All-Time Series: UCLA leads 47-43-3

The series is tied at 10-10 in games played in the Rose Bowl, with UCLA's last home win coming in 2008.

THE MATCHUP

UCLA returns to Pasadena, Calif. this week for a Saturday evening Homecoming matchup against Stanford. The Bruins, now ranked No. 12 by the AP and No. 15 by the coaches, will take on the Cardinal in a battle to be televised by ESPN at 7:30 p.m. PT. The Bruin IMG Radio Network will broadcast the contest, which will also be aired over SiriusXM and the Varsity App.

UCLA will be looking to extend its overall seven-game home winning streak compiled over the past two seasons, made up of 2021 wins versus Colorado and California and 2022 victories against Bowling Green, Alabama State, South Alabama, Washington and Utah. The Bruins have also won the last four home Pac-12 Conference contests played in the Rose Bowl Stadium. UCLA will be attempting to defeat the Cardinal in Pasadena for the first time since 2008. In that game, quarterback Kevin Craft connected on a seven-yard pass to tight end Cory Harkey with 10 seconds remaining for the winning score, securing a 23-20 victory. Stanford is coming off consecutive wins against Notre Dame and Arizona State.

In its last game, UCLA saw its nine-game win streak stopped at Oregon in a 45-30 decision. Zach Charbonnet ran for 151 yards, Jake Bobo caught eight passes for 101 yards and Dorian Thompson-Robinson generated 300 yards of total offense. UCLA had registered a ninth straight win by dealing then-No. 11 Utah a 42-32 setback on Oct. 8 in the Rose Bowl and moved to 3-0 in the league for the first time since 2007. Charbonnet ran for a career-best 198 yards against the Utes. The previous week, it handed then-No. 15 Washington a 40-32 verdict on a Friday night in the Rose Bowl. UCLA opened the league slate in Boulder, Colo. with a 45-17 triumph over Colorado.

MEET THE BRUINS

Fifth-year head coach Chip Kelly was named UCLA's head football coach Nov. 25, 2017. Kelly owns a collegiate record of 70-33 (4-4 versus Stanford) compiled in four-plus seasons at UCLA and four more as head coach at University of Oregon (2009-2012). During that span in Eugene, Ore., his Duck teams captured first or a share of first in the North Division of the conference — including three straight outright championships from 2009-2011 — and made four appearances in BCS bowl games. Kelly guided Oregon to the national championship game (2010), two Rose Bowls (after 2011, 2009 seasons) and the Fiesta Bowl after the 2012 season. He was named the 2009 and 2010 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, 2010 Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year, 2010 Walter Camp Coach of the Year, 2010 Sporting News Coach of the Year, 2010 AFCA Coach of the Year and 2010 Associated Press Coach of the Year.

UCLA has added six new assistant coaches to Kelly's staff for 2022: Tim Drevno (OL), Jeff Faris (TEs), Chad Kauha'aha'a (DL), Ikaika Malloe (OLBs, special teams coordinator), Bill McGovern (defensive coordinator) and Ken Norton Jr. (ILBs). Transfers who have joined the 2022 team include: WR Jake Bobo (Duke), WR Ryan Cragun (Pennsylvania), DB Jaylin Davies (Oregon), OL Liam Douglass (JSC), DB Azizi Hearn (Wyoming), QB Sean Holland (Fordham), OL Jaylan Jeffers (Oregon), LB Laiatu Latu (Washington), WR Titus Mokiao-Atimalala (UCF), LB Darius Muasau (Hawaii'i), DL Gabriel Murphy (North Texas), DL Grayson Murphy (North Texas), OL Raiqwon O'Neal (Rutgers), DL Gary Smith III (Duke) and DL Jacob Sykes (Harvard).

AT A GLANCE

- The Rose Bowl is celebrating its 100th year of hosting some of the world's major sports and entertainment events in 2022.
- UCLA has won seven straight home games over the past two seasons, including victories in its last four Pac-12 home games — 2021 versus Colorado and California and 2022 against Washington and Utah. It has scored at least 40 points in each of those four Pac-12 home wins.
- UCLA will be looking for its first home win in Rose Bowl Stadium over Stanford since the 2008 season. It has lost the last six matchups of the series (2020-2010) to the Cardinal in Pasadena, Calif. after winning the six previous home meetings (1998-2008).
- The winning team has scored at least 34 points in each of the last five series meetings between the Bruins and the Cardinal.
- The Bruins are ranked No. 12 in the AP Top 25 this week and No. 15 in the USA TODAY Sports AFCA Coaches Poll. The last time UCLA has been rated in the top 15 by the AP after Oct. 15 of a season was in 2014, when it was ranked as high as No. 9 in late November.
- Zach Charbonnet has rushed for at least one touchdown in each of his last eight Pac-12 games ... he has run for at least 100 yards in each of his last six Pac-12 games for a total of 850 yards on 123 carries (6.9 yards per run) and eight touchdowns ... he leads the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game (127.67) ... he is the only Pac-12 performer averaging over 100 yards a game on the ground after four straight 100-yard Pac-12 games ... Charbonnet also leads the league in all-purpose yards per game (156.17), a mark which rates fourth nationally.
- Dorian Thompson-Robinson, who is rated second in the nation with a completion percentage of .738, made his 42nd career start at Oregon to move into second on UCLA's all-time list behind only Cade McNown (1995-98), who had 44. Thompson-Robinson is ranked ninth nationally in passing efficiency at 172.3 (McNown owns the UCLA record with a 168.6 mark in 1997).
- Thompson-Robinson, with 9,313 career passing yards, can move up the all-time school charts with 29 passing yards against Stanford and go past No. 3 Josh Rosen (2015-17) who has 9,341. No. 2 on the list is Brett Hundley (2011-14) who threw for 9,966 yards. Atop the list is Cade McNown (1995-98), who totaled 10,708 passing yards.
- Jake Bobo, who caught a UCLA season high of eight passes at Oregon, has caught five touchdown passes over the past three games against ranked opponents from Washington, Utah and Oregon ... he had a total of three in his four-year career at Duke. Bobo also registered 101 receiving yards against Oregon, which was his second such game of the 2022 season.

LAST MEETINGS

In last year's meeting at Stanford Stadium, Dorian Thompson-Robinson accounted for four touchdowns in a 35-24 win against the Cardinal. After Stanford rallied from a 21-7 halftime deficit to even the score at 21-all, Thompson-Robinson connected with Kyle Philips on two fourth-quarter scoring plays to help UCLA pull away. The Bruin quarterback also scored on runs of one and two yards. Zach Charbonnet ran for 124 yards and a score.

In the most recent meeting between the two programs played in the Rose Bowl Stadium, Stanford prevailed 48-47 in double overtime in 2020. The Cardinal jumped out to a 20-3 halftime lead only to see UCLA storm back in the second half with 31 straight points. Stanford then staged a rally of its own and scored two touchdowns in the final 2:34 of regulation to send the game into overtime. The Cardinal went up by seven in the second overtime before UCLA answered with a Chase Griffin-to-Kyle Philips 21-yard scoring pass. Stanford then held on UCLA's two-point conversion attempt to come away with the win.

TEAM NOTES

- UCLA has won its last seven home games (2021 versus Colorado and California and 2022 against Bowling Green, Alabama State, South Alabama, Washington and Utah), which is its longest streak since it captured wins in 10 straight home contests over the 2005 and 2006 seasons. It has also captured wins against its last four Pac-12 home opponents over the past two seasons.

- Top-20 Bruin NCAA rankings: completion percentage - second (.732), 3rd down conversion percentage - third (.541), tackles for loss allowed - fifth (3.29 per game), team passing efficiency - eighth (170.55), sacks allowed - ninth (0.86 per game), total offense - 10th (497.4 yards per game), scoring - 14th (39.9 points per game), rushing offense - 19th (207.9 yards per game) and kickoff return yardage - 20th (23.5 per game).

- Ten players registered their first starts as Bruins against BGSU: WR Titus Mokiao-Atimalala, WR Jake Bobo, OT Raiqwon O'Neal, DB Devin Kirkwood, LB Grayson Murphy, LB Gabriel Murphy, LB Kain Medrano, DB Azizi Hearn, LB Darius Muasau and DL Jay Toia ... Mokiao-Atimalala, Bobo, O'Neal, Grayson Murphy, Gabriel Murphy, Hearn and Muasau made their UCLA

debut. TE Hudson Habermehl made his first start against Alabama State. CB John Humphrey made his initial start at CU DL Dovid Magna started for the first time versus Washington.

- Seeing their first action as Bruins in the Alabama State contest were QB Chase Artopoulos, K Joseph Firebaugh Jr., LS Beau Gardner, RB Christian Grubb, DL Hayden Harris, OL Jaylan Jeffers, DB D.J. Justice, K Ari Libenson, RB Deshun Murrell, LB Erich Osteen, DL Quintin Somerville, TE Sam Summa and true-freshmen RB Jack Pedersen, WR Braden Pegan, DB Kamari Ramsey, WR Elijah Rodriguez, DB Clint Stephens, DB Croix Stewart, LB Jalen Woods and P Chase Barry. In the opener, versus BGSU, 16 players saw their first action as Bruins off the bench: DL Jacob Sykes, LB Hayden Nelson, DL Sitiveni Havili-Kaufusi, TE Grant Norberg, DL Gary Smith III, OL Benjamin Roy Jr., LB Carson Schwesinger, LB James Dinneen, DB Kaleb Tuliau, DB Isaiah Newcombe, DB Jaylin Davies, QB/holder Sean Holland, WR Ryan Cragun, LB Laiatu Latu and true-freshmen RBs T.J. Harden and Carsen Ryan.

- Two true freshmen saw action for the Bruins in the opener: RBs T.J. Harden and Carsen Ryan. Nine more true freshmen saw their first action in Game 2 against Alabama State: P Chase Barry, WR Jady Marshall, RB Jack Pedersen, WR Braden Pegan, DB Kamari Ramsey, WR Elijah Rodriguez, DB Clint Stephens, DB Croix Stewart and LB Jalen Woods.

- UCLA had a streak of forcing at least one turnover snapped at Oregon ... UCLA is +26 turnovers in wins and -25 in losses overall under head coach Chip Kelly... in 2021, UCLA was +5 in turnovers for the season, but committed seven of its 14 turnovers in its four 2021 losses ... in its four 2020 losses, UCLA committed 12 of its 13 turnovers on the season.

- UCLA is ranked 10th in the NCAA in total offense this week (497.4 yards per game) ... the Bruins compiled 626 yards of total offense in the win over BGSU, the most since it racked up 657 in a comeback win at Washington State Sept. 22, 2019. It is the third time in Coach Kelly's Bruin tenure the team has recorded 600 or more yards (also 609 at USC in 2021).

- UCLA is rated 64th in the nation in total defense (373.4 yards per game) entering the week ... it held BGSU to 162 yards of total offense in the opener (39 rushing, 125 passing) ... it marked the first time UCLA held a team under 200 yards since its 2020 game against California (176). The last time a UCLA defense limited an opponent to fewer than 162 yards of total offense was 2008, when Arizona State gained 122 yards (21 rushing, 101 passing).

- UCLA scored three touchdowns of 50 yards or more against BGSU: Dorian Thompson-Robinson's 68-yard run, a 52-yard catch and run by Keegan Jones from Thompson-Robinson and a 50-yard strike from Ethan Garbers to Josiah Norwood. The Bruins added a 70-yard pass play from Thompson-Robinson to Logan Loya against Utah. It had three such plays all of 2021.

DTR BACK FOR MORE

- Over the past 10 games, Dorian Thompson-Robinson has completed .727 of his passes (175-239) while throwing for 2,542 yards, 24 touchdowns and six interceptions ... he has run 82 times for 510 yards (6.2 yards per carry) and seven touchdowns. He has thrown at least one scoring pass in each of the last nine games and in 17 of the last 18 contests.

- Thompson-Robinson is rated second in the nation (first in Pac-12) in completion percentage (.738) and ninth (first in Pac-12) in passing efficiency (172.3). Last season, Thompson-Robinson paced Pac-12 players in total offense (274.4 yards per game), passing efficiency (153.9), passing yards per completion (13.7) and points responsible for per game (16.5).

- Thompson-Robinson continues to move up the charts and has become just the third Bruin quarterback to record 10,000 yards of total offense (10,763 yards with Cade McNown in second - 11,285) ... he has elevated to fourth on the school list in career passing yards and now has 9,313, with No. 3 Josh Rosen (2015-17, at 9,341) next on that list (second is Brett Hundley at 9,966) ... Thompson-Robinson (78) is the all-time school leader for touchdown passes after moving past Hundley (2011-14, 75) in the Utah game.

- With his 27 completions at Oregon, Thompson-Robinson now has 743 completions, and has moved into second on that all-time UCLA list. Hundley is the all-time leader at UCLA with 837 completions.

- Thompson-Robinson started his 42nd career game at Oregon to rate second on the all-time UCLA quarterback starts list. McNown (1995-98) is the all-time quarterback leader, with 44.

- Thompson-Robinson's 56-yard rushing effort at Colorado helped him become the third Bruin quarterback (No. 1 John Sciarra, 1972-75 and No. 2 Hundley, 2011-14) to rush for more than 1,300 yards for a career. He now has 1,450 yards and sits third on the all-time UCLA quarterback rushing list. Hundley is second on the list with 1,747 yards.
- UCLA is 12-3 in games in which Thompson-Robinson has run for at least one touchdown.
- Thompson-Robinson's year-by-year passing efficiency: 2022 - 172.3, 2021 - 153.9, 2020 - 156.3, 2019 - 134.9, 2018 - 122.3 ... the last Bruin starting quarterback to post a higher rating than Thompson-Robinson's 2020 mark of 156.29 for a full season was Drew Olson in 2005 (161.6) The school record is McNown's 168.6 mark in 1997.
- Thompson-Robinson (156.3 in 2020 and 153.9 in 2021) is just the third Bruin quarterback to put together back-to-back seasons with a 150.0+ passing efficiency mark ... he joins Hundley in 2013 (153.7) and 2014 (152.7) and McNown in 1997 (168.6) and 1998 (156.9).
- Thompson-Robinson's 32 completions against BGSU were a personal high and ninth on the all-time school list for completions in a game. The school record is 40, held by Josh Rosen (2017 at Stanford) and Mike Fafaul (2016 against Utah).
- Thompson-Robinson's 68-yard run for a score against BGSU was the longest run of his Bruin career (previous long was 65 at Colorado in 2020). The two rushing scores versus the Falcons equaled his Bruin best.
- Thompson-Robinson went 19 for 23 passing in the 2022 win at Colorado to mark the fourth career game in which he has completed at least 80% of his attempts. Thompson-Robinson completed all eight of his passing attempts on the 90-yard, game-winning drive during the fourth quarter at UW in 2021. He went 21 of 26 (.807) on the game. There have been 13 such games by UCLA quarterbacks since 1980.

GLASS OF CHARBONNET

- Running back Zach Charbonnet is averaging 7.16 yards per carry, which is second in the nation ... he enters the week first in the Pac-12 (seventh in NCAA) in rushing yards per game (127.7) and also leads the league in all-purpose yards with a mark of 156.17 per game, which is fourth in the nation. He is fourth in Pac-12 scoring (7.0).
- UCLA is 11-1 when Charbonnet runs for 100 yards over his two seasons as a Bruin. His 151-yard effort at Oregon was Charbonnet's fifth 100-yard game of the 2022 season. Charbonnet ran for a career-best 198 yards on 22 carries versus Utah and also produced 100-yard games against Bowling Green (111), Colorado (104) and Washington (124).
- Charbonnet has recorded 100-yard games in his last four outings — at UO (151), versus Utah (198), against UW(124) and at CU (104) ... Tyler Ebell (2002) with six is the last UCLA back with more than four straight 100-yard games ... his 12 Bruin 100-yard games ties him for seventh on the all-time school 100-yard rushing games list with Wendell Tyler (1973-76; sixth is his coach DeShaun Foster, who totaled 13 from 1998-2001) ... in 2021, he was second in the Pac-12 in rushing (94.8 yards per game) ... he had 30 rushes for at least 10 yards in 2021 and has added 21 more already this season (three versus BGSU, two against South Alabama, two at CU, four versus UW, six against Utah and four at UO) ... the University of Michigan transfer scored 11 touchdowns as a true freshman at UM in 2019 and posted two 100-yard games (versus Army and Illinois) ... he also scored three rushing touchdowns against Army in 2019... in his final season season with the Wolverines, he had a 70-yard run for a score against Minnesota.
- Charbonnet joined the all-time UCLA top 20 rushing list with his 151-yard outing at Oregon. He places 20th with 1,903 rushing yards for his Bruin career (No. 19 is Kenny Washington, with 1,915 yards from 1937-39)
- The 2022 CU game was Charbonnet's third three-touchdown game as a Bruin — in 2021, he had three against Hawai'i and CU. While at Michigan, he ran for three scores in a game against Army in 2019.
- Charbonnet's seven 100-yard rushing games in 2021 led the Pac-12 and were the most in a season by a Bruin since Johnathan Franklin had a school-record nine in 2012.
- In 2021, Charbonnet (1,137), Brittain Brown (615) and Thompson-Robinson (609) became the first Bruin backfield trio to rush for at least 600 yards each in a season since Theotis Brown (1,092), Wendell Tyler (1,003) and Jeff Dankworth (815) did so in 1976.

ON OFFENSE

- Jake Bobo caught a season-high eight passes (UCLA career high) at Oregon, adding 101 receiving yards and a touchdown. It was his second 100-yard game of the season. He has caught five touchdown passes in the past three games against ranked teams from Oregon, Utah and Washington. He had two scoring catches each against Utah and Washington and rates 10th in the Pac-12 in reception yards per game this season (69.43). He is averaging 15.19 yards per catch on his 32 receptions as a Bruin for the season and has grabbed 21 receptions for 308 yards and five scores over the past four games.
- UCLA leads the Pac-12 in yards per play (7.08), 3rd down conversion percentage (.541) and yards per pass try (8.77).
- UCLA enters Game 8 ranked 10th in the nation in total offense (497.4 yards per game), 19th in rushing yards per game (207.9) and 24th in passing offense (289.6 yards per game).
- UCLA has outscored its last 10 opponents 230-95 in the second halves of those contests.
- After rushing for 212 yards against Utah, UCLA has surpassed the 200-yard rushing mark in four of its games in 2022 (also against Bowling Green - 269, Alabama State - 220 and Colorado - 249).

- Matt Sykes caught his first pass of the 2022 season for a 24-yard touchdown at CU. It was his first career scoring reception. Sykes caught a career-high four passes at CU and became the 14th Bruin to score a touchdown this season.
- UCLA compiled 626 yards of total offense in the win over BGSU. It was the third time a Chip Kelly-coached Bruin team has hit the 600-yard mark and was the most since the 2019 Bruins' 657-yard performance at Washington State.
- UCLA has had a tight end total at least 100 receiving yards in a game in each of the last eight previous seasons — Greg Dulcich in 2021 and 2020, Devin Asiasi in 2019, Caleb Wilson in 2018 and 2017, Nate Iese in 2016 and Thomas Duarte in 2015 and 2014.
- UCLA failed to record a rushing TD against South Alabama to snap a streak of 23 straight games with a rushing score.
- Kazmeir Allen hauled in 10 receptions against BGSU to become the 24th Bruin to make at least 10 catches in a game. Kyle Philips, now with the Tennessee Titans, was the last to do so with 12 grabs in a 2019 game at USC.

ON DEFENSE

- Mo Osling III recorded a career-high 17 tackles at Oregon ... he matched his previous career-best of 12 tackles for a game in the first half at UO. It was the most tackles by a Bruin player in a game since 2015 when linebacker Jayon Brown had 18 stops versus Colorado. Osling has 27 tackles in the past two games against Utah and UO.
- Laiatu Latu is ninth in the nation (second in Pac-12) in sacks per game (0.86) ... he recorded a career-best 3.0 sacks at Colorado ... he is tied for first in the Pac-12 (tied for 21st in nation) in fumbles forced per game (0.29).
- The Bruins enter Game 8 of 2022 ranked 64th in the nation (fifth in Pac-12) in total defense (373.4 yards per game).
- Safety Stephan Blaylock started his 38th straight game last week at Oregon. Offensive lineman Craig Novitsky (1990-93) owns the school record with starts in 46 consecutive games.
- LB Darius Muasau is second on the team with 46 tackles this season (No. 16 in Pac-12 with 6.57 per game) ... he had eight stops with his first interception and a forced fumble in the win over Utah and was credited with a season-high 10 tackles against South Alabama ... he had a total of 14 games with 10 or more stops over the past two seasons while playing for Hawai'i.
- UCLA has held four 2022 opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing ... it limited UW to 65 rushing yards, CU to 51, Alabama State to 87 and Bowling Green to just 37 this season ... it held five opponents under 100 yards rushing in 2021: 26 by Hawai'i, 49 by LSU, 67 by Stanford, 83 by Washington, 92 by California ... the Bruins have won each game.
- UCLA has won 43 straight games overall and 62 straight regular-season games in which it has held the opponent to fewer than 20 points. Its last loss came at the hands of BYU, 17-16, in the 2007 Las Vegas Bowl. Its last regular-season loss was a 16-14 decision at Colorado in 2003.
- UCLA surrendered just 162 yards of offense to BGSU in the 2022 opener. The last time a Bruin defense had held an opponent under 200 yards was in 2020 against California (176). The 162-yard total was the lowest by a Bruin opponent since Arizona State gained 122 in a 2008 contest.
- Defensive trends ... rushing defense: 2017 - 287.4 yards per game, 2018 - 199.4, 2019 - 145.5, 2020 - 135.7, 2021 - 124.2, 2022 - 122.3; rushing yards per carry: 2017 - 5.8, 2018 - 4.6, 2019 - 4.3, 2020 - 3.6, 2021 - 3.8, 2022 - 3.6; yards per play: 2017 - 6.3, 2018 - 6.0, 2019 - 6.7, 2020 - 5.4, 2021 - 5.5, 2022 - 5.2.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Nicholas Barr-Mira totaled 12 points at Oregon to bring his career scoring total to 207 points, which is 15th on the all-time Bruin scoring list ... he is 11-14 on FGs in 2022 after going 3-3 at UO, 0-1 versus Utah, 1-1 versus Washington, 1-1 at CU, 4-4 versus South Alabama, 1-1 versus Alabama St. and 1-3 against Bowling Green in 2022 ... he has connected on 30 of 41 career field goals ... he connected on a career-best 49-yard field goal in this year's game against USA.
- Barr-Mira is first in the Pac-12 in scoring (9.29 points per game) and is second in field goals per game (1.57).
- UCLA's total of 11 punts this season is the lowest by a Pac-12 team.
- Kickoff man R.J. Lopez has recorded touchbacks on 37 of his 51 kickoffs (73%) in 2022 to pace the Pac-12 kickers ... in 2021, he had touchbacks on 52 of 81 kickoffs (64%) — his 52 touchbacks tied for the lead in the Pac-12 last season.
- UCLA has blocked 22 kicks (extra points, field goals or punts) since the start of the 2012 season. In 2021, Bruins Martell Irby and Ale Kaho got their hands on punts, with Kaho's immediately recovered for a touchdown and Irby's leading to a UCLA offensive scoring drive.

UCLA ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME INDUCTS FOSTER, KEZIRIAN

Football alumni DeShaun Foster and Ed Kezirian are part of the nine-Bruin class that was officially inducted into the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame on Friday, Oct. 7.

Former UCLA All-American and NFL standout Foster is one of the most accomplished running backs in school history and returned to Westwood following his professional playing career to serve on the football staff. He completed his Bruin playing career second on the all-time touchdowns scored list (44), third on the school's all-time rushing list (3,194 yards) and fifth on the all-time Bruin scoring list (266 points). Foster was ranked 18th on the Pac-10 career rushing list when he left for the NFL, and his 722 career rushing attempts were the most in school history. As a senior in 2001, he led the Pac-10 in rushing (138.6 yards per game), scoring (9.75 points per game), and all-purpose yardage (154.75 yards per game). In his seven-year NFL career, he recorded more than 4,500 total yards and 16 touchdowns, including a 33-yard run in Super Bowl XXXVIII. During his tenure on the Bruin coaching staff, he has been instrumental in the development of some of the most productive running backs in the Pac-12, Paul Perkins, Joshua Kelley, Demetric Felton Jr. and Zach Charbonnet.

Kezirian, also known as Coach K, was a standout offensive lineman at UCLA and then returned as an assistant coach on some of the most successful teams in school history. After his coaching career, his contributions to his alma mater continued as an administrator for academics and student development, where he helped mentor hundreds of student-athletes throughout their education. An all-conference offensive lineman in 1973 who was presented UCLA's Kenneth S. Washington Award as the team's outstanding senior offensive player, Kezirian helped pave the way for a Bruin rushing attack that led the nation (400.3 yards per game) and an offense which established school records for scoring average (42.7 points per game) and single-season rushing yards (4,403) in 1973. As a coach, he helped guide Bruin teams to wins in eight-straight bowl game appearances, including three Rose Bowl victories in 1983, 1984 and 1986, and as interim head coach at the 2002 Las Vegas Bowl he led the Bruins to victory. Three of the teams for which he served as an assistant coach equaled the school record for wins in a season with 10.

BRUINS IN GRAD SCHOOL

Fifteen of the UCLA Bruins are currently enrolled in the master's degree program in Transformative Coaching and Leadership — Jake Bobo, Bo Calvert, Ryan Cragun, Kobey Fitzgerald, Jon Gaines II, Chase Griffin, Azizi Hearn, Alex Johnson, Jack Landherr IV, Antonio Mafi, Sam Marrazzo, Raigwon O'Neal, Mo Osling III, Jacob Sykes and Colson Yankoff.

Offered by UCLA's Department of Education, the master's degree in Transformative Coaching and Leadership prepares graduates for careers in coaching and sports leadership in professional and collegiate athletics, K-12 schools and community-based sports organizations. Inspired by the legendary John Wooden, the goals of the program include enabling prospective candidates to develop their own philosophy of coaching and leadership—and one that is premised on a holistic understanding of persons and sound principles of coaching, teaching and learning.

The degree program is also informed by an ethic of social justice, where teaching and coaching in various contexts—collegiate sports, professional sports, K-12 schools, Boys and Girls Clubs and other community sports programs—are analyzed through the lens of equity, access, diversity, and human dignity with the steadfast aim of contributing to the creation of a more just, equitable and humane society through enlightened and socially conscious sports education and leadership.

In addition, Shea Pitts has completed the Transformative Coaching and Leadership program and is now enrolled in the Master of Legal Studies program at UCLA Law.

Shea's grandfather, Elijah Pitts (1938-1998), was a running back for the Green Bay Packers and was part of all five NFL-championship teams under Vince Lombardi, including the first two Super Bowls ... **Nicholas Barr-Mira** is the brother of Bruin All-American and Dallas Cowboys linebacker Anthony Barr, who played eight seasons for Minnesota after being a first-round selection by the Vikings in the 2014 NFL Draft ... **Kam Brown's** dad, Larry, played from 1991-98 for Dallas, the Raiders and the Vikings and was a member of three Super Bowl championship teams (XXVII, XXVIII and XXX) and the MVP of Super Bowl XXX ... **Isaiah Newcombe's** dad, Bobby, was a member of the Ravens and Cardinals (2001) ... multiple members of the Bruin coaching staff have links to the NFL in addition to head coach Chip Kelly — defensive coordinator **Bill McGovern** was an assistant coach with the Bears (2021), Giants (2016-19) and Eagles (2013-15) ... running backs coach **DeShaun Foster** played seven seasons in the NFL: 2002-07 with the Panthers and 2008 at San Francisco after his UCLA playing career ... inside linebackers coach **Ken Norton Jr.** coached with the Seahawks and Raiders from 2010-21 after playing for the Cowboys (1988-1993) and 49ers (1994-2000) ... offensive line coach **Tim Drevno** was an assistant for the 49ers from 2011-13 ... Director of Football Performance **Keith Belton** played running back in the NFL for the Lions, Bears and Broncos from 2004-07.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

Several Bruins have dads who played college football -- LB **Shea Pitts'** dad, Ron, played defensive back at UCLA from 1981-84 and then went on to an NFL career with Buffalo and Green Bay ... Shea wears the same No. 47 his dad did while a Bruin. THE STORY OF NO. 36

On Friday, Aug. 26, 2022, head coach Chip Kelly awarded Alex Johnson the No. 36 jersey in honor of Nick Pasquale, who wore the number for the Bruins in 2012 and 2013 before his death in a car accident.

Nick was a 5-7, 172 pound redshirt freshman walk-on receiver for the Bruins who had seen his first game action a week before his death in September of 2013. He was known for his passion for the game, his limitless determination and his high qualities as a teammate. Current UCLA coaches Jerry Neuheisel and Daniel Fields were teammates with Pasquale.

Johnson has carved out roles on special teams and as a reserve defensive back across his 29 games played entering 2022. Johnson follows in the footsteps of Ethan Fernea, who donned the number from 2019-2021. The 2019 season was the first that a Bruin had worn the No. 36 since the start of the 2013 campaign.

MORE FROM UNDER CENTER

Twenty-seven first-time starters have gone under center for UCLA since 1990, including Chase Griffin, Ethan Garbers and Dorian Thompson-Robinson. The Bruins have gone 13-14 in those games.

BRUIN FRESHMEN OVER THE YEARS

UCLA has used 11 true freshmen in the 2022 season. Two true freshmen saw action in the 2022 opener against Bowling Green — RBs T.J. Harden and Carsen Ryan. Nine more saw the field in Game 2 versus Alabama State: P Chase Barry, WR Jacynd Marshall, RB Jack Pedersen, WR Braden Pegan, DB Kamari Ramsey, WR Elijah Rodriguez, DB Clint Stephens, DB Croix Stewart and LB Jalen Woods.

The Bruins set a school record with 21 true freshmen seeing the field in 2018. The following 12 players saw action in the 2018 season opener vs. Cincinnati: WR Kyle Phillips, DB Stephan Blaylock, DB Rayshad Williams, QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson, RB Kazmeir Allen, RB Martell Irby, WR Chase Cota, DL Tyler Manoa, DL Antonio Mafi, C Christophany Murray, DB Elisha Guidry and DL Otito Ogbornia. WR Michael Ezeike saw his first action at Oklahoma. LB Bo Calvert and WR Delon Hurt saw action versus Fresno State. LB Elijah Wade played for the first time at Colorado. DB Alex Johnson hit the field at Oregon. WR Greg Dulcich, OL Alec Anderson and TE David Priebe were in action at Arizona State. OL Jon Gaines II played against Stanford.

In 2021, six true freshmen saw action. Five saw the field in the 2021 season-opener against Hawai'i: OL Garrett DiGiorgio, DB Devin Kirkwood, WR Keontez Lewis, DL Tiaoalii Savea and DL Jay Toia. Nine true frosh saw action in 2019. Kain Medrano appeared on special teams versus California, while LB John Ward saw action against Oregon State. Three true freshmen Bruins played at Washington State: LS Jack Landherr IV, OL Duke Clemens and RB Keegan Jones. Four Bruins saw action in the 2019 opener at Cincinnati: LB Carl Jones Jr., TE Mike Martinez, OT Sean Rhyhan and LB Adam Cohen.

Three true freshmen saw action in the 2017 opener against Texas A&M in the Rose Bowl: DL Jaelan Phillips, DB Darnay Holmes and DB Mo Osling III. DL Martin Andrus Jr. saw action vs. Hawai'i and DB Quentin Lake saw his first action against CU. Moses Robinson-Carr took the field for the first time at Arizona. Greg Rogers came in against Oregon and Rahyme Johnson at UW.

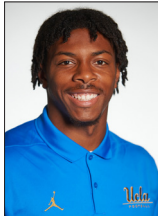

Chip Kelly was named UCLA's 17th head football coach on Nov. 25, 2017. Kelly holds over 30 seasons of coaching experience at both the professional and collegiate levels, most recently serving as head coach of the San Francisco 49ers (2016) prior to coming to Westwood. He also worked as the head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles (2013-15) following four seasons as head coach at the University of Oregon (2009-12) where he posted a record of 46-7. At each stop, he has been the guiding force for some of the most productive offenses in the game.

The 2021 season saw the Bruins record the program's most wins since 2015, at 8-4, finish tied for second in the Pac-12 South with a 6-3 conference mark and earn a bid to the San Diego Credit Union Holiday Bowl. UCLA paced the Pac-12 in scoring at 36.5 points per game to rank 12th nationally. The Bruin rushing attack averaged 215.1 yards per contest to rate as the 14th-best unit in the NCAA. It marked the first time the Bruins had generated more than 200 yards rushing, on average, in consecutive seasons since the 1987-86-85 campaigns. On the other side of the ball, the run defense rated second in the Pac-12 and 23rd nationally at 124.2 yards per game and UCLA ranked second in the conference in sacks. Kyle Philips moved up among the top-5 at UCLA in career receptions after grabbing a Pac-12 best 10 scoring passes. Zach Charbonnet led all Pac-12 running backs with seven 100-yard games during the year. Brittain Brown topped conference rushers with a 6.03 yards per carry mark. Quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson ranked No. 1 in the league in passing efficiency (153.9). Tight end Greg Dulcich was a semifinalist for the John Mackey Award as the nation's top performer at his position. His 117-yard performance versus LSU marked the eighth straight season in which a Bruin tight end reached the century receiving yards mark in a game. UCLA topped the nation in punt return average (20.0) and was seventh in kickoff return average (27.4). Offensive lineman Sean Rhyan, defensive lineman Otito Ogbornia and defensive back Quentin Lake joined Brown, Dulcich and Philips as selections in the NFL Draft.

In 2020, the Bruins led the Pac-12 in scoring (248 pts) and touchdowns scored (31). Thompson-Robinson produced the school's best pass efficiency mark since 2005 (156.29) and became the first Bruin quarterback to record a 300-yard passing (303) and 100-yard rushing game (109) in the same contest (at Colorado). UCLA produced a team rushing average of over 200 yards per game for just the fourth time since 1990. The mark of 230.6 rushing yards per contest ranked 12th nationally. A Bruin team had not finished with a rushing yards per carry mark greater than 2020's 5.1 mark since 1976. Dulcich ranked No. 2 among the nation's tight ends with both his 73.9 receiving yards per game average and 19.88 yards per catch mark. Demetric Felton Jr. led the Pac-12 and ranked sixth in the NCAA in all-purpose yards (165.83). UCLA's defense showed improvement in all phases. The unit allowed almost 50 yards less in total offense (409.9) than the previous season, while reducing its rush defense average by almost 10 yards per game (135.7). It sliced almost half a yard off the rushing average per carry to 3.6, a mark which led the Pac-12. Per game averages for tackles for loss (6.8) and sacks (3.3-ranked 8th in NCAA) both went up.

In year two at UCLA, Thompson-Robinson finished among the top 10 at the school for a single season in completions (216-9th), total offense (2,899-10th) and touchdown passes (21-10th). He set a school mark with 564 yards of total offense in a win at Washington State while leading the second-largest comeback in school history (32 points). Running back Joshua Kelley became the eighth Bruin to post back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons. Kelley finished second in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game average. Felton set a school mark for a running back with 55 receptions and added a school-record four scoring plays of 75-yards or more. UCLA produced five straight 200-yard rushing games for the first time since the 1978 season. Philips finished with the most catches ever by a Bruin freshman player and became the first redshirt freshman to lead the team in receptions since 2001. His 60 catches tied for 11th on the all-time school single season list and his total of two 10-plus catch games ranks

third on the all-time school list. Five wide receivers made their first career scoring catches during the season. The rush defense knocked off almost 0.5 yard/carry from the average of the previous season and the number of quarterback sacks increased from 11 to 26 over a year's time. Special teams improved across the board and featured a punt and kickoff return for a touchdown. UCLA ranked second in the nation in punt return average (22.5 yards).

In his first season in Westwood, Kelly became just the fourth Bruin head coach to guide his team past USC in his initial meeting with the crosstown rival. Running back Joshua Kelley racked up 289 rushing yards in the win against the Trojans, most ever by a back in the series. Kelley finished ninth in the nation in rushing average (113.0 yds per game) and 18th nationally in all-purpose yards (130.55). It marked the fifth consecutive season in which Coach Kelly had produced an NCAA top-10 rated rushing offense leader as a college head coach. A young Bruin team which saw a school-record 21 true freshmen student-athletes take the field during the season, showed steady improvement and generated 432.9 yards of total offense per game over the last eight contests of the season, including a 528-yard effort in the season-finale versus Stanford.

Kelly's lone season in San Francisco saw the 49ers improve from the league's 21st-ranked rushing attack in 2015 (1,544 yards) to the 4th-best ground game in 2016 (2,019 yards). Running back Carlos Hyde was the biggest beneficiary of the improvement, gaining 988 yards in just 13 contests (76.0 yards per game).

Over Kelly's three seasons in Philadelphia, the Eagles ranked third in the NFL in points per game (26.9) and total offense (392.8 yards per game), as well as fourth in rushing yards per game (131.3). Sixteen Pro Bowlers were selected from his teams, including eight in 2014. The Eagles won 10 games in each of his first two seasons, as his 2014 offense scored a franchise-record 474 points to surpass his 2013 team's previous-record total of 442.

The Eagles showed a marked improvement in Year 1 under Kelly, as their 10 wins followed a four-win 2012. He became just the second head coach in league history to win a division title in his first season in the NFL, as the Eagles captured an NFC East Division Championship. He was also named the Maxwell Club NFL Coach of the Year.

Kelly began his head coaching career at the University of Oregon in 2009, leading the Ducks to a 10-3 record and a trip to the Rose Bowl. He finished his time at Oregon with an overall record of 46-7 as head coach (2009-12), including a 33-3 mark in conference play. In his four seasons in Eugene, the Ducks averaged 44.7 points per game. Kelly became the first coach in school history to guide the program to three consecutive undisputed conference championships (2009-11) and its first three 12-win seasons (2010-12).

Oregon made an appearance in a BCS Bowl game in each of Kelly's four seasons, including a trip to the National Championship game following the 2010 campaign. Kelly was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year in back-to-back seasons in 2009 and 2010, and Associated Press Coach of the Year in 2010.

The 2012 Ducks finished second in the nation in scoring (49.6 points per game) and fifth in total offense (537.4 yards per game) with freshman quarterback Marcus Mariota under center. They would conclude the season with a Fiesta Bowl victory over Kansas State. A January bowl game was also the end result for Oregon the year prior, as the Ducks defeated Wisconsin in a Rose Bowl thriller, 45-38. Kelly's offense notched Top-5 finishes in points per game (46.1, third) and total offense (522.8 yards per game, fourth) in 2011.

In 2010, the Ducks led the nation both points per game (46.1) and total yardage (530.7 per game) en route to a BCS National Championship Game appearance. In addition to his Pac-10 Coach of the Year and Associated Press Coach of the Year awards, Kelly garnered Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year, Walter Camp Coach of the Year, The Sporting News Coach of the Year and American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Coach of the Year accolades.

Kelly's first season as a head coach (2009) culminated in a Rose Bowl appearance and the Pac-10 Coach of the Year award, as his offense ranked sixth in the country in both points per game (36.1) and rushing yards per game (231.7). He was promoted to the top spot after his offenses led the Pac-10 in a number of categories during his two seasons (2007-08) as offensive coordinator under Mike Bellotti.

Kelly had spent the previous 13 years at his alma mater, the University of New Hampshire, before being named offensive coordinator at Oregon. As offensive coordinator at UNH, Kelly protégée Ricky Santos earned the Walter Payton Award as the most outstanding player in FCS in 2006. The quarterback previously finished second in 2005. Kelly also coached the Wildcats' offensive line (1997, 1998) and running backs (1992, 1994-96). The New Hampshire offense averaged better than 400 yards of total offense per game in seven of his eight seasons on staff.

Kelly began his coaching career guiding defensive backs and special teams at Columbia University in 1990. He moved to outside linebackers and safeties in 1991 before his first stint at UNH as running backs coach in 1992. He also spent one season at Johns Hopkins University as defensive coordinator in 1993.

1st to 100 NCAA Championships

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 119 NCAA titles to their credit after winning the 2020-21 men's water polo championship.

SPIEKER FIELD AT THE ROSE BOWL: HOME OF BRUIN FOOTBALL

The nation's most famous college football stadium – the Rose Bowl – will be in its 41st season as the home of the UCLA Bruins football team and its 100th season of overall operation. The stadium is recognized as both a United States National Historic Landmark and a California Historic Civil Engineering landmark. Thanks to a generous donation in 2017 from prominent UCLA alum Tod Spieker and his family, the playing surface is called Spieker Field at the Rose Bowl.

The Rose Bowl was built specifically for football, but has been utilized as a venue for portions of the 1932 Olympic Games' cycling events and was the soccer site for the 1984 Olympics. The Rose Bowl has also played host to five NFL Super Bowls – XI in 1977, XIV in 1980, XVII in 1983, XXI in 1987 and XXVII in 1993. It was a venue for the 1994 World Cup and the 1999 Women's World Cup soccer tournaments, including the championship games. The USA women's soccer team victory over China in the 1999 event drew over 90,000 fans. In addition, the 1983 Army-Navy game was played in the Rose Bowl.

On Jan. 1, 2018 and Jan. 1, 2015, the Rose Bowl served as the site of one of the College Football Playoff semifinal games. In 2014, the Rose Bowl hosted the final BCS Championship contest. It had also played host to the BCS Championship game in 2002, 2006 and 2010.

Considered an ideal concert venue, the Rose Bowl has hosted shows by such groups and artists as Taylor Swift, Beyonce, Jay-Z, Kenny Chesney, Jason Aldean, One Direction, U2, 'N Sync, Eagles, Rolling Stones, Pink Floyd, Michael Jackson, Metallica, Guns and Roses, Depeche Mode and Journey.

The iconic stadium has put the final touches on a \$181 million dollar renovation, and now features a new video board, improved exiting, wider aisles in the end zones and the Terry Donahue Pavilion. The Pavilion area houses the press boxes, broadcast booths, premium seating, boxes and suites. In December of 2015, the radio and TV booths were renamed "The Keith Jackson Broadcast Center". Jackson, the former sportscaster, coined the phrase "The Granddaddy of Them All" for the Rose



Bowl Game. Also added are field level entrances and exits, and additional concession stands and restroom facilities.

Since 2007, UCLA and its opponents have dressed in new locker rooms located underneath the south concourse of the stadium. The locker area features all of the latest amenities to benefit the players, coaches, sports medicine and equipment staffs. In addition, a new media interview room and working press area were included in the upgrades. In 1998, new individual chairs were installed in the seating areas between the end zones. Also, improved seating areas for the physically challenged were installed, as well as a new sound system.

Completed in 1922 at a cost of \$272,198, the Rose Bowl was first used for the USC-California football game that year which was won by the Golden Bears 12-0. The stadium was originally horseshoe shaped and seated 57,000 persons when it hosted the 1923 Rose Bowl Game. The south end zone was enclosed

prior to the 1929 game to increase seating capacity to 76,000. Further enlargements took place in 1932 (83,677) and 1949 (100,807). A record crowd of 106,869 fans witnessed the 1973 Ohio State – USC Rose Bowl contest.

The Rose Bowl has many firsts in its vast history. On Jan. 1, 1927, radio stations across the nation were linked together for the first time in a coast-to-coast broadcast. On Jan. 1, 1954, The UCLA-Michigan State Rose Bowl Game was the first west-to-east color telecast on a nationwide connection.

The Rose Bowl has 77 rows of seats. It measures 880 feet from the north to south rims and 695 feet from east to west. Its circumference around the rim is 2,430 feet, compared to 1,350 feet at field level. It took 28 miles of lumber to provide the original seats. The square footage of the grass on the floor of the stadium is 79,156.

AM 570 LA Sports also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks. The weekly hour-long Bruin Insider Show also returns.

UCLA 45, Bowling Green 17



UCLA scored 38 unanswered points from the second quarter on and rolled to a season-opening 45-17 victory over Bowling Green at the Rose Bowl.

Redshirt senior quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson totaled four touchdowns, two apiece in the air and on the ground, while passing for 298 yards. Senior running back Zach Charbonnet added 111 yards rushing on 21 carries with a touchdown.

Overall, UCLA totaled 626 yards of offense to Bowling Green's 162. The margin was especially strong in the rushing game, with the Bruins accruing 269 rushing yards as a team, compared to 37 for the visitors. Kazmeir Allen (10 receptions, 85 yards, touchdown) and Josiah Norwood (five receptions, 63 yards, touchdown) led the receiving corps.

Defensively, the Bruins racked up nine tackles for loss while limiting Bowling Green to under 200 yards total offense. Defensive back Mo Osling III, linebacker JonJon Vaughns, and defensive back Kenny Churchwell III each finished with a co-team-high five tackles.

It was a day for career firsts as the UCLA football team scored 31 unanswered points to walk away with a 45-7 victory over Alabama State at the Rose Bowl.

Running backs Christian Grubb and T.J. Harden and quarterback Ethan Garbers each recorded their first career rushing touchdowns while tight end Hudson Habermehl caught his first receiving touchdown. Defensively, corner backs Jaylin Davies and D.J. Justice picked their first career interceptions.

The Bruins totaled 485 yards of total offense, 265 through the air and 220 on the ground, while UCLA's defensive unit forced three turnovers on two interceptions and a fumble recovery.

Alabama State quarterback Myles Crawley was 16-for-27 for 177 yards and a touchdown in his two-and-a-half quarters of play.

Garbers, who entered the game under center at the top of the second quarter for Dorian Thompson-Robinson, threw for 164 yards on 14-for-18 pass attempts. Garbers called his number twice at the goal line for two rushing scores, both coming at the end of the second quarter.

Nicholas Barr-Mira kicked a 24-yard field goal as time expired to lead UCLA to a 32-31 comeback victory over South Alabama at the Rose Bowl.

Redshirt senior wide receiver Jake Bobo paced the Bruins offensively, making five catches for 89 yards and a touchdown, his first as a Bruin. Redshirt senior quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson finished with 263 yards passing and three touchdowns.

UCLA found itself down 31-23 at the end of the third quarter but closed the gap at the top of the fourth quarter with an eight-yard touchdown pass from Thompson-Robinson to Logan Loya on fourth down. Thompson-Robinson's two-point conversion rushing attempt fell just short, however, keeping South Alabama ahead, 31-29, with 12:25 remaining in the game.

Tanner McGee was sacked by Carl Jones for a loss of 11 yards to end South Alabama's final offensive drive, giving the Bruins the ball on the 33 with 2:52 to play. A pair of 20+-yard passes by Thompson-Robinson helped the Bruins get into field goal range for Barr-Mira's heroics.

Quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson passed for 234 yards and two touchdowns while running back Zach Charbonnet found the end zone three times on just nine carries as UCLA recorded a dominant 45-17 win over Colorado at Folsom Field.

The Bruins never trailed, scoring the first 14 points of the game. The Buffaloes managed to put 10 points on the board in the second quarter, but UCLA pulled away with a dominant second half, outscoring the hosts 24-7.

Thompson-Robinson dissected the Colorado secondary all game, completing 19 of 23 passes. Thompson-Robinson added 56 yards on the ground.

Charbonnet meanwhile was just as efficient, needing just nine carries to reach 104 yards and three touchdowns. He broke off for long touchdown runs of 35 and 46 yards.

Defensively, UCLA limited Colorado to just 309 yards of total offense, including 51 yards on the ground. Particular standouts on the defensive end included linebacker Laiatu Latu (three sacks), linebacker JonJon Vaughns (team-high seven tackles and a pass breakup), and linebacker Carl Jones Jr. (interception).

The Huskies attempted a late comeback but fell short as UCLA ran out the clock with solid game management and key first down plays.

Thompson-Robinson found his stride in the second quarter, throwing touchdowns on consecutive plays to give UCLA 14 quick points. Junior Kam Brown and Zach Charbonnet added a touchdown apiece in the game. Charbonnet rushed for 124 yards and added 56 receiving yards.

Charbonnet crossed the 100-yard rushing plateau for the fourth time in six games this season.

Thompson-Robinson's 70-yard touchdown pass to Logan Loya, midway through the fourth quarter, set the new school record for most career touchdown passes (76, eclipsing Brett Hundley's 75 touchdowns).

In all, Thompson-Robinson accounted for five touchdowns – four passing touchdown and one on the ground.

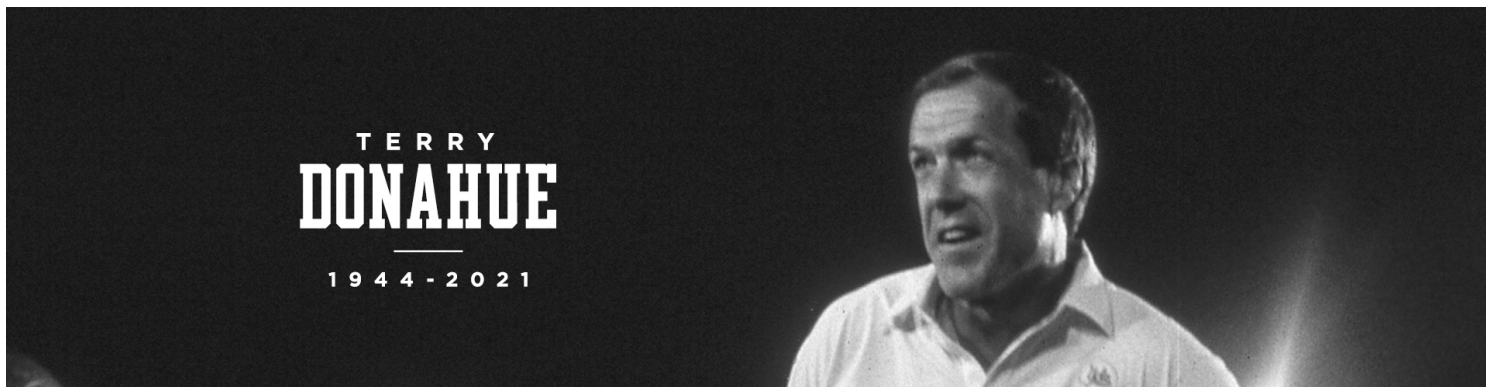

**UCLA REMEMBERS LEGENDARY COACH TERRY DONAHUE**

Terry Donahue, the winningest coach in Pacific-12 Conference and UCLA football history, passed away on July 4, 2021, at his home in Newport Beach, Calif., surrounded by family, following a two-year battle with cancer. He was 77.

Donahue devoted the majority of his adult life to championing UCLA after enrolling at the school as a walk-on defensive lineman. In his first season (1965) in Westwood as a student-athlete, the 190-pound lineman helped lead the Bruins to the program's first-ever Rose Bowl victory with an upset of previously unbeaten and No. 1-ranked Michigan State. He went on to serve as an assistant coach for the Bruins under Pepper Rodgers and Dick Vermeil and then took over the reins as UCLA's head coach, at age 31, beginning with the 1976 season.

Donahue, the first person to appear in a Rose Bowl Game as a player, assistant coach and head coach at his alma mater, would go on to post a conference-record 98 wins (98-51-5) and a school-record 151 wins (151-74-8). In a 20-year span, he won or shared five conference titles (1982, 1983, 1985, 1987, 1993) while finishing first or second in the league standings 12 times. The Bruins captured wins in three Rose Bowls (1983, 1984, 1986) during his tenure and he became the first college coach to come away with bowl game victories in seven consecutive seasons (1983 Rose Bowl, 1984 Rose Bowl, 1985 Fiesta Bowl, 1986 Rose Bowl, 1986 Freedom Bowl, 1987 Aloha Bowl, 1989 Cotton Bowl), including four New Year's Day wins in a row. Donahue's Bruins recorded seven straight top-20 finishes in the final Associated Press football poll from 1982-88.

During his 20-year head coaching reign, Donahue's Bruin teams produced 40 wins over ranked opponents culminating with his final coaching victory, a 24-20 decision in the L.A. Coliseum over No. 11 USC in 1995. He posted a 10-9-1 career ledger in battles against the crosstown rivals. Donahue's UCLA teams yielded 34 first-team All-America team selections, a list featuring some of the top performers in school history --- LB Jerry Robinson, S Kenny Easley, RB Freeman McNeil, K John Lee, LB Ken Norton Jr., QB Troy Aikman, LB Carnell Lake, S Eric Turner and OL Jonathan Ogden. Fourteen of Donahue's Bruins were chosen in the first round of the NFL Draft, including future Pro Football Hall of Famers Aikman, Easley and Ogden.

Donahue himself was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2000. In 1997, he was welcomed into the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame. Donahue joined the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame with the class of 2001. In 2013, the press box at the Rose Bowl was officially dedicated as the Terry Donahue Pavilion. ESPN named Donahue one of the 150 Greatest College Coaches in its 2019 celebration of College Football's 150th Anniversary.
