SERIES **HISTORY**

All-time vs. Washington State: 47-25 (.625)

- First meeting in 1964 | Streak: Washington State, 1
- Last Series: W (9-0); W (3-1); L (3-2) at Pullman, Wash. (May 23-24, 2015)
- Stanford took two of three from Washington State in the final series of 2015. The Cardinal swept a doubleheader in Pullman, but dropped the final game of the year in 11 innings, 3-2.
 - Stanford has won five straight series against the Cougars (11-4 record since 2011).
- The last time Washington State took a series from Stanford was in 2010 when the Cougars took two of three on The Farm.
- The Cardinal is 23-13 against Washington State at Sunken Diamond.
- Stanford beat WSU, 12-11, May 24, 1987 in the 1987 West I Regional on its way to its first of two straight national titles.

LAST **TIME OUT**

- A shutdown pitching performance by Tristan Beck and the bullpen propelled Stanford to a 2-0 series-opening victory over Kansas. Beck allowed no runs on six hits and a walk in 6.1 innings. Colton Hock came in as relief in the seventh and struck out five consecutive batters before handing the ball over to Chris Viall in the ninth who picked up the save. The Cardinal struck for two runs in the bottom of the fourth inning when Nico Hoerner led off with a triple to the right-center field gap. Mikey Diekroeger followed with a double to bring Hoerner home and give Stanford a 1-0 lead. Quinn Brodey followed with a sacrifice fly.
- On Saturday, Stanford's offense erupted for 10 runs on 13 hits to earn a 10-4 victory. Chris Castellanos came in as relief in the top of the first inning to pick up the win. Castellanos held Kansas to two runs on seven hits and one walk with four strikeouts in six innings. Seven Stanford players registered at least one hit with five players recording multi-hit games. Matt Winaker had a big day at the plate, going 3-for-4 with two RBI and two runs. Stanford did a majority of its damage in the fifth inning, rallying for seven runs on seven hits.
- Freshmen Brandon Wulff, Nico Hoerner and Duke Kinamon combined for six of Stanford's eight hits, including two milestone home runs, and all five of the team's RBI's in Sunday's 6-2 win to clinch the sweep. Summerville pitched 5.1 innings in relief and allowed just one unearned run to earn his second win of the year.
- Stanford also played on Monday in a game that was suspended in the ninth inning with the Cardinal leading 12-9 at UC Davis. The game will resume on May 17 at Sunken Diamond.

UP **NEXT**

- Stanford plays at home for all but two mid-week games between March 1-April 5.
- Following the Pac-12 opening series, the Cardinal head to San Jose State on Monday.
- Stanford then hosts USC for three games, April 1-3—all on the Pac-12 Network.
- Stanford's next overnight trip will be at UCLA, April 7-9 (last was Feb. 25-28 at Texas).

We're No. 1 🤞

• Stanford leads the nation in fielding percentage (.988). The Cardinal have made the fewest errors in the country (295 teams) with just seven in the first 15 games.

Stanford Stats III

- Stanford is No. 5 in the nation in ERA (2.18) and has allowed the second-fewest runs in the country (38). Only St. Bonaventure has allowed fewer (37 in two fewer games).
- Stanford is also No. 4 in the NCAA in hits/9inn (6.35) and WHIP (1.01).
- In addition to those categories, Stanford also leads the Pac-12 in opposing batting average (.200), and fewest hits (96), walks (96) and home runs (2) allowed.
- Five of Stanford's 10 wins have come against the Top 25, including two on the road.
- Stanford outscored Kansas 18-6 in the three-game sweep and had an ERA of 1.67.
- Stanford has held its opponent to two or fewer runs in nine of its 10 wins.
- The Cardinal is 7-0 this year when scoring first.

Stanford Streaks 📈



- Junior catcher Alex Dunlap reached base in his first nine games—that's the longest streak of the season for a Stanford player. Bryce Carter owns the longest active streak (6).
- Junior shortstop Tommy Edman has played in 104 straight games (started 101 in a row).
- Three-game sweep of Kansas was Stanford's first since May 24-25, 2015 at Utah.
- Stanford's last four-game win streak was May 23-30, 2014 (five in a row).

Closing the Door

- Stanford's bullpen has an ERA of 0.74 and opponents are hitting just .160.
- The reserves also have 61 strikeouts and just 22 walks and 33 hits in 60.2 innings.
- Colton Hock, Tyler Thorne and Chris Viall have not surrendered an ER in 36.2 innings.
- Stanford is 9-0 when leading after six innings this season.

Fab Freshmen 🚳



- Tristan Beck leads the team in wins (3), Nico Hoerner has started every game and leads the team in batting average (.304), Duke Kinamon and Brandon Wulff started all three games last series with slugging percentages of .556 and 1.250, respectively, and Kris Bubic has a 2.25 ERA with 1 save in three starts and one relief appearance.
- In all, head coach Mark Marquess added 11 freshmen in his latest recruiting class.
- Three pitchers (one lefty), four infielders, three outfielders and a catcher. Six are from the homestate of California, three from Georgia and one apiece from Colorado & Nevada.

Pac-12 Pitchers of the Week 🍅



- Stanford won the first two Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week awards this season.
- Colton Hock earned the award on March 1 after throwing 5.2 scoreless innings in relief

in the longest recorded shut out in the program's history (since 1959)—Stanford won at #23 Texas, 1-0 in 12 innings, on Feb. 25. Hock finished with a career-high eight strikeouts and allowed just three hits.

- Tristan Beck earned the conference honor in the first week—he was the first Stanford hurler to win the award since 2013 MLB first overall pick Mark Appel in May of 2013.
- Beck became the second Stanford freshman to start Opening Day since Mike Mussina in 1988 (teammate Cal Quantrill was the other in 2014).

CARDINAL NOTES

Preseason All-America

- Juniors Cal Quantrill and Tommy Edman each earned preseason All-America accolades.
- Quantrill was name third team Louisville Slugger Preseason All-America accolades from Collegiate Baseball News, and third team preseason All-America accolades from Baseball America.
- Quantrill was a Louisville Slugger and Perfect Game Freshman All-American before his sophomore season was cut short due to injury. Prior to the injury, the Port Hope, Ontario, native was 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA last season. As a freshman, Quantrill was 7-5 with a 2.68 ERA in 17 starts, which included two complete games and 98 strikeouts in 110.2 innings. He earned All-Pac-12 honors and was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year.
- A math and computational science major, Edman was the only Cardinal to start every game last season and finished with a team-high 29 RBI, 13 doubles, 22 multi-hit games, and was third on the team with a .296 average.

- Junior Cal Quantrill was also named to the Golden Spikes Award preseason watch list.
- One of 50 players named to the award given annually to the nation's top amateur player.
- One of 4 players to be on that list for the second straight year.

Klein Field at Sunken Diamond Enhancements 📼 🥕

- Long regarded as one of the most beautiful college baseball facilities in the country, Klein Field at Sunken Diamond underwent several renovations this offseason.
- Upgraded playing surface—completely replaced, laser-graded flat, features Bermuda grass and top-grade Pennsylvania clay in addition to new irrigation system.
- A modernized and expanded clubhouse now includes a players lounge, dedicated athletic training space and coaches locker room.
- Other developments included the modification and expansion of the ticket office, concession stands and restrooms.

TV Games

- Eighteen Stanford baseball games will be broadcast on the Pac-12 Network and Pac-12 Bay Area in 2016.
- Eleven of the 18 will feature the newly-renovated Klein Field at Sunken Diamond and 14 will be Pac-12 matchups.
- Only USC and Arizona State will have more televised games on the conference network (19) than the Cardinal this year.

Preseason Prognostications 👰

- Pac-12 coaches picked Stanford baseball to finish seventh in the conference in 2016.
- Oregon State was selected as the favorite. The Beavers earned 98 points and eight first-place votes, while Stanford garnered 49 points.


