SENIOR DAY AND 1998 FINAL FOUR TEAM HIGHLIGHT HOME FINALE

It will be a special day at Maples Pavilion Saturday as Stanford honors its seniors, Michael Humphrey and Dorian Pickens, and celebrates the 20-year anniversary of the 1998 Final Four Team. Saturday is the final home game for the Cardinal, which is 12-4 at Maples Pavilion. Stanford hosts Washington State, looking for a sweep of the Cougars on the year after a 79-70 win in Pullman in January. The Cardinal has won eight of the last nine against Washington State.

SENIOR LEADERS

Seniors Michael Humphrey and Dorian Pickens have both etched their name in the Stanford record books. Humphrey is among the program's all-time rebounding leaders with 663 in his career. Pickens is among the school's all-time leaders in three-pointers, currently 10th with 177. Pickens (1,086) became the 46th member of the 1,000-point club earlier this season and Humphrey is just 18 points away from the club with 982 career points.

1998 FINAL FOUR TEAM

The 1997-98 Stanford team, coached by Hall of Famer Mike Montgomery, finished 30-5 overall, reaching the Final Four in San Antonio that season after an iconic victory in the regional final against Rhode Island. Featuring starters Mark Madsen (11.7 ppg, 8.2 rpg), Tim Young (11.3 ppg, 8.1 rpg), Arthur Lee (14.5 ppg), Kris Weems (12.6 ppg) and the captain Peter Sauer (9.2 ppg), the Cardinal won its first 18 games and placed second in the Pac-10 with a 15-3 mark. After advancing to the Final Four, Stanford nearly knocked off Kentucky in the national semifinal, falling, 86-85, in overtime. Several members of that team went on to enjoy successful NBA careers, including Jarron and Jason Collins, Madsen and Young.

STANFORD AND THE PAC-12 PICTURE

Stanford (9-6) enters Saturday tied in the loss column with UCLA and Utah for third place in the conference. Stanford's nine conference wins so far are three more than its win total from all of last season's league slate. The Cardinal opened Pac-12 play with a 5-1 mark for the second time in the last 14 seasons. In January, Stanford won five consecutive conference games for the first time in 10 seasons and posted its first conference road sweep in eight seasons.

NOBODY BETTER FROM THREE IN THE PAC-12 THAN PICKENS IN LAST 12 GAMES

Dorian Pickens is the only Pac-12 player with at least 34 three pointers and a three-point shooting percentage better than 48 percent in their last 12 games. The senior is shooting 48.1 percent with 39 three pointers over that span.

PICKENS 10TH ON CAREER THREE POINTERS LIST

Dorian Pickens, who missed 11 games with a foot injury, returned for the beginning of conference play. He ranks 10th in school history with 177 career threes. The forward has totaled 45 threes in the last 14 games. He leads the Pac-12 in threes per game (3.1), is third in three-point percentage (.456) and eighth in scoring (16.1 ppg) during conference play. Despite missing nearly half the season, Pickens leads the team with 49 threes. Earlier this season, Pickens became the 46th all-time and second active member of Stanford's 1,000-point club. He enters the Washington State contest with 1,086 career points in 109 career games.

TRAVIS AMONG NATION'S ELITE POST PLAYERS

Junior Reid Travis is fourth in the Pac-12 in scoring (19.3 ppg) and rebounding (7.8 rpg). Travis and Arizona's DeAndre Ayton are the lone players to rank in the top five of the conference in both scoring and rebounding. Travis ranks in the top-five in the Pac-12 in nine categories overall. The junior posted a career-high 33 points last time out in the win over Washington. He became the 45th member of Stanford's 1,000-point club earlier this year and enters the Washington State game with 1,285 points and 671 rebounds in his 91-game career so far.

LAST TIME OUT

Reid Travis scored 23 of his career-high 33 points in the first half as Stanford jumped to an early lead on the way to a 94-78 victory over Washington on Thursday. Dorian Pickens added 20 points and Michael Humphrey added 15 points. Travis was 11 of 17 from the floor and also from the foul line. Jaylen Howell scored 18 points to lead UW, who lost their fourth straight to Stanford.

THE CAPTAINS IMPACT

Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens and Michael Humphrey were each voted to the role of the Peter Sauer Captainship, honoring the legacy of the late Peter Sauer, a team captain and leader of Stanford's 1998 Final Four team. The three captains account for 60.1 percent of the scoring average (45.4 out of 75.5 ppg) and 49.7 percent (19.0 out of 38.2 rpg) of the rebounding average.

WINNING THE BATTLE OF THE BOARDS

Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey have helped Stanford win the rebounding battle in 22 of 28 games this year, including 18 of the last 21 contests. The Cardinal is second in the Pac-12 in rebounding at 38.2 rpg. Only two opponents (Washington's Noah Dickerson (14 pts., 13 rebs.) and USC's Chimezie Metu, 12 pts., 10 rebs.) have recorded a double-double against Stanford in the last 33 games, dating back to last season.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

One of the top recruiting classes in school history has played a big role in its first season on The Farm. Each of the Cardinal's four freshmen have started at least one game and three - Daejon Davis, Oscar da Silva and Isaac White - started together in six games. At least two freshmen have started in 26 games and at least one freshman has started in all 28 games.

All four average at least 19 minutes per game. Davis leads the Cardinal in assists (4.9 apg), White is second on the team in three pointers (38) and da Silva leads the Cardinal in blocks (27). KZ Okpala, who made his collegiate debut 16 games ago, is averaging 8.8 ppg in 27.6 mpg.

In the win over Arizona State, Stanford's final 16 points were scored by freshmen. In the victory at Washington State, Stanford's four freshmen scored the first 23 points of the second half during the Cardinal's 21-3 run to erase its deficit en route to the road win.

DAVIS DIRECTING THE OFFENSE

Freshman Daejon Davis has started all 26 games he has played in. In his last 14 games, Davis is averaging 12.8 points, 5.7 assists and 4.9 rebounds per game. He averaged 15.0 points, 6.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds during Stanford's five-game winning streak in January.

Highlighting his play during conference action is the 50-foot heave to win the game at the buzzer against USC. The freshman registered career-highs in points (23) and assists (10) against UCLA on Jan 27. He has totaled 45 points and 17 assists in the two games against the Bruins this season. Davis has posted two double-doubles this season with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the win at Washington and the 23-point, 10-assist performance at UCLA. The freshman recorded 22 points seven rebounds and five assists in the win at California last Sunday.

FLOOR BURNS STAT COMES TO THE FARM

During his standout collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program. Haase totaled 167 in the 1996-97 season. For the second season, Stanford is tracking floor burns as an official stat throughout the year.

POST PRESENCE

Stanford's starting post players, Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey, have combined to average 29.9 points and 15.1 rebounds per game. The duo is second in the conference among starting post players in combined rebounding and fourth in combined scoring. Travis is fourth in the Pac-12 in scoring (19.3 ppg) and fifth in rebounding (7.8 rpg). Humphrey is seventh in the conference in rebounding (7.3 rpg).

OKPALA MAKING IMPACT IN CONFERENCE PLAY

Freshman KZ Okpala made his collegiate debut 16 games ago in Stanford's nonconference finale. The forward is fifth on the team in scoring at 8.8 ppg in 27.6 minutes per contest. Okpala, who has started 14 of the 16 games he has played in, has a pair of 20-point games against Washington State (21) and Oregon (20).

Freshman Daejon Davis, who averaged 15.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists to lead Stanford to road wins at Washington State and Washington, was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Week Jan. 15. Davis was the fourth Stanford freshman to win conference Player of the Week honors in school history and the first since Jan. 29, 2007, joining Brook Lopez, Jason Collins and Howard Wright.

DAVIS' BUZZER-BEATER WAS FIRST IN 14 SEASONS

Daejon Davis' 50-foot shot to defeat USC at the buzzer Jan. 7 was the first game-winning buzzer-beater for the Cardinal in 14 seasons. On March 3, 2004, Matt Lottich hit a desperation three-pointer as time expired to give No. 1 and undefeated Stanford a 63-61 victory over Washington State at Beasley Coliseum. Davis' buzzer-beater was the first for the Cardinal at Maples Pavilion since Nick Robinson connected on a 35-foot running jumper at the buzzer to give No. 2 Stanford an 80-77 victory over No. 12 Arizona on Feb. 7, 2004.

PRESEASON HONORS FOR REID TRAVIS

Reid Travis, the Pac-12 Conference's leading returning scorer (17.4 ppg) and rebounder (8.9 rpg), entered the year with several preseason accolades.

MOST POWER FIVE OPPONENTS IN FIVE YEARS

Stanford's challenging nonconference schedule included four opponents from power five conferences. The Cardinal played North Carolina (ACC), Florida (SEC), Ohio State (Big Ten) and Kansas (Big 12), with all but the UNC contest taking place away from Maples Pavilion. It's the most power five conference opponents in five years, since the Cardinal faced Missouri (SEC), Minnesota (Big Ten), NC State (ACC) and Northwestern (Big Ten) during its 2012 slate. Stanford went 1-3 in those games, defeating Northwestern (70-68) on the road.

WIN NO. 100 FOR HAASE

The Dec. 17 victory over San Francisco was head coach Jerod Haase's 100th career coaching victory. He is in his sixth season as a head coach and second with Stanford, following four successful seasons at UAB. He is 28-30 in his second season as head coach of the Cardinal.

WHITE POSTS BEST DEBUT MARK SINCE 1977

Freshman Isaac White's 17-point performance against Cal Poly in the season opener on Nov. 10 was the second-most points by a true freshman in his collegiate debut in the 103-year history of the program. White ranks sixth on the team in scoring at 6.6 ppg.

PETER SAUER CAPTAINSHIP

Jerod Haase announced the establishment of the Peter Sauer Captainship this season, naming Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens and Michael Humphrey captains. The three wear patches on their uniforms honoring the legacy of the late Peter Sauer, a team captain and leader of Stanford's 1998 Final Four team. Stanford will celebrate the 20-year anniversary of the 1998 Final Four team Feb. 24 vs. Washington State.

THE FOURTH-YEAR CLASS

The four members of Stanford's fourth-year class - Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens, Michael Humphrey and Robert Cartwright - accounted for 62.6 percent of the team's scoring and 55.4 percent of the team's rebounding last season. Pickens and Humphrey are true seniors, while Travis and Cartwright have each had their medical hardship waivers granted and are redshirt juniors with another year of eligibility remaining after this season. Cartwright missed the entire 2015-16 season with a compound fracture of his right forearm sustained in preseason practice on Nov. 2, 2015. Travis was forced to miss the final 22 games of the 2015-16 season with a right leg injury.

TOP-TIER RECRUITING CLASS

After signing a consensus top-25 national recruiting class last season, the Cardinal once again inked one of the nation's top classes for 2018. On Nov. 8, Stanford announced the signing of 6-5 guard Cormac Ryan from New York, New York, and 7-0 forward Keenan Fitzmorris of Overland Park, Kansas. Fitzmorris is the younger brother of Stanford women's volleyball All-American Audriana Fitzmorris.

SEEING DOUBLE

Stanford individuals have totaled 17 double-doubles in 28 games, with nine from Reid Travis, four Michael Humphrey, two from Daejon Davis and one each from Dorian Pickens and Oscar da Silva.

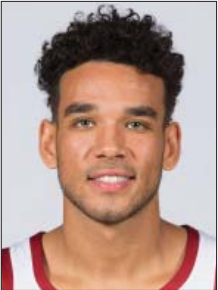

After being introduced as the Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir on March 25, 2016, Jerod Haase developed a strong relationship with his program and instilled an invested, tough and selfless attitude among his student-athletes.

In his first year at the helm of the Cardinal program, Stanford posted 14 wins against one of the toughest schedules in the nation. Redshirt sophomore Reid Travis earned First Team All-Pac-12 and NABC All-District honors, developing into one of the top players in the conference on both ends of the court. His program finished in the top-10 percent among men's basketball programs nationally in the classroom as well.

Haase and his staff signed a top-tier recruiting class that is rated as high as No. 10 nationally in the 2017 rankings, welcoming the four-member class to The Farm for the 2017-18 season.

Haase arrived on The Farm prior to the 2016-17 season after completing his fourth season as the head coach at UAB, where he led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase compiled an 80-53 overall record while improving the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in his final season at the helm of the Blazers, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25, while ranking among the nation's best in field goal percentage (.478 - 24th), assists per game (18.4 - 4th) and blocks per game (4th - 6.1).

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. More impressively, Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen - all players recruited by Haase and his staff - and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall while notching three victories against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game.

During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games and collected a victory in the conference tournament.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003.

When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1997, Haase later earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000.

Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

In 2017, Haase joined the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance, the organization that uses the power of positive reinforcement to pursue winning and the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.

Haase, 42, and his wife, the former Mindy Meidinger, have three children: Gavin (11), Garrett (7) and Gabrielle (4).
