#### LEADING OFF

- STANFORD** enters the week ranked No. 2 in the nation according to the D1Baseball and NCBWA, and No. 3 according to Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball ... finished last year ranked No. 5 in the D1Baseball Poll, No. 6 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 7 according to NCBWA, Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball Foundation ... made its 18th College World Series appearance (37th postseason appearance overall), including its second in as many seasons, a year ago ... 18 appearances are seventh-most in the nation and the Cardinal entered the CWS ranked No. 1 according to Collegiate Baseball ... won both the Pac-12 regular season and tournament championships a year ago ... hosted a regional for the 20th time in program history and won a bracket featuring No. 13 Texas State, No. 20 UC Santa Barbara and Binghamton to advance to the super regionals ... defeated Connecticut in the super regional round and is now 12-3 in super regional games played at Sunken Diamond and has advanced to the College World Series in all six seasons it has hosted a super regional ... is the only D1 program to host a regional in each of the last five tournaments ... won 22 of the last 26 games, 25 of 31, 28 of 35, 33 of 41, and 38 of 48 a year ago ... has led all teams in postseason home runs the last two years (22 in 2021; 23 in 2022) ... scored first in 35 of 65 games last year and went 26-9 when scoring first ... ranked second in the Pac-12 in average (.309) last year and led the Conference in slugging (.536) and home runs (118) while hitting 71 in the last 27 games overall ... also led the Pac-12 in shutouts (9) and ranked third in ERA (4.23).
- DREW BOWSER** is a preseason All-American ... has homered in back-to-back games, including a three-run shot in the top of the ninth on Sunday that sparked a seven-run frame and a comeback victory ... batted .385 (5-for-13) with four runs scored, two doubles, two homers and five RBIs in the series against Cal State Fullerton ... was named ABCA All-Region second team a year ago ... Pac-12 All-Tournament last year after batting .444 (8 for 18) and connecting for four home runs and two doubles while scoring six runs and driving in eight to post a 1.222 slugging percentage ... hit .286 (6 for 21) with six runs scored, a double, three home runs and eight RBIs in the Stanford Regional to earn a spot on the All-Regional team ... strung together a 17-game hit streak from May 14 - June 12 (.371, 26x70, 23 R, 4 2B, 3B, 12 HR, 27 RBIs) ... belted a pair of home runs vs. Connecticut on June 11 ... six homers and drove in 12 runs during the postseason run ... six home runs were the most of any player in the postseason.
- RYAN BRUNO** is a preseason All-American ... made a team-best 30 relief appearances, compiling a 6-1 record, one save, and a 2.72 ERA over 39 2/3 innings last year ... 30 appearances were ninth-most in the conference and tied for 10th-most in Stanford history ... struck out 71 batters and limited opponents to a .150 average against to average 16.11 strikeouts per nine innings ... made seven appearances and compiled a 1.69 ERA and a 1-0 record while striking out 20 hitters in 10 2/3 innings during the postseason ... appeared in all three games against No. 13 Texas State in the regional round, compiling 10 strikeouts over four scoreless innings ... made one appearance with the 2022 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team and struck out one over an inning against Italy.
- DAVID ESQUER** was named 2022 Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the second time while at Stanford (2018) and third overall (2001, California) ... earned 2022 ABCA West Region Coach of the Year ... won his 100th game at the helm of the program on March 4, 2021 as Stanford walked off with a 7-6 victory over San Francisco in 10 innings ... 700th career win came in a 5-4 triumph vs. Arizona on May 28, 2022 at Pac-12 Tournament ... has amassed a 184-73 overall record at Stanford and owns a 709-540-2 record as a Division I head coach (18 seasons at California) ... .716 win percentage at Stanford is the best in program history ... 300th career Pac-12 win came against USC on May 21, 2022 to claim sole possession of 2022 Pac-12 title ... made his ninth postseason appearance as a head coach (fourth with Stanford) last year ... previously guided California to Omaha in 2011 while earning National Coach of the Year honors.
- CARTER GRAHAM** is a preseason All-American and is listed on the watch list for the Bobby Bragan National Collegiate Slugger Award ... was named a second-team All-American by Baseball America and third-team All-American according to Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game last year ... ABCA All-Region first team ... All-Pac-12 first team ... named All-Stanford Regional after hitting .313 (5 for 16) with four runs scored, a double, two homers and seven RBIs ... had a 15-game hitting streak from February 27-March 27 (.410, 17 R, 3 2B, 6 HR, 20 RBIs) ... hit safely in all but 12 games he played last year, including 49 of his last 59 overall ... had an eight-game hitting streak snapped on April 15 (.406, 13x32, 11 R, 3 2B, 3 HR, 15 RBIs) ... led the team in RBIs (79) and home runs (22), was second in runs scored (64), and third in average (.331) ... led the Pac-12 in homers ... 22 homers were fourth-most in Stanford history while the 79 RBIs were sixth-most ... collected an RBI in 40 of 64 games played last season - including a string of six straight from Feb. 25 - March 5 ... collected multiple RBIs in five straight games from April 8-14 ... first two career home runs came at UTSA on Feb. 28, 2022 ... added a multi-homer game vs. UC Davis on May 3, 2022 and one more vs. No. 13 Texas State in an elimination game on June 5, 2022 ... hit .365 (.46 for 126) with 34 runs scored, seven doubles, 11 homers and 42 RBIs in Pac-12 play ... posted 24 multi-hit games and a team-best 22 multi-RBI contests ... CoSIDA Academic All-District.
- QUINN MATHEWS** is a preseason All-American and is listed on the watch list for the Golden Spikes Award ... was an ABCA All-Region second team pick in 2022 ... All-Pac-12 honorable mention ... posted a 9-2 record with a 3.08 ERA and nine saves over 27 appearances (nine starts) ... began the year as a starter but moved to the bullpen to shore up the back end of games for the Cardinal ... struck out 111 over 99 1/3 innings (10.01 strikeouts per game) while limiting opponents to a .213 average against ... finished second in the Pac-12 in ERA, wins, strikeouts, saves and hits allowed per game (6.98) ... nine saves were eighth-most in Stanford history ... was the nation's only pitcher with both nine wins and nine saves last year ... Karbach Round Rock Classic All-Tournament Team ... Stanford All-Regional team ... three-time Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week a year ago (February 28, March 28, April 18) ... the first pitcher to be honored three times in the same season since UCLA's Ryan Garcia in 2019 and first Stanford pitcher to capture this award three times in the same season since Mark Appel in 2013 ... 10 strikeouts with two hits allowed over six shutout innings to earn victory vs. No. 2 Arkansas (Feb. 27) ... earned Pac-12 and National Pitcher of the Week for his start vs. the Razorbacks.
- BRADEN MONTGOMERY** has reached in 29 consecutive games dating back to last season ... is a preseason All-American and is listed on the watch list for the Golden Spikes Award ... batted .455 (5-for-11) with five runs scored, two doubles, a homer and four RBIs in the series at Cal State Fullerton ... 3-for-3 with three runs scored and his first

homer of the season on Saturday before going 2-for-5 with a pair of doubles on Sunday - the second of which drove in three runs and put the Cardinal on top in the ninth ... also pitched on Sunday, earning the victory after tossing two innings and striking out three ... was the 2022 Pac-12 Freshman of the Year ... Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game Freshman All-American and a second-team Freshman All-American according to NCBWA ... All-Pac-12 honorable mention ... was a semifinalist for the 2022 John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year ... hit safely in eight straight games from March 20-April 3 ... homered in all three games and batted .462 (6 for 13) with four runs scored, a double, three homers and nine RBIs in the series sweep of ASU ... made collegiate debut on Opening Day vs. Cal State Fullerton, striking out a pair to record his first career save in a 1-0 shutout victory ... debuted in the field on February 20 against Fullerton and went 3 for 5 with two home runs, six RBIs and three runs scored ... became the first freshman with a multi-homer game since Alex Blandino hit two vs. Arizona State on April 20, 2012 ... added a second multi-homer game vs. Grand Canyon on April 22 ... homered and collected the save in a 3-2 win vs. CSUN on March 6 ... 18 home runs ranked third on the team and were a Stanford freshman record.

- **MALCOLM MOORE** had an outstanding opening weekend to his college career, batting .333 with five runs scored, two homers and five RBIs at Cal State Fullerton ... collected his first career homer in his first collegiate at bat on Friday before launching a pair in Sunday's 21-13 win ... has now homered three times in his first three games and leads the Cardinal in the category.
- **EDDIE PARK** had a 15-game hit streak snapped on Sunday at Cal State Fullerton (.492, 29x59, 12 R, 4 2B, 5 RBIs) ... was named Most Outstanding Player at 2022 Stanford Regional after batting .700 (14 for 20) with five runs scored, a double and two RBIs ... hit safely in all but 15 games with an at bat last year and reached in all but five ... first 41 career hits were singles, but his 42nd and 43rd were doubles ... now owns nine doubles and a triple as part of his 97 career hits ... batted .538 (21 for 39) with nine runs scored, three doubles and two RBIs during the postseason last year ... 21 hits were tied with Tommy Troy for the most of any player in the postseason.
- **TOMMY TROY** is a preseason All-American and is listed on the watch list for the Golden Spikes Award ... hit .600 (12 for 20) with eight runs scored, four doubles, three homers and seven RBIs to earn All-Regional honors at the 2022 Stanford Regional ... solo home run tied the game at 3-3 in the bottom of the ninth of championship final vs. No. 13 Texas State in regional round ... batted .500 (21 for 42) with 12 runs scored, five doubles, five homers and nine RBIs during the postseason run ... 41 total bases during the NCAA tournament led all postseason participants, while his 21 hits were tied for most with Eddie Park ... was named to Karbach Round Rock Classic All-Tournament team (.455, 2 R, 2B, RBI).

**THIS WEEK**

- No. 3 Stanford will continue the 2023 season on Tuesday when it welcomes Pac-12 rival California to The Farm for a non-conference game and the Cardinal's home opener.
- The midweek clash with Cal is set for a 6 p.m. first pitch and will be broadcast on Pac-12 Networks.
- Roxy Bernstein and Dean Stotz will be on the broadcast call for the Pac-12.

**UP NEXT**

- After the Tuesday game, Stanford will remain at home to host Rice in a three-game series starting on Friday at 2 p.m.
- The two teams will then meet at 2:05 p.m. on Saturday before concluding the series with an 11:05 a.m. start on Sunday.
- Friday's game will air live on Pac-12 Networks, with Roxy Bernstein and Dean Stotz once again on the call.

**A LOOK BACK**

- Stanford went 2-1 last week, earning a road series victory over Cal State Fullerton to begin the season.
- The Cardinal dropped the opener, but rebounded to win games two and three to take the series.
- Stanford scored once in the seventh, eighth and ninth innings on Saturday to eventually earn the 7-5 win, while senior shortstop Owen Cobb made a game-saving diving grab in the bottom of the ninth to seal the victory.
- The Cardinal got off to a great start on Sunday, scoring three times in the first, but Fullerton responded with five in the bottom of the inning and eventually built an 11-6 lead headed to the ninth.
- Stanford's bats came alive from there, scoring seven in the ninth, but Fullerton once again drew even in the home half.
- Refusing to lose, the Cardinal exploded for eight more runs in the 10th to earn the 21-13 come-from-behind victory and the series win.
- Stanford connected for eight home runs over the three games in Fullerton while averaging 9.67 runs per game (29 runs in three games).
- Five different Cardinal hitters had at least one homer, led by freshman Malcolm Moore with three and Drew Bowser with two.

**OPENING WEEKEND NOTES**

- Since 1959, Stanford has opened the season with a three-game series against Cal State Fullerton 11 times (1994, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2020, 2022 and 2023) ... the Cardinal has won seven of the 11 series and has amassed a 20-13 record over the 33 games in those sets.
- Including an 8-1 setback this year, Stanford is 49-15-1 overall on Opening Day since 1959 and has won five of its last eight games to open a season.
- The Cardinal has played 26 opening weekend series of three-or-more games since 1959 and is 18-8 in those series ... Stanford has compiled a 53-26 record over the 79 games in those sets.

**CARDINAL TABBED FAVORITE IN PRESEASON POLL**

- Coming off back-to-back College World Series appearances, Stanford has been voted the preseason favorite to win the 2023 conference title according to the Pac-12 coaches ... this year marks the second consecutive season that Stanford has been picked to win the Pac-12.
- The Cardinal earned 99 points in the preseason poll, including nine first-place votes ... UCLA followed with two first-place votes to earn 90 points and claim second ... Oregon State (77 points), Arizona (74 points) and Oregon (68 points) rounded out the top five.
- Arizona State was picked to finish sixth (45 points), followed by Washington (43 points), California (40 points), Washington State (29 points), USC (24 points) and Utah (16 points) to round out the poll.
- Stanford, which won the 2022 Pac-12 regular season title and the inaugural Pac-12 tournament championship, began the year ranked in the top four in all six national polls - including a No. 3 ranking according to the D1Baseball, NCBWA, Collegiate Baseball, College Baseball Foundation and USA Today Coaches.
- In addition to the preseason poll, the Pac-12 revealed the first baseball preseason all-conference team in its history, which was also voted on by the league's coaches ... Stanford landed a conference-leading eight players on the preseason list, including Drew Bowser, Ryan Bruno, Joey Dixon, Carter Graham, Quinn Mathews, Braden Montgomery, Eddie Park and Tommy Troy.

**PRESEASON ALL AMERICANS**

- Six Cardinal earned preseason All-America honors headed into the 2023 season, including senior Quinn Mathews, juniors Drew Bowser, Ryan Bruno, Carter Graham and Tommy Troy, and sophomore Braden Montgomery.
- Stanford's five selections (Bruno, Graham, Mathews, Montgomery, Troy) from the NCBWA and D1Baseball were the most in the nation for each publication.
- Bowser was a third-team selection according to Collegiate Baseball.
- Bruno landed on D1Baseball's first team, and was a second-team selection according to Baseball America and NCBWA.
- Graham was a first-team selection according to NCBWA and Collegiate Baseball, while landing on the second team according to D1Baseball and Perfect Game.
- Mathews was a first-team selection according to Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game, landed on NCBWA's second team, and placed on the third team according to D1Baseball ... the native of Aliso Viejo, Calif. was also named Pac-12 Preseason Pitcher of the Year according to D1Baseball.
- Montgomery was a second-team selection according to Perfect Game, Baseball America and NCBWA, while landing on D1Baseball's third team ... the native of Madison, Miss. was also voted Pac-12 Preseason Player of the Year according to Perfect Game and D1Baseball.
- Troy was a first-team selection according to D1Baseball, Baseball America and Perfect Game, while landing on NCBWA's third team.

**TOP PROSPECTS ON THE FARM**

- D1Baseball published its listing of the top draft prospects for the 2023 and 2024 MLB drafts, and the Cardinal was well-represented in the rankings, including boasting the top prospect in each class in Tommy Troy (2023) and Braden Montgomery (2024).
- After Troy, Ryan Bruno (6), Drew Bowser (7), Carter Graham (9) and Quinn Mathews (12) are all top 15 prospects for the 2023 draft.
- Montgomery headlines a 2024 list that features Malcolm Moore (6), Ty Uber (27) and Charlie Saum (28).

**LONG BALLS LEADING THE WAY**

- Stanford hit a program-record 118 home runs compared to 36 allowed last year (+82 in home run differential) ... the 118 home runs topped the previous Stanford record of 102 from 1997 ... Carter Graham led the way with a Pac-12-best 22, followed by Brock Jones with 21 (second in Pac-12), Braden Montgomery and Drew Bowser with 18 (third in Pac-12), Kody Huff with 13 (ninth in Pac-12) and Brett Barrera with 11 ... Montgomery, Graham, Jones, Huff, Bowser, Tommy Troy and Vincent Martinez each posted multi-homer games, including four from Jones, three from Graham, and two from Montgomery and Bowser.
- So far this season, Stanford has connected for a Pac-12 best eight homers through three games, including three from freshman Malcolm Moore (tied for third in the nation) and two from Drew Bowser ... the eight round-trippers rank 10th in the nation, while the 2.67 homers per game rank ninth.
- The Cardinal hit 23 homers in the postseason last year - the most of any team in the field.
- Stanford's lineup featured six different players with double-digit homers, while 11 different Cardinal hit at least one.
- The Cardinal homered in just two of its first six games, but connected for at least one in 11 of its next 14 - including three three times.
- While Stanford did not hit a homer in the four games preceding a three-game series against Arizona State, the Cardinal hit nine homers in the series against the Sun Devils - including four homers in the Sunday finale.
- Stanford's season high in homers came on June 11 vs. Connecticut when it hit eight - the most for the Cardinal since launching eight against Washington State on May 2, 2004 ... Stanford also managed a six-homer game last year - accomplishing the feat on May 20 against USC ... the six round-trippers, hit by six different players, were the most for the Cardinal since hitting seven at Arizona on May 16, 2004 ... the Cardinal connected for five home runs three times in a game last year (vs. UC Davis, May 3; at Santa Clara, May 17; vs. Arizona, May 26).
- The Cardinal finished first in the Pac-12 in home runs with 118 (eighth nationally) and averaged a conference-best 1.82 per game (14th nationally).
- Stanford managed multiple homers in 21 of its last 27 games overall - collecting 71 round-trippers over those 27 contests.
- Stanford went 38-10 when hitting at least one home run in a game and 29-7 when hitting two or more last season.

**GRAHAM AMONG NATION'S TOP HITTERS**

- Junior Carter Graham has been named to the Bobby Bragan National Collegiate Slugger Award (BBNCSA) watch list.
- The award, created by the Bobby Bragan Youth Foundation, was open to nominations from all Division I baseball programs in the country.
- The BBNCSA is based on performance at the plate, academics and personal integrity.
- Graham hit .331 with 64 runs scored, 13 doubles, a triple and a Pac-12-best 22 home runs while driving in a team-high 79 runs a year ago ... Graham hit safely in all but 12 of his 64 games played and collected an RBI in 40 of the 64 games while posting 24 multi-hit games and a team-best 22 multi-RBI contests.
- This year's watch list consists of 51 players representing 19 conferences around the country, including all five power conferences.
- The BBNCSA originally started out in 2017 as an honor going to the top college hitter in Texas ... in 2019, the BBNCSA expanded becoming a regional award covering Division I programs in Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico and Oklahoma ... the BBNCSA became a national award in 2020; however, no winner was announced due to the Covid-19 virus which cut the 2020 college baseball season short.
- The winner of the BBNCSA will be announced in June and honored at a gala in the fall at the Fort Worth Club ... Texas Tech's Hunter Hargrove won the initial BBNCSA in 2017 ... Dallas Baptist's Devlin Granberg took home the honor in 2018 with Texas Tech's Josh Jung winning the award in 2019 ... Connor Norby from East Carolina University won the BBNCSA in 2021, while last year's winner was Ivan Melendez from the University of Texas.
- Six players from the Pac-12 are on the watch list for the BBNCSA, including Graham, Drew Cowley (Oregon), Chase Davis (Arizona), Jacob McKeon (Washington State), Tanner Smith (Oregon) and Jacob Walsh (Oregon)

**A TRIO TO WATCH**

- A trio of Cardinal have been named to the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award preseason watch list, including Quinn Mathews, Braden Montgomery and Tommy Troy.
- The 2023 preseason list includes 55 athletes from the ranks of high school and college baseball ... moving forward, the Golden Spikes Award Advisory Board will maintain the award's watchlist on a rolling basis, allowing athletes to play themselves into consideration for the award based on their performances throughout the season.
- In total, 40 schools and 16 conferences are represented on this year's Preseason Watch List ... LSU and Tennessee lead all schools with four student-athletes appearing on the list, followed closely by Stanford with three ... seven other schools placed a pair of selections to begin their seasons: Florida, Maryland, Oklahoma State, Ole Miss, Vanderbilt, Virginia, and Wake Forest.
- The Pac-12 boasts five players on the Golden Spikes Award watch list, as Arizona's Chase Davis and UCLA's Cody Schrier join the three Cardinal.
- Fan voting will again play a part in the Golden Spikes Award in 2023 ... amateur baseball fans can vote for their favorite players on GoldenSpikesAward.com, beginning on May 22 with the naming of the semifinalists ... USA Baseball will announce the finalists for the award on June 7, and fan voting will once again open at GoldenSpikesAward.com before closing on June 21 ... the Golden Spikes Award winner will be announced on June 25.

**BASEBALL COACHING ENDOWMENT CELEBRATES KATHY WOLFF**

- Thanks to a gift from an anonymous donor family, an endowed assistant coach position pays tribute to Kathy Wolff - a longtime administrative associate for more than two decades to Stanford's baseball and women's volleyball programs.
- Thomas Eager was named the inaugural Kathy Wolff Assistant Baseball Coach prior to the start of the 2022 season.
- Often considered the "heart and soul" of the baseball program, Wolff was hired as an administrative assistant in the marketing department in 1985 ... the native of Palo Alto began working with the baseball program in 1987, later adding administrative duties with the women's volleyball program.
- Wolff, who saw the Cardinal win two national championships during her first two seasons with the program, helped coordinate 11 trips to the College World Series in Omaha ... the beloved member of the Stanford Baseball family was busy coordinating another College World Series trip when she passed away on June 11, 2008 ... the Cardinal honored Wolff that year by wearing "KW" patches on its sleeves throughout the College World Series run.
- In addition to helping the program recruit and retain the best coaching staff, the endowed assistant coaching position recognizes the influence that Wolff still has on the athletics department today ... Stanford's Department of Athletics, Physical Education and Recreation (DAPER) annually recognizes a staff member with the Kathy Wolff Award for best exemplifying her spirit—a passion for Stanford and an ongoing desire to help and support his/her colleagues ... in the week leading up to baseball season every year, the athletics department celebrates Cake Week—a time when staff members are encouraged to continue Wolff's tradition of bringing in baked goods to enjoy together.

**ON TOP EARLY**

- Stanford outscored opponents 123-71 in the first two innings last year - 57-33 in the first and 66-38 in the second.
- Stanford was 26-9 when scoring first a year ago and outscored its postseason opponents 31-19 in the first two innings.
- So far this season, Stanford is being outscored 8-6 in the first two innings, including 7-3 in the first inning, but it's even 8-8 through the first three innings.

**PRODUCTIVE LATE**

- Thanks to a memorable come-from-behind victory over Texas State to win the 2022 Stanford Regional, the Cardinal has made a name for itself as a club unwilling to surrender.
- The reputation has already been upheld this year as Stanford trailed 11-6 headed into the ninth inning at Cal State Fullerton on February 19 before scoring seven in the ninth and eventually winning 21-13 in 10 innings to earn a series win over the Titans ... the Cardinal outscored Cal State Fullerton 15-2 in the final two frames.

**THE 2022 SEASON**

- Stanford went 47-18 overall and 21-9 in the Pac-12 en route to an appearance in the 2022 College World Series – the second in as many years (18th overall)
- The Cardinal also claimed the Pac-12 regular season title for the second time with David Esquer at the helm (2018) and won the inaugural Pac-12 tournament championship.
- Putting together one of the best runs of baseball in program history, Stanford strung together a 17-game win streak from May 3 to June 3 - the longest unbeaten streak since beginning the 1998 season 16-0-1 and the longest win streak since winning a program-best 18 straight from April 16 - May 24, 1996.
- The Cardinal finished the year having won 22 of the last 26, 25 of 31, 28 of 35, 33 of 41, and 38 of 48 overall.
- Stanford set a program record with 118 home runs and finished second in the nation in shutouts (9).
- For the second consecutive season, the Cardinal led all teams in postseason homers (23) ... Stanford also led the field in hits (128) and doubles (24).

**CARDINAL CLEANS UP PAC-12 YEARLY AWARDS**

- Stanford captured four of the five major Pac-12 yearly awards last season - with David Esquer named Coach of the Year, Alex Williams winning Pitcher of the Year, Adam Crampton earning Defensive Player of the Year and Braden Montgomery taking home Freshman of the Year.
- Eight Cardinal players earned All-Pac-12 honors, with Brett Barrera, Carter Graham, Kody Huff, Brock Jones and Williams earning a spot on the first team ... Quinn Mathews and Braden Montgomery earned honorable mention selections.
- Crampton, Jones and Williams also found themselves on the Pac-12 All-Defensive team.
- Stanford has now won consecutive Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year awards after Brendan Beck earned the honor in 2021 ... the Cardinal has claimed nine Pitcher of the Year selections in program history.
- Montgomery was the fifth Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in program history, including the first since Cal Quantrill in 2014.
- Crampton was the third Defensive Player of the Year, including the second under Esquer after Maverick Handley won the award in 2019.
- 2022 marked the second Coach of the Year selection for Esquer while at Stanford (2018) ... it is the 11th time in program history (Mark Marquess - nine times) ... Esquer had previously captured Pac-10 Coach of the Year while at California in 2001.

**WIN STREAKING**

- Stanford strung together a 17-game win streak from May 3 to June 3, 2022 - the longest unbeaten streak since beginning the 1998 season 16-0-1 and the longest win streak since winning a program-best 18 straight from April 16 - May 24, 1996.
- Over the 17-game win streak, the Cardinal batted .348 while outscoring opponents 185-69.
- Stanford collected 35 doubles, six triples and 50 home runs (allowed only four home runs).
- Cardinal pitchers compiled a 3.76 ERA with 128 strikeouts in 153 innings while holding opponents to a .241 average against over the streak.
- As part of the 17-game win streak, Stanford's pitching staff allowed a home run to UC Davis with one out in the fifth inning on May 3 ... the Cardinal did not allow another home run until two outs in the first inning of the final game of the regular season on May 21 – a span of 10 full games and 95 1/3 innings without allowing a home run.

**HANGING ZEROES**

- Stanford posted nine shutouts last season - the second-most in the nation a year ago (Vanderbilt, 10) and fifth-most in Stanford history.
- Five pitchers combined in the first two shutouts vs. Cal State Fullerton (Feb. 18) and Santa Clara (Feb. 22), with Ty Uber, Joey Dixon and Braden Montgomery contributing to both.
- Drew Dowd and Dixon teamed to blank Indiana from the Round Rock Classic before Quinn Mathews, Tommy O'Rourke and Montgomery shut out No. 2 Arkansas that same day.
- Stanford allowed just two runs over 46 innings pitched from the eighth inning vs. Cal State Fullerton on Feb. 19 through the first inning of a game at UTSA on Feb 28.
- An unearned run allowed at UTSA in the second inning on Feb. 28 ended a string of 25 consecutive scoreless innings pitched.
- Stanford's fifth shutout came in a 1-0 victory in 10 innings at No. 3 Oregon State as Williams, O'Rourke, Dixon and Mathews combined to blank the Beavers to open a three-game series.
- Williams contributed a three-hit shutout with six strikeouts vs. Arizona State on April 8 for the sixth shutout.
- Stanford's seventh shutout came at No. 12 UCLA on April 16 as Mathews (7 IP) and Brandt Pancer (2 IP) combined for an 11-0 win.
- The eighth shutout came on May 13 at Utah as three pitchers, including Williams (8 IP) and Mathews (IP), combined for a 5-0 win.
- Stanford's final shutout came in a 19-0 victory at Santa Clara on May 17 as six pitchers combined to blank the Broncos.
- Stanford starters went 26-6 with a 3.94 ERA while pitching 278 2/3 innings.
- The Cardinal pitched to a 4.23 ERA (third in Pac-12 & 26th nationally) and recorded a 1.38 WHIP ... Stanford also managed 9.22 strikeouts per nine innings while striking out 595 - second-most in Stanford history.
- Stanford featured two of the top five pitchers in the Pac-12 in terms of ERA (Mathews - 2nd, 3.08; Williams - 3rd, 3.20)
- Mathews (three selections) and Williams (two selections) combined for five Pac-12 honors in the 12 weeks last season ... the last school to win the award five-plus times in a season was UCLA with six in 2019.

**NO PLACE LIKE HOME**

- Often considered one of the most beautiful college baseball facilities in the country, Klein Field at Sunken Diamond is the home to Stanford baseball.
- The "Sunken Diamond" name comes from the excavation to provide fill for the earthen berm within which Stanford Stadium was built in 1921, leaving a large, sunken field.
- The fixed seating capacity of Klein Field at Sunken Diamond is 2,113 ... with the addition of disabled seating and general admission lawn seating, the total capacity of the facility is 4,000.
- The original dimensions were 360 feet to left field, 350 to right, and 500 feet to center ... in 1978, a new seven-foot high fence was installed, bringing the dimensions to the current 335 to both left and right field, and 400 to center ... the outfield fence was increased to 10 feet in 1995.

David Esquer '87 was named Stanford's Clarke and Elizabeth Nelson Director of Baseball on June 16, 2017, becoming the 21st head coach in program history.

Esquer succeeded Mark Marquess, who retired after 41 years at the helm of the program. Esquer played under Marquess on Stanford's 1987 national championship team, and served as an assistant on The Farm from 1991-96. Prior to taking over the reins at Stanford, Esquer spent the previous 18 seasons as the head coach at California, where he was the 2011 National Coach of the Year and led the Bears to five NCAA Regionals and the 2011 College World Series.

The 2023 season will be Esquer's sixth in charge of the program, having guided Stanford to the 2018 and 2022 Pac-12 Conference championships, the inaugural 2022 Pac-12 Conference Tournament championship, four NCAA Regional appearances, three NCAA Super Regional appearances, and back-to-back College World Series appearances in 2021 and 2022.

In five-plus seasons at the helm of Stanford, Esquer has amassed a 184-73 (.716) overall record - the highest winning percentage of any coach in Stanford baseball history. Esquer owns a career record of 709-540-2 through 23-plus seasons as a collegiate head coach. Included in the overall ledger is a 300-292 record in Pac-12 play, including an 82-34 mark while at Stanford.

Esquer has been named Pac-12 Coach of the Year three times in his career, earning the honor in 2018 and 2022 with Stanford, and in 2001 at California. The 2022 ABCA West Region Coach of the Year won his 100th game as Stanford's head coach on March 4, 2021 as the Cardinal walked off with a 7-6 victory over San Francisco in 10 innings. His 300th career Pac-12 win came against USC on May 21, 2022 to claim sole possession of 2022 Pac-12 title, while his 700th career win came in a 5-4 triumph vs. Arizona on May 28, 2022 at the Pac-12 Tournament. In total as a head coach, Esquer has guided his teams to nine postseason appearances and three College World Series berths.

Stanford made its second consecutive appearance in the College World Series in 2022, including its 18th in program history, finishing the year with a 47-18 overall record and a 21-9 mark in the Pac-12 to win both the Pac-12 regular season and inaugural Pac-12 Tournament championships. The 47 wins were tied for eighth-most in program history. Stanford, which entered the College World Series ranked No. 1 in the nation according to Collegiate Baseball, finished the year ranked No. 5 in the D1Baseball poll. Stanford hosted a regional for the 20th time in program history and won its bracket to advance to the super regionals where it defeated Connecticut - winning five elimination games during the regional and super regional rounds to advance to Omaha. Putting together one of the best runs of baseball in program history, Stanford posted a 17-game win streak from May 3 to June 3 - the longest unbeaten streak since beginning the 1998 season 16-0-1, and the longest win streak since winning a program-best 18 straight from April 16 - May 24, 1996. Just as it did in 2021, Stanford led all teams in postseason home runs, connecting for 23 of its program-record 118 long balls during the 10-game postseason run. The Cardinal ranked second in the Pac-12 in average (.309) and led the Conference in slugging (.536) and home runs (118) while hitting 71 in the last 27 games overall. On the pitching side, Stanford also led the Pac-12 in shutouts (9) - fifth-most in program history - and ranked third in ERA (4.23). Including Esquer's Pac-12 Coach of the Year selection, the Cardinal cleaned up in the Pac-12 postseason awards process, placing eight on All-Pac-12 teams and securing four of the five major Pac-12 yearly awards - with Alex Williams winning Pitcher of the Year, Adam Crampton winning Defensive Player of the Year and Braden Montgomery taking home Freshman of the Year. Williams was named a semifinalist for the 2022 College Baseball Hall of Fame National Pitcher of the Year Award and earned unanimous All-America honors, while Carter Graham and Brock Jones also earned All-America selections. Montgomery was a semifinalist for the 2022 John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year and earned Freshman All-America honors after connecting for a Stanford freshman record 18 home runs. Standouts on the field and in the classroom, Williams and Jones were named CoSIDA Academic All-Americans. Williams was also named the 2022 Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was selected as Stanford's 2021-22 Pac-12 Tom Hansen Conference Medal recipient. The Cardinal saw six players drafted in the 2022 MLB Draft - headlined by Jones being selected 65th overall in the second round by the Rays. Kody Huff (seventh round, Rockies), Brett Barrera (eighth round, Yankees), Crampton (ninth round, Orioles), Williams (11th round, Marlins) and Quinn Mathews (19th round, Rays) were also selected.

Stanford finished the historic 2021 season ranked No. 5 nationally according to Collegiate Baseball and in the NCBWA poll, No. 7 according to Baseball America and the USA Today Coaches poll, and No. 8 according to D1Baseball after going 39-17 and 17-10 in Pac-12 play to claim third place in the conference standings. Esquer's Cardinal dropped back-to-back games just once in 2021 and finished the year 12-1 in weekend series. Stanford won the Stanford Regional and swept a Super Regional at Texas Tech to earn the berth in Omaha. Brendan Beck was a unanimous All-American and was named 2021 Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year, while Brock Jones and Zach Grech also earned All-America honors. Eight Cardinal players claimed All-Conference recognition, while Grech also earned Pac-12 Scholar Athlete of the Year. The Cardinal's 85 home runs, including an NCAA-high 22 in the postseason, were the eighth-most in Stanford history, while the .979 fielding percentage was the third-best in program history. Three Cardinal were drafted following the 2021 season, headlined by Beck being selected 55th overall in the second round by the New York Yankees.

Stanford posted a 45-14 record in 2019 before registering a 5-11 mark in a 2020 season cut short by the COVID-19 global pandemic. The Cardinal's .763 win percentage in 2019 tied for the fifth-best in program history, while its 14 losses matched the third-fewest. Stanford finished 22-7 in Pac-12 play, claiming second place before earning its 11th Super Regional berth overall, and the first since 2014. Nine Cardinal were drafted following the 2019 season, and Maverick Handley was named Co-Defensive Player of the Year.

In 2018, his first season in charge of the program, Esquer guided Stanford to its first Pac-12 Conference title since 2004, matching a program record for fewest losses with 12 (minimum 50 games played) while picking up Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors. Stanford's 46 wins equaled the 10th-most in program history to that point, while the Cardinal's .793 winning percentage ranked second. Nine Cardinal were named All-Pac-12, and Stanford hosted an NCAA Regional for the 17th time.

Through 18 seasons at Cal, Esquer compiled a 525-467-2 (.529) overall record and mentored five MLB first-round selections. Conor Jackson was the first of the five first-round picks, selected by the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2003 before Brandon Morrow was selected fifth overall by the Seattle Mariners in 2006. David Cooper (Toronto Blue Jays, 2008) and Brett Jackson (Chicago Cubs, 2009) followed before right-hander Daulton Jefferies was drafted in 2016 by the Oakland A's.

During his time at the helm of the Cardinal program, Esquer has seen two more players selected in the first round of an MLB draft, running the total to seven in his career. Nico Hoerner was drafted 24th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 2018, while Kris Bubic was selected 40th overall by the Kansas City Royals in that same draft.

Through 23 seasons as a collegiate head coach in the Pac-12, Esquer has seen 14 of his players garner All-America honors, 16 named All-Region, and two claim Conference Player, Pitcher, Freshman and Defensive Player of the Year.

A shortstop at Stanford from 1984-87, Esquer was a starter on the Cardinal's 1987 College World Series championship team. He earned all-tournament honors after hitting .350 with six RBIs in Omaha. He also earned All-Pac-10 Southern Division honors as a senior, batting .318 with 41 RBIs and 16 stolen bases. Esquer went on to play professional baseball for four seasons with the Baltimore Orioles, California Angels and Milwaukee Brewers.

Following his playing career, Esquer spent six seasons as an assistant under Coach Marquess. His time as an assistant with the Cardinal included five NCAA Regional appearances and a fifth-place finish at the 1995 College World Series. In three seasons as the top assistant at Pepperdine from 1997-99, Esquer was the program's chief recruiting coordinator as well as hitting instructor, infield coach and handler of the third base coaching duties.

Esquer was a three-sport star and class valedictorian at Palma High School in Salinas, Calif. He was tabbed the "Athlete of the Year" at Palma High School after being named team captain and MVP in baseball, football and basketball. Esquer earned a bachelor's degree in economics and a master's degree in sociology from Stanford in 1987. He and his wife, Lynn, have a daughter, Gabrielle, and son, Xavier.
