# **Stanford Postgame Notes**

# No. 5/4 Stanford (1-0) 34 San Jose State (1-1) 13

- Stanford started the season 1-0 and improves to 52-14-1 all-time against San Jose State.
- Stanford has played San Jose 67 times, more than any non-conference opponent.
- Stanford extended its overall winning streak to nine games and improved to 25-3 (.892) at home dating back to the final game of the 2007 season.
- Stanford moved to 33-8 (.805) since the start of the 2009 season.
- The Cardinal extended its unbeaten streak against San Jose State to six games, with its last loss to the Spartans coming in 2006.
- Head coach David Shaw's career record at Stanford improved to 13-2 (.867).
- Stanford improved its record in season openers against San Jose State to 21-1 (.955).
- Stanford is now 11-3 (.786) in its last 14 seasons openers and has won six straight season starters dating back to 2008.
- Game captains were fifth-year senior OLB Trent Murphy, fifth-year senior DE Ben Gardner, fifth-year senior ILB Shayne Skov and senior OG David Yankey.
- The sellout crowd of 50,424 was the largest at Stanford Stadium since 2008 (vs. USC).
- Stanford put together a touchdown drive on its first possession by covering 67 yards on six plays, the third straight season the Cardinal opened with a scoring drive.
- Three players made their first career reception in the game including senior WR Jeff Trojan, sophomore TE Luke Kaumatule and junior TE Charlie Hopkins.
- Fifth-year senior OLB Trent Murphy recorded a pair of sacks, two tackles for loss and one quarterback hurry.
- Stanford's first three drives were scoring drives, with the first two going for touchdowns.
- Stanford outrushed San Jose State, 197-35, in the game and 92-18 by the half.
- Stanford did not punt in the contest.
- Stanford's extended its streak of consecutive games with a takeaway to 25 with a fourth-quarter interception of a David Fales pass senior FS Ed Reynolds. The streak is the longest in the nation.
- Stanford opened its 119th season at home against San Jose State in the Bill Walsh Legacy Game at 8 p.m. (PT) on Saturday.
- The 8:07 p.m. (PT) kickoff against San Jose State ensured that the Cardinal will be the last college football team to begin its 2013 season.
- With tonight's win, Stanford head coach David Shaw became the first Stanford head coach to win a season-opening game in each of his first three years since Claude "Tiny" Thornhill did so from 1933-35.
- Stanford is 13-2 during the month of September dating back to 2009, including an 8-0 mark at Stanford Stadium. The Cardinal is 31-3 (.912) at Stanford Stadium since the final home game of 2007.
- Stanford has won 27 of its last 28 games played in California (only loss vs. No. 6 Oregon in 2011)
- The Cardinal is 14-0 against in-state rivals (Cal, Sacramento State, San Jose State, UCLA and USC) over the past three seasons.
- Stanford is 23-1 under head coach David Shaw when out-rushing an opponent, and 13-2 when the Cardinal produces a 100-yard rusher.
- The Cardinal is now 10-0 in 2012 when out-rushing its opponent.

# Junior QB Kevin Hogan

- Finished 17 of 27 passing for 207 yards and two touchdowns.
- Hogan was not sacked on the evening.
- Opened the game with six consecutive completions.
- Third career game with multiple touchdown passes.

#### Sophomore QB Dallas Lloyd

• Ran for seven yards on a rush up the middle on the first play of his career.

# Senior RB Tyler Gaffney

- Scored a 16-yard touchdown in the second quarter, his first since Nov. 19, 2011, against Cal.
- Rushed for 104 yards on 20 carries for the second 100-yard rushing game of his career.
- First two-rushing touchdown performance since his outing against Wake Forest in 2010.

# **Senior RB Anthony Wilkerson**

- Recorded game-long 27-yard rush and totaled 65 on the evening.
- Rushed for 54 yards in the fourth quarter and finished with 7.2 yards per carry on nine attempts.

#### Junior WR Devon Cajuste

- First career touchdown came on a 40-yard pass from junior QB Kevin Hogan in the first quarter. It was the second reception of his career.
- Finished with 62 yards on three receptions.

# **Junior WR Ty Montgomery**

- Caught first touchdown reception since the Fiesta Bowl following the 2011 season.
- Recorded the longest reception of the night with a 42-yard catch in the fourth quarter.
- Paced the offense with 81 yards on four receptions.

# Senior WR Jeff Trojan

• Recorded a four-yard reception in the third quarter, the first reception of his career.

# Sophomore TE Luke Kaumatule

Recorded a five-yard reception in the third quarter, the first reception of his career.

## **Junior TE Charlie Hopkins**

Recorded a four-yard reception in the third quarter, the first reception of his career.

#### **Junior CB Wayne Lyons**

• Recorded seven tackles (three solo) and defended one pass.

#### **Senior FS Ed Reynolds**

- Picked off the seventh pass of his career in the fourth quarter.
- Paced Stanford with 12 tackles (nine solo).

# Fifth-Year Senior ILB Shayne Skov

• Recorded nine tackles, including three solo and two QB hurries.

# Senior K Jordan Williamson

• Booted a 48-yard field goal in the third quarter, his longest since the 2012 contest at Notre Dame.
