3 • Stanford has had three all-time meetings with Pitt. The Cardinal is 1-2 against the Panthers, including a 7-6 win in the 1928 Rose Bowl Game. Pitt won the first meeting in California, 16-7, on Dec. 30, 1922, and the most recent meeting, 7-0, on Nov. 26, 1932, in the Steel City. In all, Stanford is 10-10 against the ACC, with a win over North Carolina (25-23) in the 2016 Sun Bowl in the most recent matchup.

3 • Stanford football players have conducted interviews in three foreign languages this season—JJ Arcega-Whiteside (Spanish), Jesse Burkett (Japanese) and Osiris St. Brown (German). All other Stanford football interviews this year have been done in English.

3 • The Cardinal swept its in-state rivals UCLA, USC and Cal for the third time in four years (2015, 2016, 2018). This season, Stanford went 5-0 against Californian opposition, and under Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football David Shaw (2011-current), Stanford is 29-5 (.853) vs. in-state opponents, including 23-4 (.852) against USC, UCLA and Cal. Stanford has won eight of 12 over USC, a series-record eight straight Big Games, and a series-record 11 consecutive games over the Bruins—the all-time longest winning streak by any opponent against the Bruins.

4 • All four of Stanford's losses this season have come against teams in the Top 20 of the College Football Playoff rankings—No. 3, No. 9, No. 13 and No. 17th-ranked teams in the nation (Notre Dame, Washington, Washington State, Utah). Those four teams have a combined record of 41-9 (.820) this season, and are in the Cotton, Rose, Alamo and Holiday bowls, respectively. Next season does not get easier, all three 2019 nonconference opponents appear in the CFP rankings. Notre Dame is the No. 3 seed, UCF is undefeated since 2016 and appearing in its second straight New Year's Six bowl game while Northwestern was crowned this year's Big Ten West Division champion. The trio of non-league foes has combined to go 33-5 (.868) this season and currently ranks No. 3, No. 8 and No. 22, respectively.

4 • Sophomore tight end Colby Parkinson tied a school single-game record with four touchdown receptions against Oregon State on Nov. 10. The only other Cardinal to pull off that feat was Ty Montgomery against Cal in 2013 and Ken Margerum against the Beavers in 1980. Parkinson is the first FBS tight end with four touchdown catches in a game since 2011 (Northwestern's Drake Dunsmore), and just the fifth to do so since 1996. Parkinson also finished with a career-high six receptions and 166 receiving yards—the most receiving yards by a Cardinal tight end since Coby Fleener's 173-yard game in the 2011 Orange Bowl.

10 • Stanford is making its 10th straight bowl game appearance, extending the program record. The previous best streak was three—when the Cardinal went to three straight Rose Bowls from 1933-35. The 10 straight winning seasons is the longest streak since an 11-year run from 1968-78.

10 • Stanford recorded its 10th straight winning season in conference play, extending the school record. The previous best streak was seven straight years under Pop Warner in the Pacific Coast Conference from 1924-1930.

11 • Stanford has 11 student-athletes from the state of Texas on its roster, second only to the 28 California natives.

14 • Senior wide receiver JJ Arcega-Whiteside tied a school record and ranks third nationally (first among Pac-12 players) -- with 14 receiving touchdowns. That ties Pro Football Hall of Famer James Lofton's school record set in 1977. He is four away from matching Mario Bailey's Pac-12 record set in 1991.

16 • In addition to his 60 receptions and 969 receiving yards this season, Arcega-Whiteside has drawn 16 penalties this year—13 pass interference and three holding calls for 210 penalty yards (1.6 penalties/game and 21.0 penalty yards/game).

20 • Junior quarterback K.J. Costello ranks among the Top 20 nationally in completion percentage (17th), completions per game (16th), passing efficiency (14th), passing touchdowns (9th), passing yards (13th), passing yards per game (11th) and yards per attempt (13th). He leads the Pac-12 in efficiency (159.1) and yards per attempt (8.67), and is second in the conference in yards (3,435) and TDs (29).

21 • Stanford's seniors finished their careers 20-5 (.800) at Stanford Stadium. In the last four years, the Cardinal has won 39 games, four Big Games, two Pac-12 North titles, a conference championship, and has played in the Rose Bowl, Sun Bowl and Alamo Bowl.

24 • Sophomore cornerback Paulson Adebayo, who earned FWAA second-team All-America honors, set a school record and leads the country with 20 pass breakups and 24 passes defended (four INTs).

30 • This is Stanford's 30th bowl appearance (14-14-1) and its fifth Sun Bowl appearance (1977, 1996, 2009, 2016) — the Cardinal has won three of its previous four visits to El Paso. This is Stanford's seventh bowl game in the state of Texas (4-2), including each of the last three years (2016 Sun Bowl, 2017 Alamo Bowl, 2018 Sun Bowl). Stanford is 5-6 all-time in Texas.

41 • Stanford led the conference with 41 Pac-12 All-Academic honorees, including a league-best seven first-team recipients and six second-team selections.

193 • Costello is 193 passing yards from surpassing the single-season school record held by Steve Stenstrom since 1993 (3,627). Costello is 82 yards from tying Andrew Luck for second.



TEAM

- 2 • Sophomore tight end Colby Parkinson is second in the nation among tight ends with seven touchdown receptions.
- 3 • Three Cardinal -- Irwin (100), Arcega-Whiteside (103) and Kaden Smith (120) -- had 100 or more yards receiving against Utah (Oct. 6), a first for Stanford since Oct. 10, 1998 (vs. Oregon State).
- 6 • Stanford has started six different offensive line combinations this season. Four starters have missed at least one game this season, three have missed multiple games and one has missed the entire season (a combined 26 games missed).
- 6.8 • Senior Bryce Love currently holds the Stanford career record with 6.8 yards per carry. Christian McCaffrey is second at 6.21.
- 7 • The last time a Cardinal had 7+ receptions in three straight games was DeRonnie Pitts in 2000. Trenton Irwin and JJ Arcega-Whiteside have each had 7+ catches in the same game four times this season. That included three consecutive games (Utah, at Arizona State and Washington), and at UCLA on Nov. 24.
- 40 • Senior wide receiver Trenton Irwin has at least one reception in 40 consecutive games, a streak that ranks seventh nationally. Irwin ranks 10th in the Stanford record book with 152 career receptions.
- 3,866 • Senior running back Bryce Love ranks fourth nationally among active players with 3,866 yards rushing—this also ranks fourth on Stanford's career list. He is also fifth in school history with 30 career rushing touchdowns and his 32 total touchdowns rank eighth in the Stanford record book.

K.J. COSTELLO

- 5 • Costello's five touchdown passes at UCLA on Nov. 24 were second-most in school history (Elway, 6 vs. OSU in 1980) and the most since Kevin Hogan had five in the 2013 Big Game.
- 16 • Costello has a touchdown pass in 16 straight games, matching the longest streak by a Cardinal since Andrew Luck's final 16 games. The last Cardinal with a touchdown pass in 17 consecutive games was Todd Husak (Nov. 1, 1997-Sept. 18, 1999), who is the program's radio analyst.
- 29 • Only Andrew Luck has thrown more TD passes in a season at Stanford than Costello's 29 in 2018. Luck set the record with 37 in 2011 and had 32 in 2010.
- 34 • Costello's 34 completions against Washington State were the sixth-most in a game in school history, and most since Steve Stenstrom had 37 at Notre Dame in 1994.
- 300 • Costello is the third Cardinal with seven 300-yard passing games in a season, joining John Elway (1982) and Steve Stenstrom, who set the school record with nine in 1993. He was the first Cardinal with four consecutive 100-yard passing performances since Steve Stenstrom had five in a row in 1994.
- 5,000 • Costello is the 10th Cardinal with 5,000 career passing yards (5,008).

KADEN SMITH • JOHN MACKEY AWARD FINALIST

- 3 • Smith has produced three games with 8+ receptions and 100+ yards this season (Utah, Washington State and Washington). The rest of the Power 5 tight ends in the country combined have four such games. Smith is the first tight end to accomplish that feat three times in a season since Texas Tech's Jace Amaro in 2013 (Baker Mayfield and Davis Webb were the Red Raiders' quarterbacks).
- 4 • Smith was the fourth Cardinal to be named a John Mackey Award finalist, joining Austin Hooper (2015), Zach Ertz (2012) and Alex Smith (2004).
- 47 • When junior Kaden Smith last played on Nov. 10, he led all Power 5 tight ends with 47 receptions and 635 receiving yards. Smith has a 78 percent catch rate on deep passes of 20+ yards and his seven such deep catches also rank No. 1 among FBS tight ends.
- 100 • Smith became the first Stanford tight end with back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since Alex Smith did it in three straight games in 2004. Kaden Smith had 112 against Washington State (Oct. 27) and 107 at Washington (Nov. 3). He is also the first Cardinal tight end since Zach Ertz with three 100-yard receiving games in a season.
- 1000 • Smith is the fourth Cardinal tight end with 1,000 career receiving yards (1,015). He joins Coby Fleener (1,543), Zach Ertz (1,434) and Alex Smith (1,291).

JJ ARCEGA-WHITESIDE • BILETNIKOFF AWARD SEMIFINALIST

- 6 • Senior JJ Arcega-Whiteside had six touchdown receptions over a two-game stretch from the 2017 bowl game to the 2018 opener (three vs. TCU, three vs. San Diego State). That tied Ken Margerum for the most receiving touchdowns in consecutive Stanford games, set in 1980 with quarterback John Elway on the delivering end (two at Washington State, four vs. Oregon State).
- 18 • Dating back to the 2017 regular season finale against Notre Dame, Arcega-Whiteside has 18 receiving scores over his past 14 games.
- 28 • Arcega-Whiteside's 28 career receiving scores ranks second on the program's all-time list—four behind Ken Margerum's school record of 32 from 1977-80.
- 100 • Arcega-Whiteside is the first Cardinal with five 100-yard receiving games in a single season since Troy Walters had seven in 1999, and is just the third Cardinal with nine career 100-yard games.
- 226 • Arcega-Whiteside's 226 receiving yards in the season opener against San Diego State were the third-most in program history. It was the fifth time a Cardinal receiver eclipsed 200 yards receiving.
- 1,000 • The last Cardinal to reach 1,000 receiving yards in a season was Troy Walters in 1999. Arcega-Whiteside is just 31 yards away from that milestone.
- 2,000 • Arcega-Whiteside is the 14th Cardinal to eclipse 2,000 career receiving yards. His 2,129 career yards ranks 13th in school history.

2007 • On Sept. 4, Arcega-Whiteside was the first Stanford receiver to earn Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week honors since Mark Bradford on Oct. 6, 2007. Bradford was recognized after he caught the game-winning touchdown with 48 seconds left to defeat No. 2 USC, 24-23, in what was considered "The Greatest Upset in College Football History".



- 1 • Stanford is 8-0 this season when forcing at least one turnover, and 0-4 when not forcing a turnover.
- 1 • One of the most disciplined teams in the nation, Stanford is the least penalized team in the Pac-12. The Cardinal has surrendered just 42.25 penalty yards per game.
- 2 • Two of the top pass-breakup performances by a Cardinal defense under head coach David Shaw have been registered in the 2018 season's first three games. Stanford had 11 against USC on Sept. 8, the most by any team under Shaw, and 10 against UC Davis, tying for second under Shaw.
- 3 • Stanford held USC to three points during a Sept. 8 win. The Cardinal surrendered fewer than the three points against USC only four times previously: 16-0 victory in 1905 (first meeting between the programs), 16-0 win in 1934, 3-0 triumph in 1935, and a 13-0 blanking in 1941. USC had not been held to three points or fewer since Nov. 1, 1997, when the Trojans were blanked, 27-0, at Washington.
- 5 • Fifth-year senior inside linebacker Bobby Okereke has five or more tackles in 22 of the past 25 games. Okereke's 94 tackles last season were tops among Cardinal returners, and the most by any returning player since 2008.
- 16 • Fifth-year cornerback Alijah Holder was targeted a whopping 16 times against UC Davis (Sept. 15), yet allowed only a long reception of 14 yards.
- 39 • Cameron Scarlett returned a school-record 39 kickoffs in 2017, and ranked first nationally with 12 kickoff returns of 30 or more yards. He is fifth all-time at Stanford with 1,596 career kick return yards.
- 43.8 • Senior Jake Bailey's 43.8 career punting average ranks first in program history. Bailey posted the second-best punting season in school history last year, averaging 45.4 yards/punt. He led the Pac-12 and ranked seventh nationally.
- 84 • Jake Bailey's 84-yard punt at Cal on Dec. 1 was the longest in school history, surpassing a 78-year-old mark set by Frankie Albert with a 79-yard punt against Oregon State in 1940.
- 92 • Stanford has at least one sack in 92 of its past 100 games.
- 93 • Stanford's 93 wins this decade rank fifth nationally and the most of any private school, ahead of Notre Dame (81), TCU (81) and USC (78).
- 112 • The Cardinal has at least one tackle for loss in each of its past 112 contests.
- 167:38 • Stanford went 167:38 without allowing an offensive touchdown during the season's first three games (first quarter of the season opener against San Diego State and the final play of the season's third game against UC Davis).
- 249 • Stanford made a school-record 249 consecutive extra-point attempts between Oct. 26, 2013 - Nov. 3, 2018. During the streak: Colin Riccители - 2-2, Jet Toner - 79-79, Conrad Ukropina - 108-108, Jordan Williamson - 60-60.
- 253 • Senior inside linebacker and special teamer Ryan Beecher was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin lymphoma on Dec. 21, 2017. His final chemotherapy session came on June 4, 2018, and he returned to action in Stanford's season opener against San Diego State on Aug. 31, 2018, a span of 253 days after his diagnosis.
- 320 • Stanford leads the nation with 323 sacks since 2011.

JET TONER

- 1 • Junior kicker Jet Toner's .854 career field goal percentage (35-of-41) is currently the best in school history. Toner's .933 field goal percentage (14-of-15) this season is also No. 1 in school history entering the bowl game, and ranks second in the nation.
- 1.000 • Toner holds an active school record with 86 consecutive made extra points to start a career. He is one of three Cardinal with a 1.000 career extra-point percentage.

BRADFORD M. FREEMAN DIRECTOR OF FOOTBALL DAVID SHAW

- .636 • Coach Shaw is 7-4 (.636) in postseason games, 4-3 in bowl games, 1-0 in the Sun Bowl, 0-1 on Mondays, 5-2 in December, 56-10 (.848) against unranked teams and 33-9 (.786) in day games.
- 1.9 • Stanford has 205 rushing touchdowns in David Shaw's 107 games as head coach, an average of 1.9/game.
- 30 • Stanford has averaged 30 or more points in four of head coach David Shaw's first seven seasons. This year, the Cardinal is averaging 29.58 points per game.
- 48 • The Cardinal is 48-6 (.889) under head coach David Shaw when winning the turnover battle.
- 55 • With a Dec. 1 win at Cal, head coach David Shaw earned his 55th Pac-12 win, matching Bruce Snyder (Cal 1987-91; ASU 1992-2000) for 13th-most victories in conference history. Shaw needed only 65 games to achieve 50 conference wins, tied for second-fastest in Pac-12 history (USC's Pete Carroll reached the 50-win mark through 60 league games).
- 160 • Stanford has never been shut out under Coach Shaw. The Cardinal has scored in 160 consecutive games, dating back to Nov. 4, 2006 (lost 42-0 to No. 9 USC at Stanford Stadium).
- 100 • Stanford has allowed 100 or fewer rushing yards 47 times under Coach Shaw (41-6 in such contests). Opponents have eclipsed 200 rushing yards only 16 times in 107 games under Coach Shaw.
- 2011 • Since Shaw's first season in 2011, Stanford's ...
 - 81 wins represent the winningest eight-year stretch in program history
 - 81 wins ranks seventh nationally
 - .757 winning pct. ranks eighth nationally
 - .764 conference winning pct. is the best of any Pac-12 program
 - 55 conference wins are the most of any Pac-12 program



PROGRAM

- 1 • Stanford has defeated at least one top-20 opponent on the road in seven of eight seasons under head coach David Shaw. Stanford had only one top-20 road win in the nine seasons prior to the start of Shaw's tenure in 2011 (at No. 2 USC on Oct. 6, 2007).
- 2 • Former Cardinal John Elway (Denver Broncos) and John Lynch (San Francisco 49ers) are NFL general managers. The other two schools with two NFL general managers? Connecticut and John Carroll.
- 5 • Five Cardinal have completed work for their undergraduate degree: fifth-year senior Alameen Murphy, fifth-year senior Bobby Okereke, fifth-year senior Alijah Holder, fifth-year senior Isaiah Brandt-Sims and fifth-year senior Brandon Fanaika.
- 13 • Shaw is one of 13 African-American FBS head coaches.
- 17 • Stanford overcame a 17-point deficit to post a 38-31 overtime win at Oregon (Sept. 22). It was the second-largest comeback win for the Cardinal since 1996 (trailed 21-0 in a 35-21 win at USC in 1999). Stanford has overcome a double-digit deficit in a winning effort 20 times since 1996, and six times under head coach David Shaw.
- 17 • Stanford requires students to declare a major before their junior year. Among the team's upperclassmen, 17 majors are represented. Majors are: aeronautics and astronautics, communication, computer science, economics, history, human biology, international relations, Japanese, mechanical engineering, media studies, management science and engineering, political science, product design, psychology, sociology, symbolic systems, and science, technology and society.
- 22 • Shaw is one of 22 head coaches currently coaching at their alma mater.
- 29 • Stanford's 29 fourth- and fifth-year seniors are the most of any Pac-12 program.
- 30 • Stanford's 2018 roster includes student-athletes from 30 different states and one foreign country.
- 30 • The Stanford Concussion and Brain Performance Center is at the forefront of concussion and traumatic brain injury research, and is incorporating state of the art eye-tracking tests -- EYE-SYNC -- in all of its studies. The EYE-SYNC test is administered with customized eye tracking technology, called Dynamic Visual Synchronization Goggles. The eye tracking test lasts 30 seconds, and the results show the ability to focus -- a key problem after a concussion.

ATHLETICS

- 6 • Stanford is one of six programs with at least one national championship in football, baseball and men's basketball. It is the only school with at least one national championship in football, baseball, men's basketball and women's basketball.
- 7 • Stanford is one of seven schools to earn Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) Public Recognition Award each of the past four seasons.
- 24 • Stanford won the 2017-18 Division I Learfield Sports Directors' Cup, extending its streak to 24 years of capturing the award presented to the most successful intercollegiate athletic department in the nation.
- 42 • Stanford, which sponsors 36 varsity sports, has won at least one NCAA team title in each of the past 42 academic years, representing the longest streak in NCAA history.
- 117 • The Cardinal leads the NCAA with 117 team titles.
- 142 • Stanford claimed five national team championships during the last academic year, increasing its overall total to 142, including 117 NCAA titles.

UNIVERSITY

- 1.1 • Stanford's inner campus includes about 1.1 million square feet of shrubs, 143,000 linear feet of groundcovers, 43,000 trees, 25 fountains and more than 800 different species of plants.
- 2 • Stanford's faculty includes two Presidential Medal of Freedom winners.
- 4 • Stanford's faculty includes four Pulitzer Prize winners.
- 5 • The top five undergraduate majors at Stanford include: computer science, engineering, human biology, management science and engineering, and mechanical engineering.
- 17 • The Stanford community includes 17 Nobel laureates.
- 24.8 • As of 2017, Stanford's endowment eclipsed 24.8 billion.
- 31 • Stanford faculty have won the Nobel Prize 31 times since the university's founding.
- 96 • Stanford's 8,180-acre campus is large enough to contain 96 Disneylands.
- 97 • About 97 percent of all eligible undergraduates live in campus housing.
- 150 • The 700-acre Stanford Research Park, created in 1951, is home to over 150 companies.
- 625 • There are more than 625 registered student organizations at Stanford.
- 700 • There are about 700 buildings on Stanford's campus that incorporate approximately 15.4 million square feet.
- 2,040 • Of the 47,450 applicants -- the largest application pool in school history -- for Stanford's class of 2022, only 2,040 were admitted. The admitted students came from all 50 states and 63 countries.
- 13,000 • There are an estimated 13,000 bikes at Stanford daily.

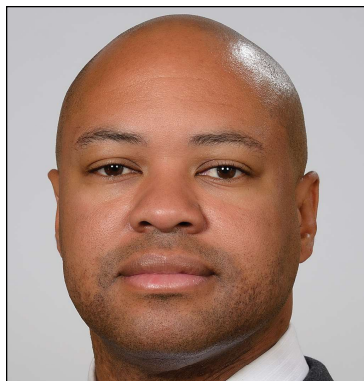

The JJ and Costello Show

STANFORD, Calif. - Stanford knew defenses were going to do whatever it takes to slow down Bryce Love after his record-setting 2017 season.

Being able to take advantage of that with the deep passing game will be key to the Cardinal's success this year.

JJ Arcega-Whiteside did just that, getting loose for three long touchdown catches from K.J. Costello to overcome a slow night by Love and No. 13 Stanford opened the season with a 31-10 victory over San Diego State.

Love was held to 29 yards on 18 carries as the Aztecs focused their defense on stopping the man who led all Power 5 backs with 2,118 yards rushing last season on the way to a Heisman Trophy runner-up finish.

After a slow start, the Cardinal made San Diego State pay for that decision. Costello connected with Arcega-Whiteside on a 38-yard score in the second quarter and then on plays from 19 and 80 yards in the third quarter as the Aztecs defensive backs struggled to contend with Stanford's big receiver. Arcega-Whiteside finished with six catches for 226 yards.

Costello added a 19-yard touchdown pass to Colby Parkinson in the fourth quarter to break open what had been a close game for more than a half. Costello finished 21 for 31 for 332 yards and four touchdowns.

The game turned following an odd sequence late in the first half. Noble Hall intercepted a deflected pass for San Diego State but then lost the ball when Stanford receiver Trenton Irwin raced back and knocked it loose before recovering the fumble.

Three plays later, Costello found Arcega-Whiteside deep for his first touchdown that gave Stanford a 9-7 lead at the half.

The Aztecs had scored first behind talented back Juwan Washington, who had runs of 22, 10 and 40 yards on a 92-yard drive that ended with his 4-yard score.

Stanford finally got on the board midway through the second quarter when Jake Bailey's 63-yard punt went out of bounds at the 1 and Bobby Okereke sacked Christian Chapman in the end zone.

Love Leads Stanford Past USC

STANFORD, Calif. - With Bryce Love and the key parts of Stanford's offense back, the Cardinal figured to be dynamic on that side of the ball.

Two games into the season, the defense showed that it is capable of leading the way, as well.

Joey Alfieri and crew helped harass talented freshman quarterback JT Daniels into four sacks and three turnovers and the 10th-ranked Cardinal held No. 17 Southern California to its fewest points in more than two decades in a 17-3 victory.

Stanford has allowed just 13 points so far this season and has not given up a touchdown in the past seven quarters against San Diego State and USC.

That kind of performance means the Cardinal haven't had to rely on big plays from Love to win. Love did bounce back from a 29-yard performance in the opener by rushing for 136 yards and a touchdown.

His 28-yard run sparked the opening drive that ended with his 6-yard score. He added a 59-yard run in the third quarter to set up a field goal.

The defense did the rest, holding USC to its fewest points since being shut out by Washington in 1997.

Stanford took control of the game late in the second quarter with a strip sack on fourth down against Daniels that set up K.J. Costello's 9-yard touchdown pass to Colby Parkinson that gave Stanford a 14-0 lead.

Daniels made an impressive debut last week for the Trojans when he threw for 282 yards and a touchdown against UNLV. But duplicating that against Stanford proved far more difficult with the Cardinal using blitzes to pressure Daniels.

Daniels went 16 for 34 for 215 yards with interceptions by Malik Antoine on his final two passes of the night. He was forced to leave the game for one possession in the first half with a bruised hand after a hard hit by Alfieri.

It was another big play by Alfieri that proved crucial late in the first half. Helton went for it on fourth-and-2 from the Cardinal 40, but Alfieri came free on a blitz and knocked the ball loose for Bobby Okereke to recover at the Stanford 49.

The Cardinal drove down field to score on Costello's touchdown pass with 34 seconds left in the half.

Stanford Tops Aggies

STANFORD, Calif. - Stanford made it through its season-opening three-game homestand unscathed. But with the schedule about to get much tougher, the Cardinal know they will need to be much better the next few weeks to remain perfect.

K.J. Costello overcame a rough start to throw two touchdown passes to JJ Arcega-Whiteside and No. 9 Stanford beat FCS-level UC Davis 30-10.

The game kicked off at the unusually early time of 11:01 a.m. local time in front of a sparse crowd at Stanford Stadium. The Cardinal even played without star running Bryce Love, who got the week off to heal some minor ailments.

After Stanford punted on the opening drive, Costello threw an interception to Nas Anesi deep in his own territory to set up an early UC Davis field goal.

Then one play after Costello's fumble that was returned for a TD was changed to an incomplete pass on replay, he sailed a pass that was intercepted by Isaiah Thomas.

UC Davis was unable to capitalize on that turnover, failing to convert a fourth-and-6 from the Cardinal 37. Stanford then took control by scoring on its next three drives, including TD passes of 9 and 88 yards from Costello to Arcega-Whiteside.

The defense did the rest against a UC Davis team that averaged 49 points per game and more than 500 yards of offense in season-opening wins over San Jose State and San Diego.

Stanford Rallies for Win Over No. 20 Oregon

EUGENE, Ore. - K.J. Costello threw for 327 yards and three touchdowns, the last a 23-yarder to Colby Parkinson in overtime, and No. 7 Stanford rallied for a 38-31 victory over No. 20 Oregon.

After Costello's touchdown pass to Parkinson, Stanford's Alameen Murphy intercepted Oregon quarterback Justin Herbert's pass in the end zone for the victory.

Bryce Love returned after sitting out last week against UC Davis to rest minor injuries. He ran for 89 yards and a touchdown as Stanford remained undefeated.

Love's 22-yard scoring run late in the third quarter cut Oregon's lead to 24-21, but Cyrus Habibi-Likio scored on a 1-yard run for the Ducks with 4:39 left.

In the frenzied final minutes of regulation, Stanford answered with Costello's 15-yard touchdown pass to JJ Arcega-Whiteside to narrow it again before Sean Barton recovered CJ Verdell's fumble on the Stanford 40 with 51 seconds left.

Costello passed for a pair of first downs on the ensuing drive and Jet Toner hit a 32-yard field to tie it and send the game into overtime.

Herbert threw for 346 yards and a touchdown while receiver Dillon Mitchell caught 14 passes for 239 yards in Oregon's first real challenge of the season after nonconference wins over Bowling Green, Portland State and San Jose State.

Oregon came out with a collective tenacity that it hadn't really shown this season. The Ducks' first series was capped by Tony Brooks-James' 7-yard touchdown run. Herbert got Oregon downfield with a 53-yard pass to Mitchell.

The Ducks went up 14-0 on Herbert's 7-yard pass to Jacob Breeland to open the second quarter.

Arcega-Whiteside scored on a 13-yard pass from Costello for his sixth touchdown reception of the season. He was tied at third nationally for touchdown catches going into the game.

Oregon answered on the next drive with Verdell's 48-yard scoring run to go up 21-7. The Ducks added a 38-yard field goal from Adam Stack and ran off the field for halftime celebrating the dominant performance by dancing and waving towels.

The momentum shifted late in the third quarter when Stanford's Joey Alfieri scooped up a fumble and ran 80 yards for the touchdown to narrow the gap to 24-14.

The Cardinal touchdown came just after Oregon had a touchdown overturned.

Love's touchdown closed the quarter before the frenetic final five minutes.

Irish Defeats Cardinal

NOTRE DAME, Ind. - No. 7 Stanford suffered its first loss of the season, falling on the road to No. 8 Notre Dame 38-17.

The Cardinal, which was beaten by the Irish for the first time since 2014, was also seeking its third victory over a ranked opponent this season, having already defeated No. 17/12 USC and No. 20/19 Oregon.

Saturday's contest also marked the first time in the series that both teams were carrying a top-10 AP ranking.

Notre Dame and Stanford traded touchdowns before the Irish eventually seized control, scoring 39 seconds before halftime to take a 21-14 lead into the break.

Bryce Love's 39-yard scamper to the end zone opened the scoring for Stanford, knotting the game at 7-7 late in the first quarter. Love finished with 73 yards on 17 carries despite leaving due to injury early in the fourth quarter.

K.J. Costello completed 15 of 27 passes for 174 yards, including a 4-yard strike to JJ Arcega-Whiteside for Stanford's second score of the game. It was the eighth touchdown catch of the year and 22nd career for Arcega-Whiteside, who now ranks fourth in school history in that category.

Arcega-Whiteside and Trenton Irwin caught five passes apiece.

Jet Toner matched his career high with a 46-yard field goal at the 2:16 mark of the third quarter, keeping the Cardinal within striking distance at 24-17. Toner improved to 7-10 on field goals over 40 yards for his career.

Utes Down Cardinal

STANFORD, Calif. - Jaylon Johnson returned an interception 100 yards for a touchdown and Zack Moss ran for two scores to lead Utah to a 40-21 victory over No. 14 Stanford.

Moss ran for 160 yards and the Utes intercepted K.J. Costello on back-to-back first-half drives in the red zone to snap an 11-game home winning streak for the Cardina, which suffered its first home loss since a 10-5 setback to Colorado on Oct. 22, 2016.

Johnson intercepted the first at the goal line and raced down the sideline for the third 100-yard interception return in school history and first since Harold Lusk did it in 1994 against Colorado State.

The Cardinal, which was playing without Bryce Love due to an injury, fell behind 24-7 at halftime with a 2-yard run from Trevor Speights accounting for its only first-half score.

Cameron Scarlett's 1-yard run with 5:02 remaining in the third quarter trimmed Utah's lead to 27-14.

K.J. Costello, who completed 26 of 41 passes for 381 yards, threw a 26-yard touchdown pass to Michael Wilson with 1:44 remaining in the third quarter, keeping Stanford within striking distance at 27-21 before Utah closed the game with 13 unanswered points.

The Cardinal totaled 381 receiving yards, with Kaden Smith (8-120), JJ Arcega-Whiteside (8-103) and Trenton Irwin (7-100) all reaching the century mark. Saturday's contest marked the first time three players totaled 100 receiving yards since Oct. 10, 1998 against Oregon State, when Troy Walters (159), Dave Davis (151) and DeRonnie Pitts (124) accomplished the feat.

TEMPE, Ariz. - K.J. Costello threw for 231 yards and a touchdown, and Stanford remained in the thick of the Pac-12 North Division race with a 20-13 win over Arizona State.

Stanford needed a half to get its offense fully rolling off a bye week, held to a pair of field goals in the first half. The Cardinal put together a pair of impressive drives in the third quarter and had a 16-minute advantage in time of possession to tie No. 14 Washington atop the Pac-12 North.

Arizona State was held to a field goal in the first half before Manny Wilkins scrambled for a 10-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter to pull the Sun Devils within 20-13.

Arizona State got the ball back at its own 16-yard line with 2:20 left, but couldn't get off a final play from Stanford's 20 after a short gain.

Wilkins threw for 353 yards, but the Sun Devils turned it over three times, including one on a failed trick play, to lose for the fourth time in five games.

Arizona State had a good drive going late in the first half, but failed on a trick play when receiver N'Keal Harry's pass off a reverse was intercepted at Stanford's 11.

The Cardinal appeared to have a touchdown when Cameron Scarlett turned a screen pass into a 59-yard score, but it was called back on a holding penalty.

Jet Toner hit his second field goal of the half, from 31 yards, on the final play of the half to put Stanford up 6-3.

Arizona State opened the second half with Brandon Ruiz's second field goal.

Stanford opened by dominating the Sun Devils on a pair of long scoring drives to take control.

Costello hit JJ Arcega-Whiteside on a 28-yard touchdown pass on the first drive, and Scarlett scored on a 1-yard dive to put the Cardinal up 20-6.

Cardinal Drops Shootout

STANFORD, Calif. - Gardner Minshew completed his first 19 passes of the second half and drove No. 14 Washington State to a 42-yard field goal by Blake Mazza with 19 seconds remaining to put the Cougars in sole possession of first place in the Pac-12 North with a 41-38 victory over No. 24 Stanford.

Minshew completed 40 of 50 passes for 438 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Cougars to their third straight win over the Cardinal.

K.J. Costello kept Stanford within striking distance, throwing a 25-yard touchdown pass to JJ Arcega-Whiteside to even the game at 38-38 with 1:25 remaining. Costello finished with 323 passing yards and four touchdowns, becoming the first Cardinal quarterback to record multiple four-touchdown games in a season since Andrew Luck in 2011.

Minshew engineered the winning drive in the final 1:25 with the big play coming on a 35-yard pass to Jamire Calvin on third-and-2 from the 33. Minshew completed one more pass to move the ball to the 25 and after two incomplete passes, Mazza made his kick to win it.

With No. 15 Washington losing at California, the Cougars head into the final month of the season alone in first place in the conference and remain the only one-loss team in the Pac-12.

Arcega-Whiteside continued his torrid play, hauling in a career-high 10 receptions for 111 yards and two touchdowns. Arcega-Whiteside, who moved into 17th place in school history with 1,792 career receiving yards, is the first Cardinal player with 11 touchdown catches in a season since 1980.

Kaden Smith hauled in nine catches for 112 yards while Trenton Irwin totaled 80 yards on eight receptions, representing his third straight game with at least seven catches.

Stanford built a 28-14 lead with 1:04 remaining before halftime, as Costello found Houston Heimuli from one yard out. Washington State quickly answered with a 23-yard field goal as time expired, closing the gap to 28-17.

Jet Toner's 40-yard field goal at the 6:16 mark of the third quarter extended the Cardinal's lead to 31-24 before the Cougars responded with a pair of touchdowns to open the fourth.

Comeback Falls Short

SEATTLE - K.J. Costello, Kaden Smith and Bryce Love jolted the Stanford offense in the second half, but a furious Cardinal comeback fell short against Washington, 27-23.

The Huskies built a 21-0 lead thanks to a 2-yard touchdown run by quarterback Jake Browning, an 11-yard touchdown pass from Browning to Drew Sample and Gaskin's 6-yard run early in the second quarter. But the Huskies offense was unable to find the end zone the rest of the way, making for a nervy second half after Stanford's Costello got hot.

Costello threw a 14-yard touchdown to Kaden Smith and Bryce Love ran for a 5-yard touchdown late in the third quarter to pull Stanford within 24-14. Collin Riccitelli hit a 21-yard field goal with nine minutes remaining after Washington's defense held inside the 10 to pull the Cardinal within 24-17.

Washington answered with one more drive and Peyton Henry hit a 38-yard field goal with 5:09 left and gave the Huskies a 10-point lead, but Costello made the final minutes uncomfortable hitting Trenton Irwin for a 33-yard touchdown with 3:24 left. Stanford missed the extra point and the Huskies lead was 27-23.

Washington was only able to run 79 seconds off the clock before punting and Stanford took possession at its 15 with 2:05 left. Costello hit five passes to get to the Washington 34 with 10 seconds left. He missed an end zone throw for Irwin and on the last play Costello was intercepted by Taylor Rapp at the goal line.

Costello was 29 of 43 for 347 yards with two touchdowns. Love rushed 18 times for 71 yards and a score. Smith finished with eight catches for 107 yards and a touchdown.

Dam Busted

STANFORD, Calif. - Sophomore tight end Colby Parkinson caught all four of K.J. Costello's touchdown passes and Stanford beat Oregon State 48-17.

Bryce Love scored a touchdown and rushed for 90 yards. Cameron Scarlett also scored for the Cardinal with a career-long touchdown run of 41 yards. Dorian Maddox scored on a 1-yard run, his first career touchdown.

Last year the teams combined for 486 total yards in Stanford's 15-14 win. The teams had 632 by halftime on Saturday.

Costello threw for 342 yards and touchdown passes of 28, 9, 75 and 5 yards. He's thrown four touchdowns in three games this season, the most since Andrew Luck did in 2011. Parkinson finished with six catches and 166 yards.

Parkinson became integral to Stanford's offense after top receiver JJ Arcega-Whiteside suffered an injury in the first quarter of last week's loss at Washington.

Love, who did not play after a brief appearance in the third quarter, finished off a 5-play, 75-yard drive with a 28-yard run that brought comparisons from last year when he set a school rushing record.

The Cardinal broke it open in the second quarter, scoring the first three touchdowns, all passes to Parkinson, and taking a 34-7 advantage before the Beavers closed within 34-17 by halftime.

JJ and Costello Strike Again

PASADENA, Calif. -- K.J. Costello threw for 344 yards and career-high five touchdowns leading Stanford to a 49-42 victory over UCLA at the Rose Bowl.

The Cardinal, which has won 11 straight over the Bruins, trailed 42-41 midway through the fourth quarter when the junior threw a 52-yard touchdown pass to Osiris St. Brown. Bryce Love ran it in for the two-point conversion to put them up by a touchdown.

UCLA drove to the Stanford 43 with under a minute remaining before turning it over on downs.

JJ Arcega-Whiteside -- who had seven receptions for 106 yards -- caught three touchdowns. He has 14, which ties the school's single-season record first set by James Lofton in 1977. Trenton Irwin (seven receptions, 103 yards) also had a touchdown while Love rushed for 85 yards on 22 carries with a TD for the Cardinal.

UCLA's Wilton Speight was 29 of 47 for 466 yards and an interception and one rushing touchdown in his final collegiate game. Tight end Caleb Wilson was his main target with nine receptions for 184 yards.

Joshua Kelley rushed for 55 yards on 18 carries with two touchdowns and Martell Irby had 47 yards and a score.

UCLA trailed 41-27 with 5:24 remaining on a Arcega-Whiteside TD from Costello before beginning its rally. UCLA got its first safety since 2012 when Martin Andrus tackled Love in the end zone. On the free kick, Darnay Holmes returned it 93 yards to bring the Bruins within 41-36 with 2:09 left in the third.

After a Stanford punt, the Bruins took a one-point lead on a 13-play, 90-yard drive, culminating in a Speight keeper from a yard out.

BERKELEY, Calif. -- Cameron Scarlett caught a short pass from K.J. Costello and raced 46 yards for one of his two touchdowns, Paulson Adebo intercepted two passes and Stanford relied on its defense to win its ninth straight Big Game, 23-13 over California.

The Cardinal scored on their first two drives of the game to take a 10-0 lead on Scarlett's first score and held on against the Golden Bears to extend the longest winning streak in the series that began in 1892.

Adebo made a spectacular one-handed interception in the end zone to preserve the lead in the fourth quarter for the Cardinal. He added another interception late in the quarter that he returned to the 3-yard line that set up Scarlett's second score and helped Stanford keep The Axe for another year.

Bryce Love lost a fumble the play after Adebo's interception but Stanford's defense stepped up again and forced a field goal that Greg Thomas missed from 36 yards to keep the score 13-6.

The Cardinal then burned more than seven minutes off the clock, with help from a third-down roughing the passer penalty against Tevin Paul, before making it a 10-point lead on Jet Toner's third field goal of the day.

This year's matchup featured both teams with at least seven wins for just the second time in the past 27 seasons. The game was delayed two weeks after being postponed on Nov. 17 because of unhealthy air conditions from Northern California wildfires.

There was a boisterous crowd hopeful the Bears would end their Big Game slump but Stanford started fast. Costello picked apart Cal's defense on the opening drive to set up Toner's 26-yard field goal and Scarlett added his long score on the second drive.

Thomas kicked two field goals in the second quarter for Cal but 290-pound fullback Malik McMorris lost a fumble late in the half and the Cardinal drove down for a field goal in the final seconds that made it 13-6 at the break.
