TEAM

- Stanford erased a 29-0 halftime deficit to beat Colorado 46-43 in double overtime. It is the fourth-largest comeback and the second-largest road comeback in Pac-12 history.
- This is the largest comeback win in the history of Stanford football.
- By erasing a 29-point deficit, Stanford overcame the largest halftime deficit to win a game in Pac-12 history.
- Friday's come-from-behind win for the Cardinal is the largest blown lead in Colorado history.
- Friday's win against Colorado gives the Cardinal a 7-6 edge head-to-head all-time and is the first win for Stanford against Colorado since 2015.
- First road conference win for Stanford since September 11, 2021 against USC.
- Snaps a seven-game conference losing streak for the Cardinal, and is the first win over a conference opponent since October 22, 2022 against Arizona State.
- The win keeps Stanford unbeaten on Fridays in 2023, with a 2-0 record on Fridays and 0-4 on Saturdays.
- This was the first overtime game played in by the Cardinal since beating No. 3 Oregon 31-24 on October 2, 2021.
- Stanford is 4-0 in its last four overtime games and is 7-5 in overtime in program history.
- The announced attendance of 53,154 is the first time this season that Stanford has played in front of a sellout crowd on the road.
- Stanford's offense compiled 523 total yards, the most since its December 19, 2020 game at UCLA.
- The Cardinal's 46 points in the second half are the most points scored in a half in program history (since 1958).
- With 46 points, Stanford scored its most points in a game since that same UCLA game in 2020.
- Stanford failed to score in the first half of a game for the first time this season.
- The rushing touchdown from Bryce Farrell with 9:01 left in the third quarter was the first Stanford touchdown in seven quarters (3rd quarter vs. Arizona).
- With a 97-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter, Stanford recorded its longest passing play since a 98-yard touchdown to Troy Walters on September 25, 1999
- Stanford scored 19 points in the third quarter, the most it has had in a single quarter since scoring 21 in the second quarter against Colgate on September 3, 2022.
- Stanford scored touchdowns on five-straight drives in the second half, and scored on its final eight possessions of the game (six touchdowns, two field goals).
- Jshawn Frausto-Ramos made his first collegiate start for the Cardinal. He became the 14th Stanford player to make his first start this season.

INDIVIDUAL

QB ASHTON DANIELS

- Threw for a career-best 396 yards and four touchdowns in the victory over Colorado.
- His 396 passing yards are the 19th-most in Stanford history.
- Scampered for a 12-yard rush in the first quarter, the longest run of his career.
- Recorded the first four-touchdown game from a Stanford quarterback since Davis Mills against Oregon State on September 28, 2019.
- His 396 yards are the most by a Stanford quarterback since Davis Mills (428) at UCLA on December 19, 2020.

WR ELIC AYOMANOR

- Set the Stanford program record for receiving yards in a game (294), besting the mark from Troy Walters in 1999.
- Second most single-game receiving yards in Pac-12 history (Marquise Lee, USC, 2012, 345).
- Most receiving yards by an FBS player since Ohio State's Jaxon Smith-Njigba in the 2022 Rose Bowl (347).
- His 13 receptions are tied for the second-most in Stanford history, trailing only Simi Fehoko (16) at UCLA in 2020.
- His 97-yard touchdown reception is the longest by a Cardinal since Troy Walters in 1999.
- First player in the Pac-12 with multiple touchdown receptions of 60+ yards since Washington's John Ross III on November 5, 2016.
- Eclipsed 100 receiving yards for the first time in his career, becoming the first Stanford wide receiver with 100 yards in a game this season (second player overall).
- Both of his receiving touchdowns are the two longest plays of the season by the Stanford offense.
- His three-touchdown game is the first by a Cardinal since Simi Fehoko in 2020 at UCLA.

WR BRYCE FARRELL

- Ran in a jet sweep touchdown in the third quarter, his third rushing touchdown of the 2023 season, pacing the Cardinal.
- Farrell now has the most rushing touchdowns this season by a wide receiver in the NCAA.
- Set a new career-high in rushing attempts with four.
- Scampered for a 12-yard rush in the first quarter, the longest run of his career.
- Had the first multi-touchdown game of his career.

OL SIMIONE PALE

- Returned to the starting lineup at right guard after a two-game absence.

DL LANCE KENELEY

- His sack of Shedeur Sanders was his first sack of the season, and second career sack.

LB SPENCER JORGENSEN

- Recorded the first sack of his collegiate career.

CB JSHAWN FRAUSTO-RAMOS

- Made his first collegiate start, becoming the 14th Cardinal to make his first collegiate start this season
- Recorded his first four career tackles.

CB COLLIN WRIGHT

- Recorded his first career sack in the third quarter.

S MITCH LEIGBER

- Recorded his first career sack in the win over the Buffaloes.
