



STANFORD FOOTBALL GAME NOTES



ARIZONA WILDCATS 21 (3-1, 1-0 PAC-12) STANFORD CARDINAL 20 (1-3, 0-2 PAC-12) STANFORD STADIUM (38,046) • SEPT. 23, 2023

TEAM

- The loss snaps a six-game winning streak for Stanford against Arizona, dating back to 2010. It was the longest winning streak for Stanford in the history of the rivalry.
- Stanford's defense slowed down the Arizona offense to just 21 points and 349 total yards of offense, both of which were season-lows for Arizona.
- Not only were the 349 total yards for Arizona a season-low for the Wildcats, it also is the fewest total yards allowed in a game by the Stanford defense in 2023.
- Saturday's game against Arizona marked the first time this season that the Cardinal has outgained the opponent in the air, throwing for 246 yards vs. 204 for the Wildcats.
- The Stanford offense ran for 106 yards, which is a season-low.
- Both Sedrick Irvin and Bryce Farrell ran for touchdowns. This gives Stanford at least one rushing touchdown in eight-straight games.
- The Cardinal got back in the sack column on Saturday night with two sacks: one from David Bailey, and a half-sack each for Anthony Franklin and Zach Buckey.
- There were no turnovers in the game by either team, the second time this season that Stanford has avoided turning the ball over (at Hawai'i).
- Stanford converted seven third downs in the game, tied for its most third down conversions in a game this season.
- Sedrick Irvin and Austin Uke made their first career starts. Logan Berzins made his first start of the season, and his second career start.
- C.J Hawkins made his first appearance in 2023, and Pat Caughey made his first career appearance.

INDIVIDUAL

QB ASHTON DANIELS

- Leading passer on the day for the Card, going 14-26 for 198 yards.

QB JUSTIN LAMSON

- Carried the ball 13 times to pace Stanford on the ground, finishing with a career-high 57 rushing yards, including a 15-yard scamper in the second quarter.

RB SEDRICK IRVIN

- In his first career start, led the Cardinal with 66 rushing yards, a new career-high.
- His first carry of the game came on third and seven, and he gained 45 yards, the longest rush of his career.
- Scored his first career touchdown in the third quarter from one yard out to put Stanford in front 17-14.

WR TIGER BACHMEIER

- Led Stanford receivers with four catches for 93 yards, both representing career-highs for the true freshman.
- Caught a 35-yard deep ball from Ashton Daniels in the third quarter for the longest reception of his career.

WR BRYCE FARRELL

- Scored a two-yard rushing touchdown on a jet sweep in the second quarter, his second rushing touchdown of the season. This is the first time in his career that he has recorded multiple touchdowns in a season.

DL ZACH BUCKEY

- Record the first half-sack of his career.
- Set a new career-high in tackles with three.

S SCOTTY EDWARDS

- Tied a career-high in tackles with six.

K JOSHUA KARTY

- Snapped a streak of 26-consecutive made field goals with a 51-yard miss. Missed two field goals in a game for the second time in his career (Sept. 25, 2021).
