THE GAME: In a season already full of flexibility and fluidity, No. 2 Stanford (1-0, 0-0) has adjusted its schedule and is now in Las Vegas, set to visit the UNLV Lady Rebels on Saturday, Dec. 5 at 2 p.m. Ben Wilson and Jeremy Roach have the call on the Mountain West Network and Kevin Danna will handle the radio broadcast on TuneIn.

THE RUNDOWN:

Stanford's 68-point, season-opening victory over Cal Poly was its third-largest win in school history ... The Cardinal improved to 35-12 all-time in its first game of the season ... Tara VanDerveer now owns 1,095 career wins and is four victories shy of passing Pat Summitt (1,098) as the winningest coach in women's college basketball history ... Haley Jones' 16 points and 11 rebounds ensured that Stanford has had a double-double performer in three-straight three season-openers ... Kiana Williams has been named on the watch lists for the Naismith Trophy, Wade Trophy and Ann Meyers Drysdale Award ... Lexie Hull joins Williams on watch lists for the Naismith and Wade Trophies, while Jones is also on the watch list for the Naismith Trophy and Cheryl Miller Award ... Francesca Belibi and Cameron Brink are both on the Katrina McClain Award watch list ... Stanford's preseason ranking of No. 2 is its highest since the 2009-10 season ... The Cardinal was picked to win the Pac-12 ... Stanford returns 84 percent of its scoring, 69 percent of its rebounding, 85 percent of its assists, 88 percent of its made 3-pointers, 68 percent of its blocks and 82 percent of its steals from last season.

The Cardinal has won six in a row against the Vegas locals, including a 74-33 victory in December of 2017 at Maples Pavilion. The only two losses to UNLV in program history happened prior to the arrival of Tara VanDerveer. Stanford has not lost to a team from the Mountain West Conference since Dec. 20, 1986 against Fresno State.

WHAT TO EXPECT »

- Stanford arrived to Las Vegas on Wednesday, Dec. 2, temporarily relocated training and competition due to the emergency directive issued by the Santa Clara County Public Health Department on Nov. 28.
- Stanford returns four starters and 10 letterwinners from a team that went 27-6, tied for second in the Pac-12, advancing to the conference tournament championship game, and finished last season ranked No. 7 in the country.
- Joining that group is the nation's sixth-best recruiting class - featuring two five-star standouts in Cameron Brink and Jana Van Gytenbeek and a top Australian amateur, Agnes Emma-Nnopus.
- Of Stanford's 25 all-time McDonald's All-Americans, six are slated to play this season for the Cardinal.

CATCHING YOU UP »

- Stanford opened its season in the latest season-opener for the program since 1993 last Wednesday, taking down Cal Poly, 108-40.
- The 68-point win was the third-largest margin of victory in program history.
- Stanford's 108 points scored were its second-most points ever scored in a season-opener, only behind 119 points scored vs. Wisconsin in 1988.
- Five players scored in double figures for the Cardinal, including 19 from Lexie Hull and 16 points with 11 rebounds for Haley Jones, her second career double-double.
- The freshman class impressed, led by Cameron Brink's 17 points and six rebounds. Brink's 17 points are the most for a Stanford rookie in their first collegiate game since Candice Wiggins had 24 at Utah in 2004.
- Jana Van Gytenbeek finished with five assists for Stanford, the most for a freshman in their first collegiate game since Jeanette Pohlen had five at Yale in 2007.
- Fifth-year senior Anna Wilson made her sixth career start against the Mustangs.
- Hannah Jump scored 15 points, her first game in double figures since last Jan. 26 vs. Utah, breaking a 12-game streak of not scoring more than nine.
- Kiana Williams has now scored in double figures in 10-straight games.

SUCCESS AGAINST FORMER CARDINAL »

- Tara VanDerveer is 50-5 all-time against her former assistants and 48-9 her former players.
- UNLV is coached by former Stanford player and assistant coach, Lindy La Rocque. Saturday's game is only the second time VanDerveer has faced an opposing coach that was both a player and assistant at Stanford (first was last season vs. Cal's Charmin Smith).

HIGH EXPECTATIONS »

- Stanford entered the year with its highest preseason ranking in the Top-25 since 2009-10.
- The Cardinal was a mainstay in the top-10 a year ago, beginning the season ranked No. 3 before an ascent to No. 1, the program's first in seven seasons. Stanford remained there for three weeks before dropping to fifth, and never went below No. 8 before finishing the year at No. 7.
- Stanford has been ranked in the top-10 in 27 straight AP polls, the fifth-longest active streak in the country.
- The Cardinal is second in total appearances in the AP poll with 570 behind Tennessee (740). Its 429 appearances in the top 10 are third, trailing Tennessee (617) and Connecticut (495) and its 249 appear-

ances in the top five are fourth behind Tennessee (464), Connecticut (449) and Louisiana Tech (278).

- The Cardinal had been ranked in 312 consecutive polls, the third-longest streak all-time, until it fell out on Dec. 25, 2017. Stanford has appeared in each of the past 48 AP polls, the ninth-longest active streak in the country.

PAC-12 PROWESS »

- Approaching a unique scheduling setup, Stanford is set to play a full, 22-game, round-robin, Pac-12 schedule, including eight games against teams that are currently ranked in the AP Top-25. The Cardinal was 8-5 against ranked competition last year, playing in seven-straight ranked contests to end the season.
- Stanford's eight wins against the Top 25 last season was its most since the 2016-17 season.

WHO'S BACK? »

- Boasting one of the deepest rosters of talent in the nation, Stanford returns a healthy majority of every statistical category from a season ago, including 84 percent of its scoring, 69 percent of its rebounding, 85 percent of its assists, 88 percent of its made 3-pointers, 68 percent of its blocks and 82 percent of its steals.
- Of note is the return of Haley Jones, the number one recruit in the high school Class of 2019. Jones played in 18 games for the Cardinal as a freshman before suffering an injury that would end her season. Jones is back at full strength, looking to build off of 11.4 point, 4.2 rebound and 2.4 assist per game averages.
- Jones was the first freshman since Nicole Powell in 2001 to score in double digits in each of her first four conference games.
- Along with Jones in the sophomore class are a trio who etched their name into Stanford record books as rookies. Francesca Belibi finished the season shooting 58.2 percent from the floor, the fourth-best field goal shooting percentage of any freshman in program history. Hannah Jump now ranks sixth in Stanford freshman history in both made 3-pointers (43) and 3-point shooting percentage (41.3). Ashton Prechtel blocked 31 shots, the fifth-most by a freshman in program history.
- The Hull twins, Lexie and Lacie, have played key roles for the Cardinal in their two years with the program - Lexie finished last season with the team lead in rebounds and steals, ranking second in points and assists. Lacie has started 48 games for Stanford and has twice been named an honorable mention on the Pac-12 All-Defensive Team.
- Anna Wilson was granted a fifth year by the NCAA and is joined in the senior class by Alyssa Jerome, who has played in 100 career games with 25 starts.
- Senior Maya Dodson opted out of the season.

KI IS THE KEY »

- Senior Kiana Williams led the Cardinal in minutes played, points, assists and made 3-pointers as a junior and was named honorable mention All-America by the WBCA, Associated Press and USBWA.
- She joined the 1,000-point club in a win over No. 23 Tennessee and currently ranks 24th in program history with 1,385 career points.
- Williams carried the Cardinal through the wear and tear of conference play, including a highlight weekend in the mountains, at Utah and Colorado. There, she combined to hit 11 3-pointers in the two games, the most in back-to-back games since Bonnie Samuelson in 2014-15. She poured in a career-high 29 points against the Buffaloes, including seven 3-pointers and the game-winning shot at the buzzer.
- Named All-Pac-12 by both the coaches and media, Williams averaged 18.7 points, 2.0 rebounds and 3.7 assists at the Pac-12 Tournament, with 10 of her 19 made field goals coming from behind the arc. She is averaging 17.4 points on 50 percent shooting including 48.5 percent from three in nine Pac-12 Tournament games.
- Her 232 made 3-pointers rank fifth in program history and are the fifth-most by any Power 5 player in the country the last three seasons. She is only five away from Bonnie Samuelson in fourth.

WHO'S NEW? »

- The Cardinal welcome the nation's sixth-ranked recruiting class, featuring the No. 3 and No. 39 ranked players in the country in Cameron Brink and Jana Van Gytenbeek, along with top Australian prospect Agnes Emma-Nnopus.
- Brink was named a McDonald's All-American, Jordan Brand Classic All-American and a three-time Naismith High School All-American, in addition to being named the Gatorade Oregon Player of the Year twice.
- Brink comes from a basketball family, as both her mother and father played at Virginia Tech. She is the goddaughter of Dell and Sonya Curry; godsibling of Steph, Seth and Sydel Curry.
- Van Gytenbeek etched her name throughout the Colorado state record book, setting the state record for career assists (679), while setting her high school record for career, single-season and single-game points, assists and steals. She was named honorable mention All-America by both the WBCA and Naismith as a senior, as well as the Gatorade Colorado Player of the Year.

- Emma-Nnoku, born in Nigeria and moved to Australia at the age of three, is known as a rebounding wing player, and features experience playing for the Australian national team since the U16 level.

TARA APPROACHING THE SUMMITT »

- A four-time national coach of the year (1988, 1989, 1990, 2011) and 15-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year, Tara VanDerveer, who prior to coming to Stanford served as head coach for a combined seven seasons at Idaho (1978-80) and Ohio State (1980-85), has accumulated a 1,095-253 (.812) record as a collegiate head coach and a 943-202 (.825) record at Stanford.
- VanDerveer has more wins to her name than 344 of the NCAA's 351 Division I programs and is four victories shy of passing Pat Summitt (1,098) as the winningest coach in women's college basketball history.
- VanDerveer owns the fifth-highest winning percentage (.812) among Division I women's basketball coaches all-time and her 35 20-win seasons are third to Summitt (36) and C. Vivian Stringer (37).
- She has accounted for 943 of Stanford's 1,119 total victories since its first varsity season in 1975.
- In Dec. 2018 the Women's Sports Foundation announced the creation of The Tara VanDerveer Fund for the Advancement of Women in Coaching and is now in its second class of grant recipients.
- A total of \$200,000 was awarded to 10 universities and colleges to support a female coach on the rise, assisting with living expenses, professional development and mentorship. The institutions will use funding to support coaching fellows across a myriad of women's sports including field hockey, wrestling, basketball and volleyball, as well as softball and strength and conditioning.
- The WSF created the VanDerveer Fund to directly address the alarming decline of women in coaching. In the 1970-71 academic year, 90% of all head coaches for women's college teams were women. By 2017, 45 years after the passage of Title IX, women's share of these positions in women's NCAA sports had dropped to 40%.

A LOOK BACK »

- Stanford finished last season 33rd nationally in scoring offense, averaging 73.3 points per game, and 77th in scoring defense, giving up 60.2 points per game.
- The Cardinal was 28th in field goal shooting percentage (44.5) and 21st in field goal shooting percentage defense (35.7).
- Stanford was also ninth in made 3-pointers (281) 11th in total rebounds (1,346), 18th in made 3-pointers per game (8.5), 18th in blocked shots (160) and 23rd in blocked shots per game (4.8).
- Stanford made 162 3-pointers in conference play last year, its most against the Pac-12 in program history. Additionally, Stanford featured three players with at least 40 made 3-pointers (Kiana Williams, Lexie Hull, Hannah Jump) for the first time since 2014-15.
- Of Stanford's nine players that played at least 31 games last season, all averaged at least 12.0 minutes per game.

SCOUTING REPORT »

- The Cardinal, which relies heavily on its detailed scouting reports to stop its opponents, has finished in the top 15 in the country in field goal percentage defense in 10 of the last 14 years, but in none of the past three seasons. It was 29th in 2017-18 (.367) and 16th in 2018-19 (.358), prior to finishing 21st (.357) last year.
- Last year, Stanford opened its season with a 92-27 romp over Eastern Washington on Nov. 5.
- The margin of victory (65) was the third largest in program history, trailing only a 77-point win against Washington on Jan. 8, 2009 and a 73-point win against Long Beach State on Dec. 8, 1993.
- Eastern Washington's 27 points were the fifth-fewest for a Stanford opponent all-time and the lowest total since Pacific managed to score just 26 on Nov. 21, 2004.
- The Eagles also shot 14.1 percent from the floor (9-of-64), the worst clip for a Cardinal foe since at least 1999-00 (the beginning of readily available records).
- It was the lowest for a team in a game between two NCAA Division I opponents since Cincinnati shot 13.8 percent (8-of-58) against Connecticut on March 5, 2018. South Florida has since held St. Francis (PA) to 13.5 percent shooting on Nov. 24, 2019.

STARTING HOT »

- Stanford has won 51 of its last 52 games when holding a lead at halftime. The Cardinal was a perfect 23-0 when ahead at halftime last season, and came back from a halftime deficit three times.

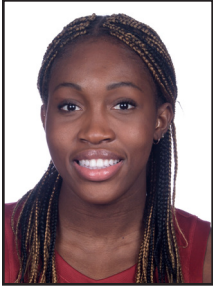
