Stanford Saga

The nationally-ranked Stanford basketball team has reached the NCAA "Elite Eight" for the second time in school history ... By virtue of a 78-65 victory over Cincinnati (3/22/01), the Cardinal will meet Maryland (24-10) in the championship game of the NCAA West Regional on Saturday (3/24/01) at 1:40 p.m. (pt) at the Anaheim Pond ... The winner advances to the NCAA Final Four (March 31, April 1) in Minneapolis, Minn. ... Stanford has reached the NCAA Final Four twice in school history; the 1942 NCAA championship season, and in 1998 when Stanford won the Midwest Regional in St. Louis ... All-American **Casey Jacobsen** scored a career-high 27 points to help lead the Cardinal to its victory over Cincinnati (3/22/01) ... Stanford shot a season-high .628 from the floor ... **Jason Collins** added 15 points and eight rebounds, while **Ryan Mendez** added 16 points and six rebounds, and **Jarron Collins** added 14 points and seven rebounds ... Stanford opened NCAA Tournament play with a convincing 89-60 victory over UNC Greensboro (3/15/01) at the West Regional at San Diego ... **Jason Collins** scored 25 points, grabbed eight rebounds and blocked three shots to lead the Cardinal attack ... Stanford shot .509 from the floor ... It was the seventh straight season that the Cardinal has won its opening round game of the NCAA Tournament ... Stanford recorded its widest margin of victory in an NCAA Tournament game against UNC Greensboro ... Then came a dramatic 90-83 victory over St. Joseph's (3/17/01) ... The Cardinal made all 10 of its free throws in the final 45.1 seconds, six by **Jarron Collins** and four by **Mendez**, the nation's leading free throw shooter ... **Jason Collins** scored 22 points and **Jacobsen**

Did You Know ...

*** Stanford was 11-0 on the road this year ... Two of the past three national champions (Kentucky in 1998, Connecticut in 1999) chalked up the same road record.
*** **The Jacobsen brothers (Casey, Adam, Brock)** have chalked up 559 three-pointers in their collegiate careers ... That is second-best in national collegiate basketball history ... The national record is 597 three-pointers by the McCarthy brothers (Brendan, who scored 300 three-pointers at St. Anselm College from 1993-96, and Kevin, who scored 297 three-pointers at New Hampshire College from 1989-92) ... **Adam Jacobsen** played at Pacific (1993-98) and **Brock Jacobsen** played at USD (1995-99).
*** **Ryan Mendez** is shooting a school record setting and nation's leading .948 (92-for-97) from the free throw line ... The Pac-10 record is .950 (95-for-100) set by **Rod Foster** of UCLA during the 1981-82 season ... A Stanford player has won the Pac-10 free throw percentage title six of the last seven seasons ... **Mendez** and **David Moseley** won the title last year at .875.
*** **Ryan Mendez** broke the Pac-10 record for consecutive free throws with 49 ... **Mendez** has made his last 14 free throws.
*** All-America **Casey Jacobsen** needs one three-pointer to break the single season school record he shares with **Dion Cross (82 in 1994-95)**.

Considered the top point-guard in the West by several scouting magazines ... Averaged 13.7 points and 6.7 assists per game during his junior season.

Robert Little

6-10, 265, Center, Paul VI Catholic High School, Fairfax, Va

Averaged 15 points and ten rebounds per game as a junior ... Shot 67 percent from the floor and gained all-state honors.

added 21 for Stanford ... Stanford set a school record for most points scored in an NCAA Tournament game with 90 points against St. Joseph's ... The Cardinal also set a school standard in NCAA Tournament games with (31) free throws made and attempted (37).

Cardinal Catalogue

*** A team blessed with near-perfect team chemistry, outstanding leadership from its senior class, quality depth, and excellent talent has added up to another great Stanford basketball team ... Although the Cardinal lost three key seniors to graduation, the Cardinal of 2000-01 has emerged as one of the contenders to reach the NCAA Final Four, and possibly win a national championship ... Since December 25, 2000, the Cardinal has been ranked no lower than second in the nation.

*** Stanford's participation in the 2001 NCAA Tournament is the school's seventh straight, and tenth overall ... Stanford earned its first trip to the NCAA's in 1942, and Stanford won the national championship that year with a 53-38 victory over Dartmouth on March 28, 1942 in Kansas City, Mo ... **Howie Dallmar** scored 15 points in the championship game to earn tournament MVP honors ... The game wasn't even broadcast back to the San Francisco Bay Area ... After expenses, Stanford's share of the NCAA pot was \$93.75 ... It would then be 47 years before Stanford's next appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1989 ... Times have changed since then ... The Cardinal has been to the NCAA's a school record seven times (16-8), including a Final Four appearance during the 1997-98 season.

*** Only eleven Stanford basketball players in school history have ever played on four Stanford NCAA Tournament teams ... The list includes three members of this year's team, seniors **Jarron Collins**, **Michael McDonald** and **Ryan Mendez**.

*** **Mike Montgomery** is in his 15th season at Stanford with a record of 319-145.

*** In 14 previous seasons at Stanford, **Montgomery** has directed the Cardinal to 13 post-season appearances (9 NCAA, 4 NIT).

*** **Montgomery's** overall record (14-plus seasons at Stanford, 8 seasons at Montana) is 473-222.

Road Report

*** Stanford has enjoyed great success away from Maples Pavilion.

*** The Cardinal, since the 1997-98 season, has chalked up a 40-5 record (45 games, +583 points) on the road, and 26-5 on a neutral court.

*** The Cardinal is 8-0 on neutral courts this year ... In those games, the Cardinal has won by an average of 17.0 points per game (8 games, +136 points) ... Stanford is shooting .499 from the floor, and is averaging 83.1 points per game.

*** In eleven games on the road (eleven games, +172 points) this year, the Cardinal has won by an average of 15.6 points per game ... And also during that time, Stanford is shooting .532 on enemy territory, while scoring 82.1 ppg.

*** Stanford is the first team to go undefeated on the road in league play (9-0 in 2000-01) since Oregon State turned the feat during the 1980-81 season.

*** Since the 1994-95 season, Stanford is 86-11 (52-10 vs Pac-10 schools, 34-1 vs non-league opponents).

*** This year (14 home games), Stanford beat its opponents by an average of 22.4 points per game (14 games, +314 points).

*** The Maples Pavilion record is 27.3 points per game set last year in 14 home games.

*** Stanford has hosted 50 consecutive soldout crowds at Maples Pavilion.

Super Seniors

*** A part of Stanford's success this year has been because of the play of three outstanding seniors, **Jarron Collins**, **Michael McDonald** and **Ryan Mendez** ... All three players will be remembered for their hard work, dedication, and for their efforts to maintain Stanford's status as one of the nation's best collegiate basketball programs.

*** All three players have played a total of 369 games in a Stanford uniform and have helped lead the Cardinal to four NCAA tournament appearances.

*** **Jarron Collins** has played in 128 games at Stanford (second-best in school history), and is one of nine players in school history to score at least 1,000 points (1,072) and grab 600 or more rebounds (704).

*** **Jarron Collins** is ranked in the Top-10 in four categories (games played, career field goal percentage, career rebounds, career blocks).

*** **Michael McDonald** is enjoying his finest season on The Farm, and will be remembered as one of the best point-guards in school history.

*** **Michael McDonald** is near the school record for assist-to-turnover ratio, and his three-point field goal percentage (.515) is third-best for a single season in school history.

*** **Michael McDonald** is currently fifth all-time in assists (386) and tenth in career three-point field goal percentage (.404).

*** **Ryan Mendez**, a co-captain, is also enjoying his best season at Stanford this year, and he will not only be remembered as one of Stanford's all-time best three-point shooters, but also one of the school's all-time best free throw shooters.

*** **Ryan Mendez** is #2 all-time in free throw percentage at .876, and is well ahead of the school record for single free throw percentage at .948 (#1 in the nation).

*** **Ryan Mendez** is third all-time in three-pointers made (174), fourth all-time in three-point attempts (417) and eighth in three-point field goal percentage (.417).

*** During their tenure at Stanford, **Jarron Collins** and **Michael McDonald** have helped Stanford chalk up a 114-18 record, three Pac-10 titles, four trips to the NCAA Tournament, and a trip to the 1998 Final Four.

*** **Ryan Mendez** has helped Stanford to a 114-20 record, three conference titles, four trips to the NCAA's, and a journey to the 1998 Final Four.

Senior Status

*** The senior class of **Jarron Collins**, **Michael McDonald** and **Ryan Mendez** has combined to score 2,598 points and grab 1,324 rebounds.

 *** The Cardinal starting five of **Casey Jacobsen, Jarron Collins, Ryan Mendez, Jason Collins** and **Michael McDonald** has helped Stanford attain a #2 national ranking ... Combined, they are shooting .531 (723-of-1,361) from the floor, and .458 (195-of-426) from three-point territory.
 *** Four starters are averaging in double-figures.

- *** After 33 games, Cardinal shooting is doing just fine.
 *** The Cardinal has hit .514 from the floor (#1 in the nation), including 20 games in which Stanford hit 50 percent or better.
 *** In the last eleven games, Stanford has hit 319-of-583 shots for .547.
 *** Stanford has not shot this well from the floor for the season since the 1988-89 season when the Cardinal ended the year at .522.

Trey Time

- *** Shooting from three-point territory has remained a strength for the Cardinal thus far in 2000-01.
 *** Last year, the Cardinal led the Pac-10 in three-point shooting percentage at .400, and in three-point field goals made at 7.90 per game ... Stanford produced the second (**David Moseley, .449**), third (**Casey Jacobsen, .435**) and fifth-best (**Ryan Mendez, .420**) three-point shooters in the Pac-10.
 *** After 33 games this year, the Cardinal has hit 242-of-565 three-point attempts for .428, #1 in the Pac-10 and #3 in the nation.
 *** And while **Moseley** has graduated, **Jacobsen** and **Mendez** are back in top form, hitting .471 (#2 in the Pac-10) and .390, respectively ... And **Michael McDonald** is hitting 53-of-103 from three-point range, good for .515, tops in the Pac-10.
