CARDINAL OPENS 2018 WITH UCLA AT MAPLES THURSDAY

Stanford continues its stretch of eight consecutive games in the state of California as the Cardinal hosts UCLA Thursday at 7 p.m. at Maples Pavilion. Stanford enters the week 6-8 overall and 0-1 in the Pac-12 after dropping a 77-74 decision to California at Maples Pavilion this past Saturday. The Bruins come to The Farm 11-3 overall and 2-0 in the conference after posting a sweep of the Washington schools this past weekend.

It's the fifth consecutive season Stanford has opened the Pac-12 slate at home and the fourth straight year the Cardinal has opened the conference portion of its schedule with consecutive home games.

THE GOLDEN STATE TOUR

Stanford is in the middle of a stretch of eight consecutive games played in the state of California. It began with a Nov. 29 matchup with Montana at home, followed by a visit to Long Beach State Dec. 3 and home games with Denver and San Francisco at Maples Pavilion. Stanford then faced No. 14 Kansas in a neutral-site contest in Sacramento Dec. 21, before opening Pac-12 play this past Saturday against California.

The UCLA game is the third of four consecutive opponents from the state of California to visit Maples Pavilion. USC visits The Farm to close the stretch on Sunday. When it's complete, Stanford will have remained in the State of California for a span of 45 days. The Cardinal will play its first conference road game Jan. 11 at Washington State in Pullman, Washington.

AGAINST UCLA

UCLA leads the all-time series between the schools, 143-93. The Cardinal and Bruins only played once each of the previous two seasons due to Pac-12 scheduling. Stanford defeated UCLA, 79-70, in the Bruins' last trip to Maples Pavilion on Feb. 27, 2016. UCLA has won four of the last six between the two schools overall, but the Cardinal has won two of the last three games played on The Farm.

CARDINAL PLAYERS AGAINST UCLA

Six active Stanford players have played against UCLA in their careers. Michael Humphrey has averaged 13.3 ppg and 6.3 rpg in four contests against the Bruins. Fellow senior Dorian Pickens is the lone other Cardinal to have played in four games against UCLA, averaging 7.5 ppg in those contests. With Reid Travis missing the entire 2015-16 season and last year's lone contest against UCLA, the fourth-year junior has faced the Bruins just once as a freshman in 2015.

LAST TIME OUT

Stanford dropped a 77-74 decision to California Saturday in the Pac-12 opener for both teams. The Golden Bears trailed 65-48 before outscoring the Cardinal 27-8 over the last 7½ minutes to win at Maples Pavilion for the first time since 2014. Dorian Pickens scored 13 points in his return for Stanford after missing seven weeks with a foot injury. Michael Humphrey added 15 points and 13 rebounds, Reid Travis had 15 points and eight rebounds, and Kezie Okpala scored 11.

TRAVIS NEWEST MEMBER OF 1,000-POINT CLUB

Junior forward Reid Travis, a preseason All-American and candidate for several national player of the year awards, ranks third in the Pac-12 in scoring at 20.9 ppg. He averaged nearly 23 ppg over his final six nonconference games. The forward matched his career-high with 29 points (first recorded against Kansas last season) in the victory over San Francisco on Dec. 17 to become the 45th member of Stanford's 1,000-point club. He enters Thursday's game against UCLA with 1,038 points and 552 rebounds in his 77-game career so far. Travis ranks 11th in the Pac-12 in rebounding (7.1 rpg).

OKPALA MAKING IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Freshman Kezie Okpala made his collegiate debut two games ago and has made an impact in both contests. The forward has totaled 17 points, five rebounds, three steals and two blocks in 65 minutes in the two contests against Kansas and California. He made his first career start last time out against the Bears, playing the most minutes of anyone on the roster (37) with 11 points in the contest.

Stanford's starting post players, Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey, have combined to average 32.8 points and 16.0 rebounds per game this season. The duo is second in the conference among starting post players in combined scoring and is third in combined rebounding, the only pair to rank in the top-three in both categories in the conference. Travis is third in the Pac-12 in scoring at 20.9 ppg, to go along with 7.1 rpg. Humphrey ranks third in the conference in rebounding at 8.9 rpg, to go along with 11.9 ppg.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

Stanford's roster has played 620 combined games. The Cardinal entered the season with the fifth-most veteran roster (games played) in the nation. While fourth-year players Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey anchor the post, injuries have limited several veteran perimeter players. This has given one of the nation's top recruiting classes a chance to play important minutes as freshmen this season. All four members of Stanford's freshman class have started at least one game this season and three freshmen - Daejon Davis, Oscar da Silva and Isaac White - started together in six games earlier this season.

All four freshmen on the roster average more than 25 minutes per game. Davis leads the Cardinal in assists per game (4.0 apg), White leads all freshmen in the Pac-12 in three-pointers (29) and da Silva ranks third on the roster in rebounding (5.5 rpg), second in blocks (13) and third in steals (11). Fellow freshman Kezie Okpala made his collegiate debut two games ago. He is averaging 8.5 ppg in 32.5 mpg over those two contests.

Prior to this season, Stanford last started three freshmen on January 27, 1983 (at Washington) with Keith Ramee, Andy Fischer and Earl Koberlein earned the starting nod in that contest.

HUMPHREY CONTROLLING THE GLASS

Michael Humphrey, who was among the Pac-12 leaders in rebounding last season, ranks third in the Pac-12 in rebounding with an average of 8.9 rpg. The average is 58th nationally. The forward ranks third in the conference and 25th nationally in defensive rebounds per game (7.1 drpg). He posted a career-high 18 rebounds against Pacific on Nov. 12. The senior, who is averaging 11.9 ppg, has four double-doubles this year.

CARDINAL FINDING ITS RANGE

After averaging 5.9 three-pointers per game through its first 10 games, Stanford nearly set a school single-game record with 13 three-pointers in the Dec. 15 win over Denver. The school record for three-pointers in a game is 15. The Cardinal had averaged 17.1 three-point attempts per game in its first 10 games, before attempting 70 over its last three contests, including 32 against Denver. Leading Stanford from beyond the arc is freshman Isaac White, who has 29 three-pointers on the year, including 10 in his last four games. He ranks 10th in the Pac-12 in three-pointers per game (2.2).

FLOOR BURNS STAT COMES TO THE FARM

During his standout collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program. Haase totaled 167 in the 1996-97 season. For the second season, Stanford is tracking floor burns as an official stat throughout the year.

PICKENS' OUTSIDE TOUCH

Dorian Pickens, the only player to start all 31 games last season, posted at least one three-pointer in all but four games, with multiple three-pointers in 19 contests during his junior season. He ranked ninth in the Pac-12 in three-point field goals made in conference play (39, 2.2) and 11th overall (67, 2.2) as Stanford's leading three-point shooter (67-of-169, 39.6 percent) last year. The forward registered a career-high seven three-pointers (7-of-10) against Idaho last season. He had his consecutive games played streak of 63 snapped in the third game of this season, missing 11 games with a left foot injury. He returned last time out against California. Pickens is 9-for-30 from three-point range this season.

DAVIS TAKING CONTROL OF THE POINT

Freshman Daejon Davis has started all 12 career games he has played in. After averaging 7.0 ppg in his first five games, he is averaging 9.6 points in his last seven contests. In a two-game span against Montana and Denver, Davis totaled 37 points, 10 rebounds and nine assists.

CARTWRIGHT WITH CAREER-BEST NUMBERS

After averaging 4.1 ppg over the first two seasons (67 games) of his career, junior Robert Cartwright is averaging 8.2 ppg in 14 games this season. He had a season-high 19 points against Portland State. He ranks seventh in the Pac-12 in assist/turnover ratio (2.2). Cartwright has started six games this season.

MOST POWER FIVE OPPONENTS IN FIVE YEARS

Stanford's challenging nonconference schedule included four opponents from power five conferences. The Cardinal played North Carolina (ACC), Florida (SEC), Ohio State (Big Ten) and Kansas (Big 12), with all but the UNC contest taking place away from Maples Pavilion. It's the most power five conference opponents in five years, since the Cardinal faced Missouri (SEC), Minnesota (Big Ten), NC State (ACC) and Northwestern (Big Ten) during its 2012 slate. Stanford went 1-3 in those games, defeating Northwestern (70-68) on the road.

WIN NO. 100 FOR HAASE

The Dec. 17 victory over San Francisco was head coach Jerod Haase's 100th career coaching victory. He is in his sixth season as a head coach and second with Stanford, following four successful seasons at UAB. The win was Haase's 20th at the helm of the Cardinal.

THE FOURTH-YEAR CLASS

The four members of Stanford's fourth-year class - Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens, Michael Humphrey and Robert Cartwright - accounted for 62.6 percent of the team's scoring and 55.4 percent of the team's rebounding last season. Pickens and Humphrey are true seniors, while Travis and Cartwright have each had their medical hardship waivers granted and are redshirt juniors with another year of eligibility remaining after this season. Cartwright missed the entire 2015-16 season with a compound fracture of his right forearm sustained in preseason practice on Nov. 2, 2015. Travis was forced to miss the final 22 games of the 2015-16 season with a right leg injury.

PETER SAUER CAPTAINSHIP

Head coach Jerod Haase announced the establishment of the Peter Sauer Captainship in September, naming Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens and Michael Humphrey captains. The three wear patches on their uniforms honoring the legacy of the late Peter Sauer, a team captain and leader of Stanford's 1998 Final Four team. Stanford will celebrate the 20-year anniversary of the 1998 Final Four team Feb. 24, 2018, against Washington State.

TOP-TIER RECRUITING CLASS

After signing a consensus top-25 national recruiting class last season, the Cardinal once again inked one of the nation's top classes for 2018. On Nov. 8, Stanford announced the signing of 6-5 guard Cormac Ryan from New York, New York, and 7-0 forward Keenan Fitzmorris of Overland Park, Kansas. Fitzmorris is the younger brother of Stanford women's volleyball All-American Audriana Fitzmorris.

WHITE POSTS BEST DEBUT MARK SINCE 1977

Freshman Isaac White's 17-point performance against Cal Poly in the season opener on Nov. 10 was the second-most points by a true freshman in his collegiate debut in the 103-year history of the program. White ranks fourth on the team in scoring at 9.7 ppg.

SEEING DOUBLE

Stanford individuals have totaled eight double-doubles in the first 14 games, with four from Michael Humphrey, three from Reid Travis and one from Oscar da Silva.

HERENTON VISITED INDIA AS PART OF ACE PROGRAM

Sophomore Rodney Herenton visited New Delhi, India, July 21 through Aug. 12 of 2017 as part of the Rubenstein-Bing Student-Athlete Civic Engagement Program (ACE). He was part of a group of 10 student-athletes from both Stanford and Duke that taught classes at the Vidya School, giving lessons on English and different sports to children in seventh and eighth grades. Three days out the week, the group visited Earth Saviors, a shelter home for the sick, disabled, and abandoned. At Earth saviors, they helped paint walls, decorate the living quarters, among other tasks.

The ACE program provides one-time funding for accepted Stanford-Duke ACE student-athletes to participate in three-week, immersive summer service experiences with an international community partner. Each summer, 40 student-athletes participate in one of four international group programs with service themes like education, coaching, environmental sustainability and conservation, and health outreach and education.

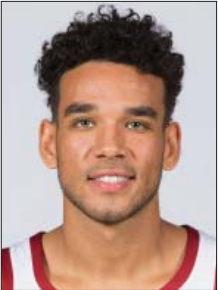

After being introduced as the Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir on March 25, 2016, Jerod Haase developed a strong relationship with his program and instilled an invested, tough and selfless attitude among his student-athletes.

In his first year at the helm of the Cardinal program, Stanford posted 14 wins against one of the toughest schedules in the nation. Redshirt sophomore Reid Travis earned First Team All-Pac-12 and NABC All-District honors, developing into one of the top players in the conference on both ends of the court. His program finished in the top-10 percent among men's basketball programs nationally in the classroom as well.

Haase and his staff signed a top-tier recruiting class that is rated as high as No. 10 nationally in the 2017 rankings, welcoming the four-member class to The Farm for the 2017-18 season.

Haase arrived on The Farm prior to the 2016-17 season after completing his fourth season as the head coach at UAB, where he led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase compiled an 80-53 overall record while improving the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in his final season at the helm of the Blazers, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25, while ranking among the nation's best in field goal percentage (.478 - 24th), assists per game (18.4 - 4th) and blocks per game (4th - 6.1).

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. More impressively, Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen - all players recruited by Haase and his staff - and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall while notching three victories against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game.

During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games and collected a victory in the conference tournament.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003.

When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1997, Haase later earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000.

Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

In 2017, Haase joined the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance, the organization that uses the power of positive reinforcement to pursue winning and the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.

Haase, 42, and his wife, the former Mindy Meidinger, have three children: Gavin (11), Garrett (7) and Gabrielle (4).
