- Stanford's win was its ninth in nine meetings with Hawaii.
- The Cardinal has not lost back-to-back games since Dec. 2010.
- Stanford's 12 3-point makes were its most since hitting 13-of-24 against Arizona on Feb. 16, 2014.
- The Cardinal made 12-of-18 from behind the arc, its best percentage with at least 10 attempts since nailing 7-of-10 against Oregon State on Jan. 5, 2014. Stanford hadn't converted more than 60 percent while attempting more than 15 since going 11-of-18 (.611) against Iowa on March 22, 2010.
- Stanford handed out 16 assists on 31 made baskets, its highest assist total and best ratio of the season.
- Lili Thompson scored a game-high 26 on 8-of-14 shooting, her third game of at least 25 points this year. She's averaging 23.8 points per game. A Stanford guard has not averaged more than 20.0 ppg since Candice Wiggins in 2007-08 (20.2).
- Thompson doubled her previous best for 3-pointers made, hitting six on just seven attempts. There have been 12 performances in Stanford history of at least seven made 3-pointers, but none since Rosalyn Gold-Onwude against Iowa in 2010 (7). Three Cardinal players in program history have made all of their 3-pointers when attempting at least five: Jennifer Azzi vs. Eastern Michigan, 12/29/89 (7-for-7); Joslyn Tinkle vs. Michigan, 3/26/13 (5-for-5); Lauren St. Clair vs. UCLA, 2/3/00 (5-for-5).
- Erica McCall missed her first career double-double by just one rebound, tallying 11 and 9. Her nine rebounds topped her previous best of eight, which she had achieved three other times.
- Amber Orrange scored 12 of her 19 points in the second half and dished out a game-high eight assists. She now has 451 in her career and is alone in eighth in Stanford history. Next up is Virginia Sourlis, who had 483 from 1982-86.
- The Cardinal held a 14-point advantage at the break, 48-34, after closing the final 6:46 of the first half on a 23-8 run.
- Bonnie Samuelson made two more free throws and has been successful on all of her 14 attempts from the line this season. She is a career 91.8 percent free thrower shooter and has made 37 straight.
