RINGING IN THE NEW YEAR IN LA

Stanford opens the Pac-12 Conference schedule in Los Angeles Thursday, meeting UCLA at Pauley Pavilion at 8 p.m. on ESPN. The Cardinal, winners of five of its last seven, finished the regular-season nonconference slate with at least seven wins for the eighth time in nine years.

YOUNG SQUAD

Eleven of Stanford's 15 players are in their first or second year playing. Only senior Josh Sharma and juniors Marcus Sheffield, Trevor Stanback and Rodney Herenton entered the year with at least two seasons played. Through 12 games, first and second-year players have accounted for 81.2% of Stanford's scoring (714 of 879) and 79.2% of Stanford's rebounding (346 of 437).

Stanford's starting lineup in five games this season has been made up of three sophomores and two freshmen. In four games, sophomores Daejon Davis, KZ Okpala and Oscar da Silva have started alongside freshmen Cormac Ryan and Bryce Wills. Against Long Beach State last time out, the sophomore trio of Davis, Okpala and da Silva started alongside Wills and fellow freshman Jaiden Delaire. The Cardinal is one of only four teams in Division I that have started all freshmen and sophomores this season, joining East Carolina, Incarnate Word and Mount St. Mary's.

DAVIS DOMINANT IN DECEMBER

Sophomore Daejon Davis averaged 17.6 points, 5.2 assists and 2.0 steals in Stanford's five games in December. The point guard has matched his season-high scoring total of 19 in three of the last five games against No. 2 Kansas, Eastern Washington and San Francisco.

Davis is averaging 19.3 points, 6.3 assists and 4.0 rebounds in three career games against UCLA. He posted career-highs in points (23) and assists (10) at UCLA as a freshman last season.

FREQUENT FLYERS

Thursday marks Stanford's eighth game away from The Farm in its first 13 contests, with the Cardinal traveling 16,771 miles. Stanford has played outside the Pacific time zone in six of its seven previous road games, traveling to Chapel Hill and Wilmington, North Carolina, Lawrence, Kansas and the Bahamas. Stanford spent 16 of the first 26 days of the season (Nov. 6-Dec. 2) on the road.

SHARMA'S CAREER NIGHT EARNS THE SENIOR PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior Josh Sharma was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Week on Monday, following his career-night against Long Beach State on Saturday. Sharma earned his first career conference honor following his first career double-double with a career-high 23 points and a career-best 18 rebounds. He played 28 minutes off the bench, finishing 10-of-15 from the field with three dunks.

HOW SHARMA'S PERFORMANCE STACKS UP HISTORICALLY

Josh Sharma's performance against Long Beach State marked just the third time in the last 22 years a Stanford player posted at least 23 points and 18 rebounds in a game. Michael Humphrey recorded 26 points and 18 rebounds against Pacific on Nov. 12, 2017 and Curtis Borchardt registered 25 points and 21 rebounds against Arizona on Feb. 2, 2002. He is one of seven players in the nation to record at least 23 points and 18 rebounds in a game this season and one of 23 players in the Pac-12 in the last 22 years to achieve the feat.

Sharma's 12 offensive rebounds in the contest tied for the most in the nation this season. He joined Washington's Jon Brockman (vs. Stanford on Jan. 8, 2009) as the only Pac-12 players with at least 12 offensive rebounds in a game since the 1996-97 season.

The senior's rebounding total is the most in a game by a Stanford player since Humphrey posted 20 rebounds at Oklahoma State last March. It is the second-most by a Pac-12 player this season.

The rebounding total was more than double his previous career-high of nine against Middle Tennessee State earlier this season. The point total was eight points better than his previous career-best total of 15 against Cal State Northridge during his sophomore season.

AGAINST UCLA

UCLA leads the all-time series, 145-94. Stanford and UCLA split last year's regular-season series, with each team winning at home. The Bruins defeated the Cardinal in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament last season. Stanford has lost 12 consecutive games at UCLA. The Cardinal's last victory against the Bruins at UCLA was Jan. 20, 2005, as Dan Grunfeld scored a game-high 25 points to lead Stanford to a 75-64 victory.

STANFORD IN CONFERENCE OPENERS

Stanford owns a 20-20 record in conference openers since the 1978-79 season (15-9 home, 5-11 away). The Cardinal has lost its last two Pac-12 openers, falling to California (77-74) last season and Arizona State (98-93) the year before. Thursday marks the first time in six years Stanford will open the Pac-12 season on the road. Stanford last opened the conference schedule with UCLA on Dec. 29, 2011 at home, a 60-59 victory over the Bruins. Thursday marks the first time since Dec. 29, 2005, Stanford will open the conference slate at UCLA.

JEROD HAASE IN CONFERENCE OPENERS

Jerod Haase is 2-4 in conference openers as a head coach with an 0-2 mark at Stanford. He coached UAB to victories over Middle Tennessee to open the 2015 and 2016 Conference-USA slate, after dropping conference-opening decisions to Middle Tennessee in 2014 and UCF in 2013.

THREE-POINT FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE DEFENSE

Stanford is third in the Pac-12 and 38th nationally in three-point field goal percentage defense. The Cardinal has limited opponents to just 29.6 percent on threes (56-of-189) this season. Five of Stanford's first 12 opponents have recorded four or less three-pointers against the Cardinal. Stanford held Middle Tennessee without a three-pointer in its Battle 4 Atlantis finale.

SHARMA'S LAST SEVEN GAMES

Josh Sharma is averaging 9.7 ppg over his last seven games, after averaging 5.8 ppg in his first five contests of the season. He now ranks sixth in the Pac-12 in field goal percentage (.606) and offensive rebounding (2.3 orgp), and eighth in blocks (1.1 bpg).

DAVIS DOES IT ALL

Sophomore Daejon Davis, who broke Brevin Knight's school freshman assist record with 160 last season, has started 44 of 45 career games. He is averaging 17.6 points, 5.2 assists and 2.0 steals in his last five games. Davis ranks second on the team in scoring (11.8 ppg). His 1.7 steals per game average is third in the Pac-12 and his 3.8 assists per game ranks eighth in the conference. The sophomore has posted at least four points, four rebounds, four assists and four steals in two games this season against UNC Wilmington and Middle Tennessee. He has posted at least four points, four rebounds and four assists in four contests. Davis matched his career-high rebound total with 10 boards vs. Middle Tennessee in November.

OKPALA'S IMPACT AS A SOPHOMORE

Sophomore KZ Okpala is averaging a team-best 16.6 ppg and 6.1 rpg in 31.3 mpg through 12 games this season. He averaged 9.0 ppg in 28.1 mpg in his first 12 games last season. The forward, who had a career-best 29 points in the season opener against Seattle, is seventh in the Pac-12 in scoring, third in three-point field goal percentage (.469) and 14th in rebounding. RYAN AMONG PAC-12'S BEST 3-POINT THREATS

Freshman Cormac Ryan is second in the Pac-12, averaging 2.3 three-point field goals per game. The freshman has recorded at least four three-point field goals in a game in four of nine contests (5 vs. Seattle, 4 vs. North Carolina, 4 vs. Florida, 4 vs. Eastern Washington). He has multiple three-point field goals in five games and is shooting 33.9 percent from three-point range (21-of-62). He scored a team-best 12 points, all in the second half and all on three-pointers, against Florida. Ryan's 11.0 ppg ranks third on the team.

WILLS ONE OF NATION'S YOUNGEST PLAYERS

With a birthdate of October 13, 2000, Bryce Wills is the youngest player in the Pac-12 and one of the youngest in Division I. Wills is the seventh-youngest player in the nation. He has started six games, including two of the last three. The freshman posted a career-best 10 points against Portland State and at San Francisco. The guard is averaging 22.7 minutes per game over the last three contests.

SHEFFIELD BACK

Redshirt junior Marcus Sheffield returned to the lineup this season, after missing the entire 2017-18 season. He injured his leg in practice a couple days before the regular-season opener last year. Sheffield, who poured in a career-best 35 points against Arizona State on Dec. 30, 2016, averaged 6.7 ppg during his true sophomore campaign in 2016-17. He is averaging 5.1 ppg in 15.3 mpg off the bench in the first 12 games of 2018-19.

FLOOR BURNS

During his collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program. Haase totaled 167 in the 1996-97 season. For the third season, Stanford is tracking floor burns as an official stat.

JOSH JAMS

Of senior Josh Sharma's 40 field goals on the season, 19 have been dunks. He has 12 dunks in the last seven games. The center ranks sixth in the Pac-12 in field goal percentage, shooting better than 60 percent (60.6) from the field.

The center also has a presence on the defensive end, ranking eighth in the Pac-12 with 13 blocks.

DA SILVA FINDS TOUCH FROM DOWNTOWN

Sophomore Oscar da Silva has connected on 13 of his last 28 three-point attempts, dating back to late in the first half against Eastern Washington four games ago. He opened the season 3-of-30 on three-point attempts. The sophomore finished with a career-high six threes vs. San Jose State.

DA SILVA'S SECOND-HALF PRODUCTION

Oscar da Silva has scored 82 of his 115 points on the season in the second half. Over the last 10 games, 78 of his 105 points have come after halftime. He posted all 12 of his points at San Francisco, all 11 of his points at North Carolina and all seven of his points against Wisconsin in the second half.

WHITE DIALED IN FROM LONG RANGE

Sophomore Isaac White, who led Stanford with 38 three-pointers last season, is one of the Pac-12's top three-point threats again. The guard is shooting 41.4 percent from three-point range (10-of-25) this season. He was 5-of-5 from beyond the arc at No. 2 Kansas. White has played 95 minutes in Stanford's last five games, after totaling 23 over the first seven contests.

KISUNAS EARNING MINUTES

After playing five minutes in the first two games (did not see action at UNCW), freshman Lukas Kisunas played 12 minutes in the second half at No. 7 North Carolina. The forward collected four rebounds and a block in extended action against the Tar Heels. He has played in 11 of 12 games.

MOST STEALS IN 22 YEARS

In the win at UNCW, Stanford recorded 15 steals, matching its best total in a game in the last 22 years. The only other time Stanford had 15 steals in that span was vs. Oregon State Jan. 5, 2006.

RYAN POSTS THIRD-BEST TOTAL IN DEBUT

Cormac Ryan's 16-point performance in his collegiate debut against Seattle was the third most by a true freshman in his debut in the program's 104-year history. Ryan connected on five threes, similar to now-sophomore Isaac White's collegiate debut last season (17 points on five three pointers). BACK-TO-BACK TOP-20 RECRUITING CLASSES

In Stanford's first 11 games, five true freshmen have seen action. Cormac Ryan and Bryce Wills have both started several games. Ryan is third on the team in scoring (11.0 ppg). Jaiden Delaire averages nearly four points in nearly 13 minutes of action. Lukas Kisunas has played in 10 games averaging 5.6 minutes per contest. Sam Beskind made his Cardinal debut in the win over Eastern Washington. The Cardinal's class of newcomers was ranked as high as No. 20 nationally, giving the program back-to-back top-20 recruiting classes. Stanford's 2017 class of Daejon Davis, KZ Okpala, Oscar da Silva and Isaac White was ranked No. 8 nationally.

SCHOOL-RECORD SHOOTING PCT. VS. SEATTLE

In the win over Seattle, Stanford posted a school-record 73.3 three-point field goal percentage. The Cardinal connected on 11-of-15 attempts, led by Cormac Ryan's 5-of-6 performance. The old mark was 72.7 percent (8-of-11) vs. Oregon St. Dec. 17, 1988.

2017-18 SNAPSHOT

Stanford returned two starters and nine letterwinners from last season's squad that won 19 games and reached the postseason for the first time in three years. Davis was named to the All-Pac-12 Freshman Team after averaging 10.7 points and 4.8 assists. He broke Brevin Knight's freshman assist record with 160. Okpala, who started 21 games, averaged 10.0 ppg last year.

HAASE INCREASES WINS EACH SEASON

Jerod Haase has led his teams to increased win totals in each of his first six full seasons as a head coach. In his first season as a head coach in 2012-13, Haase guided UAB to 16 wins, eventually posting 26 wins and a second consecutive postseason berth in his final year with the Blazers in 2015-16. After Stanford earned 14 wins in his first season on The Farm in 2016-17, he led the Cardinal to 19 wins and a second-round appearance in the NIT last season.

CARDINAL INKS TERRY FOR 2019

Jerod Haase announced the signing of nationally-ranked point guard Tyrell Terry to a National Letter of Intent in November. The 6-1, 160-pound guard out of Minneapolis, Minnesota, is a consensus four-star prospect and one of the top point guard's in the Class of 2019. A star for De La Salle High School in Minneapolis, Terry is ranked No. 61 in the 2019 class by 247Sports, No. 81 by Rivals and No. 90 by ESPN. The point guard is No. 76 in the 247Sports composite rankings. He is the third-ranked prospect in the state of Minnesota by all three outlets. Terry is rated as the fifth-best point guard in the class by 247Sports, while Rivals ranks him No. 11 at his position and ESPN has him at No. 12 in their positional rankings.

PAC-12 PRESEASON POLL

Stanford was picked ninth in the Pac-12 Conference men's basketball preseason poll, as voted on by the media who cover the league.

The Cardinal, picked fifth by the media in last season's preseason poll, finished third in the conference in 2017-18 with an 11-7 record for its best conference finish and most league wins in a decade.

CARDINAL PLAYERS AGAINST UCLA

Eight active Stanford players have faced UCLA previously. Sophomore Daejon Davis is averaging 19.3 points, 6.3 assists and 4.0 rebounds in three games against the Bruins last season. Fellow sophomore KZ Okpala is averaging 12.3 points and 4.0 rebounds in three contests.

LAST GAME AGAINST THE BRUINS

Reid Travis posted a double-double, with 17 points and 14 rebounds, and KZ Okpala scored 23 points, however, No. 5 seed Stanford came up short in an 88-77 defeat to No. 4 seed UCLA in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament March 8, 2018 in Las Vegas.

The Cardinal fell behind early, trailing by as many as 13 points midway through the first half. That deficit was quickly erased, however, as Stanford used an 8-0 run in a minute span to climb back into it.

Fueled by a pair of three-pointers from Daejon Davis and another from Dorian Pickens, Stanford put together a 15-2 run to tie it up at 32-32 with less than five minutes remaining in the half. The Bruins took a 44-40 advantage into the break.

Davis, who scored 10 points in the opening half, was limited by early foul trouble. The Cardinal freshman point guard was called for his fourth foul 1:06 into the second half. He was forced to go to the bench for a 12-minute stretch.

The Bruins tried to push their lead to double digits, but the Cardinal would not give up. Stanford twice got within four points in the second half, but could not get any closer.

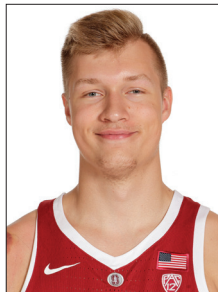

In just his first two seasons as Stanford's Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball, Jerod Haase has already left a strong imprint on the program. Under his leadership, the Cardinal has instilled an invested, tough and selfless attitude that has elevated Stanford to success it hasn't enjoyed in a decade.

In his second season on The Farm, Haase guided the Cardinal to a third-place finish in the Pac-12 with 11 conference wins, the program's highest finish and most league victories in 10 seasons. Competing without two starters for half the season, Stanford won 19 games overall and earned a postseason berth for the first time in three years with a second-round appearance in the National Invitation Tournament.

In two seasons with Haase and his staff, several members of the Cardinal have earned individual accolades. Forward Reid Travis has been voted a First Team All-Pac-12 selection by the league's coaches and garnered NABC All-District laurels each of the last two seasons. Forward Dorian Pickens was named an all-conference player for his performance on the court and the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year for his efforts in the classroom this past season. Point guard Daejon Davis was named to the five-member Pac-12 All-Freshman Team in 2017-18.

In two full recruiting cycles, Haase and his staff have landed top-tier classes. Stanford's 2017 recruiting class was regarded as one of the best in school history. The four-member group was rated a top-10 class nationally by many, ranked as high as eighth by Rivals. The Cardinal's 2018 class is again regarded among the best in the nation. In his first year with the Cardinal in 2016-17, Stanford posted 14 wins against one of the toughest schedules. Stanford finished in the top-10 percent among men's basketball programs in the classroom as well.

Haase was appointed Stanford's 18th men's basketball coach on March 25, 2016. At UAB, Haase led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase compiled an 80-53 overall record while improving the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in his final season at the helm of the Blazers, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25, while ranking among the nation's best in field goal percentage (.478 - 24th), assists per game (18.4 - 4th) and blocks per game (4th - 6.1).

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. More impressively, Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen - all players recruited by Haase and his staff - and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall while notching three victories against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game. During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games and collected a victory in the conference tournament.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003. When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Calif., Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection. Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' 1997 Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Haase earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000. Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

In 2017, Haase joined the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance, the organization that uses the power of positive reinforcement to pursue winning and the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.

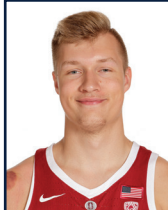
