Five Things To Know

- This is just the second "Friday the 13th" game in CU history and first in October. In 2015, CU fell to USC 27-24 on Friday, Nov. 13.
- CU has played in front of a sold-out crowd in all six games to date, a school record. CU is one of just five teams nationally to play in front of a sellout in every game, joining Georgia, Iowa, Notre Dame and Tennessee.
- CU hasn't played Stanford since the 2020 COVID shortened season. CU has won three straight over the Cardinal with other wins coming in 2016 and 2019.
- CU has had five different players hit the 100-yard receiving plateau, setting a new school record.
- CU's kicker (Alejandro Mata) and punter (Mark Vasset) were both honored this week. Mata picking up Pac-12 Player of the Week honors and Vasset being named to Ray's 8 list by the Ray Guy award.

The Prime Effect

- When Coach Prime was hired, the aggregate following of CU football on all social media channels was 268K, and as of Thursday PM it is 2.18M. Prior to the TCU game, it was 1.27M as CU added 1M followers from the time Coach Prime was hired until the first game. In the first six weeks of the season, CU has added 997K new followers.
- The TCU game saw CUbuffs.com have the biggest day in its history with 730K visitors.
- Coach Prime is 29-8 as a collegiate head coach, including a 23-3 record in his final two seasons at Jackson State with two SWAC Championships and two appearances in the Celebration Bowl.
- Colorado sold out its Spring Game, season ticket allotment and all six games fully for the 2023 season.
- CU had the only spring game on ESPN and has four of its first five games on network TV in 2023, matching the school record.
- Merchandise sales increased by 505% in December 2022 after Coach Prime was hired and eight of the top 10 days on CU's on-line store have happened since Coach Prime's hiring.

Deion "Coach Prime" Sanders



Known as "Prime Time" during his Hall of Fame playing career, Deion Sanders and has since transitioned into "Coach Prime," and was named the 28th full-time head football coach at the University of Colorado, athletic director Rick George announced Saturday, Dec. 3.

Sanders joins the CU program from Jackson State University, where in three seasons the Tigers compiled a 27-6 record and won back-to-back Southwestern Athletic Conference championships and Celebration Bowl appearances competing on the FCS level; that mark included a 12-1 record this season. This year, Jackson State defeated

Southern, 43-24, in the SWAC title game but fell in overtime to N.C. Central, 41-34, in the Celebration Bowl.

At Jackson State, Sanders achieved tremendous success on and off the field as a fierce advocate for additional exposure and a level playing field for all Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). Sanders brought national attention to HBCUs, pushing for opportunities to highlight its talent and the culture. In March 2022, Sanders held a Pro Day featuring athletes from four other schools in the state of Mississippi to provide a platform in front of 22 NFL teams and the Canadian Football League. In April 2022, Jackson State became the first HBCU to have its spring football game televised live nationally on ESPNU.

Sanders was named the 21st head coach in Jackson State history on Sept. 21, 2020, but had to wait to coach his first game until COVID-19 restrictions were lifted and several FCS schools opted to play a delayed schedule in the spring. Exactly six months to the day later (Feb. 21, 2021), he led the Tigers to a 53-0 win over Edward Waters (Fla.) to begin the "Coach Prime Era." It was considered the touch point of the elevation of JSU football and the University into becoming one of the most impactful and recognizable brands nationwide.

JSU was 4-3 in the pandemic-delayed 2020 season before rolling to an 11-2 record in 2021, winning the SWAC title with a 27-10 win over Prairie View A&M in the title game. The Tigers lost to South Carolina State in the Celebration Bowl; otherwise their only other losses over his last 26 games was a 12-7 setback at FBS Louisiana-Monroe in Sept. '21 and this year's bowl.

Seven of his players on the 2021 JSU roster earned a professional opportunity in the NFL, CFL or USFL, including James Houston IV, who was drafted in the sixth round by the Detroit Lions. He also signed cornerback Travis Hunter, considered the top high school prospect in the nation, to an NLI in December 2021, the highest ranked prospect to ever sign with an HBCU or an FCS program.

Sanders was voted the SWAC's Coach of the Year for a second straight season; 12 of his players earned some level of All-SWAC honors. For the 2021 campaign, he also garnered honors for the FCS Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year, BOXTOTOW National Coach of the Year and Black College Hall of Fame Coach of the Year.

Prior to joining the collegiate coaching ranks at Jackson State, Sanders had been involved in coaching for over a decade. He was the offensive coordinator at Trinity Christian School (Cedar Hill, Texas), leading the Tigers to three straight Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS) titles and a 42-3 record.

A two-time unanimous first-team All-American at Florida State, he won the third annual Jim Thorpe Award in 1988, presented to the nation's top defensive back. That same year, he

finished eighth in the voting for the Heisman Trophy.

He finished his Seminole football career with 14 interceptions, three returned for touchdowns; those are still tied for third in the FSU record book. He owns the longest interception return in school history when he raced 100 yards for a TD against Tulsa as a freshman. Sanders also racked up a still-school record 1,429 punt return yards with three more scores. Playing for the late Hall of Fame coach Bobby Bowden, FSU was 36-9-1 in his four seasons as a Seminole, finishing as the nation's No. 2 team as a junior in 1987 and No. 3 his senior season in 1988.

He also played one season of baseball for FSU (as a sophomore in 1987, batting .267 with three home runs, 21 runs batted in and 27 stolen bases) and ran sprints and relays in track (he was the 1988 Metro Conference outdoor champion in the 100- and 200-meter dashes). He was inducted into Florida State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1994 and into the College Football Hall of Fame in its 2011 class.

Sanders is the only athlete ever to play in both a Super Bowl (twice) and the World Series.

He appeared in 188 regular season games (157 starts) in the National Football League with five teams: Atlanta (1989-93; the Falcons selected him as the fifth overall pick in the first round in the '89 Draft), San Francisco (1994), Dallas (1995-99), Washington (2000) and Baltimore (2004-05). He was the NFL Defensive Player of the Year for 1994, was named to its 1990s All-Decade Team and to the NFL's All-Time Team in 2020, the latter as part of the league's 100th season celebration.

"Prime Time" made 53 interceptions over the course of his career, with 512 tackles, 19 forced fumbles and 13 recoveries. He amassed 7,838 all-purpose yards, primarily through returns (2,199 punt, 3,523 kickoff). He also caught 60 passes for 784 yards and three touchdowns as in 1996, he became just one of two, two-way starters in the NFL since the platoon days of the 1950s. He set an NFL record with 19 career touchdowns on returns, nine coming via interception returns with six on punts, three on kickoffs and one fumble run back.

In Major League Baseball, he was drafted out of high school in the sixth round of the 1985 draft by the Kansas City Royals and then selected in the '88 draft by the New York Yankees.

Sanders played a total of 11 seasons in professional baseball, nine in the major leagues with the New York Yankees (1989-90), Atlanta (1991-94), Cincinnati (1994-95, 1997, 2001) and San Francisco (1995). In 641 major league games, he owned a career batting average of .263 with 39 home runs, 168 runs batted in and 186 stolen bases.

Prime Effect

Much has been reported and written about the Prime Effect and the numbers are staggering. CU had a 97 percent season ticket renewal rate and then on April 17 became the first school nationally to announce a sellout of season tickets. It marks the first time CU has sold out of season tickets before August and the ninth time in program history. All six home games have completely sold out for the first time in CU history. CU appeared on FOX Big Noon Kickoff the first two weeks of the season and will again in Week 5 against USC, while also having the premier ABC spot for Week 4 at Oregon. The football team has seen a social media increase of 447% for followers to the accounts on Instagram, Facebook, Tik Tok, Threads and X, a gain of over 1 million followers from 226,800 to over 1.9 million, since Coach Prime's hiring.

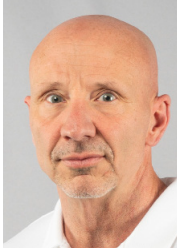

Prime Staff

The staff that Coach Prime has put together is nothing short of astounding. The 10 full-time assistant coaches have combined to coach for 210 seasons of experience, including 94 at the Power 5 level or in the NFL. They have cumulatively coached over 2,100 games and won 1,284 with 37 10-win seasons, 66 bowl games and six national championships among them. Add in the eight analysts, and the numbers jump even higher, as that group has collectively coached 312 seasons of football, 3,386 games with 1,924 wins. Seven have served as a head coach in college or the NFL and in college, they combine for 88 bowl game appearances, 51 10-win seasons, 40 conference championships, 29 playoff appearances and six national championships.

The two teams are tied in the all-time series, each with six wins, as CU has won three in a row in the series after the Cardinal had reeled off a five-game winning streak that dated back to 1991.

- Each team has won three games with both as members of the Pac-12 Conference, which CU joined in 2011.
- The series dates back 116 years, to a Friday after Thanksgiving game in Denver in 1904, when the Cardinal left the state with a 33-0 whitewash of the Buffaloes. Otherwise, four of the next five games in the series were all decided by a touchdown or less until the first three Pac-12 league meetings, in which Stanford outscored CU 138-17.
- Colorado won the first three games in Boulder, until Cardinal came to town in 2012 and won 48-0, ending a CU streak of 150 straight game it had scored in at home (and remains the only opponent shutout at Folsom Field in the last 34 years).
- Stanford captured the first three games in Palo Alto (including the first two played there in the early 1990s, the last two games in the series before the schools became conference mates).

SIGNATURE ANNIVERSARY GAME

30th. Stanford was the opponent for CU's first-ever Thursday night game in Boulder (Sept. 6, 1990), and the Buffaloes battled back from a 14-0 and 17-14 deficits to win 21-17. Eric Bieniemy scored on fourth-and-goal from the 1-yard line with 12 seconds remaining in the game to give CU the win after Stanford had retaken the lead with just over four minutes to play. It was CU's first of what would be 11 wins in its national championship season. As a freshman in 1987, Bieniemy rushed 14 times for 119 yards and a touchdown in CU's 31-17 win; it was his first of 22 career games where he would rush for 100 or more yards, still the school record. While some say it was controversial but replays showed Bieniemy scored, the football Gods helped Stanford in the '93 game (a 41-37 Cardinal win), when Stanford was awarded a touchdown on a Steve Stenstrom to Tony Cline 7-yard pass that Cline held on to for barely half a second before Dwayne Davis knocked the ball out of his grasp—no way a touchdown today with instant replay; however, had it been ruled incomplete, Stanford still had fourth down to run a play, trying to rally from a 37-27 deficit with four minutes left.

SERIES: DID YOU KNOW?

In 1977, the Buffs opened as the No. 12 team in the nation in the Associated Press poll, coming off winning the 1976 Big 8 Championship and defeated the Cardinal in a thriller in Boulder, 27-21. TB James Mayberry starred on offense (152 yards, 2 TD) and LB Brian Cabral on defense (25 tackles, 13 solo). Cabral also had an interception (in the end zone with CU leading, 20-14 midway through the fourth quarter) and two passes broken up in being named the Big 8 Conference's player of the week.

COLORADO BUFFALOES: ON THIS DAY

Colorado is 11-3 all-time on October 13, having last played on the date in 2007. That was a big win over Texas A & M on a solemn occasion, as long-time CU athletic staffer Fred Casotti passed away the day before. Here's a brief look at some of the games played on the date: 1894—CU scores three touchdowns of the 4-point variety to one by the Denver Athletic Club in a 12-4 win over the DAC in Denver. 1951—CU rushes for 325 yards and forced five Missouri turnovers as the Buffs beat Missouri, 34-13, in Boulder. Ralph Curtis gains 121 of those yards and scores three touchdowns in the rout, including a 51-yard dash that gave CU the lead for good at 14-7. 1956—The Buffs crush Colorado State, 47-7, on the strength of a 26-point second quarter after a scoreless first. Seven different Buffs score touchdowns, with Howard Cook scoring twice and Bob Stransky running for on and throwing for another. 1973—Dave Logan's 52-yard punt return for a touchdown early in the third quarter breaks open a close 7-3 game as the Buffs defeat Air Force, 38-17, in what was the Falcons' final visit to this day to Folsom Field. Logan returned three kicks for 98 yards in the game, which also saw Billy Waddy score twice. 1984—Steve Vogel threw touchdown passes of 43 and 85 yards to Ron Brown to take a 23-12 lead in the third quarter and then held on for a 23-21 win over Iowa State in Boulder—CU's lone win in a 1-10 season. 1990—CU used a dominant third quarter to break open a 14-12 game at halftime in defeating Iowa State, 28-12. The week after the infamous Fifth Down game, the Buffs came in ranked No. 11 but dropped to No. 14 despite the win as pollsters bought into the crying by some that Colorado should have given

the game to Missouri. Eric Bieniemy ran for 131 yards and a touchdown, and Kanavis McGhee (12 tackles) led a defense that had seven sacks. 2001—Derek McCoy caught five passes for 113 yards as No. 20 CU celebrated being ranked for the first time in 22 weeks with a 31-21 win over No. 25 Texas A & M in Boulder. After Jeremy Flores opened the game with two field goals, including a career-best 51-yard effort for a 6-0 CU lead, the Aggies took a 14-6 lead on a pair of touchdown passes. CU slowly worked its way back into the game and used touchdowns from McCoy and Cortlen Johnson to wrestle lead back in the second half en route to the win. 2007—In a rare night game at Kansas State (that ended exactly at Midnight), the Wildcats ended CU's three-game winning streak with a 47-20 thumping of the Buffaloes. KSU scored the game's last 17 points to pull away from CU, spoiling a great game from Hugh Charles, who ran for 171 yards and a touchdown.

OCTOBER 13 COLORADO MVP: Kory Mossoni, 2001. With Colorado ahead, 24-21, as the game entered the final minute, it was his sack of A&M quarterback Mark Farris that forced a fumble near midfield, ending any chance of an Aggie comeback when Joey Johnson picked up the loose ball and returned it 52 yards for the clinching score.

Shedeur Sanders Off To Best Start In School History

QB Shedeur Sanders is quickly turning heads in the 2023 season, and through the first half of the regular season is in the top six nationally in six different categories and is second in the nation in completions per game at 31.0. Through week 6, he is the only player in the nation with 2,000 passing yards, coming in at 2,020 with his 336.7 yards per game ranking second and his 16 touchdown passes ranks third nationally while his points responsible for and total offense marks rank sixth in the nation.

Shedeur Sanders Clutch Stats Top The Nation

Shedeur Sanders is quickly putting together one of the best seasons in CU history, and when you look at clutch situations, his numbers are even better. Even after a sub-par performance at Oregon, he is still second in the nation in passing with 336.7 yards per game, completing 72.7 percent of his passes with 2,020 yards, 16 touchdowns and two interceptions.

He is one of the best in the nation in clutch situations. On third down, he is 38-of-58 for 445 yards with three touchdowns, two interceptions and 24 first downs, tied for third most in the nation. On third-and-long (10-plus) he leads the nation in passing, completing 16-of-20 (80.0) passes for 235 yards and has 10 first downs in those situations, most nationally. He is also 5-of-5 passing on fourth down with five first downs and two touchdowns.

In the fourth quarter, he is 44-of-58 (75.9) for 669 yards with seven touchdowns and no interceptions. His fourth quarter yardage leads the nation and his QB rating of 212.6 in the fourth quarter is the best nationally for quarterbacks with 30-plus attempts in the quarter.

He is also great when the Buffs are trailing by one score, hitting on 59-of-77 (.766) passes for 544 yards with four touchdowns and no interceptions and a QB rating of 153.1. His completion percentage in those situations is second nationally and best for quarterbacks with more than 20 pass attempts in that situation.

Production Gained

Looking at the 2022 production for the Buffaloes, especially when looking at impact plays both on offense and defense, and it's clear the roster has been upgraded.

PASSING & RECEIVING

Last season, the Buffaloes completed 179 passes for 2,075 yards and 10 touchdowns. The receivers and running backs the Buffs brought in accounted for 210 receptions for 2,845 yards and 26 touchdowns last season, the most significant of those numbers the jump in touchdowns from 10 to 26.

Shedeur Sanders completed 344-of-488 passes for 3,752 yards and 40 touchdowns to just six interceptions. Compared to the Buffs 2022 numbers, that's almost doubling the number of completions for 1,673 more yards and 30 more touchdown passes with four fewer interceptions.

RUSHING

If you count Alton McCaskill's 2021 numbers since he didn't play in 2022, the rushing numbers the Buffs got out of the portal accounted for 242 more rushing yards on 42 fewer attempts and more than doubled the touchdown output with 24 compared to the 11 rushing touchdowns CU had as a team in 2022.

TOUCHDOWNS

Taking those numbers, CU accounted for 50 touchdowns rushing and receiving (not to mention Sanders' 40 passing touchdowns) compared to the 21 touchdowns the Buffs offense produced in 2022.

DEFENSE

Looking at impact plays on defense, the Buffs certainly upgraded on that side of the ball, as well. Last season, CU accounted for 49 tackles for loss where the new players coming in accounted for 72.5 tackles for loss, an increase of 23.5. Sacks dramatically increased from nine CU had as a team to 39 among the new players. Interceptions more than doubled from six to 13 and pass breakups was relatively even but still increases from 32 to 35.

2023 Colorado Football Anniversaries

- 1898** Now in its ninth year of intercollegiate football, Colorado plays its first opponent from outside the state boundaries, as Nebraska visited Boulder on Nov. 17; the then Bugeaters left town with a 23-10 win over the Silver & Gold.
- 1908** Fred Folsom returns for his third of four stints as head coach, and leads CU to the Colorado Football Association title and a 5-2 record.
- 1923** Colorado completes the season with a 9-0-0 record, its best in 34 years of football, as CU outscores its opponents by 280-27 (no team scored more than seven). The popularity of the team is at an all-time high, and thus the school begins work on a new stadium on the northeast side of campus.
- 1928** (Oct. 13) Bill Smith records the first known 100-yard rushing game ever by a CU player, running for 132 yards and a TD in a 21-7 win at UNC.
- 1933** Sophomore William "Kayo" Lam bursts on the scene and leads CU to a 7-2 record. It's the last year the school is known as the Silver & Gold, as "Buffaloes" wins a contest the following year and the teams have been named such ever since.
- 1943** The full effect of World War II hits college football, CU being no exception. The Buffs played a limited conference schedule (two games), sweeping Utah home and away, lost twice to No. 18 Colorado College and defeated three military teams in going 5-2.
- 1958** Howard Cook ties Byron White's record by scoring 25 points against Arizona in Tucson, as he scored four touchdowns and kicked an extra point in CU's 65-12 rout of the Wildcats; the record would stand for 43 years. Cook also became the first Buff to lead the nation in punt returns.
- 1963** The season finale against Air Force on Nov. 23, is postponed for two weeks as the nation mourned the death of President John F. Kennedy.
- 1988** (Oct. 22) Oklahoma edges CU, 17-14, in the first night game ever at Folsom. A 7-2 start paves the way for the Buffs to crack the Top 20, as at No. 19 the Buffs are ranked for the first time since 1978; an 8-4 final record is the school's best since a similar mark in 1976.
- 1993** (Oct. 16) Colorado wins 27-10 at Oklahoma, the 78th victory by head coach Bill McCartney, as he becomes the all-time winningest coach in school history, passing Fred Folsom. In that game, Lamont Warren throws a 34-yard touchdown pass to Charles Johnson; Warren slipped on the slick Astroturf and Johnson was interfered with but still caught the ball while lying on the ground in a play that was selected as the national play of the year (the first of two in a row for CU). Johnson went on to be named the offensive player of the year in the Big 8, the first wide receiver to ever receive the award.
- 1998** Two milestones this season: CU's 37-8 win over Iowa State is the school's 600th all-time, and the 51-43 win over Oregon in the Aloha Bowl is the 1,000th game in school history.

Coach Prime Era Begins With 100th Season At Folsom Field

The 2023 season is the first under Deion "Coach Prime" Sanders and the 100th at CU's Folsom Field. CU was the first team in the nation to sell out of season tickets in April and is now completely sold out for the entire season, the first time in CU history CU has sold out all of its home games. The Buffs opened its home season with Nebraska and Colorado State in back-to-back weeks, just the 11th time CU hosted its two rivals in the same season, and for just the fourth time in CU history CU defeated both the Huskers and Rams at Folsom Field (also in 1904, '56 and '89). USC will visit Folsom for the final time as a conference member to close out September (30th) and the other games are against Stanford on Friday, Oct. 13 for Family Weekend, against Oregon State Nov. 4 for Homecoming and the season will close out at home on Nov. 11 against Arizona for Senior Day and Veteran's Day.

CU Football Historical Snapshot

Colorado is in its second century of intercollegiate football, as the Buffaloes continue their 134th season of intercollegiate football in 2023. Through Week 5, CU has played in 1,296 games with an all-time record of 722-538-36.

In FBS, only 23 programs began earlier than the Buffs did in 1890 and only three schools west of Colorado are in that 23, all Pac-12 programs in California (1886), USC (1888) and Washington (1889). Only 13 programs have played more seasons than the Buffs with 133 entering 2023, no Pac-12 programs as CU and Washington are the only two programs in the west that will play in their respective 134th season of intercollegiate football.

Playing In Front Of Six Straight Sellouts A School Record

Colorado has played in front of a sellout crowd for each of its first six games in 2023, with three home games and tilts at TCU, Oregon and Arizona State. The streak will be extended to seven as this week's Stanford game has also sold out.

CU is one of just five teams in the nation to play in front of a sellout every game this season. Others include Georgia (6, 5 home, at Auburn), Iowa (6, four home, at Iowa State, at Penn State), Notre Dame (7, three home, vs. Navy in Ireland, at N.C. State, at Duke, at Louisville), Tennessee (5, three home, vs. Virginia in Nashville, at Florida). Notre Dame will play in at least nine straight sellouts to open the season and Tennessee six.

Michael Harrison Among Most Productive Tight Ends

Michael Harrison is among the most productive tight ends in recent memory for the Buffs. With 26 receptions for 215 yards and four touchdowns, he is tied for third among tight ends nationally in receptions and receiving touchdowns. Two tight ends have five touchdown receptions and he's tied with three other players with four.

His 27 receptions are already the most by a tight end at Colorado in 14 season, since Riar Geer had 36 receptions for 402 yards and 4 touchdowns in 2009. His four touchdowns are also tied for the most by a walk-on in a season in CU history alongside Scotty McKnight, who was considered a walk-on in his freshman season 2007 when he had 43 receptions for 488 yards and four touchdowns. He is already also nearing the top 20 for tight ends in a CU career for receptions, needing two more to move into 19th place.

Five With 100 Receiving Yards A School Record

CU has set a new school record with five different players recording a 100-yard receiving game. CU actually tied the record the first game of the season as four different players hit the mark, the first time more than two players had done so in the same game. Xavier Weaver, Jimmy Horn Jr., Dylan Edwards and Travis Hunter all hit the mark in the first game and Omarion Miller joined the list against USC. Previously, four different players hit the mark in 1984, 2016 and 2017.

Roster Turnover Numbers

Much has been document and opinionated about the roster turnover Coach Prime and staff undertook from last year's 1-11 team that was outscored by an average of 45-15. As defensive coordinator Charles Kelly said at Pac-12 media day, "We've taken criticism, and that's fine, but we've done within what the rules allow for us to create the best possible roster for the University of Colorado and we don't apologize for that." As it can be assumed, the Buffs lead the nation in most things related to roster turnover. A look:

Travis Hunter

Travis Hunter is revolutionizing the way college football is played, starting both ways each of the first three games at both cornerback and wide receiver and recording the top two scrimmage snap games in CU history in the first two before leaving the CSU game at halftime with an injury after a late hit. It's hard to put into context, but in the wake of his performances, FOX Sports put together a list of the Top 10 two-way performers in the last 30 seasons.

In chronological order, they are Champ Bailey, Georgia, Charles Woodson, Michigan, Chris Gable, Ohio State, Owen Marecic, Stanford, Shaq Thompson, Washington, Nick Vigil, Utah State, Myles Jacks, UCLA, Jabrill Peppers, Michigan and Adoree' Jackson, USC.

Hunter also leads the nation in 3rd-and-10 or longer receiving with four receptions for an average of 26.3 yards and four first downs. No other player has more than two first downs in that situation.

National Player of the Week Honors

Colorado's trio of Dylan Edwards, Shedeur Sanders and Travis Hunter each earned some type of national player of the week honors for the season opening performance at TCU, and Xavier Weaver added to it after the second week. Sanders was named the Walter Camp National Player of the Week, the Davey O'Brien National QB of the Week, and the CFP National Performer of the Week. Edwards was named the Doak Walker National RB of the week and the Shaun Alexander National Freshman of the Week. Hunter was named the Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week and the Paul Hornung National Player of the Week.

Prior to the week, CU had a collective 29 national players of the week dating back 53 years to 1970. The 13 awards from those three players surpasses the most award from a single season in CU history.

Three Receivers With 10+ A First

In Week 1's victory over TCU, Jimmy Horn Jr. and Travis Hunter became the first duo to both catch 11-plus passes in a game in CU history. Xavier Weaver added his name to the double figure receptions list with 10 against Nebraska. In CU history there have only been 30 10-reception games entering 2023, and the this group of receivers already has the most players with 10-plus receptions in a season.



Comebacks, Rivals & Turnarounds

Bufs One Of Four To Go 3-0 After 11 Losses

The 2023 Buffaloes are just the fourth team in FBS history to start a season 3-0 after losing 11 games the previous season, and the first team since Minnesota accomplished the feat in 2008 in the second season under coach Tim Brewster, who is currently the Buffs tight ends coach. The other two teams to accomplish the feat were the 1985 Indiana Hoosiers, led by Bill Mallory, who led the Buffaloes through a successful era in the 1970s, and the 2000 South Carolina Gamecocks, led by Lou Holtz. Each of those teams were in the second year of their respective tenures and those schools.

Beating CSU, Nebraska In Folsom A Rarity

With its thrilling 43-35 win over Colorado State a week after toppling Nebraska 36-14, the 2023 version of the Colorado Buffaloes became just the fourth team to beat the Huskers and Rams at Folsom Field, and first since 1989. The Buffs and Rams played at Invesco Field at Mile High for most of this century, and prior to that didn't play regularly every season. The 1952 Buffs tied Nebraska and beat Colorado State, as well.

On that final drive, he was 5-of-6 passing for 106 yards, hitting Jimmy Horn on a 45-yard strike with just 36 seconds left and then connecting with Michael Harrison on the two-point conversion to tie the game. Two other game-winning drives come to mind as some of the best in school history.

Fourth Quarter Comebacks

CU has orchestrated three fourth-quarter comebacks in the first six games of the season, first two separate four-point deficits at TCU to open the season followed by an 11-point deficit against Colorado State in Week 3 and a field goal deficit to start the fourth quarter at Arizona State. The first two are two of 14 fourth-quarter comebacks in the past 30 seasons of four or more points (needing more than a FG to tie/win). Of the below, the Colorado State comeback this season was just the third where the Buffs were down 10-plus points with under 10 minutes remaining, joining Washington State 2012 and Michigan 1994. Colorado also nearly pulled off the biggest comeback in its history against USC, down 34-7 (-27) before pulling within one score in the fourth quarter.

The 2023 Buffaloes became the first team to be ranked in the Week 1 AP College Football Top 25 after having 11 losses the previous season, coming in at No. 22 in that first poll after being No. 25 in the Coaches Poll. CU improved four spots to No. 18 after beating Nebraska (21 in the coaches poll) then slipped one spot to No. 19 after a double OT win against Colorado State, with the coaches matching that ranking of No. 19. After falling to Oregon, the Buffs received votes the next two weeks. .

TV Ratings & Attendance

BUFFS MOST WATCHED TEAM IN AMERICA

The Colorado Buffaloes are the most-watched team in the country. Taking figures from SportsMediaWatch.com not counting games they don't report, which are mostly regional and conference televised games, the Buffs have had a combined 42.8 million viewers so far this season, all in the first five weeks, almost double second place Alabama, which has had 21.56 million viewers in four games that were reported. CU's average of 8.57 million per game is more than 2 million more per game than any other team, with Florida State next with 6.45 million in three games.

Through the first five weeks of the season, CU was the most watched team of the weekend three times and second place twice, and all five games brought in more than 7 million followers. Only three other games nationally brought in 7 million or more viewers through week 5, giving CU five of the eight most-watched games in the opening month of the season.

BUFFS ON NATIONAL TELEVISION

The In the first five weeks of the season, CU appeared on network TV four times with the other game on the flagship ESPN station. After appearing on Pac-12 Networks at Arizona, CU will have its sixth game on a major national network against Stanford on ESPN. The only other known game is at Washington State on Friday, Nov. 17 on FS1.

CU has already appeared on national network television four times, matching the most in CU history along with the 1990 national championship season (also coming off an 11-1 season in 1989 as opposed to a 1-11 season in 2022). The most games CU has appeared on network TV or the flagship ESPN channel is seven times, also in 1990, and CU has six such games with four regular season games still to be selected. In terms of most games on national TV not counting conference or regional sports networks, CU already has seven such games with the CU record nine in 2008 followed by eight four times, most recently in 2016.

CU must appear twice on the Pac-12 Networks, equal to the number of non-conference home games the Buffs hosted in 2023.

Buff First Team Nationally To Sell Out Of 2023 Season Tickets

The Colorado Buffaloes officially sold out of season tickets on April 17, selling out for the first time since 1996 and for the first time before August and ninth time in CU history. A poll of BCS SIDs found that the Buffs were the first team to sellout in 2023, ahead of Tennessee (May 25), Appalachian State (June 7) and Auburn (July 5).

Buff's Completely Sellout Of All Entire Season For First Time

The Colorado Buffaloes announced a complete sellout of all its home games for the first time in program history after the Arizona game became the final game to sellout on Sept. 19. The record previously was five games in the 1993 season, a standard that stood for 30 years. CU sold out of four of six games a total of five times, all coming from 1990-96.

Bufs In The NFL

NFL Bufs

In 2022, the Bufs had 15 players in the NFL, on an active or practice squad roster at some point during the regular or postseason. Rookie Nate Landman became the 278th player in CU history on an NFL roster, and those players have played a combined 1,343 seasons. CU has had 276 players drafted, including 24 in the first round, and 32 players in the first 32 picks (what today would be first round). The Bufs had the most players in the NFL in 1999 with 39 and have twice had runs of 30-plus players, first from 1977-81 and again from 1995-99 and briefly again in 2002 and 2005.

Super Bowl Bufs

A total of 66 former CU players have accumulated 96 Super Bowl appearances and 37 former players have a combined 55 Super Bowl rings. A total of 37 of the 57 Super Bowl games have featured at least one former Buff and the most Bufs in a single Super Bowl came in Super Bowl XXX when six Bufs played for the Pittsburgh Steelers.

In 2020, 247Sports put together a list of the 54 Super Bowls to date and compiled a list of the all-time college leaders. At that time, CU ranked tied for 10th with 93 players and tied for 21st in Super Bowl scoring among college teams with 37 points. Cliff Branch (18), Mason Crosby (7), Cullen Bryant (6), Boyd Dowler (6) have scored in Super Bowl games.

NFL Stadiums

CU has played 42 games in 14 different NFL stadiums, and 25 games in six current NFL venues. CU is 15-10 in current NFL stadiums, including 12-5 in Denver, 1-0 in Foxborough, 1-0 in Seattle, 1-2 in Houston, 0-1 in Jacksonville, 0-1 in Kansas City and 0-1 in Santa Clara. CU has also played in former NFL stadiums in San Diego, Irving, Seattle, Houston, Miami, Tempe, Anaheim and Los Angeles. Four times the Bufs have played in two NFL stadiums in the same season, in 2002 (Denver, Houston), 2004 (Kansas City, Houston), 2008 (Denver, Jacksonville) and 2016 (Denver, Santa Clara).

NFL Scouts

Since 2000, a total of 1,218 NFL Scouts have attended Colorado games (home, road and neutral). So far in 2023, 58 scouts from 24 teams have scouted the Bufs: Arizona, Atlanta, Baltimore, Buffalo, Carolina, Chicago, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Denver, Detroit, Green Bay, Jacksonville, Kansas City, LA Chargers, LA Rams, Las Vegas, Miami, Minnesota, New Orleans, Pittsburgh, San Francisco, Seattle, Tennessee and Washington. Against USC, a total of 26 scouts from 18 teams were in attendance, one of the better attended games in CU history. The record is 31 scouts from 20 teams against UCLA in 2016.

A Game-by-Game Look In 2023: Week 1 at TCU: Nine scouts from eight teams; Week 2 vs. Nebraska 10 scouts from four teams; Week 3 vs. Colorado State: four scouts from three teams; Week 4 at Oregon: 1 scout from 1 team; Week 5 vs. USC: 26 scouts from 18 teams; Week 6 at ASU: 8 Scouts from 6 teams. At least 16 scouts from 9 teams are expected for the Stanford game.

Crosby Finishes 16th Season

PK Mason Crosby finished his 16th season in 2022, matching Stan Brock (1980-95) for the most by a former Buff. Crosby has been with Green Bay his entire career and is the team's all-time leading scorer, both in regular season and postseason games. Crosby has played in 258 career games and has scored 1,918 points, hitting 395-of-485 field goals and 733-of-753 PATs. Crosby currently ranks No. 11 in NFL history in scoring and is second among active players. His 395 field goals ranks No. 13 in NFL history and his 733 PATs ranks fifth all-time.

1994 Bufs/1995 NFL Draft

All 11 offensive starters from the 1994 CU team played in the NFL, with 10 being drafted, and another six from defense played in the NFL, making 17 of the 22 starters from that team playing in the NFL. The 1995 NFL Draft was a special one for CU, when 10 Bufs were drafted. CU is one of just 14 schools who have had 10 players drafted in a single draft in the seven-round era (1994-present).

CFL, USFL & XFL Bufs

Three current Bufs played in the CFL in 2022, Tony Brown, Mustafa Johnson and Chris Mulumba. The resurrected USFL began play again in 2022 and four Bufs played in that first season, Delrick Abrams, Drew Lewis, Devin Ross and Evan Worthington. The XFL also made a comeback in 2023 playing from February into May. Also playing in the XFL was Lewis (Houston), and he was joined by Javier Edwards (San Antonio), Steven Montez (Seattle), Carson Wells (St. Louis).
