SERIES HISTORY

▶ Sacramento State

- » Under Coach Marquess, Stanford is 23-13 against the Hornets.
- » These programs last met on April 29, 2009—Stanford won 6-4 at Sunken Diamond.
- » Current Stanford assistant Nicholas Enriquez was a player and assistant under Head Coach Reggie Christiansen during his first year as a head coach at Menlo College.

▶ Cal State Fullerton - (Stanford leads series, 59-46)

- » In the season opening series for both teams, the Titans won 1-0 on Opening Day and took the middle game, 8-1. Stanford rallied from a 6-0 deficit to win 7-6 in 11 innings in the finale.
- » These teams have met each of the past three seasons. Prior to that, the last meeting between these schools was in the 2011 NCAA Regional in Fullerton in 2011—Stanford defeated the eighth-ranked Titans, 1-0. Jordan Pries (7.2 innings) and eventual first round draft pick Chris Reed (1.1) combined for the shutout. Stanford won the Regional the next day with a 14-2 victory over Illinois, but eventually fell in the Super Regional at North Carolina.
- » The season prior, Fullerton ended Stanford's season in the 2010 Fullerton Regional, 6-5.
- » Titans assistant Chad Baum coached Stanford assistant Jon Karcich at Santa Clara.

▶ BYU

- » Stanford is 3-1 against the Cougars under Coach Marquess, including a 2-1 victory in the 1981 Austin Regional.
- » These programs last met on April 24, 2012—Stanford won 10-9 at Sunken Diamond.
- » Stanford Director of Baseball Operations Kevin Bills was on the last two postseason teams for the Cougars in 2000 and 2001.

LAST WEEKEND

- ▶ Stanford capped the season with its fourth Pac-12 sweep (second on the road).
- ▶ In the opener at Washington State on Thursday, Stanford scored two in the first and five in the second for an early 7-0 lead. Matt Winaker and Quinn Brodey each homered in a four-run fifth, and Bubic struck out six en route to a 13-2 victory.
- ▶ On Friday, Matt Winaker went 2-for-5 with the game-tying, two-run double in the seventh. He was followed by RBI hits from Nico Hoerner and Quinn Brodey to turn a two-run deficit into a two-run lead. Colton Hock got the save in a 5-3 win.
- ▶ In the finale, Brandon Wulff hit a three-run homer in a four-run first, and Chris Castellanos allowed just one earned run in seven innings of work. Stanford cruised to a 15-1 win.

UP NEXT

- ▶ Regional winner will face either Long Beach State, UCLA, Texas or San Diego State in the Super Regional, June 9-12. Stanford would host its first Super since 2003 if it advances.

CARDINAL NOTES

Regional Round Up 🏆

- ▶ Stanford last played in a Regional in 2014 and last hosted in 2012.
- ▶ Stanford has won three straight Regionals (2011, 2012, 2014).
- ▶ Stanford has won 16 of its 29 Regionals with a record of 86-33 (.723) in Regional play.
- ▶ This will be the 16th time Sunken Diamond has served as host to a Regional (Stanford has advanced 12 of the previous 15 times).
- ▶ The Cardinal is 49-10 all-time in Regionals on The Farm (.831).
- ▶ Stanford has won seven straight Regional games at Sunken Diamond.
- ▶ Stanford has not hosted a Super Regional since 2003 (national runner-up).

NCAA Notables 📝

- ▶ Stanford is a national seed for the first time since 2004. The Cardinal was a No. 5 seed, but was eliminated by Long Beach State in the Regional—it broke a string of five straight College World Series appearances (1999-03).
- ▶ Stanford holds an all-time record of 139-72 (.659) in 32 postseason appearances.
- ▶ In 75 postseason games at Sunken Diamond, Stanford is 61-14 (.813).
- ▶ Stanford has made 16 College World Series appearances, most recently in 2008 (finished third), and has won two national championships (1987 and 1988).
- ▶ This is the 30th postseason appearance under Coach Marquess, which already includes six NCAA Super Regional titles, 16 NCAA Regional crowns, 14 trips to Omaha and two national titles.

Moving Up 📈

- ▶ Junior reliever Colton Hock set the school season saves record on May 9 against San Francisco. He surpassed the record of 13 set 30 seasons ago by Steve Chitren and matched by Jeff Burksch in 2000.
- ▶ Hock's 16 saves are tied for most in the nation.
- ▶ Recorded 4+ outs in 10 of his 16 saves.
- ▶ Hock's 25 career saves ranks second at Stanford behind Chitren's 26 from 1986-89, and is tied for ninth all-time in Pac-12 history.
- ▶ Chitren, who recorded the final out of both of Stanford's national championships (1987 and 1988), congratulated Hock after his record was broken.

Stanford Streakers 📈

- ▶ Matt Winaker has reached base in 25 straight games, a career high and the longest of streak for Stanford since Alex Blandino reached in 31 straight games in 2014.
- ▶ Brandon Wulff and Jesse Kuet each have career-high 10-game hit streaks. Freshman Daniel Bakst owns Stanford's longest hit streak this year at 11 games (March 12-April 6).
- ▶ Wulff has reached base in 14 straight games.
- ▶ Duke Kinamon (2B) and Nico Hoerner (SS) have started all 54 games together this year.
- ▶ Winaker has played in 122 straight games. The last time he did not enter Coach Marquess' lineup was April 28, 2015 vs. SJSU.
- ▶ Junior Quinn Brodey has started 118 consecutive games for the Cardinal — last time he was not in starting lineup was May 5, 2015 vs. Santa Clara.
- ▶ Stanford has 10+ hits in nine straight games.

Non-Conference Dominance 🌐

- ▶ Stanford has won nine straight non-conference games and nine straight non-conference games at Sunken Diamond.
- ▶ Stanford finished undefeated in midweek games this year (10-0).

CARDINAL NOTES

Stanford Win Totals 🏆

- ▶ Stanford's 40 wins are the most since 2012 (41), and the most in a regular season since 2004 (44, finished with 46 overall).
- ▶ The Cardinal has won seven in a row and 21 of its last 23 games, including a 16-2 record in its last 18 Pac-12 games.
- ▶ Stanford's 21 conference wins are the most since winning the 1998 Pac-8 Southern Division with a 22-8 mark.
- ▶ Stanford was the runner-up in the Pac-12—its best finish since 2008.
- ▶ Stanford's 11-game win streak from April 18-May 6 was the program's best since 1999. In that span, Stanford won eight straight conference games (first time since 1999).
- ▶ Stanford has won 10 straight at home and is 23-7 at Sunken Diamond this year, the most home wins since 26 in 2012. The Cardinal also won 12 straight at home earlier this season in a streak that carried over from the end of the 2016 season.
- ▶ Stanford won six straight conference series for the first time since 2008, and swept back-to-back Pac-12 opponents for the first time since 2012 (did so twice this season).
- ▶ The Cardinal went 5-0 in Pac-12 road series this year. Overall, Stanford went 8-2 in Pac-12 series and 10-3-1 in 14 series this season.
- ▶ Stanford had not won 13 games in one month since posting 15 wins in May of 2003— the Cardinal has now done so in back-to-back months (13-5 in April and 13-2 in May).

Stanford Leaders 🧑

- ▶ Nico Hoerner had 52 hits in conference play (led Pac-12). His .388 average against Pac-12 competition was second to Oregon State's Nick Madrigal (.392).
- ▶ Matt Winaker led the Pac-12 with 35 runs and 34 RBI in conference play (was second with 75 total bases). All eight of Winaker's home runs came against Pac-12 competition (tied for most in the conference).
- ▶ Stanford finished first with 311 hits, 74 doubles and .297 average in Pac-12 play.

Stanford Stats 📊

- ▶ A lefty has started 45 straight games for Stanford and all but two this year (senior righty Brett Hanewich started Feb. 18 and Feb. 28). Stanford has used just five starting pitchers this season (Miller, Castellanos, Bubic, Summerville, Hanewich).
- ▶ Stanford is 40-8 (.833) this year when scoring a run (0-6 when scoring 0 or less).
- ▶ Stanford is 38-5 (.884) this season when scoring more than three runs.
- ▶ The Cardinal is 52-5 (.912) when out-hitting its opponent since 2016.
- ▶ Stanford, which led the nation with a school record fielding percentage of .983 last season, ranks 15th this year (.979) and is 24-1 when not committing an error this year.
- ▶ Stanford is 25-6 (.806) with RHP Kris Bubic as the starting DH.
- ▶ With Brandon Wulff starting in RF, Stanford is 32-8 (.800) and just 8-6 with anyone else.

Closing the Door 🚪

- ▶ Stanford is 28-0 this year when leading after six innings and 37-0 when tied or leading after seven innings.
- ▶ The Cardinal is 24-4 (.857) this season when scoring first, and is 9-2 in one-run games.
- ▶ Stanford led the Pac-12 with 23 saves (12 in conference play).

Preseason Prognostications 🗳️

- ▶ Pac-12 coaches correctly picked Stanford to finish second in the conference in 2017.
- ▶ Oregon State was correctly selected as the Pac-12 favorite. The Beavers earned 97 points and eight first-place votes, while Stanford garnered two first-place votes and 89 points.

NINE NOTES

Big Milestone

▶ Only five NCAA coaches have reached 1,600 career wins, only four have been Division I coaches, and only three have done it at one school. Coach Marquess is a member of each

of those exclusive clubs after an 8-4 win over arch rival Cal at Sunken Diamond on April 4.

▶ Augie Garrido (1,975 wins at five schools), Mike Martin (1,937 wins and counting at Florida State), Gordie Gillespie (1,893 wins in Division III) and Gene Stephenson (1,768 wins at Wichita State) are the only coaches to reach the milestone.

▶ Shortly after the 2016 campaign, head coach Mark Marquess announced that 2017 would be his final season.

- » Became fourth Division I head coach (fifth ever) to win 1,600 games (4/4/17 vs. Cal).
- » Coached 2,500th game at Cal on May 14—fifth ever to sign that many lineup cards.
- » Most wins in Pac-12 history, fourth-most wins in Division I history.
- » Two national championships (1987, 1988), 30 NCAA Tournament berths and 14 CWS.
- » Stanford finished .500 or better in 39 of his 41 seasons.
- » Nine-time conference Coach of the Year, three-time national Coach of the Year.
- » Six 50-win campaigns, 21 years with 40 wins and 37 campaigns with 30 wins.

▶ Other “9” Notables

- » All his student-athletes get at least one quarter ahead academically by their junior year.
- » Handwrites all his practice schedules.
- » Carries his signature briefcase to the dugout for each game.
- » Baseball student-athletes are responsible for Sunken Diamond groundskeeping.

Retired Number

▶ For the first time in program history, Stanford baseball retired a number. No one will wear No. 9 again after Coach Marquess retires following the 2017 season. The official announcement was made following Marquess' final home game on May 21—Stanford won that day with a walk off single in the 10th inning.

Honoring

▶ Colloquially known by his jersey number “9”, here are some ways the University and team have honored Coach Marquess this season:

- » Served as football's honorary captain for the weekend and game against Rice (Nov. 26)
- » More than 100 alumni returned to Sunken Diamond for a pregame ceremony to honor Coach Marquess on Feb. 25.

- » A “9” flag was raised on Feb. 25 and will fly at Sunken Diamond all season.
- » All season ticket prices end in 9, and Two for Tuesday ticket deals went to \$9 (was \$12).
- » May 9 had 1977 theme and ticket prices based on his first season as head coach.
- » Majority of first pitches this season were thrown by Marquess friends and family.
- » Concessions unveiled the Commemorative Coach Marquess cup, available all season.
- » Concessions featured several Coach Marquess combos for \$9.99 all season.
- » Final season logo was created as well as #FinalSeas9n hashtag.
- » Bobblehead and trading card giveaway on May 20.
- » Framed jersey after his last home game, and giant “9” signed by players, co-workers, fans.

- » Personal messages can be sent to Coach Marquess at this link: bit.ly/NineNote

▶ Several opposing teams also recognized Coach Marquess during Stanford road games.
