USC'S OLDEST RIVAL

•No. 6 USC will play the first Pac-12 game of 2023 when long-time foe Stanford comes to visit the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum one final time as a member of the Pac-12 Conference. It's a nationallytelevised primetime matchup on FOX.

•Stanford is USC's oldest rival, dating back to 1905. The Trojans have won 6 of the last 11 games against the Cardinal dating back to 2013 (the two teams did not meet in 2020 for the first time since 1945).

 USC has won 2 of its last 3 home games against Stanford dating back to 2017.
 As USC enters the Big Ten Conference in 2024 and Stanford has just announced its move to the Atlantic Coastal Conference in 2024, this could be the last matchup between two historic west coast rivals for the foreseeable future.

• This is the Pac-12's first conference game of 2023.

NEVADA RECAP

 Defending Heisman Trophy winner QB Caleb Williams went 18-of-24 for 319 yards and 5 TDs and rushed for 42 yards to lead the Trojans to victory over Nevada 66-14 in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. His 5 touchdown passes tied his most as a Trojan (4th time). Williams has a career high of 6 TD passes while at Oklahoma (vs. Texas Tech on Oct. 10, 2021). • Through two games, Williams is 36-of-49 (.735) with 9 TDs and 0 INTs. • As of Sept 3, he is No 1 in the nation (and No. 1 in the Pac-12 Conference) in passing TDs (9), No. 1 in

the nation (and No. 1 in the Pac-12 Conference) in points responsible for (54), No. 2 in the nation (and No. 1 in the Pac-12 Conference) in passing yards (597), No. 4 in the nation (and No. 1 in the Pac-12 Conference) in passing efficiency (236.4), No. 5 in the nation (and No. 1 in the Pac-12 Conference) in yards per pass attempt (12.18), No. 6 in the nation (and No. 1 in the Pac-12 Conference) in passing yards per completion (16.58) and No. 6 in the nation (and No. 2 in the Pac-12 Conference) in points responsible for per game (27.0)

• The last time USC opened a season by scoring more than 50 points in each of its first two games was the 2015 season. USC began that season with a 55-6 win over Arkansas State and a 59-9 win over Idaho. Both games were also at home.

 $m \check{T}$ he last time USC scored more points in any two games in a season (122 points through 2 games) was the start of the 2005 season, when the Trojans scored 133 in defeating at home Hawai'i (63-17) and Arkansas

(70-17). • The 66 points scored were USC's most since defeating Rice also 66-14 in the 2022 season opener on Sept. 3, 2022.

• The 35 first-half points scored by USC matches the most points by the Trojans in a half under Lincoln Riley, done twice before (35 in the second half vs. Rice on Sept. 3, 2022 and 35 in first half vs. Stanford on Sept. 10, 2022).

 USC had 668 total yards of offense against Nevada and 501 total yards against San José State. USC now has 11 games of 500 or more total yards under Lincoln Riley (16 games).

 USC's 668 total yards were its most since amassing 737 total yards vs. Idaho on Sept. 12, 2015 in a 59-9 win.

• **QB Miller Moss** also saw action going 7-of-10 (.700) with 1 TD. He threw a career-long 71-yard TD pass to **WR Duce Robinson** in the fourth quarter (the first TD of Robinson's USC career).

• WR Zachariah Branch opened the game with a 22-yard TD.

• WR Tahj Washington caught 2 TDs and had 3 receptions for 75 yards. The 2 TD catches ties his career high for one game (3rd time).

• RB MarShawn Lloyd scored his first TD as a Trojan and 11th rushing TD of his career with a 24-yard scamper in the first quarter. In 21 games at South Carolina, Lloyd had 10 rushing and 2 receiving TDs. Tonight, Lloyd had 7 carries for 76 yards and the 1 TD.

• RB Quinten Joyner had a 47-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. It was the freshman's first career TD for USC and it is the longest TD run by a Trojan this season. In total, Joyner had 4 carries for 65 yards.

So that was awesome

• USC recorded 5 sacks, one each by RUSH Jamil Muhammad, RUSH Solomon Byrd, RUSH Braylan Shelby, ILB Shane Lee and DT De'jon Benton.

• PK Denis Lynch went 9-for-9 in extra-point attempts and made a 37-yard field goal.

STANFORD SCOUTING REPORT

• Stanford is 1-0 overall after defeating Hawaii 37-24 in its season opener in Honolulu.

• It was the debut for new head coach Troy Taylor leading the Cardinal. He spent the last four seasons at Sacramento State.

• QB Ashton Daniels went 22-of-36 for 249 yards and 2 TDs and no INTs. It was his first career start.

- TE Benjamin Yurosek was Daniel's favorite target and caught 9 passes for a career-high 138 yards.
- WR John Humphreys had 3 receptions for 29 yards and 1TD.
 RB Casey Filkins led the Cardinal in rushing with 67 yards on 6 carries.
- RBs E.J. Smith and Bryce Farrell each scored rushing TDs.
- Defensively, S Alaka'i Gilman led the team with 7 tackles.
- OLB David Bailey recorded 3 sacks for minus 20 yards against Hawaii.
 S Jimmy Wyrick, CB Collin Wright and DL Zach Buckey each tallied a PBU.
- K Joshua Karty scored 3 FG of 25, 25, and 46 yards. He was 4-for-4 in OAT attempts.

•USC is still ranked No. 6 in the pre-season AP sports media poll and 6th in the USA Today coaches poll. Stanford is not ranked. New rankings come out on Sept. 5.

SERIES

• Stanford is USC's oldest rival, with the series dating back to 1905.

• USC holds a 64-34-3 lead over Stanford (Troy's 2005 victory was vacated due to NCAA penalty; original record: 65-34-3).

In games in the Los Angeles area (including a 1918 game in Pasadena), USC leads 28-20-1 (not • including a USC win in 2005 vacated due to NCAA penalty; original record: 29-20-1) and has won 2 of the 3 last home games.

VERSUS PAC-12 CONFERENCE

USC has won 69.8% (490-204-29) of its games against current Pac-12 opponents (does not include 9 wins later vacated due to NCAA penalty; original record: 499-204-29, 70.2%).

PAC-12 OPENERS

 In conference openers, USC is 71-24-5 (.735). In conference openers at home, the Trojans are 42-10-3 (.791). (Does not include 1 win vacated due to NCAÁ penalty; original record: 72-24-5, .738)

IN SEPTEMBER

• USC has a 194-55-8 (.770) all-time record while playing in the month of September (does not include 3 wins vacated due to NCAA penalty; original record: 197-55-8, .773).

IN COLISEUM

 USC has a 463-146-27 (.749) all-time record in the Coliseum since the stadium opened in 1923 (not including 6 wins vacated due to NCAA penalty; original record: 469-146-27, .752). USC's 642 games played in the Coliseum (including the 6 vacated wins) is the third most that any school has played in its home stadium (behind Georgia Tech's 718 in Bobby Dodd Stadium and Tennessee's 643 in Neyland Stadium).

 Stanford DLB Lance Keneley is the son of former USC DL Matt Keneley (1993-96) and USC women's volleyball player Antoinette Lindemann (Thomas). He is also the nephew of former USC football DT Todd Keneley (1999) and OG-C Clay Hattabaugh (1991-95).

• Stanford OL Jaxson Moi's father, Junior Moi, was a OLB-DE at USC (1991-92)

 Stanford women's beach volleyball coach Andrew Fuller was an assistant at USC for 3 seasons (2013-15). His wife and volunteer assistant for the women's beach volleyball team, Lauren Fendrick, attended law school at USC.

• Stanford's co-offensive line coach Viane Talamaivao played at USC from 2014-17 and returned as a graduate assistant from 2019-20. He then shifted into a quality control analyst for the 2021 season.

Stanford offensive quality control analyst Vavae Malepeai played for Trojans from 2017-21 and graduated from USC with three degrees: a bachelor's degree in communications, a master's in project management and another master's in non-governmental organizations and social change.

SERIES RECORD CONFUSION?

Both USC and Stanford list their football series record as 64-34-3 in the Trojans' favor, but both come about it differently. The Cardinal do not count USC's 25-8 win in 1918, because Stanford claims that a team composed of Student Army Training Corps players, not the Stanford varsity squad, played the Trojans that year. USC counts that 1918 win, but not its 51-21 win in 2005 that was vacated by NCAA penalty (Stanford's 2005 loss was not vacated, just USC's win). • Stanford's creative director Jonathan Chaves previously served as USC football's art director from 2022-23.

2023 SCHEDULE

 The Trojans will play seven home games in the Coliseum in Riley's second season. USC will face 9 Pac-12 opponents and 3 non-conference foes.

• USC opened its 2023 slate in the Coliseum on Aug. 26 in a Week Zero game against San José State. It was the team's fifth-ever meeting. USC then faced Nevada on Sept. 2 of Labor Day weekend. There has been 94 years since the last meeting between the two teams on Nov. 9, 1929. The 2023 Trojan-Wolf Pack matchup will mark the 100th anniversary of the teams' 1923 meeting in the second-ever collegiate varsity football game played in the then-new Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum played on Oct. 13, 1923. [The first varsity game in the Coliseum was played a week earlier on Oct. 6, 1923 versus Pomona, but USC didn't schedule Pomona this year because it is not FBS]. The Trojans stay home for the third week in-a-row to begin Pac-12 play against Stanford [led by new head coach Troy Taylor] on Sept. 9. It will be the Pac-12's first league game of the 2023 campaign. After a bye on Sept. 16, USC will hit the road for the first time in the 2023 season and challenge Arizona State (with new coach Kenny Dillingham) on Sept. 23. The Trojans stay on the road and visit Colorado (with new head coach Deion Sanders) on Sept. 30. Troy returns to the Coliseum on Oct. 7 to host Arizona on Trojan Family Weekend. Then, USC travels to South Bend to challenge Note Dame on Oct. 14 in the greatest intersectional rivalry in college football. On Oct. 21 the Trojans return home to face defending Pac-12 champion Utah. USC visits California on Oct. 28 and returns back to the Coliseum to face Washington on Nov. 4 for Homecoming. The Trojans travel to Oregon on Nov. 11 and then wrap up the regular season on Nov. 78 against UCLA. Washington hasn't played at the Coliseum since 2018, while USC hasn't played at Oregon since 2015.

LAST YEAR

• In his first season as USC's head coach in 2022, the 39-year-old **Lincoln Riley** led the Trojans to have equaled the biggest one-season victory turnaround (+7 victories) in USC history (USC's 1962 national champs won 11 games after winning just 4 in 1961). In 2021, Troy won 4 games and in 2022, it had 11 victories. Riley tied the record for most victories by a first-year head coach (tied with John Robinson in 1976. This also ties the Pac-12 record). Riley's Trojans went 11-3 in 2022 to bring USC back to the top of the college football landscape. USC went undefeated in the Collseum (7-0), doing so for the first time since 2017. Riley guided the Trojans to a Pac-12 Championship appearance and to a Cotton Bowl appearance. In Riley's electric offense, USC scored 579 points in 2022 compared to just 344 points scored in 2021. The Trojans finished the season nationally ranked No. 1 in turnover margin (1.57), No. 1 in turnovers lost (7), No. 3 in first downs offense (359), No. 3 in passes intercepted (19), No. 3 in passing offense (335.4), No. 3 in scoring offense (41.4), No. 3 in total offense (506.6) and No. 5 in turnovers gained (29).

• Riley's 2022 Trojans broke six USC records. The 2022 team now holds the USC record for most yards passing in a single season (4,696 yards in 14 games), most passes attempted in a single season (515), most touchdown passes in a single season (43), lowest percentage of passes had intercepted (0.97%, 5 in 515 attempts), most games scoring 30+ points (12) and most games scoring 40+ points (10). They also tie the USC single-game record for most touchdowns on interception returns (3 vs. Rice).

• Under Riley's tutelage in 2022, **QB Caleb Williams** was named the 88th recipient of the Heisman Trophy. In addition to winning college football's most prestigious award, Williams also was named the 2022 Walter Camp Player of the Year, the 2022 AP Player of the Year, the 2022 Maxwell Award winner, the 2022 Sporting News College Football Player of the Year, the 2022 CBS Sports Player of the Year, the 2022 Action Sports Player of the Year, the 2022 CFPA National Performer of the Year and the 2022 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year, the 2022 CFPA National Performer of the Year and the 2022 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year, the defensive Morris Trophy winner and was a finalist for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, the Rotary Lombardi Award, the Chuck Bednarik Award, the Ted Hendricks Award, and the Lott IMPACT Trophy. Both Tuipulotu and Williams were Unanimous First Team All-Americans, USC's first since 2012. OLs Brett Neilon and Andrew Vorhees and S Calen Bullock were also named First Team All-Americans. Riley's 5 First Team All-Americans were the most in a single season since 2007 when USC also had 5 first teames. WR Jordan Addison, CB Mekhi Blackmon, DL Tuli Tuipulotu, OL Andrew Vorhees and QB Caleb Williams were all selected to the All-Pac-12 First Team, and Vorhees was the offensive recipient of the Morris Trophy. Riley was a finalist for the 2022 CBC and the Soft of the S

offense of the No. 10 ranked USC Trojans to a 41-28 victory over Stanford in Palo Alto, Calif. This was the Trojans' first win over the Cardinal in Stanford Stadium since 2014, and it was **Lincoln Riley's** first Pac-12 Conference win as head coach of the Trojans. USC is now 2-0 on the 2022 season, and 1-0 in Pac-12 Conference play.

The Trojan offense amassed 505 total yards of offense and scored five TDs in the first-half of play. USC did not see a third down until the final minute of the second half.

USC's defense collected four more turnovers in Saturday's game. The last time USC's defense forced a total of 8 turnovers in consecutive games was in 2020 when the Trojans had 5 turnovers at Utah (11/21/20) and 3 the next game versus Washington State (12/6/20).

In the first series of the game, **DB Max Williams** intercepted Stanford QB Tanner McKee and returned it for 32-yards. This marked the first INT of his career. He set up **QB Williams** and the Trojan offense to quickly score on a 5-yard pass to **TE Lake McRee**, the first of his career.

The Stanford offense returned to the field for its second offensive series and marched all the way to the USC 2-yard line where **DB Mekhi Blackmon** intercepted McKee in the end zone and returned it 17 yards. Williams then tossed a 22-yard touchdown pass to **WR Jordan Addison** which made the score 14-0.

Stanford put points on the board as RB E.J. Smith caught a short pass for a TD, but just 11 seconds later, Williams responded with a 75-yard TD pass to Addison.

WR Mario Williams scored his first TD as a Trojan after Max Williams forced a fumble that Blackmon recovered. This score pushed USC's lead to 28-7.

On Stanford's next possession, Smith found the end zone for a second time. But the Trojans continued to showcase Lincoln Riley's high-scoring offense as **RB Travis Dye** scored on a 27-yard TD run to close out the first half of play.

In the second half, **PK Denis Lynch** nailed a 45-yard FG, his career long. **DL Tuli Tuipulotu** forced a fumble, which **DB Jacobe Covington** recovered and set up Lynch to kick another 42-yard FG.

Stanford scored twice more in the fourth quarter, but it wasn't enough to top the Trojans.

USC improves to 64-34-3 overall in its series with Stanford.

PLAYER DEPARTURES

The Trojan offense will be feeling the effects of losing three impactful linemen up front. Brett Neilon and Andrew Vorhees, both First Team All-Americans and four and five-year starters, respectively, were instrumental in USC's offensive success last season. Their outstanding play in the trenches allowed Caleb Williams to lead the offense to have a record-setting season. In addition to being a First-Team All-American, Vorhees was also selected to the All-Pac-12 First Team and was the offensive recipient of the Morris Trophy. Also moving on is fellow offensive lineman Bobby Haskins. Though just at USC for one season, Haskins made an impact on one of the top offensive lines in the nation and helped the unit to become Joe Moore Award semifinalists. Veteran lineman Courtland Ford was also lost to the transfer portal. The offense also lost All-Pac-12 First Teamer Jordan Addison. Addison, who was the 23rd pick of the 2023 NFL Draft, recorded 59 catches for 875 yards and 8 TDs as Caleb Williams' favorite receiver in 2022. Another departed Trojan is running back **Travis Dye**. Although Dye was at Troy for just one season, he immediately became the emotional leader of the team and the heartbeat of the program. An instant fan-favorite, Dye's season was cut short due to a broken ankle which ended his season prematurely in the 10th game against Colorado. Before his injury, the All-Pac-12 Second Teamer rushed for 844 yards on 145 carries, averaging 6.1 yards per carry, with 9 touchdowns. Receiver Terrell Bynum (16 receptions for 159 yards and 1 TD in 2022) is gone as well as long-time Trojan tight end Josh Falo (22 receptions for 276 yards and 5 TDs in his career).

•Defensively, the Trojans lost Tuli Tuipulotu, a team captain and three-year starter on the defensive line. Tuipulotu was one of the most disruptive defensive players in the nation in 2022. He led the nation in sacks with 13.5 and was second in the nation in tackles for loss with 22.0 In 2022, he was named the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year, the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year, the defensive Morris Trophy winner and was a finalist for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, the Rotary Lombardi Award, the Chuck Bednarik Award, the Ted Hendricks Award, and the Lott IMPACT Trophy. Tuipulotu was also a Unanimous First Team All-American. In his career, he recorded 116 tackles, including 32 for loss of 172 yards with 21 sacks for 148 yards. He tallied 5 pass breakups, 4 forced fumbles and 1 fumble recovery in the end zone to score a touchdown in his career. In the secondary, USC lost All-Pac-12 First Teamer Mekhi Blackmon. Blackmon recorded 67 tackles (fourth on the team), including 2.0 for loss of 7 yards in 2022. He led the team with 12 pass breakups and decorated his stat sheet with 3 interceptions, 1 fumble recovery and 1 forced fumble. USC also lost Nick Figueroa, a reliable and versatile player who knew the defense so well he was able to play multiple positions as a lineman and rush end. In his career, he recorded 71 tackles, including 17.5 for loss of 73 yards with 10 sacks for 59 yards, 2 pass breakups, 1 fumble recovery and 1 blocked kick while appearing in 42 games with 21 starts. Figueroa, a stand- out in the classroom, was named a First Team Academic All-American in 2022 and was a Second Team selection in 2021. USC also lost long-time Trojan Brandon Pili from the defensive line. In his 5-year career, Pili tallied 74 tack- les, including 10 for loss of 32 yards with 3.5 sacks for 20 yards, 4 pass breakups, 1 forced fumble and 1 blocked kick while appearing in 52 games with 6 starts. USC also lost linebackers Ralen Goforth (148 tackles, including 4 for losses of 8 yards, 2 breakups, 2 fumble recoveries, 1 interception and 1 forced fumble while appearing in 40 games in his career, with 16 starts) and Tuasivi Nomura (34 tackles, including 1.5 for loss of 5 yards, and 1

pass breakup while appearing in 33 games with 3 starts). •On special teams, the Trojans lost long-time kickoff man Alex Stadthaus. He had touchbacks on 122 of his 253 kickoffs (48.2%) and made 11 tackles in his career while appearing in 45 games.

OFFENSIVE OVERVIEW

 Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Caleb Williams returns to lead the Trojan offense along with 5 other offensive starters: veteran offensive linemen Justin Dedich and Jonah Monheim and receivers Brenden Rice, Tahj Washington and Mario Williams. Others returning with starting experience in Riley's system are running back Austin Jones, tight end Lake McRee, receiver Michael Jackson III and offensive linemen Mason Murphy and Gino Quinones.

 The 2022 Trojan offense averaged 506.6 yards to rank No. 3 in the nation, including 335.4 passing yards per game to also rank third nationally. USC protected the ball and only lost 7 turnovers to rank No. 1 in the nation, and ranked No. 2 in the nation in passes had intercepted with 5. USC ranked No. 2 in the nation in 3rd down conversion percentage at 0.536 and ranked No. 3 in the nation in first down offense (359). Ten players who caught a pass are back from last season.

•The 2022 team set USC records for most yards passing in a single season with 4,696 yards in 14 games, most passes attempted in a single season with 515, most touchdown passes in a single season with 43, lowest percentage of passes had intercepted with 0.97% (5 in 515 attempts), most games scoring 30+ points with 12 and most games scoring 40+ points with 10 and now ties the USC single-game record for most touchdowns on interception returns with 3 versus Rice.

OUARTERBACKS

• Defending Heisman Trophy winner Caleb Williams, the record-setting Unanimous First Team All-American quarterback, should again be America's top player as he returns for his second season at USC as a junior in 2023. He will attempt to be just the second player ever to win a second Heisman. Williams was also named the 2022 Walter Camp Player of the Year, AP Player of the Year and Maxwell Award winner. He was the 2022 Sporting News College Football Player of the Year, CBS Sports Player of the Year, Action Sports Player of the Year, CFPA National Performer of the Year and DC Touchdown Club Player of the Year. He was a Unanimous All-American. He was selected as the 2022 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year and was named to the All-Pac-12 First Team. Overall in 2022, he completed 333-of-500 passes (66.7%) for 4,537 yards and 42 TDs with just 5 INTs, plus he rushed for 382 yards and 10 TDs. He was first nationally in passing TDs (42) and points responsible for per game (22.3). He was third nationally in passing yards (4.537) and fourth nationally in passing yards per game (324.1). He was fifth nationally in passing efficiency (168.5, first in Pac-12) and total offense (351.4). He was seventh nationally in yards per pass attempt (9.1).

• Also returning is redshirt sophomore backup quarterback Miller Moss. He saw action in 5 games (Rice, Fresno State, Arizona State, Colorado and the Pac-12 Championship versus Utah) in 2022, and went 12-of-14 (85.7%) for 159 yards and 1 TD.

• Two more quarterbacks, redshirt sophomore Jake Jensen and sophomore Gage Roy, return to Lincoln Riley's room. Neither has played yet.

• Joining the Trojans this spring was freshman Malachi Nelson, the No. 1 recruit in the nation per ESPN. The decorated quarterback from Los Alamitos (Calif.) HS was named a 2023 Under Armour All-American and a Polynesian Bowl All-Star. He also competed at the 2022 Elite 11 Finals. --Williams went 18-of-25 (.720) for 278 yards and 4 TDs with no INTs against <u>San José State</u>. His

76-yard TD pass to WR Tahj Washington in the second quarter was the longest of Williams' career. It was also the longest touchdown throw by a USC quarterback since Kedon Slovis in 2019, who threw a 95-yard touchdown pass against Arizona State on Nov. 9. He earned DC Touchdown Club Player of the Week for his performance. Moss went 5-of-7 (.714) and rushed for 4 yards on 1 carry to score the first rushing TD of his career. Freshman QB Malachi Nelson made his Trojan debut and went 1-of-3 (.333) for 0 yards.

--Williams went 18-of-24 (.750) for 319 yards and 5 TDs with no INTs against <u>Nevada</u>. His 5 TD passes tied his most as a Trojan (4th time). Williams has a career high of 6 TD passes while at Oklahoma (vs. Texas Tech on Oct. 10, 2021). He also had 3 carries for 50 yards rushing. Moss went 7-of-10 (.700) with 1 TD and no INTs.

RUNNING BACKS

• USC lost running back Travis Dye, the heartbeat of the 2022 squad. However, they have members of the backfield returning.

 Redshirt senior Austin Jones returns as USC's most experienced back. Jones stepped in as the feature-back for Dye when he suffered a season-ending injury against Colorado. He contributed in all 14 games with 4 starts in 2022. He racked up 705 rushing yards on 135 attempts (5.2 avg) and with 5 TDs. He also had 25 receptions for 267 receiving yards (10.7 avg) with a TD.

• Redshirt senior **Darwin Barlow** also returns with experience. He saw action in 9 games (all but Arizona State, Washington State, Arizona, Cal and Tulane) as a redshirt junior in 2022. He rushed for a total of 96 yards on 16 carries (avg 6.0) and 3 TDs. He also had 3 receptions for 34 yards (11.3 avg).

Redshirt junior Matt Colombo, who has yet to see action, also returns to the Trojan squad.

 From the transfer portal, Riley picked up MarShawn Lloyd from South Carolina. The redshirt junior was South Carolina's rushing leader as a redshirt sophomore running back in 2022. In his 3-year career at South Carolina (2020-22) while appearing in 21 games (with 8 starts), he ran for 801 yards on 175 carries (4.6 avg) with 10 TDs and caught 21 passes for 220 yards (10.5 avg) with 2 TDs.

Two freshmen, Quinten Joyner and A'Marion Peterson, enrolled at USC this spring. Joyner was selected to compete at the 2023 All-American Bowl and the Polynesian Bowl. Joyner was named to the 2022 All District 25-6A First Team after he rushed for 1,794 yards on 196 carries (9.2 avg.) for 25 TDs and caught 5 passes for 73 yards while playing running back for Manor (Texas) HS. Joyner had 2 kickoff returns for 44 yards (22.0 avg) with a long of 24. Peterson was named the 2022 All-District 3-4A Division II MVP as a senior running back at Hirschi HS in Wichita Falls, Texas. He rushed for 330 yards on 24 carries (13.8 avg.) with 6 TDs and caught 3 passes for 54 yards, helping Hirschi go 9-3 overall and place first in its district.

--Jones led the Trojans with 54 rushing yards on 6 carries and 2 TDs against <u>San José State</u>, while Lloyd rushed for 42 yards on 9 carries and caught 1 pass for 12 yards. Joyner rushed for 34 yards on 5 carries, Barlow ran for 10 yards on 2 carries and Colombo had 7 rushing yards on 1 carry.

--Lloyd led the Trojans with 76 rushing yards on 7 carries and 1 TD against <u>Nevada</u>. He also caught 2 passes for 59 yards. Joyner rushed for 65 yards on 4 carries with 1 TD and caught 1 pass for 7 yards. His 47-yard rushing TD was the freshman's first career TD for USC and it was the longest TD run by a Trojan this season. Barlow rushed for 20 yards on 2 carries and caught 1 pass for 10 yards, and Jones rushed for 19 yards on 2 carries.

WIDE RECEIVERS

• Once again, Riley's wide receiver room is not lacking in depth. Although they lost 2022 All-Pac-12 First Teamer Jordan Addison (the 2021 Biletnikoff winner), returning are experienced wide outs in redshirt senior Tahj Washington, senior Brenden Rice and junior Mario Williams.

• In 2022, while appearing in all 14 games with 11 starts, Washington had 50 receptions for 785 yards (15.7 avg) and scored 6 TDs. He also was a vital member of the Trojan special teams. He was named an All- Pac-12 Honorable Mention.

• Rice competed in all 14 games with 12 starts in his first season with the Trojans in 2022. He recorded 39 catches (fourth for USC) for 611 yards (15.7 avg) with 4 TDs. Rice also recorded 3 kick returns for 49 yards (16.3 avg).

• Williams saw action in 12 games with 9 starts during his first season with the Trojans in 2022. He caught 40 passes (3rd for USC) for 631 yards (15.8 avg) with 5 TDs (third for USC). Williams also fielded 2 kick- offs for 7 yards.

• Junior Michael Jackson III (17 receptions for 236 yards, 13.9 avg, with 4 TDs in 2022) and redshirt sophomore **Kyron Hudson** (15 receptions for 152 yards, 10.1 avg, with 3 TDs in 2022) return for the Troians.

 In his freshman debut, Raleek Brown, who now joins the wide receiver room, contributed in all 14 games in 2022 as a running back. He rushed for 227 yards on 42 carries (5.4 avg) with 3 TDs, caught 16 passes for 175 yards (10.9 avg) with 3 TDs and had 24 kickoff returns for a total of 517 yards (21.5 avg) with a long of 40 yards to finish the season ranked No. 22 in the nation for combined kick returns.

• Three receivers who have yet to play at USC-senior Corey Nerhus, redshirt junior Ty Shamblin and redshirt sophomore **Josiah Zamora**—will also be available for the Trojans.

 USC picked up Arizona transfer Dorian Singer, a junior, at the semester. He appeared in all 12 games with 11 starts in his sophomore season with the Wildcats. He had a breakout year in yards and receptions, marking his first 1,000-yard-plus season and earning AP All-Pac-12 First Team and All-Pac-12 Second Team honors. He finished the season with a career-high 1,105 yards on a career-high 66 receptions, and 6 TDs and recorded four 100-plus yard games. He was named to the 2022 Biletnikoff Award Midseason Watch List.

· Also joining the wide receiver corps are freshmen Zachariah Branch and Makai Lemon, who enrolled in the spring.

 Branch, the younger brother of USC safety Zion Branch, tallied 753 yards on 45 receptions with 11 TDs and recorded 5 punt returns for 90 yards (18.0 avg.) as a senior wide receiver at Bishop Gorman HS in Las Vegas (Nev.). He competed in the 2023 Under Armour All-American Game where he was a team captain. He was also chosen to play in the 2023 Polynesian Bowl. He was named to the 2022 Nevada Preps All-Southern Nevada First Team after helping the Gaels win the Class 5A state title.

· Lemon was named a 2023 Under Armour All-American and was selected to compete in the Polynesian Bowl. Lemon was also a Polynesian High School Player of the Year finalist. He made the 2022 All-CIF Division I Team, MaxPreps All-America First Team, MaxPreps California All-State First Team and Los Angeles Times All-Star Team as a senior wide receiver at Los Alamitos (Calif.) HS, catching passes from fellow Trojan freshman Malachi Nelson. He caught 69 passes for 1,044 yards (15.1 avg.) and 12 touchdowns to help Los Alamitos place first in the Sunset League and reach the CIF Southern Section Division 1 semifinals. On special teams, he recorded 8 kickoff returns for 267 yards (33.4 avq.).

 Freshmen Ja'Kobi Lane, Jaden Moore, and Duce Robinson joined the squad in the summer for camp.

• Lane made 2023 PrepStar All-Western Region after he caught 65 passes for 823 yards (12.7 avg) and 11 TDs and rushed for 38 yards on 15 carries (2.5 avg) to help Red Mountain HS in Mesa (Ariz.) reach the 6A semifinals. He also went 2-for-3 in passing for 96 yards for 2 TDs. Lane was selected to the 2022 12Sports All-Fever Team and All-6A East Valley All-Region First Team and won the National Football Foundation Arizona Chapter J.D. Hill Wide Receiver of the Year Award and the All-6A East Valley All-Region Co-Offensive Player of the Year Award. He also was named the 2022 Elite 11 All-Tourney wide receiver MVP.

• Moore prepped at the Bishops School in La Jolla (Calif.) where he helped the Knights to the 2022 Coastal League Championship as a senior and was named to the All-League Defense First Team.

• Robinson was a 2022 MaxPreps First Team All-American after he had 84 receptions for 1,614 yards (19.2 avg) and 14 TDs as a senior. Robinson was selected to the 2023 Under Armour All-American Game and the Polynesian Bowl. The 6-6, 225 pound tight end was named the 2022 6A Northeast Valley Region Offensive Player of Year. On special teams, he fielded punts and tallied 16 for 155 yards (9.7 avg.). He also made the 2022 Elite 11 7on7 All-Tournament Team. According to 247Sports Composite, Robinson was the No. 1 ranked tight end in the nation, the No. 1 player in the state of Arizona and the No. 17 recruit in the nation.

 Robinson is a two-sport standout and is a highly-touted baseball recruit as well. As an outfielder, he competed in the 2022 Baseball Factory All-America Game and the Area Code Games. Robinson is the third athlete ever to be named "Under Armour All-American" in both baseball and football (joining Kyler Murray and AJ Brown).

-Branch and Singer led the Trojans with 4 catches against <u>San José State</u>. Branch recorded 58 receiving yards and 1 TD, while Singer also caught 4 passes for 41 yards and 1 TD. Robinson tallied 3 catches for 44 yards and Washington had 2 receptions for 85 yards and 1 TD. Mar. Williams collected 2 receptions for 26 yards and Brown had 1 catch for 14 yards. Rice tallied 1 catch for 12 yards and a TD, while Hudson recorded 1 catch for 8 yards. Lane had 1 reception for 5 yards, and Lemon recorded 1 reception for O yards.

-Mar. Williams led the team with 4 receptions for 66 yards against <u>Nevada</u>, while Washington led the WR unit with 2 TDs and caught 3 passes for 75 yards. Rice tallied 3 catches for 37 yards and a TD, and Lemon had 3 receptions for 13 yards. Singer notched 2 catches for 37 yards and Robinson had 1 catch for 71 yards and a TD, the first of his collegiate career. Branch collected 1 catch for 22 yards and 1 TD and Jackson III notched 1 catch for 15 yards and 1 TD. Hudson and Lane each recorded 1 catch for 20 yards and 11 yards, respectively.

TIGHT ENDS

 Although the tight end room is one of USC's smaller position groups, it is not lacking in experience. Redshirt sophomore Lake McRee and redshirt senior Jude Wolfe have both seen action for the Trojans.

• McRee saw action in 13 games with 2 starts as a redshirt freshman in 2022. He caught 10 passes for 106 yards (10.6 avg) and scored 2 TDs. Wolfe appeared in 3 games on special teams after returning from a summer injury as a redshirt junior in 2022.

 Untested Luke Otte and Carson Tabaracci move over from the defensive side of the ball to compete at tight end as a sophomore and redshirt freshman, respectively, in 2023. • Freshman Kade Eldridge (2023 PrepStar All-Western Region, 2022 1A NWC All-Conference

Defensive MVP and All-State representative from Lynden Christian HS in Lynden, Wash.) and transfer CJ Woods from Cal Poly joined the team this summer. Fellow 2023 signee Walker Lyons will enroll in the fall of 2024 as he will be leaving to serve a Mormon mission in Norway in 2023. --McRee had 3 receptions for 36 yards against <u>San José State</u>.

--McRee had 1 reception for 10 yards against <u>Nevada</u>.

OFFENSIVE LINEMEN

• The USC offensive line unit was a Joe Moore Award Semifinalist in 2022 and returns 5 Trojans who started at various points of the season. All-American First Teamers Brett Neilon and Andrew Vorhees, as well as impact player **Bobby Haskins**, will be missing from the Trojans trenches on the offense this fall.

 Justin Dedich, USC's most experienced lineman who has seen action at a multitude of positions, returns for his final season as a redshirt senior at center. In 2022, he started 10 games at right guard, 2 games at left guard and 1 game at center, filling in for the starter, **Brett Neilon**, after he suffered a season ending injury. He was named to the Pro Football Focus All-American Third Team and was All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention.

 Redshirt junior Jonah Monheim started all 14 games on the offensive line in 2022. He started 11 times at right tackle and 3 times at right quard. He was named All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention. Redshirt sophomore Mason Murphy saw action in all 14 games, starting in 5 in 2022 at tackle. Redshirt senior Gino Quinones saw action in all 14 games, with 2 starts in 2022. He started once at right guard and once at left quard.

 Other offensive linemen returning are redshirt senior Cooper Lovelace, senior Grant Tucker, redshirt juniors Andres Dewerk and Andrew Milek and sophomore Kilian O'Connor.

• Two experienced transfers will join the offensive line unit. Redshirt seniors Jarrett Kingston (from Washington State) and **Michael Tarquin** (from Florida) enrolled at USC this spring. • In his 5-year career at Washington State (2018-22), Kingston appeared in 37 games on the

offensive line with 26 starts (16 starts at left guard and 10 starts at left tackle). Last season, he was named to 2022 All- Pac-12 Conference Honorable Mention.

• In his 4-year career at Florida (2019-22), Tarquin appeared in 34 games on the offensive line with 20 starts (10 starts each at left guard and left tackle).

 Freshman Elijah Paige joined the squad in the spring. He made the 2022 Arizona 6A Northeast Valley All-Region list as a senior offensive lineman at Pinnacle HS in Phoenix (Ariz.). He was one of four player-elected captains for the 2022 Pinnacle squad. • During the summer, the Trojans landed redshirt junior, **Emmanuel Pregnon**, a Wyoming transfer.

After not appearing in any games in 2020 and redshirting in 2021, he moved into the starting lineup at right quard for the Cowboys as a redshirt sophomore in 2022. He graded out as the No. 3 guard in the Mountain West according to PFF and earned Freshman All-America recognition. He started all 11 games he played in and only allowed two sacks.

 Freshmen Micah Banuelos (2023 Under Armour All-American and 2022 Washington 4A NPSL Offensive Lineman of the Year from Kennedy Catholic HS in Burien, Wash.), **Alani Noa** (2023 PrepStar All-Western Region and 2022 MaxPreps All Sac-Joaquin Section First Team from Grant Union HS in Sacramento, Calif.), Tobias Raymond (2023 PrepStar All-Western Region and 2022 All-Channel League Offensive Lineman of the Year from Ventura HS in Ventura, Calif.), Jack Susnjar (2022 Cal Hi Sports All-State Team from Loyola HS in Los Angeles, Calif.), and **Amos Talalele** (2023 Polynesian Bowl All- Star and 2021-22 Santa Clara Valley Athletic League First Team from Santa Clara HS in Santa

Clara, Calif.) joined the team in the summer for camp. --Monheim (LT), Noa (LG), Dedich (C), Quinones (RG) and Tarquin (RT) started against <u>San José</u> <u>State</u>. Noa became the first USC true freshman to start at left guard in a season opener since Toa Lobendahn started the opener at left guard in 2014 vs. Fresno State on Aug. 30. The last true freshman to start any game at left guard for USC was Courtland Ford in 2020 vs. Washington State on Dec. 6. --Monheim (LT), Pregnon (LG), Dedich (C), Kingston (RG) and Tarquin (RT) started against <u>Nevada</u>.

DEFENSIVE OVERVIEW

 Although the Trojans' defense lost its leader in Unanimous All-American Tuli Tuipulotu, there are many familiar faces returning. First Team All-American defensive back Calen Bullock returns among seven other starters including inside linebackers Shane Lee and Eric Gentry, defensive linemen Stanley Ta'ufo'ou and Tyrone Taleni and defensive backs Jaylin Smith, Max Williams and Ceyair Wright. Others returning with starting experience in defensive coordinator Alex Grinch's system are defensive backs Bryson Shaw and Jacobe Covington and rush ends Solomon Byrd and Romello Height.

 In 2022, USC led the nation in turnover margin (1.6). This was quite an improvement from 2021 when the Trojans were ranked No. 74 in the nation in the same category (-0.1). The turnover battle was a major focus for the Trojans as they ranked No. 3 in the nation with 19 passes intercepted by 11 different players. USC ranked No. 5 in the nation in turnovers gained with 29.

DEFENSIVE LINEMEN

• The Trojan defensive line will be feeling the loss of Tuipulotu, but will have veteran leadership as well as a mix of new faces.

• USC's most experienced returning members of the defensive line are redshirt senior **Tyrone Taleni** (30 tackles, including 7.5 for loss with 7 sacks, 3 QB hurries and 1 forced fumble while appearing in 22 career games with 9 starts) and **Stanley Ta'ufo'ou** (46 tackles, including 7.0 for a loss (with 1 sack), 2 fumble recoveries and 2 QB hurries in his career while appearing in 31 games with 25 starts). Junior Korey Foreman (24 tackles, including 4.5 for loss with 2.5 sacks and 1 INT while appearing

in 23 career games) returns looking to make an impact as an upperclassman.
Redshirt senior Solomon Tuliaupupu, who has been plagued by foot and knee injuries throughout his career, saw his first action in 2022 and recorded 10 tackles, including 3 for loss (with 2.5 sacks) and 1 QB hurry while appearing in all 14 games.

 Other returning members who hope to compete for time in the trenches are redshirt seniors Sinjun Astani and De'jon Benton (20 tackles, including 1.5 for losses).

 Two more defensive linemen return have yet to decorate their stat sheet: redshirt junior Kobe Pepe (3 game appearances), and redshirt freshman Devan Thompkins (1 game appearance)

Bolstering the defensive line unit are three transfer linemen: redshirt seniors **Kyon Barrs** and Jack Sullivan and sophomore Anthony Lucas. Transferring from Arizona, Barrs recorded 102 tackles, including 12.5 for losses (with 5 sacks) while appearing in 38 games with 23 starts during his 4-year career as a Wildcat. In 2021, he made the All-Pac-12 Second Team. Sullivan arrives at Troy from Purdue, where he tallied 85 tackles, including 13.5 for losses (with 9.0 sacks), 7 pass deflections and 1 forced fumble while appearing in 46 games with 19 starts during his 5-year career. Lucas saw action in 7 games during his freshman season at Texas A&M collecting 7 tackles with 1 for loss.

Over the summer, the Trojans made noise throughout the college football world when they signed the No. 1 player in the transfer portal, **Bear Alexander**. The sophomore defensive lineman from Georgia saw action in 12 of 15 games and recorded 9 total stops, including 2 sacks, and 13 QB hurries. He had 2 tackles for loss and a sack in Georgia's 65-7 win over TCU in the National Championship Game

• Freshmen Elijah Hughes (2022 6D Regional Defensive Player of the Year and Liberty District Defensive Player of the Year from Washington-Liberty HS in Arlington, Va.) and **Deijon Laffitte** (2023 PrepStar All-Western Region from Colony HS in Ontario, Calif.) also enrolled at USC in the summer.

--Lucas collected 3 tackles, including 2.0 for loss of 5 yards against San José State. Barrs tallied 2 tackles, while Ta'ufo'ou and Hughes each had 1. Alexander also collected 1 tackle, with a 0.5 sack for minus 11 yards.

--Ta'ufo'ou returned a fumble for a 23-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter against <u>Nevada</u>. Alexander had 4 tackles, with 0.5 for loss of 1 yard, and Benton-collected 3 tackles, with 1 for loss of 7 yards (including 1 sack for 7 yards) against Nevada. Pepe recorded 2 tackles, Hughes had 1 tackle, with 1 for loss of 2 yards and Lucas and Foreman each had 1 tackle.

RUSH ENDS

· After losing the steady presence of Nick Figueroa, a utility man who could play both as a lineman and a rush end, USC will look to fill this position.

 Redshirt senior Solomon Byrd (115 career tackles, including 20 for losses with 14 sacks, 3 forced fumbles, 2 fumble recoveries and 2 pass breakups and 1 QB hurry while appearing in 37 games with 11 starts), who moved to rush end midseason in 2022, returns for his final sea- son.

 Redshirt junior Romello Height (18 career tackles, including 3 for losses, while appearing in 12 games with 2 starts) returns from an injury that cut his 2022 season short.

• Untested sophomore Garrett Pomerantz will also be available.

 A transfer rush end joined the squad this spring in redshirt senior Jamil Muhammad from Georgia Southern. In his 3-year career at Georgia Southern (2020-22), Muhammad had 70 tackles, including 11.0 for losses (with 7.5 sacks), 1 interception, 4 pass deflections, 3 forced fumbles and 1 forced fumble while appearing in 34 games with 10 starts.

 Also joining the Trojans this spring was early enrollee freshman Sam Greene. He helped St. Frances Academy in Baltimore (Md.) earn the No. 1 ranking in the final 2022 state MaxPrep's Top 25 as a senior.

 Freshmen DJ Peevy (2023 PrepStar All-Western Region from Lincoln HS in San Diego, Calif.) and Braylan Shelby (Texas First Team 10-5A-1 All-District from Friendswood HS in Friendswood, Texas) joined the team in the summer.

--Muhammad had 3 tackles, 1 forced fumble, 1 PBU and 1 QBH against <u>San José State</u>. Byrd recorded 1 tackle, with a 0.5 sack for minus 11 yards. Shelby also made 1 tackle.

--Byrd had 4 tackles, with 1 for loss of 8 yards (including 1 sack for B yards] and 1 forced fumble against <u>Nevada</u>. Shelby decorated his stat sheet with 3 tackles, with 2 for loss of 10 yards (including 1 sack for 9 yards) and 1 forced fumble. Muhammad had 32 tackles, with 1 for loss of 4 yards (inclduing 1 sack for 4 yards), and Height collected 2 tackles. Greene tallied 1 tackle.

INSIDE LINEBACKERS

 The inside linebackers return some of the Trojans' most productive defenders, while adding some fresh talent to the room.

· USC captain Shane Lee, a redshirt senior, returns to lead the defense. In his 4-year career (3 years at Alabama and 1 year at USC), he has made 174 tackles, including 15.5 for losses (with 9.5 sacks), plus 3 interceptions (1 of which he ran back for a TD), 3 forced fumbles, 2 pass deflections, a fumble recovery and a QB hurry while appearing in 42 games (with 25 starts). He was selected as All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention in 2022

· Junior Eric Gentry, another 2022 standout, is back ready to contribute for USC. He has recorded 116 career tackles, including 9 for loss (with 3 sacks), 5 pass breakups, 3 QB hurries, 2 forced fumbles and 1 INT while appearing in 23 games with 12 starts.

• Two more returning linebackers with experience are junior Raesjon Davis (8 career tackles) and senior Chris Thompson Jr. (20 career tackles, including 1 for a loss of 1 yard).

· Also battling for action will be junior Theo Bravos, sophomore Roman Marchetti and redshirt freshman Garrison Madden.

Senior Mason Cobb from Oklahoma State transferred to Troy in the spring. Cobb recorded 106 tackles, including 16.0 for losses (with 3 sacks), 1 interception, 1 pass deflection and 1 forced fumble while appearing in 31 games with 13 starts in his 3-year career at Oklahoma State (2020-22). In 2022, he was named to the All-Big-12 Second Team.

The highly recruited Tackett Curtis enrolled at USC this spring. He was the 2022 MaxPreps Louisiana High School Player of the Year and won the State Championship game MVP as a senior linebacker. He led Many (La.) HS to the Louisiana 2A state championship. Curtis recorded 112 total tackles, 16 for loss, 6 sacks and 3 interceptions in his final season at Many. He was a finalist for the high school Butkus Award which recognizes the top linebacker in the nation. He was named the 2022 2a-3 Defensive MVP and earned placement on the 2022 2a-3 All-District Team. He also made the 2022 MaxPreps All-America First Team.

 The Trojans also added transfer Deuce Palmer, a redshirt senior, from SMU.

--Cobb recorded 6 tackles, including 2.0 for loss of 7 yards, against <u>San José State</u>. Curtis recorded 2 tackles. His start at middle linebacker marks the first time a USC true freshman has started at middle linebacker in the season opener since Cameron Smith started in the 2015 season opener against Arkansas State on Sept. 9, 2015. Gentry also tallied 2 tackles.

--Lee led the defense with 10 tackles against <u>Nevada</u>, with 1 for loss of 13 yards (including a sack for 13 yards) and Davis had 4 tackles and a QBH. Thompson Jr. recorded 2 tackles and Curtis had 2 tackles before being ejected for targeting in the first half. Palmer recorded 1 tackle.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

· Junior Calen Bullock, a First Team All-American, will lead the Trojan secondary in 2023. He started all 14 gamess and led the team in interceptions with 5 (ranked 11th in the nation). He also tallied 48 tackles (sixth on the team) and 5 pass breakups (tied for second on the team). He was named to the All-Pac-12 Second Team. In his 3-year career, he has 87 tackles, 7 interceptions (running 1 back for a TD) and 8 pass breakups while appearing in 26 games with 14 starts.

 Redshirt senior Bryson Shaw was a standout for the Trojans in 2022, recording 50 tackles (fifth on the team), including 1 for loss, plus 4 pass breakups, 1 interception and 1 fumble recovery while appearing in all 14 games and starting 5 times. In his 4-year collegiate career (3 years at Ohio State, 1 year at USC), he has 112 tackles (including 1.5 for loss), 8 pass breakups, 2 interceptions, 2 fumble recoveries while appearing in 35 games (with 17 starts).

 Redshirt senior Max Williams, who returned to the field in 2022 after recovering from an injury, tied for the team lead in tackles with 79 and in forced fumbles with 2 in 2022. He was named All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention. In his career, he has 107 tackles, including 5.5 for losses of 9 yards (with 1.5 sacks for minus 6 yards), plus 7 pass breakups, 3 forced fumbles and 2 interceptions. He has appeared in 24 games, starting 18 times.

 Junior Jaylin Smith and redshirt sophomore Ceyair Wright both had strong performances in 2022 and will return to contribute in 2023. Smith has 48 tackles in his career, including 3 for loss (with 1 sack), 2 pass breakups, an interception, and a forced fumble while appearing in 21 games with 10 starts. Wright has tallied 30 tackles, 1 interception and 2 pass breakups while appearing in 16 career games (with 11 starts)

 Also with starting experience is redshirt junior Jacobe Covington (19 tackles and 4 pass breakups in 2022) who will look to contribute this . season.

 Also competing for playing time will be redshirt sophomores Anthony Beavers Jr. (12 tackles, including 1.5 for losses in 2022), Prophet Brown (12 career tackles) and Xamarion Gordon (10 career tackles and 1 interception) and sophomores Domani Jackson (2 tackles and 1 pass breakup) and Fabian Ross (2 game appearances).
 Redshirt freshman Zion Branch is coming back from injury this

season and eager to compete.

 Others in the mix are an untested duo: redshirt junior L Simpson and redshirt sophomore Daniel Jimenez-Fulton.

· Redshirt senior transfer Christian Roland-Wallace joined the Trojans in the secondary this spring. In his 4-year career at Arizona (2019-22), he had 169 tackles, including 3.5 for loss (with 1.5 sacks), 2 interceptions, 18 pass deflections and 2 forced fumbles in 41 games with 37 starts.

· Freshmen Maliki Crawford and Christian Pierce both enrolled early to join the Trojans for spring ball. Crawford was named to the 2022 All- CIF Division 4 Team, VC Star All-Channel League First Team and the VC Star 1st Team All-County as a cornerback at Pacifica HS in Oxnard, [Calif,]. Crawford has experience playing in all three facets of the game. He also competed at the 2023 Polynesian Bowl. Pierce was named to 2022 All-Baseline League and selected as the League Defensive MVP as a safety at Rancho Cucamonga (Calif.) HS.

• ÚSC also added redshirt freshman transfer Tre'Quon Fegans from Alabama.

--Smith led the team with 8 tackles against San José State. Jackson recorded 6 tackles and 1 PBU, Wright had 4 tackles, including 1 for loss of 1 yard, and Bullock tallied 4 tackles. Williams had 2 tackles, including 1 for loss of 6 yards, while Shaw and Covington each had 2 tackles. Branch, Beavers Jr. and Roland-Wallace each had 1 tackle and Roland-Wallace also had a PBU.

--Smith had 6 tackles with 2.5 for loss of 12 yards against <u>Nevada</u>, while Bullock had 5 tackles and 2 PBUs. Jackson recorded 5 tackles and 1 PBU, and Shaw had 3 tackles. Branch collected 3 tackles while Roland-Wallce had 2. Wright, Covington and Pierce each tallied 1 tackle.

SPECIAL TEAMS OVERVIEW

• The Trojan special teams unit is returning most of its members and adding a transfer kicker/punter to bolster the competition.

• USC only punted the ball 32 times last season. Sophomore running back Raleek Brown was a bright spot for the Trojan special teams unit as he was in the Top 25 in the nation in combined kick returns.

PUNTERS

Aadyn Sleep-Dalton, who enrolled in USC in 2022 after arriving in the U.S. from Australia, was USC's punter as a junior in 2022. He averaged 40.3 yards on his 30 punts in 2022, of which 8 pinned opponents within the 20. He also had a tackle and appeared in 12 games.

• In 2022, USC fans also learned that Heisman-winning quarterback Caleb Williams can punt. He recorded 2 punts against Notre Dame where he averaged 42.0 yards with a long of 58 yards.

 Also available are three untested punters: redshirt senior Will Rose, redshirt junior Michael McAllister and junior Garth White. None has seen game action as a punter.

 In the spring, junior transfer Eddie Czaplicki joined the Trojan squad from Arizona State. In his 2-year career as a Sun Devil (2021-22), he handled punting and kickoffs duties. He has recorded 95 punts for 4,253 yards (44.8 avg.), with a long of 75 yards and 29 going 50 yards or more. He has touchbacks on 29 of his 56 kickoffs (51.8%).

-In his USC debut, Czaplicki averaged 41.5 yards on 2 punts against <u>San José State</u>.

--Czaplicki averaged 42.5 yards on 2 punts against <u>Nevada</u>. He had a long of 47 yards and 1 inside the 20.

PLACEKICKERS

• Redshirt sophomore **Denis Lynch**, who handled kicking duties for the Trojans in 2022, returns this season. Lynch accumulated 119 total points (ranked 10th in the nation for total points scored) going 74-of-74 on extra points and 15-of-22 (68.1%) on field goals in 2022. His season long came against UCLA when he nailed a 49-yard field goal at the end of the first half. Lynch was perfect on field goals from 40-49 yards, going 8-8. He also had 2 kickoffs last season, totaling 101 yards.

• Competing with him for the starting job will be Czaplicki, White and freshman addition Tyler Robles from La Costa Canyon HS in Carlsbad, (Calif.)

, --Lynch made 8-of-8 PATs against <u>San José State.</u> --Lynch made 9-of-9 PATs against <u>Nevada</u>. he also made a 37-yard field goal. Robles made 1-of-1 PAT.

SNAPPERS

• Redshirt senior Jac Casasante returns as USC's starting long snapper after filling that role in 2022. Senior Daniel Meunier and redshirt junior Nathan Weneta are also available.

HOLDERS

• Redshirt senior Will Rose returns to his role as the Trojan holder in 2023.

PUNT RETURNERS

Junior Michael Jackson III is the only returning Trojan who handled punt return duties. He tallied 70 yards on 11 returns (6.4 avg) with a long of . 17 yards.

• Junior Dorian Singer has punt return experience from his time at Arizona and freshman **Zachariah Branch** returned punts in high school.

--Branch had 3 punt returns for 66 yards against <u>San José State.</u>

--Branch had 1 punt return for 12 yards against Nevada.

KICKOFF RETURNERS

 Four returning Trojans shared kickoff return duties in 2022. Sophomore Raleek Brown had 24 returns for 517 yards (21.5 avg) with a long of 40 yards to finish the season ranked No. 22 in the nation for combined kick returns.

Senior Brenden Rice also handled kick returns. He recorded 3 returns for 49 yards (16.3 avg) with a long of 18 yards. Redshirt senior Tahi Washington had 3 kickoff returns for 75 yards (25.0 avg). Junior Mario Williams fielded 2 kickoff returns for a total of 7 yards.

 Three early enrollee freshmen have experience from high school fielding kickoff returns: Zachariah Branch, Quinten Joyner and Makai Lemon.

--Branch recorded 1 kickoff return for 96 yards for a touchdown against <u>San José State</u>. The last USC true freshman to return a kickoff for a touchdown was Adoree' Jackson vs. Nebraska (98 yards) in the 2014 Holiday Bowl (Jackson also had a scoring kickoff return earlier in the season vs. Utah for 100 yards). The last Trojan to have a scoring kickoff return and a receiving TD in a game was Adoree' Jackson against Notre Dame in 2016 (He also had a scoring punt return in that same game). The last Trojan to return a kickoff for a touchdown was Velus Jones Jr. (100 yards) vs. Fresno State on Aug. 31, 2019.

-Branch recorded 2 kickoff returns for 29 yards against <u>Nevada</u>, and Lemon had 1 kickoff return for 13 yards.

• The University of Southern California will take the historic step of joining the Big Ten Conference in 2024, a move that will position USC and its student-athletes for long-term success in both athletics and academics.

•"Over the past three years, we have worked hard to ground our university decisions in what is best for our students," said USC President Carol L. Folt. "With the Big Ten, we are joining a storied conference that shares our commitment to academic excellence and athletic competitiveness, and we are positioning USC and our student-athletes for long-term success and stability amidst the rapidly evolving sports media and collegiate athletics landscapes. We are delighted to begin this new chapter in 2024."

•The Big Ten Conference voted to accept both USC and crosstown rival UCLA as full members of the conference effective August 2, 2024, enabling both schools to remain in the Pac-12 Conference for the duration of the Pac-12's existing media rights agreements.

USC WELCOMES JENNIFER COHEN

• Jennifer Cohen became the 10th Director of Athletics and the Charles Griffin Cale Director of Athletics' Chair in August 2023.

 Cohen arrived at USC with three decades of intercollegiate athletics experience, most recently leading the University of Washington's athletics department for seven years. She is recognized as a fiercely competitive national leader who takes a student-centered approach to building culture and winning the right way.

• In 1998, Cohen joined Washington as an assistant director of development before moving to the university's central development office to focus on fundraising efforts on behalf of the office of undergraduate education. She also spent time with UW's regional gifts program before returning to athletics to oversee the department's major gifts program prior to becoming the director of athletics in 2016. Before arriving at Washington, Cohen held a variety of roles in intercollegiate athletics administration at Pacific Lutheran University, the University of Puget Sound, and Texas Tech University.

· Cohen currently serves as a member of the College Football Playoff Committee and as a member of the National Coalition of Minority Football Coaches. In 2019, she was a finalist for the Sports Business Journal's Athletic Director of the Year.

· A native of Arcadia, California, Cohen received her bachelor's degree from San Diego State University and her master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration from Pacific Lutheran University.

The Trojan Marketplace a student-athlete NIL business registry that is custom-designed for businesses, donors, alumni and any other interested parties wishing to connect with student-athletes for NIL opportunities. Registered businesses can search, filter and initiate conversations with student-athletes to discuss an NIL deal. Once the NIL deal between a registered business and student-athlete is completed, the business will use Trojan Marketplace to create a transaction that will produce a direct payment to the student-athlete and automate a disclosure to the INFLCR Verified Compliance Ledger. Finally, in order to educate collectives, USC has developed a training module to provide education to NIL entities about NCAA rules, University Policy and the impact of Title IX. Collectives are separate entities and not affiliated with USC but have completed the education process and are able to utilize the "USC Educated NIL Entity" badge. More information can be found online at USCTrojans.com.

...As its student-athletes prepare to capitalize on their name, image and likeness, USC Athletics announced a new partnership in June with leading NIL advisory and education firm Altius Sports Partners to provide strategic guidance, consultation, and wide-ranging educational support in creating the school's NIL program, which will benefit all 21 Trojan men's and women's sports programs and 550-plus student-athletes. Initially, a central component of the partnership included developing a comprehensive education plan to support the program's staff, coaches and student-athletes. USC and ASP's cross-disciplinary team of NIL experts collaborated on educational programming related to several key elements of the upcoming NIL implementation, such as rules and regulatory awareness, revenue opportunity maximization, recruiting best practices, and gender equity and social justice implications, among other considerations related to empowering student-athletes. As the NCAA, congressional, and state legislative processes evolve, the partnership with ASP and its specific NIL focus will allow USC to be agile in response to a new and rapidly changing environment. Long-term, ASP will play a central role in strengthening USC's NIL plan.

•••In January, former Trojan TB Reggie Bush, one of the most dynamic players in the history of college football, was named to the 22-member 2023 College Football Hall of Fame class. He is the 46th inductee with USC ties in the College Football Hall of Fame, including 35 players. A Trojan has been elected into the Hall in 15 of the past 24 years. He will be inducted at a Dec. 5 dinner in Las Vegas and then enshrined at the Hall in Atlanta.

•••USC players will honor late College Football Hall of Famer Charles White, USC's 1979 Heisman Trophy-winning tailback and a member of the Trojans' 1978 national championship team who then played 9 seasons in the NFL. White passed away on Jan. 11, 2023. The team will wear No. 12 stickers, White's number, on their helmets this season.

· White was USC's third Heisman Trophy winner and still is the school's career rushing leader (6,245 yards, then the No. 2 mark in NCAA history) while scoring 49 touchdowns. A 4-year USC letterman (1976-77-78-79) and 2-time unanimous All-American (1978-79), he set 22 NCAA, Pac-10, USC and Rose Bowl records. He captained the 1979 Trojans while leading the nation in rushing. As a senior in 1979, he also won the Walter Camp, Maxwell and Pop Warner Awards. He was a 3-time All-Conference first teamer (1977-78-79), was USC's team MVP in 1978 and 1979 and won the 1978 Voit Trophy while finishing fourth in the Heisman voting as a junior. He was USC's rushing leader in 1977 (1,478 yards), 1978 (1,859 yards) and 1979 (2,050 yards), as well as the school's total offense leader in 1978 (1,854 yards), scoring leader in 1978 (86 points) and 1979 (114 points) and kickoff return leader in 1976 (295 yards). He had 31 career 100-yard rushing games, including 10 in 1979. The 1978 and 1979 Rose Bowl Player of the Game, he is a member of the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame. USC went 42-6-1 during his 4-year career, won the 1978 national title and was victorious in 4 bowls (including 3 Rose Bowls). He was inducted into the USC Athletic Hall of Fame in 1995 and the College Football Hall of Fame in 1996. He made the Pac-12 All-Century Team in 2015. He also was a hurdler on USC's 1979 track team. A first round pick in the 1980 NFL Draft, White played with the Browns (1980-84) and Rams (1985-88). He led the league in rushing in 1987. He returned to USC in 1990 as a special assistant to the athletic director. In 1993, he became an assistant football coach in charge of the Trojan running backs (a position he held through 1997). He then held an administrative job at USC.

•••The Trojan Athletic Fund, founded in 1923, provides the funding necessary to sustain USC's athletic excellence. The TAF motto is "Investing In Today's Champions and Tomorrow's Leaders." The app also incorporates information about USC teams, including rosters, biographical, statistical and historical information and exclusive videos, as well as a virtual tour of USC's athletic facilities, including the McKay Center and the Coliseum. USC merchandise and tickets also are available for purchase within the app, which has new video and elements added throughout the year.

• USC is second behind Notre Dame's 525 for most NFL draft picks (523). USC and Michigan are the only schools with a draftee every year since 1939.

• USC (85) is second behind Ohio State (90) for most first round NFL draft picks. USC is tied with Notre Dame and Oklahoma for most players selected as the top pick in the NFL draft (5)

• There are currently 37 ex-Trojans on NFL rosters.

• Among USC's current NFLers are QB Sam Darnold, RB Ronald Jones II, WRs Robert Woods, JuJu Smith-Schuster, Drake London and Michael Pittman Jr., LB Uchenna Nwosu, DBs Adoree' Jackson and Talanoa Hufanfa, DLs Leonard Williams and Rasheem Green and OLs Alijah Vera-Tucker and Austin Jackson.

DB Ceyair Wright (uncle, Mazio Royster, cousins Darick and Darnay Holmes), RUSH Devan Thompkins' uncle, Larry Grant played in the NFL with the San Francisco 49ers (2008, 2011-12), St. Louis Rams (2008-10), Chicago Bears (2013) and Cleveland Browns (2013). WR Brenden Rice (father is legendary Pro Football Hall of Fame wide receiver Jerry Rice, who played for the San Francisco 49ers (1985-2000), where he was on 3 Super Bowl champions (MVP in XXIII, plus XXIV, XXIX), Dakland Raiders (2001-04), Seattle Seahawks (2004) and Denver Broncos (2004) and set NFL records for career receptions (1,549), receiving yards (22,895) and receiving touchdowns (197). His stepfather, Rick Cunningham, was an offensive lineman in the NFL with the Indianapolis Colts (1990), Phoenix/ Arizona Cardinals (1992094), Minnesota Vikings (1995), Òakland Raiders (1996-98) and in the CFL with the Montreal Alouettes (2000, 2002) and Edmonton Eskimos (2001-02)).

• Assistant coach Donte Williams' cousin, Kris Richard, played in the NFL. Assistant coach Luke Huard's brother Damon played with the Miami Dolphins (1997-2000), New England Patriots (2001-2003, including on the Super Bowl XXXVI and XXXVIII champs), and Kansas City Chiefs (2004-08). His brother Brock played with the Seattle Seahawks (1999-2001, 2004) and Indianapolis Colts (2002-03). Defensive graduate assistant Peyton Pelluer's father, Scott, played with the New Orleans Saints (1981-86). His uncle, Steve, was a quarterback with the Dallas Cowboys (1984-88), Kansas City Chiefs (1989-91), Winnipeg Blue Bombers (1995) and Frankfurt Galaxy (1996-97). Assistant coach Shaun Nua played 4 seasons (2005-08) in the NFL, the first 3 with the Pittsburgh Steelers and 2008 with the Buffalo Bills. He was a member of the Steelers' Super Bowl XL-winning team in 2006.
 Senior offensive analyst Kliff Kingsbury was the head

coach of the Arizona Cardinals for 4 seasons (2019-22).

ANNIVERSARIES

• 2023 marks 100 years of USC football in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. To commemorate the centennial celebration, the Trojan football players will wear a "100" sticker on their helmets during the 2023 season.

• The 2023 USC-Nevada matchup will mark the 100th anniversary of the teams' 1923 meeting in the second-ever collegiate varsity football game played in the then-new Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum played on Oct. 13, 1923. (The first varsity game in Coliseum was played a week earlier on Oct. 6, 1923 versus Pomona, but USC didn't schedule Pomona this year because it is not FBS).

ACADEMICS

• The USC football team posted an NCAA Academic Progress Rate of 972, marks the program's fifth consecutive ranking with at least 970 APR, according to data released by the NCAA in May of 2023. A team's APR accounts for eligibility, retention and graduation to generate a measure of academic performance of each student-athlete on scholarship. The APR is a multiyear rate based on scores from the 2017-18, 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21 academic years. USC Athletics' 21-team multiyear APR of 990 is a new department high and continues the Trojans' upward overall trajectory. It follows last year's record-setting tally of 988, which was an improvement from 985 in 2020. The NCAA did not release its annual scorecard of academic achievement for all Division I teams in 2021, taking a one-year hiatus due to the pandemic. • The Trojan football team posted a NCAA Graduation Success Rate

• The Trojan football team posted a NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 79%, according to data released by the NCAA in November of 2022. GSR measures how many players in the classes of 2011-14 graduated within 6 years of enrollment. USC Athletics' overall GSR in 2021 was at 93%, an all-time high for the ninth consecutive year.

• Forty-six Trojans (42% of the roster) have cumulative grade point averages of 3.00 or higher, including 5 with GPAs above 3.50 (through summer 2023 semester). LINCOLN RILEY



3 Heisman Trophy Winners Coached 3 College Football Playoff Appearances 4 Big 12 Championships • 2018 Big 12 Coach Of The Year

Lincoln Riley is one of the nation's most successful coaches. In fact, he has had more success before the age of 40 than any other head coach in college football history. Lincoln Riley has been a head coach for 6 seasons and has developed 3 of the last 6 Heisman Trophy winners, all of whom are quarterbacks. Riley is also the only head coach to coach 3 Heisman winning quarterbacks. From coaching 3 Heisman Tophy winners, to having an 84 percent winning record, to appearing in 3 College Football Playoffs, Lincoln Riley's coaching achievements set a standard of excellence. And didn't take long for Riley to implement that standard at USC. In his first season as USC's head coach in 2022, the

And bluit take folg for kney to implement that standard at USC. In this thist season as USC shead coach (the Vac), the 39-year-head coach (tied with John Robinson in 1976. This also ties the Pac-12 record). Riley's trojans went 11-3 in 2022 to bring USC back to the top of the college football landscape. USC went undefeated in the Colliseum (7-0), doing so for the first time since 2017. Riley guided the Trojans to a Pac-12 Championship appearance and to a Cotton Bowl appearance. In Riley's lectric offense, USC scored 579 points in 2022 compared to just 344 points scored in 2021. The Trojans finished the season nationally ranked No. 1 in turnover margin (1.57), No. 1 in turnovers lost (7), No. 3 in passes intercepted [5], No. 3 in passes intercepted [5], No. 3 in first downs onffense (359), No. 3 in passes intercepted [5], No. 3 in team passing offense (335.4), No. 3 in scoring offense (41.4), No. 3 in team passing efficiency (169.20), No. 3 in total offense (506.6) and No. 5 in turnovers gained (29). Riley's 2022 Trojans broke six USC records. The 2022 team now holds the USC record for most yards passing in a single season (4,696 yards in 14 games), most passes attempted in a single season (515), most touchdown passes in a single season (43), lowest percentage of passes had intercepted (0.97%, 5 in 515 attempts), most games scoring 30+ points (12) and most games scoring 40+ points (10). They also tie the USC single-game record for most touchdowns on interception returns (3 vs. Rice). Under Riley's tutelage in 2022, quarterback Caleb Williams was named the 88th recipient of the Year, the 2022 CAP Player of the Year, the 2022 Mawell Award winner, the 2022 Sporting News College Football Player of the Year, the 2022 AC DS Sports Player of the Year, the 2022 Mawell Award winner, the 2022 CFPA National Performer of the Year and the 2022 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year, the 2022 CFPA National Performer of the Year and the 2022 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year, the 2022 AC Ding winner and was a finalist Team, and Vorhees was the offensive recipient of the Morris Trophy. Riley was a finalist for the 2022 Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award. He threw

Riley was hired by USC on Nov. 28, 2021. He arrived after serving as the head coach at Oklahoma, winning 85 percent of his games in five seasons there and led the Sooners to four Big 12 titles and four New Year's Six bowls with three College Football Playoff appearances. Riley posted a 55-10 overall record in his five years (2017-21) at Oklahoma for an impressive .846 winning percentage. His Sooners were 37-7 (.841) in league play and won Big 12 championships in his first four years there as he became the first person to win outright Football Bowl Subdivision conference crowns in each of his first four seasons as a collegiate head coach. He set Oklahoma records for most victories in his first two (24), three (36) and four (45) seasons, breaking marks held by Barry Switzer and Bob Stoops.

Áfter serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for two of the most prolific offenses in OU's history, Riley took over as the Sooners' head coach in 2017 when Stoops retired. He was the youngest FBS head coach (33) at the time of his hiring. He also coached the OU quarterbacks and called the offensive plays while serving as head coach, running a balanced offensive attack. Riley led his initial Oklahoma squad to a 12-2 overall record in 2017, becoming just the fifth FBS coach with no previous head coaching experience at

a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The Sooners won the Big 12 title by going 8-1, played in the CFP semifinal in the Rose Bowl and finished third in the final AP poll. Quarterback Baker Mayfield won the Heisman Trophy that season, along with the Maxwell, Davey O'Brien, Manning, Walter Camp Player of the Year and AP Player of the Year Awards, and was the No. 1 pick of the 2018 NFL Draft. Tight end Mark Andrews won the 2017 Mackey Award.

Oklahoma was again 12-2 overall and 8-1 while winning the Big 12 championships in 2018 and 2019. He was the Big 12 Co-Coach of the Year in 2018. Quarterback Kyler Murray won the 2018 Heisman Trophy, O'Brien Award and Manning Award, was the AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 selection in the 2020 NFL Draft, while quarterback Jalen Hurts was the Heisman runner-up in 2019. The Sooners appeared in the Orange Bowl in 2018 and Peach Bowl in 2019, both CFP semifinals. OU was fourth in the final AP poll in 2018 and seventh in 2019. He to the Appendix of the Verandow and the final AP poll in 2019 and seventh in 2019.

In the COVID-impacted 2020 season, Oklahoma went 9-2 overall, won the Big 12 at 6-2, beat Florida in the Cotton Bowl and was sixth in the final AP poll.

poll. In 2021, the Sooners were 10-2 in the just-completed regular season, tied for second in the Big 12 standings at 7-2 and are ranked 13th by AP. Riley spent 2015 and 2016 as Oklahoma's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2015 when his offense ranked seventh nationally in total offense. In 2016, receiver Dede Westbrook won the Biletnikoff Award and was fourth in the Heisman voting, while running back Joe Mixon set the OU season all-purpose yardage record (2,331 yards) and fellow running back Samaje Perine set the school career rushing mark [4,122 yards]. Riley came to Oklahoma after five seasons (2010-14) as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at East Carolina. He added the title of assistant head coach in 2014. The Pirates, running a spread offensive scheme, set more than 50 team and individual school offensive records during bis time there. His squads had the ton five nassing seasons in school bistory and for four total offense marks. In 2014, FCIL set a school season

his time there. His squads had the top five passing seasons in school history and top four total offense marks. In 2014, ECU set a school season mark with 6,929 yards of total offense. East Carolina appeared in the national Top 10 in such categories as passing and scoring offense, third down

Conversion percentage and red zone scoring efficiency. His Pirate wide receivers Justin Hardy and Zay Jones became the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. Hardy caught an NCAA record 387 career passes for 4,541 yards (including a trio of 1,000-yard seasons). Jones, who Riley coached for the first two years of his career, went on to break Hardy's mark with 399 career receptions.

East Carolina quarterback Dominique Davis was the 2010 Conference USA Newcomer of the Year and set school records for career completions and TD passes. He completed an NCAA record 36 consecutive passes in 2011. He was succeeded by Shane Carden, who broke many of Davis' record. Carden set ECU season marks for passing yards (4,736 in 2014) and completion percentage (.705 in 2013) and was the Conference USA MVP in 2013 followed by the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014.

Riley was on the football and track teams at Muleshoe (Tex.) High, a West Texas town of 5,000. He was a walk-on quarterback at Texas Tech in the spring and summer of 2003 before starting his coaching career as a student assistant there under head coach Mike Leach for three seasons (2003-05), working with the offense.

He became an offensive graduate assistant at Texas Tech in 2006, then joined the Red Raiders' fulltime staff as the wide receivers coach in 2007 and the inside wide receivers coach in 2008 and 2009. In 2009, he called plays as the interim offensive coordinator in the Alamo Bowl, producing 579 yards of offense. His wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the 2007 Biletnikoff Award while establishing Big 12 and NCAA freshman records with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards, while fellow wideout Danny Amendola also had a 100-catch, 1,000-yard season in 2007. The Red Raiders played in a bowl in each of his seven seasons and Tech quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007.

Riley received his bachelor's degree in exercise and sports science from Texas Tech in 2006.

He was born on Sept. 5, 1983, in Lubbock, Tex. He and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella. His younger brother, Garrett, is the offensive coordinator at Clemson after previously coaching at TCU (where he helped coach the Horned Frogs to the 2022 National Championship game), SMU, Appalachian State, Kansas, East Carolina and Augustana College and playing quarterback at Texas Tech and Stephen F. Austin.



Defending Heisman Trophy winner **QB Caleb William**s passed for 278 yards and 4 TDs, and freshman WR Zachariah Branch made an electrifying debut with a 96-yard kickoff return and a 25-yard reception for touchdowns in No. 6 USC's 56-28 victory over San Jose State.

Williams commanded an up-beat Lincoln Riley offense by leading 6 TD drives in eight series. WRs Dorian Singer, Tahj Washington and Brenden Rice also caught TD passes and RB Austin Jones rushed for two more scores.

After Singer scored in the first quarter, Williams showed off his famed poise and playmaking originality in the second guarter when he dropped a shotgun snap, corralled it and promptly flung a stunning 76-yard touchdown pass to Washington the longest pass of Williams' career.

San José State's QB Chevan Cordeiro hit WR Nick Nash with a 28-yard TD pass just 8 seconds before halftime to trim USC's lead to 21-14, setting off a few grumbles in the Coliseum. But Williams confidently led a drive ending in Jones' second TD to open the second half.

Four minutes later, Trojan fans saw Branch light up the Coliseum with a catch-and-run for a score on a drive set up by his 35-yard punt return.

Branch then broke it open with his kickoff return down the Spartans' sideline in the third quarter, dodging tackles all the way home. The Coliseum crowd, which has cheered game-breaking talents from Reggie Bush and Margise Lee to Amon-Ra St. Brown and Drake London over the past two decades alone, rose and roared for a freshman.

San Jose State's WR Nash caught three touchdown passes from Cordeiro. who passed for 198 yards and rushed for 52 more.

Williams threw his last TD pass of the game to Rice before **QB Miller Moss** came in to take over. He ran the ball in for a TD himself, his first rushing TD of his career

His 5 touchdown passes tied his most as a Trojan (4th time). USC is now 2-0 on the 2023 season. USC had 668 total yards of offense and 501 total yards in the first game. USC now has 11 games of 500 or more total yards under **Lincoln Riley** (16 games). USC's 668 total yards were its most since amassing 737 total yards year idan on Sept. 12, 2015 in a 58-9 win. The last time USC apanda a season by scoring more than 500.

bbB total yards were its most since amassing /3/ total yards vs. Idano on Sept. 12, 2015 in a 59-9 win. The last time USC opened a season by scoring more than 50 points in each of its first two games was the 2015 season. USC began that season with a 55-6 win over Arkansas State and a 59-9 win over Idaho. The last time USC scored more points in any two games in a season (122 points through 2 games) was the start of the 2005 season, when the Trojans scored 133 in defeating at home Hawai'i (63-17) and Arkansas (70-17). The 66 points scored were USC's most since defeating Rice also 66-14 in the 2022 season opener on Sept. 3, 2022. The 35 first-half points scored by USC matches the most points by the Trojans in a half under Lincoln Riley. done twice before [35 in the second half vs. Rice on Sent. 3]

35 first-half points scored by USL matches the most points by the irojans in a half under Lincoln Riley, done twice before (35 in the second half vs. Rice on Sept. 3, 2022 and 35 in first half vs. Stanford on Sept. 10, 2022). USC's defense collected 5 sacks by 5 different defenders. In USC's first offensive drive of the game, Williams scrambled, stiff-armed a defender and managed to toss a 30-yard pass to WR Dorian Singer to whip up some magic to start the game. Williams then threw a 22-yard TD pass to WR Zachariah Branch put the Trojans on the board first with a 7-0 score. The Welfnack responded with a TD of their own as PB Scon Dellars rushed 3.

The Wolfpack responded with a TD of their own as RB Sean Dollars rushed 3 yards into the end zone to tie up the score. Six minutes later, **RB MarShawn Lloyd** scored on a 24-yard rush for the Trojans. **WR Tahj Washington** closed out the first quarter as he caught a 22-yard pass from Williams and shimmied around Wolfpack defenders to find open grass into the end zone to make the score 21-7.

The second quarter opened with another Trojan TD as Williams tossed a pass right over the middle of the field to **WR Michael Jackson** III who paid tribute to his namesake, the King of Pop, with a dance move in the end zone. As the Trojans continued to wind down the clock, the Coliseum was awaiting more magic from the defending Heisman Trophy winner. He threw a 54-yard pass to Lloyd to ignite a roar from the crowd and set up the next exciting play. In true Williams fashion, he extended the following play with his feet, running around the field escaping defenders to find **WR Brenden Rice** in the end zone for a 13-yard TD. USC led 35-7.

Washington opened the second half with another TD pass from Williams to mark the only score from either team in the third quarter. Williams exited the game and it was officially "Miller Time". **QB Miller Moss**

Wintanis Exteed the game and it was officially Miller Time . Us Miller Moss went 7-of-10 [700] with no INTs. In the fourth quarter, PK Denis Lynch scored on a 37-yard field goal and DT Stanley Ta'ufo'ou returned a fumble for a 23-yard TD. It was the first fumble recovery by a Trojan returned for a touchdown since Tuli Tuipulotu at Washington State on Sept. 18, 2021. In his press conference after the game, Coach Riley said, "Dt double of the state on sept. 18, 2021. "Obviously Stanley's fumble return was probably the major highlight of the game. When big people score, football is more fun. So that was awesome." Nevada responded with a TD as QB AJ Bianco threw a 77-yard pass to WR

Jamaal Bell.

Two young Trojans had the opportunity to score late in the game for USC. **RB Quinten Jayner** collected a 47-yard rushing TD and **WR Duce Robinson** scored on a 71-yard pass from Moss (a career-long for the QB). Both TDs were the first of their Trojan careers
