Stanford plays its sixth road game in its first eight contests, when the Cardinal travels to Lawrence, Kansas, for a Saturday matchup with No. 2 Kansas at Allen Field House. Stanford's matchup with the Jayhawks marks its third nationally-ranked opponent away from Maples Pavilion in seven games this season.

YOUNG SQUAD

Eleven of Stanford's 15 players are in their first or second year playing. Only senior Josh Sharma and juniors Marcus Sheffield, Trevor Stanback and Rodney Herenton entered the year with at least two seasons played. Through seven games, first and second-year players have accounted for 79.6 percent of Stanford's scoring (383 of 481) and 82.7 percent of Stanford's rebounding (210 of 254).

Stanford's starting lineup is made up of three sophomores (Daejon Davis, KZ Okpala, Oscar da Silva) and two freshmen (Cormac Ryan and Bryce Wills).

JAYHAWK GREAT LEADS THE CARDINAL INTO LAWRENCE

Stanford head coach Jerod Haase returns to Allen Fieldhouse, where he was a star player for Kansas from 1995-97. Haase earned his Bachelor of Science in business administration in 1997 and his Masters in business in 2000. After playing his freshman season at California, Haase transferred to Kansas where he helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and still ranks 11th in school history in three-point field goals (156) and steals (174). Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points (which now ranks 33rd all-time). While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Paul Pierce, Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished 34-2. He averaged 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

This is Haase's second visit to Allen Field House as the head coach of the Cardinal. Nearly two years ago to the day (Dec. 3, 2016), Stanford lost an 89-74 decision to No. 4 Kansas in Lawrence.

STANFORD AGAINST TOP-FIVE TEAMS

Stanford is 5-14 against Associated Press top-five teams since the 2000-01 season. The Cardinal last defeated an AP top-five team on Jan. 28. 2007, earning a 75-68 victory over No. 3 UCLA at home. Stanford's last road win vs. an AP top-five team was Jan. 10, 2004, when No. 4 Stanford defeated top-ranked Arizona, 82-76, in Tucson. The Cardinal's last neutral-site win vs. a top-five opponent was No. 21 Stanford's 64-58 win over top-ranked Kansas Dec. 7, 2003 in Anaheim. Saturday marks the Cardinal's first top-five opponent since an 89-75 defeat at UCLA on Jan. 8, 2017.

AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

No. 3 Kansas is Stanford's third nationally-ranked opponent this season. Stanford is 1-15 vs. ranked foes in the AP poll in the Jerod Haase era, defeating No. 16 Arizona State (86-77) Jan. 17, 2018. Stanford's last road win over a ranked team came at No. 9 Texas (74-71 OT) Dec. 23, 2014. Jerod Haase owns a 3-23 record against ranked teams as a head coach. He played 10 ranked foes at UAB, leading the Blazers to a win over No. 9 Iowa State (60-59) in the NCAA Tournament on March 19, 2015, and a victory over No. 16 North Carolina (63-59) in Birmingham, on Dec. 1, 2013.

AGAINST KANSAS

Saturday is the 14th all-time meeting between Stanford and Kansas. The Jayhawks lead the all-time series, 10-3, however, the Cardinal has won two of the last four. In the most recent meeting, Kansas defeated Stanford, 75-54, on Dec. 21, 2017 at Golden 1 Center in Sacramento, California. In its last trip to Lawrence, the Cardinal fell to the Jayhawks, 89-74, on Dec. 3, 2016. Prior to that, Stanford defeated Kansas, 60-57, March 23, 2014, in St. Louis to reach the NCAA Sweet 16.

AGAINST THE BIG XII

Stanford owns a 14-19 all-time record against current members of the Big XII Conference. The Cardinal has played Kansas (13) the most of any current team in the league. Stanford's last meeting with a Big XII opponent was against Oklahoma State in Stillwater, Oklahoma, in the second round of the NIT last March.

OKPALA'S IMPACT AS A SOPHOMORE

Sophomore KZ Okpala is averaging a team-best 16.3 ppg in 31.7 mpg through seven games this season. He averaged 10.9 ppg in 31.0 mpg in his first seven games last season. The forward, who had a career-best 29 points in the season opener against Seattle, is ninth in the Pac-12 in scoring. He was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Week on Nov. 12.

RYAN ON TARGET FROM DOWNTOWN

Freshman Cormac Ryan is averaging 2.1 three-point field goals per game. He scored a team-best 12 points, all in the second half and all on three-pointers, against Florida in the Battle 4 Atlantis. The freshman has recorded at least four three-point field goals in a game in three of Stanford's seven contest (5 vs. Seattle, 4 vs. North Carolina, 4 vs. Florida).

Ryan is second on the team in scoring, averaging 10.7 ppg. He is shooting 30.6 percent from three-point range (15-of-49).

DAVIS CONTRIBUTING ON BOTH ENDS

Sophomore Daejon Davis, who broke Brevin Knight's school freshman assist record with 160 last season, has started all 40 career games he has played in. The point guard is averaging 7.6 ppg this year, with 10 steals in seven games. He ranks ninth in the Pac-12 in steals (1.3 spg). The sophomore has posted at least four points, four rebounds, four assists and four steals in two games this season against UNC Wilmington and Middle Tennessee. He has posted at least four points, four rebounds and four assists in three of Stanford's seven games so far. The point guard matched his career-high rebound total with 10 boards against the Blue Raiders.

YOUNGEST PLAYER IN THE PAC-12

With a birthdate of October 13, 2000, Bryce Wills is the youngest player in the Pac-12 and one of the youngest in Division I college basketball. With most of the Division I schools reporting, Wills is the seventh-youngest player in the nation this season. He has started the last four games and is coming off a career-best 10-point performance against Portland State.

DA SILVA'S SECOND-HALF PRODUCTION

Oscar da Silva has scored 35 of his 50 points on the season in the second half. Over the last five games, 31 of his 40 points have come after halftime.

SCHOOL-RECORD SHOOTING PERCENTAGE IN WIN OVER SEATTLE

In the season-opening win over Seattle, Stanford posted a school-record 73.3 three-point field goal percentage. The Cardinal connected on 11-of-15 attempts, led by Cormac Ryan's 5-of-6 FG percentage. The old mark was 72.7 percent (8-of-11) vs. Oregon State on Dec. 17, 1988.

MOST STEALS IN 22 YEARS IN VICTORY AT UNC WILMINGTON

In the win at UNCW, Stanford recorded 15 steals, matching its best total in a game in the last 22 years. The only other time Stanford had 15 steals during that span was against Oregon State on Jan. 5, 2006.

RYAN POSTS THIRD-BEST POINT TOTAL IN DEBUT

Cormac Ryan's 16-point performance in his collegiate debut against Seattle was the third most by a true freshman in his debut in the program's 104-year history. Ryan connected on five threes, similar to now-sophomore Isaac White's collegiate debut last season (17 points on five three pointers).

BACK-TO-BACK TOP-20 RECRUITING CLASSES

In Stanford's first seven games, four true freshmen have made their first collegiate appearances. Cormac Ryan led the way with 16 points in 33 minutes in the season opener against Seattle. Jaiden Delaire had eight points in 25 minutes against the Redhawks. Lukas Kisunas had two points in five minutes. Bryce Wills made his collegiate debut at UNCW, with three points in 14 minutes. He has started the last four games. The Cardinal's class of newcomers was ranked as high as No. 20 nationally, giving the program back-to-back top-20 recruiting classes. Stanford's 2017 class of Daejon Davis, KZ Okpala, Oscar da Silva and Isaac White was ranked No. 8 nationally.

SHEFFIELD RETURNS

Redshirt junior Marcus Sheffield has returned to the lineup this season, after missing the entire 2017-18 season. He injured his leg in practice a couple days before the regular-season opener last year. Sheffield, who poured in a career-best 35 points against Arizona State on Dec. 30, 2016, averaged 6.7 ppg during his true sophomore campaign in 2016-17. Sheffield is averaging 6.0 ppg in 15.6 mpg off the bench in the first seven games of 2018-19.

KISUNAS A PRESENCE IN THE POST

After playing five minutes in the first two games (did not see action at UNCW), freshman Lukas Kisunas played 12 minutes in the second half at No. 7 North Carolina. The forward scored two points, collected four rebounds and a block in extended action against the Tar Heels in Cha-

pel Hill. He scored four points in eight minutes last time out against Portland State.

2017-18 SNAPSHOT

Stanford's 2018-19 roster includes two returning starters and nine letterwinners overall from last season's squad that won 19 games overall and reached the postseason for the first time in three years.

Davis, who started all 33 games he played in last season, was named to the five-member All-Pac-12 Freshman Team last year after averaging 10.7 points and 4.8 assists. He broke Brevin Knight's freshman assist record with 160. Okpala, who started 21 of the 23 games he played in, averaged 10.0 ppg last year.

PAC-12 PRESEASON POLL

Stanford was picked ninth in the Pac-12 Conference men's basketball preseason poll, as voted on by the media who cover the league.

The Cardinal, picked fifth by the media in last season's preseason poll, finished third in the conference in 2017-18 with an 11-7 record for its best conference finish and most league wins in a decade.

CARDINAL INKS TERRY FOR 2019

Head Coach Jerod Haase announced the signing of nationally-ranked point guard Tyrell Terry to a National Letter of Intent in November. The 6-1, 160-pound guard out of Minneapolis, Minnesota, is a consensus four-star prospect and one of the top point guard's in the Class of 2019. A star for De La Salle High School in Minneapolis, Terry is ranked No. 61 in the 2019 class by 247Sports, No. 81 by Rivals and No. 90 by ESPN. The point guard is No. 76 in the 247Sports composite rankings. He is the third-ranked prospect in the state of Minnesota by all three outlets. Terry is rated as the fifth-best point guard in the class by 247Sports, while Rivals ranks him No. 11 at his position and ESPN has him at No. 12 in their positional rankings.

HAASE INCREASES TEAM WIN TOTALS EACH SEASON

Jerod Haase has led his teams to increased win totals in each of his first six full seasons as a head coach. In his first season as a head coach in 2012-13, Haase guided UAB to 16 wins, eventually posting 26 wins and a second consecutive postseason berth in his final year with the Blazers in 2015-16. After Stanford earned 14 wins in his first season on The Farm in 2016-17, he led the Cardinal to 19 wins and an NIT berth last season.

The Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball Jerod Haase

Overall: 117-89 (Six seasons) Stanford: 37-36 (Two seasons)

In just his first two seasons as Stanford's Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball, Jerod Haase has already left a strong imprint on the program. Under his leadership, the Cardinal has instilled an invested, tough and selfless attitude that has elevated Stanford to success it hasn't enjoyed in a decade.

In his second season on The Farm, Haase guided the Cardinal to a thirdplace finish in the Pac-12 with 11 conference wins, the program's highest finish and most league victories in 10 seasons. Competing without two starters for half the season, Stanford won 19 games overall and earned a postseason berth for the first time in three years with a second-round appearance in the National Invitation Tournament.

In two seasons with Haase and his staff, several members of the Cardinal have earned individual accolades. Forward Reid Travis has been voted a First Team All-Pac-12 selection by the league's coaches and garnered NABC All-District laurels each of the last two seasons. Forward Dorian Pickens was named an all-conference player for his performance on the court and the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year for his efforts in the classroom this past season. Point guard Daejon Davis was named to the five-member Pac-12 All-Freshman Team in 2017-18.

In two full recruiting cycles, Haase and his staff have landed top-tier classes. Stanford's 2017 recruiting class was regarded as one of the best in school history. The four-member group was rated a top-10 class nationally by many, ranked as high as eighth by Rivals. The Cardinal's 2018 class is again regarded among the best in the nation. In his first year with the Cardinal in 2016-17, Stanford posted 14 wins against one of the toughest schedules. Stanford finished in the top-10 percent among men's basketball programs in the classroom as well.

Haase was appointed Stanford's 18th men's basketball coach on March 25, 2016. At UAB, Haase led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase compiled an 80-53 overall record while improving the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB

capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in his final season at the helm of the Blazers, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25, while ranking among the nation's best in field goal percentage (.478 – 24th),

assists per game (18.4 – 4th) and blocks per game (4th – 6.1).

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. More impressively, Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 under-

classmen – all players recruited by Haase and his staff – and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall while notching three victories against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game. During Haase's first

year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games and collected a victory in the conference tournament.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003. When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Calif., Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection. Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' 1997 Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Haase earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000. Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

In 2017, Haase joined the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance, the organization that uses the power of positive reinforcement to pursue winning and the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.
