men's basketball team opened up the 2014-15 season with a 74-59 loss at Stanford Friday night as part of the Northwestern Mutual Coaches vs. Cancer Classic at Maples Pavilion.

Wofford (0-1) held its own through the first 16 minutes of the game. The Terriers opened 3-of-5 from beyond the arc and led 17-13 as sophomore Jaylen Allen connected on his first two 3-point attempts of the season.

Stanford (1-0) closed the gap. The Terriers led 24-23 with 4:17 before halftime when the Cardinal used a 13-3 run to go into the locker rooms up 36-27. Stanford shot 4-of-8 during the run and forced the Terriers into four turnovers after they had only committed three through the first 16 minutes.

Stanford's Stefan Nastic finished with a career-high 26 points. The 6-foot-11 center shot 11-of-14 and grabbed five boards to help the Cardinal outboard Wofford 32-25. The big man was simply too overmatching inside and showed his mid-range game as well. After scoring the majority of his points in the paint, he pulled up for a couple 12-foot jumpers to score six straight Stanford points before exiting the game with four minutes to play.

Wofford allowed just one 25-point scorer all of last season – Davidson's De'Mon Brooks scored 28 last January 4.

"They're much better than we thought they were," said 13th-year head coach Mike Young. "Nastic is a skilled player who concerned us heading in and we wanted to see if he could beat us. He did and sometimes you have to just tip your cap."

"We can still take a lot of positives from this game. These guys stayed in there and continued to fight through the second half. We never stopped competing."

Allen led the Terriers with 12 points off the bench. The Johnson City, Tenn. native completed his sophomore opener 4-of-7 from the field and 2-of-5 from long range, coming up one point shy of his career-high. He was joined in double figures with 11 apiece from senior Karl Cochran and junior Spencer Collins.

Wofford shot 44.7 percent (21-47 FG) to Stanford's 52.8 percent (28-53 FG). On top of Nastic's 26 were Anthony Brown with 16, Travis Reid with 12 and Chasson Randle with 12. The Cardinal starters combined for all but five of the team's 74 points.

The Wofford men's basketball team opens the home slate Tuesday morning at 7 a.m. The Terriers will compete in ESPN's College Hoops Tip-Off Marathon, hosting Iona for the 35th year of basketball inside Benjamin Johnson Arena. The game will be televised on ESPN2

Terriers cruise past Carver College

SPARTANBURG, S.C. - The Wofford men's basketball team dominated Carver College on Tuesday night, defeating the Cougars 94-35 at Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium. Twelve Terriers scored in the victory as Fletcher Magee (18), Cameron Jackson (11) and Ryan Larson (11) each scored in double figures.

Wofford improves to 2-1 on the season, embarking on a two-game road trip this upcoming weekend. The Terriers travel to Stanford on Friday (10 p.m.) before going to Oklahoma on Sunday (2 p.m.).

"We played pretty darn well," said head coach Mike Young. "I thought everyone battled."

Ball movement was key to the Wofford offense on Tuesday, totaling 21 assists as a team, led by point guard Storm Murphy and reserve guard Tray Hollowell, who dished out six and five assists, respectively.

"I thought Tray (Hollowell) impacted the game in multiple ways," said Young. "He took a couple quick shots early, but had a couple of nice assists, and then things opened up for him so he could get to the rim a little bit."

It was all Wofford from the start, with four different Terrier starters scoring in the first two and a half minutes of the game. The Terriers held Carver College scoreless for nearly eight minutes, stretching their lead to 32 points just a little past the midway point of the first half.

As a team, Wofford shot 57.5% from the floor and 53.3% from 3-point range. Magee led the team with five 3-pointers in the game, while freshman Ryan Larson went 3-for-4 from downtown coming off the bench.

The win matches Wofford's previous 59-point victory over Johnnon and Wales (104-45, Dec. 9, 2017) and marks the first time that Wofford has scored 90 or more points this season.

"We got to use a lot of different players and try some different things," Young said. "We're still looking for a full 40-minute game, but we'll take it and we look forward to getting on that plane and going out west."

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – The Southern Conference announced its preseason all-conference team and polls on Thursday, with Wofford guard Fletcher Magee being selected as the preseason player of the year by the league’s 10 coaches.

Senior forward Cameron Jackson joins Magee on the preseason all-conference team which was also selected by the coaches, as Wofford was picked to finish second in both the coaches’ and media polls. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own teams or student-athletes as part of the balloting. The 2018-19 all-conference team features 11 players due to a tie in voting.

Magee, who was named the Malcolm U. Pitt Player of the Year by the SoCon media last season, led the nation in 3-pointers, making 148 which was good for fifth-most in NCAA Division I history. The senior guard, who was a finalist for the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, was recently named to the 2018-19 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award watch list and slated as the top shooter in the nation by college hoops insider Jeff Goodman.

Magee led the SoCon in scoring last season, averaging 22.1 points per game, shooting 48 percent from the floor and 44 percent from three. The Orlando, Florida native helped lift the Terriers to victories over the ACC’s Georgia Tech and No. 5 North Carolina last year, scoring 36 and 27 points, respectively. Magee, who now holds the Wofford record for 3-pointers made (351), set a career high in both points (45) and 3-pointers (11) against Chattanooga (Feb. 17, 2018), scoring in double figures in all but one game last season.

Jackson, who was named second team all-conference last season, averaged 12 points per game in 2017-18, pulling down a team-high 5.9 rebounds per game. A native of Winchester, Virginia, Jackson was named the Lute Olson National Player of the Week and SoCon Player of the Week after scoring 18 points, pulling down nine rebounds and blocking six shots as Wofford upset the No. 5 North Carolina Tar Heels in Chapel Hill (Dec. 20, 2017). The senior forward ranks seventh all-time at Wofford with 78 blocked shots, totaling 45 in 2017-18.

Wofford, which finished last season 21-13, going 11-7 in SoCon play, was slated just behind the defending regular-season and tournament champion UNCG by both the coaches and media. The Terriers totaled 74 points, receiving four first-places votes in the coaches’ poll, totaling 214 points and receiving six first-place votes by the media.

ETSU, Furman and Mercer finished third through fifth in both polls, respectively. The Citadel grabbed sixth place in the coaches’ poll while Chattanooga was picked sixth by the media, with Samford, Western Carolina and VMI rounding out spots 7-10.

RICHARDSON INDOOR STADIUM

A new era at Wofford began in 2018 with the opening of the Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium. The new home of basketball and volleyball is adjacent to the north end of Gibbs Stadium, where the Terriers play football.

Wofford alumnus and trustee Jerry Richardson, Class of 1959, provided the gift to fund the facility that includes a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 350-seat volleyball competition venue as well as offices, locker rooms, meeting rooms, training rooms and special fan areas, including several open-air suites. The facility replaces Benjamin Johnson Arena, which will continue to be used as a first-rate gymnasium for intramural and campus recreational activities.

"The Richardsons have done it again," head men's basketball coach Mike Young said. "First the Center for the Arts and now the Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium. I'm eager to tour prospective students through both buildings to show them, as well as tell them, that Wofford student-athletes are students first."


The Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium also has a seating capacity for non-athletics functions, such as commencement and concerts, of 4,500. The facility includes "Club 51" for club seat holders, the "Boneyard" lounge in the student section, state of the art sound system and acoustical design, along with electronic charging stations throughout the building.


