2024 NOTABLES

- No. 4 Stanford (7-2) returns to action on Feb. 23, competing at the Barbara Kalbus Invitational. The Cardinal is a six-time champion of the event (2007, 2009, 2011, 2018, 2022, 2023) and in position to claim its third consecutive tournament crown.
- Since suffering consecutive losses (Jan. 20-21) for only the fifth time since the 2000 campaign, Stanford has won six in a row while quickly finding its form as multiple players adjust to new roles. The Cardinal is averaging 13.4 goals during the winning streak while reaching the 20-goal mark in two of those games.
- Stanford's signature win to date was an 8-6 overtime win over California on Feb. 3, thanks to timely offense and swarming defense in the extra session. The Cardinal, which has won 19 of the last 22 meetings against the Golden Bears dating back to 2016, trailed 5-4 with 3:21 remaining in the third quarter before flipping the script. Sophia Sanders matched her career high with four goals while Christina Hicks and Sophie Wallace supplied the overtime scoring. Maya Avital finished with 15 saves and has now made 93 in seven career appearances against the Golden Bears.
- Sophie Wallace (23 goals, 9 assists, 32 points, 58 shots, 7 multi-goal games) and Sophia Sanders (19 goals, 4 assists, 23 points, 43 shots, 6 multi-goal games) are pacing the team in scoring. Wallace has yet to miss a game in her career and is back for a fifth year as the Cardinal's leading returning scorer from 2023. Sanders has already eclipsed the production from her first two seasons combined (15 games, 12 goals). Christina Hicks (18 goals) and Maggie Hawkins (11 goals) are other key returners off to strong starts.
- Newcomers Kamryn Barone (12 goals, 12 assists, 24 points, 20 shots) and Quinn Healy (12 goals, 12 points, 17 shots) have been impressive in their debuts. Barone erupted for four goals in a win over Santa Clara on Feb. 4 while Healy's five-goal performance in that same game is one of her four multi-goal efforts.
- Stanford is also anchored by the nation's top returning goalkeeper in two-time ACWPC All-American Maya Avital, who made the jump to a first-team selection in 2023. Avital, who has made 58 saves, has increased her career total to 468 and is two shy of passing Julia Hermann (2014, 2016-18) for fifth place in school history. Avital's 189 saves last season ranked eighth all-time on the Cardinal's single-season list.
- Two-time defending champion Stanford has appeared in 12 of the last 13 NCAA finals and is the nation's only program to have participated at every NCAA Championship since the event's inception in 2001. Nine-time NCAA champion Stanford is bidding to join UCLA (2005-09) as the only programs to capture three straight NCAA crowns.
- In 2023, Stanford (24-1, 5-1 MPSF) defeated USC 11-9 to secure its ninth NCAA title in school history and repeat for the first time since 2014-15. Stanford avenged its only loss and closed out another stellar campaign which included a second straight MPSF crown and its best start to a season (16-0) since 2011. Stanford's 16-game winning streak to open the season was its longest overall since 2014.
- Now in his 27th season, head coach John Tanner has compiled a 629-91 (.873) overall record while directing the Cardinal to 22 all-time NCAA appearances, nine NCAA titles (2023, 2022, 2019, 2017, 2015, 2014, 2012, 2011, 2002) and nine national runner-ups. Named ACWPC Coach of the Year for the eighth time, Tanner picked up his 600th career victory in Stanford's 25-8 win over Fresno State on Jan. 28, 2023.

STANFORD IN THE OLYMPICS

- Five Stanford players will be taking a leave of absence and redshirt year in 2024 while training and competing with their respective national teams in preparation for the 2024 Paris Summer Olympics. Redshirt sophomore Jenna Flynn (San Jose, Calif.), redshirt senior Ryann Neushul (Goleta, Calif.), redshirt senior Jewel Roemer (Martinez, Calif.) and redshirt sophomore Ella Woodhead (San Rafael, Calif.) are training with Team USA while redshirt freshman Serena Browne (Montreal, Quebec, Canada) is competing for Canada.
- Stanford boasts a rich and storied Olympic tradition, with current and former Cardinal standouts fueling Team USA to dominance on the world stage. Stanford has produced 14 Olympians in school history, including a program-best six participants at the 2020 Tokyo Games.
