THE OPENING KICKOFF

- Stanford begins the 2022 season on Saturday with a 5 p.m. PT kickoff against Colgate at Stanford Stadium. The Cardinal and Raiders have never played.
- Stanford is 9-2 in home openers under David Shaw and 8-3 in season openers.
- The Cardinal last played an FCS opponent in 2018 when it welcomed UC Davis to The Farm. Stanford's last non-Power Five opponent was a week three matchup at #17 UCF in 2019.
- Stanford has played 25 straight Power Five opponents and 38 straight games against either Power Five or ranked opponents, dating back to the 2018 matchup with UC Davis (Sept. 15, 2018).
- Stanford's offense returns one of the most experienced rosters in the country. The Cardinal returns 91.98% of passing yards and 86.8% of receiving yards, as well as 100% of offensive line starts.
- Saturday's game against Colgate will be Cardinal Kids Day. Kids in eighth grade and below can get in free (up to four per family) with the purchase of a paid adult ticket.

- Looking ahead to next week's matchup against USC, Stanford will recognize its Hall of Fame Class, as well as Andrew Luck for his induction into the College Football Hall of Fame Class of 2022.
- Stanford Athletics is celebrating the 50th Anniversary of Title IX by inducting its first-all-female class. The ceremony will be on Friday evening with recognition Saturday during the football game.
- The 2022 class consists of: Lisa Bernhagen Ramos (Women's Track and Field), Elaine Breen Penrose (Women's Swimming and Diving), Margie Dingeldein (Women's Water Polo), Ashley Hansen (Softball), Carly Janiga Reardon (Women's Gymnastics), Linda R. Meier (Special Recognition (Service)), Nneka Ogwumike (Women's Basketball), Christen Press (Women's Soccer), Tara VanDerveer (The Setsuko Ishiyama Director of Women's Basketball (1985-present)) and Sally Voss Krueger (Women's Golf).
- Other game themes this year consist of: Mental Health Awareness and Educator Appreciation (Oregon State), Reunion Homecoming (Arizona State), Salute to Heroes and Set The Expectation (Washington State) and Fan Appreciation Day and Senior Day (BYU).

MEDIA POLICIES

Stanford University is constantly monitoring public health guidelines and adjusting its policies to reflect the latest guidance from the CDC, State of California and Santa Clara County. At this time, the Stanford Athletic Communications office plans to host media at Stanford Stadium with no Covid restrictions. Stanford Athletics understands the importance of assisting the media in providing coverage of the institution, its athletics programs, administrators, coaches and student-athletes. Our goal is to disseminate information as widely, uniformly and fairly as possible using normally accepted media standards. To this end, the best attempt will be made to fill reasonable requests by recognized media outlets, however, the Stanford Stadium pressbox and work spaces have limited seating and not all requests may be met for all games. Members of the media are encouraged to work with the Stanford Athletic Communications staff to assist in that endeavor. It is not permissible for media members to contact any athletics department administrator, associate, coach or student-athlete directly without working through the communications department.

CONTENT & WORKPLACE POLICIES

1. Video clips of in-game competition, live or otherwise, online or via social media networks are not permitted. Still photos may be shared online and across social platforms during the game.
2. Any non-editorial or commercial use of any picture, audio, film, tape, or digital image or drawing of the event is prohibited without prior, specific, written authorization from the host institution.
3. Internet usage in all media areas, including media work areas, stadium pressbox, digital work room and the field, is for work-related purposes only. Media members who do not follow the proper internet procedures may have their credentials and internet access revoked for the remainder of the event.
4. Media should respect the work environment of their colleagues by maintaining a quiet and professional atmosphere in all working media areas. The press box will close three hours after the conclusion of the game.

FIELD ACCESS & SIDELINE POLICY

Field access is limited to photographers, videographers and sideline reporters whose job function requires them to work from field level. Print media, and anyone working out of the press box, will only be permitted on the field for the final five minutes of games. No interviews should be conducted on the field.

1. Photo credentials will be issued only to accredited media outlets prior to the game and photo identification must be provided.
2. Photographers and videographers must check in at media will call located at Gate 8 of the stadium. Those photographers and videographers who will work on the sidelines will be issued a photo vest. This photo vest must be worn at all times to gain access to the sidelines. Vests must be returned after the game at the on-field dropoff location situated next to the south endzone tunnel.
3. Only working photographers and videographers with professional-grade cameras will be allowed on the field. Those without proper equipment or not shooting the game will be escorted from the sidelines regardless of credential.
4. Working photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot in the designated area (between the two marked dotted lines outside the 20-yard lines and behind the end zone).
5. Photographers are encouraged to use the photo work areas, located on Level 3 of Stanford Stadium and the media room on Level 2 of the fieldhouse. Wireless internet is available. While security in this area is provided, Stanford University is not responsible for the loss of any items.
6. According to NCAA policies, the presence of any type of photographer and videographer in the bench area for all sports is strictly prohibited with the exception of one (1) institutional videographer in the football bench area. According to the NCAA Football Rules and Interpretations Manual (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4b): "the team area shall be limited to squad members in uniform and a maximum of 40 other individuals directly involved in the game. The 40 individuals not in uniform shall wear special identification." (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4e): "No media personnel, including journalists, radio and television personnel, or their equipment, shall be in the team area or coaching box, and no media personnel shall communicate in any way with persons in the team area or coaching box." Stanford Athletics prohibits photographers and videographers from stopping and shooting from behind the bench area or into the bench area.

GAME NOTES

THE MATCHUP

• Stanford and Colgate meet for the first time on the gridiron. The Cardinal has never played any current member of the Patriot League.

• Stanford has twice played UC Davis in David Shaw's 11 seasons, but those are the only two instances in which the Cardinal has played an FCS opponent during that span.

SUSTAINED EXCELLENCE

Since 2010, Stanford Football has been one of the best programs nationally. In that span, the Cardinal ranks:

- **13th nationally with 105 wins** (105-46 overall) and 2nd in the Pac-12 behind Oregon. No other Pac-12 program ranks in the Top 25.
- **Tied for 14th with 50 NFL Draft picks**, 2nd most in the Pac-12 behind USC.
- **7th in wins over Top 25 opponents with 31** (31-24 in that span), the best in the Pac-12.
- **Tied for 8th nationally with 10 consensus All-Americans**, most in the Pac-12.
- **1st nationally with 15 Academic All-Americans**, five more than any other program and 10 more than any Pac-12 school in that span.
- Including the 2009 season, Stanford's five Top-Two finishers in the Heisman Trophy voting is second nationally to Alabama's six in that span.
- The Cardinal has appeared in four Pac-12 Championship Games since 2011 and would have appeared in five under the newly instituted Pac-12 Championship Game format.

HEAD COACH DAVID SHAW

- Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football David Shaw '94 owns a career record of 93-45 (.674) overall and a mark of 64-32 (.667) against Pac-12 foes.
- Shaw's 93 wins are the most in school history, as he surpassed the legendary Pop Warner (71 wins) during the 2017 season.
- Shaw owns a 29-23 (.558) record against AP Top 25 programs. Of Shaw's 29 wins against ranked foes, 17 of them have come against Top-15 opponents and 11 of those have been against teams ranked in the Top 10. Last year's win over No. 3 Oregon marked Shaw's fifth Top-5 win and fourth Top-3 victory.
- Stanford has defeated multiple Top-15 opponents in five of Shaw's 11 seasons. In addition to the 2021 season, Stanford has defeated multiple Top-15 teams in 2012, 2013, 2015 and 2017 under Shaw.
- Stanford has defeated a Top-20 opponent on the road in eight of Shaw's 11 seasons.
- Shaw is one of seven active coaches in the country who is the winningest head coach at his current school. He is joined by North Carolina's Mack Brown, Northwestern's Pat Fitzgerald, Iowa's Kirk Ferentz, Oklahoma State's Mike Gundy, Navy's Ken Niumatalolo and Utah's Kyle Whittingham.
- Shaw is the only four-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year in conference history (dating back to 1975).
- Shaw's 93 wins are currently tied for 10th-most in Pac-12 history and his 64 conference wins are tied for sixth-most in Pac-12 history.

STAFF STABILITY

- David Shaw believes in staff stability and proves it in his actions. Stanford was one of just five FBS programs with no staff changes this offseason. The others: BYU, Iowa State, NC State and Wyoming.
- Shaw enters his 16th straight season at Stanford, and 12th as head coach. Defensive coordinator Lance Anderson has been at Stanford all 16 years with Shaw and enters his ninth season leading the Cardinal defense. Offensive coordinator Tavita Pritchard has also been on The Farm all 16 years with Shaw, first as a player, followed by as a coach, and enters his fifth season leading Stanford's offense.
- Stanford is one of three schools in the FBS (also Navy and Utah) to have six assistant coaches who have been on staff for at least seven years. In addition to Anderson and Pritchard, Special teams coordinator Pete Alamar enters his 11th at Stanford, DB coach Duane Akina his ninth, DL coach Diron Reynolds his seventh straight (eighth overall) and TE coach Morgan Turner his 13th straight season on The Farm.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- Stanford is one of 11 programs scheduled to face at least five teams ranked in the Associated Press Preseason Top 25 this season. Stanford and Texas Tech are the only two to play four ranked inside the Top 15.
- The Cardinal is scheduled to play three Top-15 opponents on the road (No. 5 Notre Dame, No. 7 Utah and No. 11 Oregon) and plays No. 14 USC and No. 25 BYU at home.

TOP 20 WINS ON THE ROAD

• Stanford has defeated at least one Top-20 opponent on the road in eight of the 11 seasons under head coach David Shaw. Stanford had only one Top-20 road win in the nine seasons prior to the start of Shaw's tenure.

A RETURN TO NORMALCY IN 2022

- For the first time since 2019, Stanford Football enjoyed a 'normal' offseason training schedule and program.
- The team reported to campus in early January and began its winter strength and conditioning program before spring ball started in late February. After the April 9 spring game, the Cardinal had its normal spring and summer strength and conditioning program and schedule before training camp.
- In 2020, the team was sent home in March and didn't return until July 1. Then, before an abbreviated six-game schedule commenced in November, the season was canceled, shortened, canceled again and finally restarted. The Cardinal faced county limitations, forcing it to begin training camp in October at nearby Woodside High School before spending the last three weeks of the season away from home due to Santa Clara County policies.
- In 2021, the team wasn't able to return to campus until March, truncating the training schedule with spring ball starting late and the spring game taking place on May 22. This severely condensed Stanford's offseason training program.
- For any player entering their fourth year or fewer in the Stanford Football program, the 2022 season marks the first college football offseason that has been 'regular' in their careers.

EARLY ENROLLEES

- Stanford welcomed three early enrollees in January 2022 for the winter quarter for the first time in program history. EDGE David Bailey, WR Mudia Reuben and TE Sam Roush were the Cardinal's three early enrollees.
- In 2021, QB Ari Patu and CB Jaden Slocum became Stanford's first-ever early enrollees, but joined the program in March for the spring quarter.
- On June 10, 2021, the Stanford Faculty Senate voted to implement a three-year pilot program that would allow certain student-athletes to enroll at Stanford as early as winter quarter before their freshman year. Early enrollment would be limited to no more than 15 students per year, and each student-athlete must be academically qualified and have already graduated from their respective high school.

LDS MISSIONS PRIOR TO STANFORD

- Stanford has five student-athletes who have served LDS missions: Senior ILB Levani Damuni (New Zealand), freshman S Scotty Edwards (South Africa), senior ILB Spencer Jorgensen (Thailand), sophomore WR Kale Lucas (Philippines and Seattle) and junior QB Tanner McKee (Brazil). ILB Anson Pulsipher is currently on a mission in Chile and will return in 2023.
- In addition to the five student-athletes, defensive coordinator Lance Anderson served an LDS mission to Phoenix.

MCKEE BY THE NUMBERS

- Junior quarterback Tanner McKee enters the 2022 season as the Cardinal's unquestioned starter. The offseason leading up to the 2022 season has been McKee's first full offseason since 2017 when he was entering his senior season of high school.
- In 2018, McKee embarked on a two-year LDS mission in Brazil, before returning during the early stages of the pandemic in spring of 2020.
- McKee finished his 2021 season 206-of-315 (65.4%) passing for 2,327 yards and 15 touchdowns. He played in 10 games with nine starts.
- McKee became the third freshman in program history (Andrew Luck, 2009; Chad Hutchinson, 1996) to reach the 2,000-yard passing mark. He was also just the fourth Cardinal QB since 2000 to reach 2,000 passing yards in a season. Andrew Luck and Kevin Hogan did so three times each, while K.J. Costello did so in 2018.
- Since 2000, McKee's five games with three-plus touchdowns in 2021 was the most for a Stanford freshman and the fourth-most overall (Andrew Luck: 9 in 2011; Kevin Hogan: 7 in 2015; Luck: 7 in 2010).
- McKee began the 2021 season with 161 straight pass attempts without an interception. At the time, it was the most consecutive pass attempts without an interception in the country to begin the season.
- McKee was ranked as the No. 4 quarterback in the Class of 2018 by 247Sports.
- With the victory over No. 3 Oregon on Oct. 2, 2021, McKee became the first freshman quarterback to defeat a Top-5 team since true freshman Bo Nix led No. 15 Auburn to a 48-45 victory over No. 5 Alabama on Nov. 30, 2019.
- McKee led Stanford to a road win at No. 14 USC in his first career start on Sept. 11, 2021, becoming the first Pac-12 QB since Tavita Pritchard in 2007 to defeat a ranked opponent on the road in his first career start.

FRESHMAN TOUCHDOWN RECORD

McKee's 19 total touchdowns (15 passing, 4 rushing) are the most by a Stanford freshman (true or redshirt) in school history. Andrew Luck (2009) and Steve Stenstrom (1991) both had 15.

FOUR QUARTERBACK STARTERS IN 2021

- For the first time in school history, Stanford had four quarterbacks start a game during the 2021 season. Tanner McKee started nine games while Ari Patu, Isaiah Sanders and Jack West all started one.
- Stanford had previously had three quarterbacks start a game in both 2019 (K.J. Costello, Davis Mills, Jack West) and in 1974 (Guy Benjamin, Mike Cordova, Jerry Waldvogel).

TRUE FRESHMAN QB STARTER

- True freshman QB Ari Patu started at Oregon State on Nov. 13, 2021.
- Patu became Stanford's first true freshman to start at QB since John Paye in 1983.

GAME NOTES

RETURNING OFFENSIVE LINE PRODUCTION

- Stanford's offensive line returns all five starters. The Cardinal is one of seven schools to return all five offensive linemen.
- Stanford returns 101 career starts and 122 career games played on the offensive line among players who have made starts: OT Walter Rouse (30 GP/29 GS), OG Barrett Mills (29/26), OG Jake Hornibrook (25/12), OG Branson Bragg (16/16), C Drake Nugent (15/12) and OT Myles Hinton (16/9).
- The Cardinal was hard hit by injuries in 2019, which forced all five of this year's senior class onto the field as true freshmen. Now, in 2022, the experience is expected to pay huge dividends under second-year OL coach Terry Heffernan.
- The Cardinal OL, by major: Rouse (Biomechanical Engineering), Miller (Mechanical Engineering), Nugent/Hornibrook (Science, Technology and Society), Bragg (Mathematical and Computational Sciences) and Hinton (Human Biology).

INJURIES SLOW OFFENSE IN 2021

- Stanford's offense dealt with a plethora of injuries in 2021. QB Tanner McKee did not play a single game with all five of his top receiving threats in 2021.
- The injury to Brycen Tremayne proved especially costly for the Cardinal. Tremayne had 20 receptions for 245 yards and five touchdowns prior to his season-ending injury in the first half against Oregon.
- The Cardinal offense was averaging over 35 points per game with McKee and Tremayne on the field together. After the injury, Stanford averaged just over 14 points per game the rest of the season.
- Tremayne was an especially important red zone threat for Stanford, as the Cardinal scored touchdowns on 14 of 17 (82%) red zone trips in the first five weeks of the season, but scored touchdowns on just 9 of 17 (53%) red zone trips over the last seven games after the Tremayne injury.

THE STANFORD TREES

- Led by 6-foot-6 quarterback Tanner McKee, the Cardinal offense features height across the board.
- Stanford's top five receiving threats are all 6-foot-2 and above, including 6-foot-5 WR John Humphreys, 6-foot-4 tight end Benjamin Yurosek, 6-foot-4 WR Brycen Tremayne, 6-foot-3 WR Elijah Higgins and 6-foot-2 WR Michael Wilson.
- From left to right, Stanford's projected starting offensive line is: 6-foot-6 LT Walter Rouse, 6-foot-5 LG Jake Hornibrook, 6-foot-1 C Drake Nugent, 6-foot-4 RG Branson Bragg and 6-foot-7 RT Myles Hinton.

RETURNING PASS CATCHING PRODUCTION

- Stanford returns 2,241 of 2,582 (86.8%) receiving yards from 2021 and 195 of 239 (81.6%) receptions in 2022.
- Stanford's top four wide receivers (Elijah Higgins, John Humphreys, Brycen Tremayne and Michael Wilson) plus tight end Benjamin Yurosek all return. Those five combined for 147 catches for 1,870 yards and 13 touchdowns in 2022.
- Tight end Benjamin Yurosek, a Mackey Award watch lister in 2022, led Stanford with 658 receiving yards in 2021. Yurosek, who had 43 catches - 29 of which went for first downs or touchdowns - had 13 catches of more than 20 yards last season.

DEFENSIVE FRONT SHIFT

- Stanford will employ a four-man front in 2022, a shift from the 3-4 defense they've frequently played under Willie Shaw Director of Defense Lance Anderson.
- With that change came the 'EDGE' position - a hybrid defensive end/outside linebacker position - which is frequently used in NFL terminology.
- The Cardinal will be able to take advantage of its personnel and employ more pass rushers on the field in addition to its experienced linebacker corp.
- Stanford's defense will have more opportunity to be multiple, whether employing three linebackers or two linebackers with an extra defensive back - a nickelback - at any given time.

EXPERIENCED SECONDARY

- Stanford returns an experienced secondary in 2022, led by senior CB Kyu Blu Kelly, who led the Pac-12 with 13 passes defended a season ago (11 pass breakups, two interceptions).
- Last year, the Cardinal had 10 different players make a start in the secondary, with graduate transfer S Patrick Fields (37 starts at Oklahoma) joining the program this offseason.
- This year's secondary brings 128 career starts to the table as the 2022 season commences.
- In addition to Fields' 37 career starts with the Sooners, S Kendall Williamson has made 27, CB Kyu Blu Kelly 25 and S Jonathan McGill 12. CB Salim Turner-Muhammad and S Jimmy Wyrick have each made six, CB Ethan Bonner five, S Jaden Slocum four and CB Nicolas Toomer and S Alaka'i Gilman three each.

THE HOME OF CHAMPIONS

- Stanford is one of six programs with at least one national championship in football, baseball and men's basketball and the only school with at least one in football, baseball, men's and women's basketball.
- Stanford is the only school to sweep both the men's and women's Capital One Cups in the same campaign, doing so in both 2017-18 and 2020-21.
- Stanford won 25 straight (a streak which snapped in 2020-21) Division I Learfield Sports Directors' Cups, the award presented to the most successful intercollegiate athletic department in the nation.
- Stanford has won at least one NCAA team title in each of the past 46 academic years (dating back to the 1976-77 campaign), the longest streak in NCAA history.
- The Cardinal leads the NCAA with 131 team titles. In total, Stanford claimed three national team championships during the last year - men's gymnastics, women's water polo and women's golf - increasing its overall total to 158.

2022 TEAM CAPTAINS

- Stanford elected its 2022 team captains on Aug. 21. The Cardinal captains are: returning captain Michael Wilson, alongside newly appointed captains Levani Damuni, Jonathan McGill, Tanner McKee, Ricky Miezian and Drake Nugent.
- Wilson is the eighth two-time captain in Shaw's 12 seasons.

STANFORD IN THE NFL

- Since 2010, Stanford has had 50 former players drafted into the NFL, the 14th-most nationally and second-most in the Pac-12. The Cardinal's 43 draft picks since the 2012 Draft (David Shaw era) is tied for the most in the conference.
- Thirty-four alumni have appeared on an NFL roster during the 2022 preseason.
- Stanford's eight tight ends drafted since 2010 are the most in the nation. (Dray, Fleener, Ertz, Toilolo, Hooper, Schultz, Smith, Parkinson). The Cardinal has had the most tight ends on NFL Kickoff Weekend active rosters for 10 straight years.
- Stanford's 16 quarterbacks drafted in the Modern Era (since 1967) rank second in the nation. [behind USC 19, tied with Ohio State] Stanford's 24 quarterbacks drafted all-time rank second in the nation [behind USC 25].

• Stanford is one of six schools all-time to produce at least four No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks (Auburn, Georgia, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, USC). The Cardinal is the only school to have four quarterbacks taken with the No. 1 overall pick (Garrett, Plunkett, Elway, Luck).

LELAND STANFORD JUNIOR UNIVERSITY

- Stanford was established in 1885 and opened in 1891.
- Stanford's faculty includes one Presidential Medal of Freedom winner and four Pulitzer Prize winners. Stanford faculty have won the Nobel Prize 35 times since the university's founding and the Stanford community includes 20 Nobel laureates.
- Stanford students have consisted of 128 Rhodes Scholars, 97 Marshall Award winners, 71 Truman Scholars and 22 Knight-Hennessy Scholars.
- The top five undergraduate majors at Stanford include: computer science, engineering, human biology, management science and engineering, and mechanical engineering.
- Stanford's 8,180-acre campus is large enough to contain 96 Disneyland.
- The Stanford campus features roughly 43,000 trees, 25 fountains and over 800 different species of plants.
- The 700-acre Stanford Research Park, created in 1951, is home to over 150 companies.

REMEMBERING JOHN ARRILLAGA

- John Arrillaga '60, the philanthropist who passed away Jan. 24 at age 84, made great contributions throughout his life to Stanford University and Stanford Athletics.
- In his memory, Stanford first donned "Mr. A" helmet stickers on the April 9 spring game and will continue that throughout the upcoming season.

HALL OF FAME CELEBRATION

Stanford will host its Hall of Fame celebration the weekend of Sept. 9-10 in conjunction with the Cardinal's game against USC (Sept. 10, 4:30 p.m., ABC). First ballot College Football Hall of Famer **Andrew Luck** will be recognized with a National Football Foundation on-campus salute in between the first and second quarters. One of the most precise passers in college football history, Luck put together a record-setting career at Stanford that saw him claim numerous national awards and honors. A native of Houston, Texas, Luck becomes the 19th Cardinal player to join the College Football Hall of Fame. Luck guided Stanford to 23 victories over his final two seasons, including appearances in the 2011 Orange Bowl and 2012 Fiesta Bowl. He won the 2011 Maxwell, Walter Camp and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm awards and was a two-time runner-up (2010, 2011) for the Heisman Trophy. A 2011 First Team All-American and two-time conference Offensive Player of the Year, Luck rewrote the Stanford and conference record books. In total, Luck went 31-7 as a starter, resurrecting a Stanford program that had suffered seven-straight losing seasons before he became the starter in 2009. He passed for 9,430 yards and 82 touchdowns during his Cardinal career, adding 957 yards and seven more touchdowns on the ground.

In conjunction with its Title IX 50th anniversary celebration, Stanford Athletics will induct the first all-female Hall of Fame class in school history. Former student-athletes include: Lisa Bernhagen Ramos (women's track and field), Elaine Breeden Penrose (women's swimming and diving), Margie Dingeldein (women's water polo), Ashley Hansen Church (softball), Carly Janiga Reardon (women's gymnastics), Nneka Ogwumike (women's basketball), Christen Press (women's soccer) and Sally Voss Krueger (women's golf). Tara VanDerveer (women's basketball) will be inducted for her legendary coaching career, which enters a 37th season in 2022-23, while longtime volunteer Linda R. Meier will receive special recognition for her service to the department. The class will be inducted in an evening ceremony on Friday, Sept. 9, at Bing Auditorium and publicly introduced on Saturday, Sept. 10, during Stanford's football game against USC.

David Shaw enters his 12th season as the Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football in 2022. A 1995 Stanford graduate who is the fifth alum to hold the position, Shaw is the 34th head coach in Stanford history, and the winningest coach in program history.

In his first 11 seasons, Shaw has guided Stanford to 93 wins, eight bowl games, four Pac-12 Championship Game appearances and three Rose Bowl Games. Shaw's teams have won at least 11 games four times and at least eight games eight times. He owns a career record of 93-45 (.674), including a 64-32 (.667) record in Pac-12 play. His 93 victories are tied for the 10th-most in conference history while his 64 league wins are tied for sixth-most.

Shaw has led Stanford to three Pac-12 titles and a pair of wins in The Granddaddy of Them All. In total, the Cardinal has won five bowl games under Shaw.

Shaw is the longest tenured Black head football coach in FBS history at one school and the winningest Power Five Black head football coach.

He owns a 29-23 (.558) record against AP Top-25 opponents with 17 of those victories over Top-15 foes, 11 against Top-10 teams and five over Top-5 opponents.

Shaw's Cardinal has defeated multiple Top-15 opponents in five of his 11 seasons and has defeated at least one Top-20 opponent on the road in eight of his campaigns.

Shaw has produced 42 NFL Draft picks (including six first rounders), 40 first team All-Conference recipients, 24 AP All-Americans (including nine first teamers), 13 Academic All-Americans, three National Football Foundation scholar athletes, three Pac-12 Offensive Players of the Year, two CoSIDA Academic All-Americans of the Year and numerous other National Award winners.

National Award recipients under Shaw include: Andrew Luck (2011 Walter Camp Player of the Year, Maxwell Award winner, CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year, Heisman Trophy runner up); Christian McCaffrey (2015 Paul Hornung Award winner, CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year, Heisman Trophy runner up); Bryce Love (2017 Doak Walker Award winner, Heisman Trophy runner up); Jordan Richards (2014 Pop Warner College Football Award winner, William V. Campbell Trophy finalist); Casey Toohill (2019 William V. Campbell Trophy finalist), Thomas Booker (2021 William V. Campbell Trophy finalist); and Isaiah Sanders (2021 Wuerffel Trophy). Three Cardinal have also been named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team under Shaw (2020 Treyjohn Butler, 2019 Connor Wedington, 2017 Harrison Phillips).

The 2017 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year, Shaw is the only four-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year in conference history (dating back to 1975). He was the recipient of the award in 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017. He has been named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year three times and has been a finalist for National Coach of the Year four times.

Of the 42 NFL Draft picks under Shaw, six have been first round selections: Andrew Luck (2012, 1st Overall, Indianapolis), David DeCastro (2021, 24th Overall, Pittsburgh), Andrus Peat (2015, 13th Overall, New Orleans), Joshua Garnett (2016, 28th Overall, San Francisco), Solomon Thomas (2017, 3rd Overall, San Francisco) and Christian McCaffrey (2017, 8th Overall, Carolina).

Multiple Cardinal have been selected in all 10 NFL Drafts since Shaw took over as head coach, with at least four selections in seven different drafts. Six Stanford players were drafted in both the 2014 and 2015 drafts, the most during Shaw's tenure.

Shaw is one of seven active coaches in the country who is the winningest head coach at his current school. He is joined by North Carolina's Mack Brown, Northwestern's Pat

Fitzgerald, Iowa's Kirk Ferentz, Oklahoma State's Mike Gundy, Navy's Ken Niumatalolo and Utah's Kyle Whittingham.

In 2021, Shaw led the Cardinal to wins over No. 3 Oregon (31-24 in overtime) and at No. 14 USC (42-28). The Cardinal were one of only two Pac-12 schools with multiple wins over Top-15 opponents, joined by Pac-12 champion Utah.

Six Cardinal garnered All-Pac-12 recognition, led by Thomas Booker and Kyu Blu Kelly who were both named to the second team. RG Branson Bragg, QB Tanner McKee, C Drake Nugent and TE Benjamin Yurosek were all honorable mention.

McKee ushered in a new era for the Cardinal offense, starting nine of 12 games and passing for 2,327 yards and 15 touchdowns. He added four more scores on the ground, setting a new freshman record at Stanford for total touchdowns. By defeating No. 14 USC, McKee became the first Pac-12 quarterback since Tavita Pritchard in 2007 to beat a Top-15 opponent on the road in his first career start. In October, McKee became the first freshman quarterback since Bo Nix in 2019 to defeat a Top-5 team with Stanford 31-24, overtime victory over No. 3 Oregon.

Booker and S Noah Williams were named Academic All-Americans, with Booker garnering a spot on the first team for the second consecutive season. Booker was also named an NF Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy, along with a Senior CLASS Award first teamer.

The off field success didn't stop in the classroom, as sixth-year QB Isaiah Sanders was named the recipient of the 2021 Wuerffel Trophy, college football's premier community service award.

Stanford's 2020 season was unlike any in program history, as Shaw guided the Cardinal to four straight wins to finish the season, en route to a 4-2 overall record. Playing a six-game, conference-only schedule due to the COVID-19 global pandemic, Stanford was forced to spend its final 19 days away from campus due to county restrictions.

The Cardinal began its winning streak with a one-point, Big Game win at Cal. Stanford went on to defeat Washington, Oregon State and UCLA on the road to end the year, capping off the UCLA win with a 14-point, fourth-quarter comeback and a double-overtime victory.

Shaw was named to the Uplifting Athletes' Rare Disease Champion Team in 2020. In 2018, Shaw was a bone marrow donor for his brother, Eric, who is now cancer free after battling a rare disease for over seven years.

Additionally, fifth-year CB Treyjohn Butler was a member of the AFCA Allstate Good Works Team, given to 11 FBS players who stand out both on the field and in the community.

In 2019, Stanford endured many injuries to starters and key players throughout the season. The Cardinal played 21 true freshmen, including 12 who used a year of eligibility by playing in more than four games, and eight who combined for 43 starts throughout the season. The Cardinal started three true freshmen on the offensive line for half the year, while four true freshmen started at least one game along the offensive line.

Off the field, Stanford student-athletes shined. The Cardinal had a league-best 33 named to the Pac-12 Honor Roll, which honors any student-athlete who boasts at least a 3.3 cumulative grade-point average, excluding freshmen. In addition, two Cardinal earned recognition for arguably the biggest off-field accolades in college football. Fifth-year OLB Casey Toohill was named one of 12 finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy and a member of the NFF Scholar-Athlete Class, while junior WR Connor Wedington was a member of the AFCA Allstate Good Works Team.

In 2018, Shaw led Stanford to its 10th straight bowl game and a win over Pitt in the 2018 Sun Bowl for their fifth bowl game victory in eight seasons under Shaw. Quarterback K.J. Costello finished with the second-most passing yards and third-most touchdowns in a season in school history, while wideout JJ Arcega-Whiteside tied a 41-year-old school record with 14 receiving touchdowns.

Stanford did most of its damage on the ground during the 2017 season, as its 5.9 rushing yards/attempt ranked first in program history, and its 2,833 rushing yards ranked fourth. Running back Bryce Love set the school's single-season (2,118) and single-game (301) rushing records while being named the 2017 Doak Walker Award winner. Love, also the Lombardi Award winner and Heisman Trophy runner-up, set Stanford's career records for yards/rush (7.76) and consecutive 100-yard rushing games (9). The unanimous All-American combined with Cameron Scarlett to form the top rushing tandem in program history.

HEAD COACH DAVID SHAW

Love was the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year and winner of the Touchdown Club of Columbus Jim Brown Award. He ranked first among Power 5 conference running backs in over a dozen categories, including FBS records for 50-yard rushes (13), consecutive games with a 30-yard rush (13) and consecutive games with a 50-yard rush (11).

Shaw was named recipient of the Dodd Trophy following the 2017 season in which he guided Stanford to a 9-5 record. It was Stanford's third all-time national coach of the year award, following Chuck Taylor (1951) and Clark Shaughnessy (1940) winning the AFCA Coach of the Year Award. The Dodd Trophy, college football's most coveted coaching award, honors the head football coach whose program embodies the award's three pillars of scholarship, leadership and integrity, while also having success on the playing field throughout the season.

In 2016, Shaw led the Cardinal to the Sun Bowl where the 25-23 win over the Tar Heels capped a 10-3 season in which the Cardinal ranked 12th in the final AP and USA Today polls. The Cardinal also won at least 10 games for the fifth time under Shaw, a mark the program only accomplished four times from 1891-2010.

Stanford ranked eighth nationally in defensive touchdowns (4), 12th in winning percentage (.769), 17th in time of possession (32:46), 22nd in team sacks (2.85), 18th in scoring defense (20.4) and 25th in team passing efficiency defense (117.8). All-America running back Christian McCaffrey ranked first in all-purpose yards per game (211.6), fourth in rushing yards (145.7) and 20th in rushing yards per carry (6.34). Conrad Ukropina ranked fifth in field goals per game (1.83). Dallas Lloyd ranked 13th in total interceptions (5) and 18th in interceptions per game (0.4). Jake Bailey ranked 24th in punting (43.5).

McCaffrey and Love combined to rush for 2,386 yards, which was a school record until the next season, while McCaffrey's 284 rushing yards at Cal was a school record at the time, as well.

Stanford had two top-10 NFL Draft picks for only the fifth time, following the 2016 season. Solomon Thomas was the third overall pick by the San Francisco 49ers, and was the highest drafted defensive player in program history. Thomas also won the Pac-12's Morris Trophy, given to the league's top lineman. McCaffrey, the CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year, was selected by the Carolina Panthers with the eighth overall pick. He was Stanford's highest running back draft pick since 1982.

Following the 2015 season, Stanford became the only school ever ranked in the top four by U.S. News and World Report (4th) and the Associated Press (3rd) in the same year.

Stanford was 12-2 overall and 8-1 in Pac-12 play in 2015, going on to win the Pac-12 and Rose Bowl crowns. The Cardinal topped five ranked opponents, including Top-10 foes in No. 6 USC, No. 4 Notre Dame and No. 6 Iowa. Stanford was one of four teams in 2015 to record five or more wins over AP Top-25 opponents and one of four teams with three or more wins over AP Top-10 foes.

McCaffrey was named AP Player of the Year and won the Paul Hornung Award and Johnny "Jet" Rodgers Award. McCaffrey, also a Heisman Trophy finalist, set the NCAA record for all-purpose yards (3,864) and earned Academic All-America honors. McCaffrey earned consensus All-America first team nods and Outland Trophy winner Joshua Garnett received unanimous All-America distinction. Blake Martinez and Austin Hooper were named All-America third teamers. Fifteen Cardinal were lauded with All-Pac-12 honors and 22 received All-Pac-12 academic distinction.

McCaffrey posted the top four FBS individual all-purpose, single-game performances in 2015 and his 461 all-purpose yards vs. USC in the Pac-12 Championship Game was fifth-most in FBS history. He owned three of the top five 100-yard receiving and rushing games by an FBS player and became the only FBS player ever with 200 rushing, 100 receiving and 100 kickoff return yards vs. USC. He earned Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year honors following the season.

Shaw was instrumental in the maturation of quarterback Kevin Hogan during his Cardinal career. Hogan appeared in more than 50 contests and posted a school-record 36-10 mark as a starter. He ranked first in career total offense (10,634), second in completion percentage (.659) and passing efficiency (154.6), and third in passing yards (9,385) and passing touchdowns (75). His 171.0 passing efficiency clip in 2015 was the best single-season mark ever by a Cardinal signal caller. Hogan also set school records for career rushing yards (1,249) and touchdowns (15) by a quarterback.

Stanford's West Coast offense led the nation with 13 consecutive games scoring at least 30 points. The Cardinal amassed a school-record 3,131 rushing yards on 610 attempts in 2015, the most ever by a Cardinal program. The offensive unit's 529 points ranked second-most in a season and its 33 rushing touchdowns, 223.7 rushing yards/game, 30 passing touchdowns, 37.8 points/game and 6,097 total yards of offense ranked third.

Stanford won eight games in 2014 and closed the season on a three-game winning streak, including a victory in the Foster Farms Bowl. The Cardinal scored at least 30 points in seven of 13 games.

While facing six nationally ranked opponents that season, including four on the road, the Cardinal defensive unit helped Stanford rank second nationally in scoring defense (16.4 points/game), third in total defense (282.4 yards/game), seventh in rushing defense (104.5 yards/game) and eighth in passing defense (177.9 yards/game). The Cardinal joined Penn State and Clemson as the only three teams to finish in the top-10 nationally in all four categories. The team was also among the best nationally in getting to the quarterback, ranking sixth with 46 sacks. Stanford also led the nation in punt return average and strong safety Jordan Richards was a 2014 National Football Foundation's Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy.

In 2013, Shaw led Stanford to a second straight Pac-12 title and the program's 14th trip to the Rose Bowl. Stanford became the only team to earn four consecutive BCS bowl bids during the Bowl Championship Series era.

After leading the team to a landmark regular season, Shaw received AFCA Regional Coach of the Year honors and was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year.

Stanford defeated five nationally-ranked opponents at home in 2013 while winning 11 games despite playing the fifth-toughest schedule nationally in the Sagarin ratings. Stanford was among just three schools (Alabama and Oregon) with 10 or more wins in each season from 2010-13.

The Cardinal finished the 2013 campaign ranked fifth in the BCS standings, the fourth straight Top-10 BCS ranking for the Cardinal. The team ranked sixth in the final 2012 BCS Standings, following back-to-back No. 4 rankings at the end of the 2010 and 2011 seasons.

The 2013 team ranked among the nation's best in kickoff return average (1st), rushing defense (3rd), tackles for loss allowed (4th), sacks (7th), scoring defense (10th), kickoff coverage (10th), total defense (14th), sacks allowed (16th), red zone offense (16th), passing efficiency (17th) and red zone defense (19th).

Stanford had six players receive All-Pac-12 first-team honors with 19 all-conference selections in 2013. There were also eight different national awards that listed Stanford players as semifinalists and finalists. There were 25 players chosen to the Pac-12 All-Academic team and four were placed on the Capital One Academic All-District list, including Jordan Richards who was a second team All-America selection.

Shaw guided the Cardinal to a 12-2 record in 2012 and its first Pac-12 championship in 13 years. The campaign culminated with Stanford's first Rose Bowl victory in over 40 years, a 20-14 win over Wisconsin in 2013.

Shaw was named the 2012 Pac-12 Conference Coach of the Year, becoming the second to earn the honor outright in consecutive seasons since the award's inception in 1975. Stanford became the first school to defeat programs ranked No. 1 (Oregon) and 2 (USC) in the AP poll during the regular season and the Cardinal closed its season with five straight wins over as many ranked opponents.

Stanford's historic defensive output in 2012 broke the single-season sacks record (57) and led the Pac-12 in scoring defense (17.2), total defense (336.2), rushing defense (97.0), sacks (4.07) and tackles for loss (9.00). The Cardinal ranked first nationally in sacks, second in tackles for loss, fifth in rushing defense and 11th in scoring defense.

Stanford became the first program to win both the AFCA Academic Achievement Award and a BCS bowl game in the same season.

Stephan Taylor, a Doak Walker Award semifinalist, set the Stanford career record with 4,300 rushing yards and Zach Ertz led Stanford pass catchers and all FBS tight ends in receiving yards (898) and total receptions (69), both school records for a tight end. Ertz was a John Mackey Award finalist and the seventh unanimous All-American in program history.

Stanford was one of five schools to have four or more players selected to the 2012 AP All-America teams, with Ertz earning the honor along with David Yankey (second team), Trent Murphy (third team) and Ed Reynolds (third team). Yankey was a consensus All-American.

In Shaw's first season as head coach in 2011, the Cardinal posted an 11-2 record and made its second consecutive BCS appearance, falling to Oklahoma State in the Fiesta Bowl. Shaw became just the ninth major college head coach in history to post 11 or more wins in his first season, and the first since Chris Peterson (13-0) of Boise State and Bret Bielema (12-1) of Wisconsin in 2006.

Shaw was named the 2011 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, becoming just the third in Stanford history to earn the award, following Bill Walsh (1977) and Tyrone Willingham (1995, 1999).

The Cardinal was ranked in the Top 10 of both major polls for all 16 weeks of the season, peaking at No. 3 in the AP poll and No. 2 in the USA Today Coaches poll on Nov. 6.

Behind 2011 Heisman Trophy runner-up Andrew Luck, Stanford averaged 43.2 points/game and established a school-record with 561 points. Stanford's 11 victories in 2011 came by an average of 27.4 points.

Stanford's 2011 defense was ranked first or second in the Pac-12 in six categories, including rushing defense (1st - 84.4), third-down conversion defense (1st - 31.1), scoring defense (2nd - 21.9), total defense (2nd - 337.6), sacks/game (2nd - 3.00) and opponent first downs (2nd - 17.5).

Luck was named Walter Camp Football Foundation National Player of the Year along with receiving the Maxwell Award as the nation's top player. He finished second in the balloting for the Heisman Trophy and was the Pac-12's Offensive Player of the Year for a second straight season.

Right guard David DeCastro was a unanimous All-America selection; left tackle Jonathan Martin landed spots on the Walter Camp and AFCA All-America squads; tight end Coby Fleener and outside linebacker Chase Thomas were named All-Americans by Sporting News.

In all, 21 players earned All-Pac-12 honors in 2011, including six first-teamers. Twelve earned Pac-12 All-Academic honors, including first-team selections Luck and Brent Etiz. Luck was also named the Capital One Academic All-American of the Year by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

Prior to his appointment as head coach, Shaw served as Stanford's offensive coordinator for four seasons, playing an instrumental role in the resurgence of the Cardinal program which established school scoring records in 2009 and 2010 before setting another scoring mark in his first year as head coach. During Shaw's tenure as offensive coordinator, the Cardinal scored 40 or more points in 11 games from 2007-10.

Stanford's balanced offense amassed a school-record 6,142 yards during the 2010 season, averaging 213.8 on the ground and 258.7 yards through the air. In addition, Shaw's play calling in the red zone helped Stanford convert on a national-best 88.6 percent of its scoring opportunities inside the 20-yard line.

Prior to Stanford, Shaw served as the wide receivers and passing game coordinator at the University of San Diego during the 2006 season, winning the Division I-AA Mid-Major national title and the Pioneer League championship with the nation's top offense. The Toreros led all NCAA Division I-AA teams in passing offense (293.3 yards/game), total offense (494.25) and scoring offense (42.83). Quarterback Josh Johnson was one of four offensive All-Americans on the team and led all NCAA Division I-AA quarterbacks in passing efficiency (169.0 quarterback rating), touchdown passes (34), passing yards (3,320) and total offense (336.7).

Shaw's coaching resume also includes nine years of NFL experience with the Philadelphia Eagles (1997), Oakland Raiders (1998-2001) and Baltimore Ravens (2002-05). Shaw's last coaching job in the NFL with Baltimore included a stint as the quarterbacks and wide receivers coach from 2002-04 before working solely with the wide receivers in 2005. His tenure included an AFC North title in 2003. Derrick Mason set a franchise record with 86 receptions for 1,073 yards under Shaw's tutelage in 2005. Mark Clayton set a franchise rookie record for receptions in 2005 when he caught 44 balls for 471 yards.

After three seasons of quality control with the Oakland Raiders from 1998-2000, Shaw moved into the role of quarterbacks coach in 2001 as the Raiders won a second straight AFC West title. Quarterback Rich Gannon made the Pro Bowl for the second straight season and was the game's MVP.

Shaw began his NFL coaching career as the quality control coach with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1997.

He launched his coaching career at Western Washington, where he coached outside linebackers in 1995 and the tight ends in 1996.

A four-year letterwinner at Stanford from 1991-94 as a receiver, Shaw was a member of Stanford's 1991 Aloha Bowl team coached by Dennis Green that finished the season 8-4 and was the third-highest scoring team in school history at the time. He was also on the Cardinal team that went 10-3 and won the 1993 Blockbuster Bowl under Bill Walsh. Shaw finished his Stanford career with 57 catches for 664 yards and five touchdowns.

He also competed in a varsity track meet and a varsity basketball game before graduating in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in sociology.

Shaw's father, Willie, had two coaching stints at Stanford (1974-76, 1989-91) during his 33-year coaching career, which also included time with the Detroit Lions, Kansas City Chiefs, Minnesota Vikings, New Orleans Saints, Oakland Raiders, San Diego Chargers and St. Louis Rams. Stanford announced in 2013 that its defensive coordinator position had been endowed by a gift from an anonymous donor, named in honor of Willie Shaw.

Shaw is Chair of the NCAA Football rules committee and is on the Board of Trustees for the AFCA. He is also on the NCAA Football Competition Committee and represents the Pac-12 on the AFCA Ethics Committee. He was previously on USA Football's Football Advisory Committee and a member of the NCAA Commission to Combat Campus Sexual Violence. In addition to his work with that commission, Shaw has been a leading advocate of the Set The Expectation program, aimed at working to end the culture of sexual assault and domestic violence among college and high school athletes. Stanford players became the first university in the country to sign the Set The Expectation student pledge, stating they would use their platforms to speak out against sexual assault and violence against women.

Born in San Diego, Shaw and his wife, Kori, are the parents of three children -- Keegan, Carter and Gavin.

Cardinal Falls in Opener

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) -- Kansas State sixth-year quarterback Skylar Thompson ran for two touchdowns, bulling into the end zone for the first one after missing most of last season with a shoulder injury, and the Wildcats opened the season with a 24-7 win over Stanford on Saturday.

Deuce Vaughn sprinted 59 yards for a touchdown and finished with 124 yards rushing on 13 carries for the Wildcats, who finished last season with a five-game losing streak.

Stanford was down 24-0 before Tanner McKee's 14-yard touchdown pass to Brycen Tremayne with 3:16 left on its last offensive snap. The Cardinal, who last year won the last four games of their pandemic-shortened 4-2 season, have played 177 games since last being shut out.

Thompson, who later had a 13-yard TD run, opened the scoring when he put his left shoulder down and knocked cornerback Kyu Blu Kelly to the ground on a 6-yard TD run in the first quarter.

On the possession before the first TD, Kelly had an impressive interception in the end zone, leaping and reaching back over Phillip Brooks and then managing to get one foot down inbounds. But Stanford went three-and-out, setting up the two-play TD drive, Thompson finding a wide-open Brooks for a 56-yard pass to the 6.

Trees Topple No. 14 Troy

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Tanner McKee passed for two touchdowns and rushed for another score in his first collegiate start, and Stanford rebounded from a season-opening loss with a 42-28 upset victory over No. 14 Southern California on Saturday night.

Nathaniel Peat had an 87-yard touchdown run while racking up a career-high 115 yards, and Kyu Blu Kelly returned an interception 31 yards for a touchdown in a surprising rout for the Cardinal (1-1, 1-0 Pac-12). Led by McKee, Stanford's offense came back superbly a 24-7 loss to Kansas State last week.

McKee went 16 of 23 for 234 yards while seizing his chance to start. McKee hit Elijah Higgins and Brycen Tremayne for TDs as Stanford rolled to a 29-point lead in the fourth quarter of its ninth victory over USC in the California rivals' last 14 meetings.

Kedon Slovis passed for 223 yards, and Keaontay Ingram and Darwin Barlow rushed for TDs as the Trojans' (1-1, 0-1) nine-game regular season winning streak ended in tonight's win for Stanford.

Stanford's defense limited star Trojans receiver Drake London to four catches for 68 yards and a touchdown with 5:54 to play.

The 100th meeting between the Pac-12's two California private schools resumed a rivalry that was interrupted last season for the first time since 1945 by the coronavirus pandemic.

Peat put the Cardinal ahead early with his long sprint down the Cardinal sideline for the fifth-longest TD run in Stanford history. The speedy big-play tailback and kick returner nearly topped his previous career-high of 93 yards rushing on that play alone.

USC evened it early in the second quarter with a 15-play, 95-yard drive capped by Ingram's 2-yard TD surge, but McKee put the Cardinal back ahead with a 3-yard TD pass to Higgins on fourth down only after Stanford decided to go for it after USC lined up in the neutral zone on a successful field goal.

Stanford went up 21-10 right before halftime on Tremayne's TD reception, set up by a 49-yard catch by Austin Jones.

Kelly picked off Slovis' pass when it deflected off London's hands, and the cornerback eluded Slovis near the goal line to score his first career touchdown. The rout was on when McKee scored on a 1-yard keeper late in the third quarter.

Stanford's road trip to start the season continues when the Cardinal travels to Vanderbilt next Saturday, Sept. 18.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -- Tanner McKee ran for a touchdown and threw for two more as Stanford beat Vanderbilt 41-23 Saturday night in the first meeting between the two programs.

Stanford (2-1) finally can head home on a two-game winning streak after playing the first three games on the road, the only Power Five program this season to even play its first two straight games away from home.

Stanford took control scoring 13 points in the final 1:53 of the second quarter. Joshua Karty kicked a 46-yard field goal, then Jimmy Wyrick picked off a Ken Seals pass for the first interception of his career. That set up McKee's second TD pass of the half, a 5-yarder to Brycen Tremayne with 40 seconds left.

The Cardinal defense forced the first three-and-out by Vandy. Casey Filkins returned the punt 48 yards to the Vandy 22, and an illegal formation penalty on the Commodores moved the ball to the 17. Karty came out for the easy 35-yarder for a 27-14 halftime lead. Those were the first field goals of the sophomore kicker's career.

Stanford made it 20 straight after forcing Vanderbilt three-and-out again to open the third quarter. McKee capped a 55-yard drive with a 5-yard TD pass to Jay Symonds for a 34-14 lead.

McKee finished with 218 yards passing in the second straight start of his career. The sophomore completed at least one pass to nine different receivers. Nathaniel Peat and E.J. Smith ran for a TD apiece.

The Cardinal had a 422-398 edge in total offense as Vanderbilt scored a TD on the final play of the game.

After a seven-game road trip that spans back to the 2020 season, Stanford finally returns home next Saturday to host UCLA on at Stanford Stadium.

Card Falls to #24 UCLA in Home Opener

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) -- Playing its first home game since Nov. 2020, Stanford's comeback fell short in a 35-24 loss to No. 24 UCLA on Saturday night at Stanford Stadium.

Stanford (2-2, 1-1 Pac-12) had played its last seven games away from home because of COVID-19 protocols last season and a tough opening schedule. The Cardinal managed to win six of those games but came up short against the Bruins (3-1, 1-0 Pac-12).

UCLA broke out to a 14-0 lead and then, after letting Stanford battle back to tie it, got the biggest play of the game when Thompson-Robinson found Kyle Phillips open deep over the middle for a 75-yard TD on the next play from scrimmage.

The Bruins sealed the win when Thompson-Robinson threw a 5-yard TD pass to Phillips after briefly leaving the game with an injury.

Stanford started the game with five straight three-and-outs and trailed 14-0 on short TD runs by Thompson-Robinson and Zach Charbonnet before the offense even got going.

McKee then started to find some open receivers downfield as the Cardinal worked its way back into the game. Bryce Tremayne made a toe-tapping 19-yard TD grab to get Stanford on the board in the second quarter.

Then, after the Bruins went back up by 14 on Thompson-Robinson's second TD run late in the first half, McKee connected on a 56-yard TD pass to Elijah Higgins in the third quarter and a 52-yarder to Bryce Farrell early in the fourth to tie the game at 21.

But Thompson-Robinson answered on the next play and UCLA held on for the win.

Stanford faces No. 3 Oregon on Saturday at Stanford Stadium.

Cardinal Clips No. 3 Oregon in OT

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) -- Tanner McKee threw a TD pass on an untimed down at the end of regulation to tie the game and another on the opening possession of overtime to lead Stanford to a 31-24 victory over No. 3 Oregon on Saturday.

McKee came back after leaving for a play on the final drive of regulation with an injury to tie it on a 2-yard pass to Elijah Higgins after a holding penalty by Oregon (4-1, 1-1 Pac-12) in the end zone extended the game one play.

McKee then gave the Cardinal (3-2, 2-1) the lead with a 14-yarder to John Humphreys in overtime. Stanford then forced Anthony Brown to throw an incomplete pass on fourth-and-8 to seal its fourth win against an Oregon team ranked in the top 10 since 2009.

The Ducks were appeared poised for their first 5-0 start in eight years when they rallied from 10 points down at halftime to take a 24-17 lead early in the fourth quarter on Brown's second TD run of the game.

But then McKee delivered the big plays late and the Cardinal capitalized on three Oregon penalties on the game-tying 87-yard drive in the final 1:59 of regulation.

McKee left the game for one play on the drive after being hit by Kayvon Thibodeaux on a play ruled targeting. Oregon was then called for another roughing the passer penalty and the holding penalty in the end zone on what appeared to be the final play.

The Cardinal got the untimed down and McKee delivered with the pass to Higgins. Stanford opted for the extra point and the game went to OT.

Stanford returns to play on a short week, traveling to Arizona State on Friday night.

Stanford Falls to No. 22 Arizona State in Tempe

TEMPE, Ariz. (AP) -- The Cardinal dropped a Pac-12 Friday night showdown against No. 22 Arizona State, 28-10, at Sun Devil Stadium.

The Sun Devils (5-0, 3-0 Pac-12) racked up 255 yards and three touchdowns on the ground. Jayden Daniels provided the balance, throwing for 175 yards and running for 76 more, including a 51-yard touchdown.

Stanford (3-3, 2-2) had trouble stopping Arizona State's run game, falling behind early, limited to 9 yards rushing on 20 carries.

Tanner McKee threw for 356 yards and a touchdown, but had his first three interceptions of the season. Pierce scored in the third quarter after Jack Jones stepped in front of a receiver for an interception and laterally just before hitting the ground.

Elijah Higgins tallied 110 yards on seven catches with a touchdown, while sophomore tight end Benjamin Yurosek added 118 yards of his own on six catches.

Both teams were coming off big wins.

Stanford took down Oregon 31-24 by sending the game to overtime with a touchdown on an untimed final play of regulation.

Arizona State picked up one of its biggest wins under coach Herm Edwards, knocking off then-No. 20 UCLA 42-23.

The Sun Devils kept rolling against the Cardinal with an onslaught of big plays.

Daniels scrambled through a hole up the middle, ran away from two Stanford defenders who collided and raced off for a 51-yard touchdown run on Arizona State's opening drive.

Raachad White scored on a 5-yard run, one play after leaping a defender for a 29-yard gain. The Sun Devils pulled off consecutive trick plays covering 54 yards, the second Elijah Badger's 22-yard TD run on a reverse to lead 21-7 at halftime.

Arizona State's offense stagnated in the second half, but the defense came up with the big plays when it needed.

Stanford had some early success on offense and scored when McKee hit Elijah Higgins on a 6-yard corner fade. The Cardinal stalled after that and McKee threw his first interception of the season on a pass that caromed off two players' hands in the closing seconds of the first half.

Cardinal Comes Up Short in Pullman

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) -- The Cardinal mounted a second-half comeback in Pullman, but Max Borghi scored on a 2-yard run with 1:30 left in the game as Washington State overcame Stanford 34-31 on Saturday.

Borghi's winning score was set up by a 41-yard pass reception by Calvin Jackson Jr. Borghi finished with 89 yards rushing and two touchdowns.

Quarterback Jayden de Laura threw for 289 yards and three touchdowns for Washington State (4-3, 3-2 Pac-12), which won its third straight game and holds a five-game winning streak against Stanford.

Austin Jones and Benjamin Yurosek caught touchdown passes for Stanford (3-4, 2-3), while Joshua Karty kicked three field goals.

Quarterback Tanner McKee fired a 45-yard touchdown pass to Yurosek on Stanford's first possession. Karty added a pair of field goals as Stanford jumped to a 13-0 first quarter lead.

The Cougars came to life in the second quarter, as de Laura threw touchdown passes of 32 yards to Travell Harris, 31 yards to Jackson and 10 yards to De'Zhaun Stribling for a 20-13 lead.

Borghi powered over from the 2 late in the third quarter to lift WSU to a 27-16 lead.

But the Cardinal replied with a 74-yard drive. McKee pushed into the end zone from the 1 early in the fourth, then ran in the two-point conversion to cut Washington State's lead to 27-24.

After a Washington State punt, Stanford drove 85 yards and took a 31-27 lead on McKee's 8-yard scoring pass to Jones with 7:32 left in the game.

Washington State got the ball back on its 30 with 3:26 left. De Laura marched them down the field and Borghi scored the winning points with 1:30 left.

The Cardinal has a bye next Saturday before hosting Washington on Oct. 30.

Washington: The Huskies are feeling a lot better after their second consecutive comeback win. Morris made the game-winning throw but it was Washington's running game that made the difference. McGrew and Davis were unstoppable most of the night.

Cardinal Falls to Beavers in Corvallis

CORVALLIS, Ore. (AP) -- Chance Nolan passed for 257 yards and two touchdowns, and ran for a score, leading Oregon State to a 35-14 win over Stanford on Saturday.

Nolan completed 19 of 25 passes, including a 67-yard touchdown to Trevon Bradford that increased the lead to 21-0 early in the third quarter.

Injuries have taken a toll on Stanford (3-7, 2-6), which has lost five games in a row.

Freshman Ari Patu struggled to get the Cardinal's passing game going in his first career start, completing 7 of 14 for 51 yards with a touchdown and interception before leaving midway through the third quarter with an undisclosed injury. Stanford used three quarterbacks in the game.

Oregon State opened the scoring in the first quarter on Nolan's 4-yard touchdown run, culminating a 16-play, 74-yard drive.

Jack Colletto's 2-yard touchdown run on a direct snap with 17 seconds left in the first half gave the Beavers a 14-0 advantage at the break. Stanford managed just 74 total yards in the opening half and its best drive ended on a blocked field goal attempt from 55 yards.

Oregon State increased its lead on 21-0 early in the third quarter when Bradford turned a short pass into a 67-yard touchdown.

Stanford answered with its best drive of the game. Patu completed an 8-yard touchdown pass to tight end Benjamin Yurosek on fourth and 2, cutting the lead to 21-7.

B.J. Baylor's 6-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter, and a 5-yard touchdown pass to tight end Teagan Quitortiano early in the third quarter gave Oregon State a 35-7 lead.

Nathaniel Peat scored on a rush from 18 yards out to bring the game to its final score of 35-14.

The Cardinal hosts California next Saturday.

Cardinal Falls to Cal

STANFORD, Calif. - Stanford fell to California, 41-11, in the 124th Big Game between the two schools Saturday evening.

Chase Garbers was one of more than 20 players from Cal (4-6, 3-4 Pac-12) to miss the game at Arizona two weeks ago following a positive COVID-19 test. The Golden Bears had more than 40 positive tests in all for the program, leading to last week's game against Southern California to be postponed.

But nearly all of those players were back on Saturday for the Big Game and Cal took control over Stanford (3-8, 2-7) with 636 yards of offense, including 352 on the ground.

Garbers delivered the biggest play with an 84-yard TD pass to Trevon Young to open the scoring in the second quarter. That broke the record for longest pass in the Stanford/Cal series, eclipsing the 82-yarder Brian Johnson threw to Walter Batson for Stanford in 1987.

Garbers added a 1-yard TD pass to Christopher Brooks later in the half to deliver Cal just its second win in the past 11 Big Games. Garbers ran and threw for a score two years ago in a 24-20 win at Stanford Stadium that was the Bears' only other win in the past 11 games against Stanford (3-8, 2-7).

The Cardinal has dropped six straight games overall for their longest skid since losing their first nine games in 2006 under coach Walt Harris.

Even the return of Tanner McKee made little difference for Stanford. He missed the past two games when the Cardinal were outscored by 66 points in losses to Utah and Oregon State and struggled to get much going on offense.

Stanford was gashed again by big plays, allowing a 75-yard run to Brooks and a 76-yard TD run to Marcel Dancy in the third quarter. The Cardinal have allowed five TDs from scrimmage of more than 50 yards in the past three games.

Stanford hosts Notre Dame on Saturday to close out the 2021 season.

Stanford Drops Season Finale

STANFORD, Calif. - Stanford closed out its 2021 campaign Saturday evening at Stanford Stadium, falling to No. 6 Notre Dame 45-14, in the annual meeting for the Legends Trophy.

Jack Coan threw two touchdown passes and ran for another score as Notre Dame kept its playoff hopes alive. The Fighting Irish (11-1, No. 6 CFP) won their final seven games following a home loss to Cincinnati but will likely need some help next week to get into the College Football Playoff for the third time in the past four seasons.

Stanford (3-9) was bidding for its third top-15 win of the season, having already defeated No. 14 USC and No. 3 Oregon. However, the Cardinal lost its seventh straight game to end the season.

Notre Dame built a 24-0 halftime lead following Kyren Williams' 1-yard touchdown rush with 4:47 in the second quarter.

Jonathan McGill intercepted Coan's pass on the first drive of the second half to set up a 13-yard drive, capped by Austin Jones' 5-yard run to make it 24-7.

The Irish moved ahead 38-7 before Tanner McKee connected with Benjamin Yurosek for a 49-yard passing touchdown with 11:44 remaining in the fourth quarter.

McKee completed 20-of-25 passes for 172 yards. Jones carried nine times for 37 yards while Michael Wilson caught six passes for 52 yards and Yurosek hauled in five receptions for 87 yards.
