Stanford has a few opportunities this weekend to buck some recent trends. The Cardinal has dropped five in a row, and has lost its last 11 games to Oregon State dating back to 2012. Stanford will look to end both those streaks during a three-game set in Corvallis, Friday-Sunday.

SERIES HISTORY

All-time vs. Oregon State (since 1964): 40-37 (.519)

Streak: Oregon State, 11 • Last Series: L 2-5, L 5-7, L 3-12 at Sunken Diamond

- Stanford last beat Oregon State May 4, 2012 in the opener of a three-game set in Corvallis.
- Oregon State's 11-game winning streak over the Cardinal is the longest in the program's history against the Cardinal.
- Stanford swept the 2010 series, but has lost 14 of 15 to the Beavers since then.

Current Cardinal against Oregon State

- Saturday starter Chris Castellanos has a 6.00 ERA in 6.0 innings (2 app) vs. the Beavers.
- Junior Tommy Edman has hit .308 in five career games against Oregon State.
- Sophomore Matt Winaker hit .400 with 2 doubles and 4 RBI in 3 games last year vs. OSU.
- Reliever Chris Viall has a 3.38 ERA in 5.1 innings (2 app) vs. the Beavers.

LAST TIME OUT

- Stanford was swept by Arizona State at Sunken Diamond and dropped a mid-week matchup with Santa Clara on Tuesday.
- Freshman Tristan Beck struck out a career-high 11 batters, but the Cardinal was edged in the series opener with Arizona State, 3-2, on Friday night. The Sun Devils tallied one in the second, but Stanford answered with the next two. But the Sun Devils used three hits and a sacrifice fly to score the deciding runs in the seventh.
- On Saturday, ASU led 3-2 after five, but Stanford scored three in the sixth on a solo home run by Quinn Brodey and a two-RBI double by Austin Barr to take a 5-3 lead. The Sun Devils responded with five in the next half inning to take an 8-5 lead, and went on to win, 9-6.
- In the series finale on Sunday, Stanford lost in extras, 8-7. The Cardinal held leads of 2-1, 4-3 and 6-4, but the Sun Devils scored three in the seventh to lead 7-6. Tommy Edman reached on an error to drive in the tying run in the ninth, but Arizona State won it with a solo home run in the top of the tenth.
- On Tuesday, John Hochstatter went 4.0 innings in the longest outing since his Tommy John surgery. He surrendered just two earned runs, but Stanford never led and fell 4-2 to the Broncos in Santa Clara.

UP NEXT

- The Cardinal is in the middle of a stretch of 11 of 15 games on the road.
 - That stretch ends with this trip to Corvallis to take on Oregon State (April 29-May 1).
- Only home series in this road stretch was against Arizona State last weekend.
- Next week, Stanford hosts a mid-week with San Francisco on Tuesday (5:30 p.m.), and a three-game series with rival Cal on the Pac-12 Networks (Thursday-Saturday, 7 p.m.).

CARDINAL NOTES

We're No. 1 🏆

- Stanford entered the weekend ranked No. 1 in the nation in fielding percentage (.986).
- The Cardinal has the fewest errors in the country (295 teams) with just 18 in the first 35 games. Western Michigan is second with 22 errors in 36 games. The team record for fewest errors in a season is 49 set in 2009 (current pace of just 27 errors).
- In addition to those two categories, Stanford pitching also entered the week atop the Pac-12 in ERA (2.93), opposing batting average (.224), and fewest runs (121), earned runs (102), hits (252), doubles (38), and home runs (12) allowed. Second-fewest walks (113).
- Most of those numbers aren't even close:
 - ▶ Stanford's ERA is nearly a half run better than No. 2 Cal (3.36).
 - ▶ Stanford has allowed 27 fewer runs than No. 2 Oregon State & 105 fewer than Utah.
 - ▶ Stanford has allowed 100 fewer hits than two Pac-12 teams.

Stanford Stats 📊

- Stanford is No. 12 in the nation in ERA (2.93) and has allowed the sixth-fewest earned runs (102) in the country.
- Stanford is also No. 7 in the NCAA in hits per nine innings (7.25) and No. 9 in WHIP (1.17).
- Stanford has held its opponent to two or fewer runs 16 times this year (15-1), and allowed more than two runs 15 times (4-15).
- The Cardinal is 10-2 this year when scoring first and 11-3 when hitting a home run.

Stanford Streaks 📈

- Stanford opponents have scored first in eight straight games.
- Junior Alex Dunlap has reached base in 10 straight games—the longest active streak for Stanford. Matt Winaker reached in 14 consecutive games earlier this year.
- Winaker's five-game hit streak is currently the longest active streak for Stanford—Mikey Diekroeger had an eight-game hit streak from April 2-15.
- Junior Chris Castellanos is No. 11 in the nation in walks and has allowed just one free pass in the last 22.1 innings.
- Junior shortstop Tommy Edman has played in 124 straight games (started 121 in a row).
- Stanford won its first three Pac-12 series for the first time since 2008 when the Cardinal finished third at the College World Series (won first five that year).

Closing the Door 🚪

- Stanford's bullpen has an ERA of 2.23 and opponents are hitting just .203.
- The reserves also have 141 strikeouts (compared to 60 walks and 99 hits) in 137.0 inn
- Six different pitchers have an ERA under 2.00 coming out of the bullpen this year.
- Stanford is 16-1 when leading after seven innings this season.

Pac-12 Pitchers of the Week 🔥

- Stanford won the first two Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week awards this season.
- Colton Hock earned the award on March 1 after throwing 5.2 scoreless innings in relief in the longest recorded shut out in the program's history (since 1959)—Stanford won at #23 Texas, 1-0 in 12 innings, on Feb. 25. Hock finished with a career-high eight strikeouts and allowed just three hits.
- Tristan Beck earned the conference honor in the first week—he was the first Stanford hurler to win the award since 2013 MLB first overall pick Mark Appel in May of 2013. He was also the second Stanford freshman to start Opening Day since Mike Mussina in 1988 (teammate Cal Quantrill was the other in 2014).

All-Century 🧑🏻

- Four Stanford legends were among the 30 players selected to the Pac-12 Baseball All-Century Team. Three Cardinal pitchers -- Jack McDowell, Mike Mussina, and Mark Appel -- were among those honored as well as former Cardinal catcher and current Houston Astros manager A.J. Hinch.

They're Back! 🏠

- Nearly 80 percent of Stanford's starting lineup and rotation return from a year ago.

TV Games 📺

- Eighteen Stanford baseball games will be broadcast on the Pac-12 Networks in 2016.
- Eleven of the 18 will feature the newly-renovated Klein Field at Sunken Diamond and 14 will be Pac-12 matchups.
- Only USC and Arizona State will have more televised games on the network (19).

Preseason All-America 🇺🇸

- Juniors Cal Quantrill and Tommy Edman each earned preseason All-America accolades.
- Quantrill was name third team Louisville Slugger Preseason All-America accolades from

Collegiate Baseball News, and third team preseason All-America accolades from Baseball America.

- Quantrill was a Louisville Slugger and Perfect Game Freshman All-American before his sophomore season was cut short due to injury. Prior to the injury, the Port Hope, Ontario, native was 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA last season. As a freshman, Quantrill was 7-5 with a 2.68 ERA in 17 starts, which included two complete games and 98 strikeouts in 110.2 innings. He earned All-Pac-12 honors and was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year.
- A math and computational science major, Edman was the only Cardinal to start every game last season and finished with a team-high 29 RBI, 13 doubles, 22 multi-hit games, and was third on the team with a .296 average.

Klein Field at Sunken Diamond Enhancements 🆕

- Long regarded as one of the most beautiful college baseball facilities in the country, Klein Field at Sunken Diamond underwent several renovations this offseason.
- Upgraded playing surface—completely replaced, laser-graded flat, features Bermuda grass and top-grade Pennsylvania clay in addition to new irrigation system.
- A modernized and expanded clubhouse now includes a players lounge, dedicated athletic training space and coaches locker room.
- Other developments included the modification and expansion of the ticket office, concession stands and restrooms.

2016 Schedule 📅

- 54 regular season games, 30 at Klein Field.
- More than half of the schedule (30/55, 54.5%) is against 2015 tournament teams.
 - Cal (5), Texas (4), Cal St. Fullerton (3), UCLA (3), USC (3), Oregon (3), Oregon State (3), Arizona State (3), Vanderbilt (3).
- Though the Top 25 rankings vary, each has included at least 20+ games for Stanford against Top 25 opponents.
- 11-day break from March 7-17 for finals.
- Longest homestand was seven games and 20 days long (March 1-20).
- Longest road swing is four games (four times).
- First 11 games were played in 13 days.

Preseason Prognostications 📊

- Pac-12 coaches picked Stanford baseball to finish seventh in the conference in 2016.
- Oregon State was selected as the favorite. The Beavers earned 98 points and eight first-place votes, while Stanford garnered 49 points.
