ninth place in the Pac-12 standings. Five of Colorado's final six regular season games are against teams currently above or equal to them in the Pac-12 standings. All five of those teams, including Stanford, reside within that two-game log jam between second and ninth place.

Colorado is averaging 73.0 points per game while shooting 44.9 percent from the field. Overall the Buffaloes have been balanced in scoring with three players averaging double-figures and seven averaging between five and 15 points an outing. Defensively, Colorado is allowing 73.0 points per game while holding opponents to 41.8 percent shooting and 34.5 percent from 3-point range.

Colorado is second in field goal defense, overall rebounding (37.8 rpg) and defensive rebounds (28.0 drpg) and fifth in 3-point defense (.345) and rebounding margin (+3.3) on the Pac-12 charts. During conference play, the Buffaloes hold the Pac-12's top field goal defense (.417) and lead the league in defensive rebounds (27.4 drpg).

McKinley Wright IV leads the team at 14.7 points, 5.3 assists and 1.0 steal per game. He also tops the team in field goals made and attempted (126 of 278) while ranking third in rebounding (4.4 rpg) and blocks (13). Wright had a game-high 17 points against California with six rebounds and five assists. He recorded career and team season-highs with 11 free throws made on 14 attempts.

Wright's 128 assists are the third most in one season by a Colorado freshman. He is just 15 assists away from Chauncey Billups' freshman record of 143 set in 1995-96. Currently Wright is 17th on Colorado's all-time season assists list.

After the California game, Wright now has 15 games with at least five assists. He has three double-doubles, two of the points-assists variety.

On the Pac-12 charts, Wright is third in assists, ninth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.8), 14th in scoring and 15th in free throw shooting (.780). He tops all Pac-12 freshmen in assists and assist-to-turnover ratio and is third in scoring.

George King leads Colorado in rebounding at 8.3 per game while ranking second in scoring at 13.9 points an outing. King recorded his sixth double-double of the season, and 13th of his career with 12 points and 10 rebounds vs. Utah. King has eight double-figure rebounding games this season with five coming in the last nine contests.

King is hitting 45.3 percent from 3-point range during Pac-12 play, the fourth best mark in the conference during that span. He has made 60 percent (9 of 15) over the last four games. King had 22 points, matching a career-high nine field goals, while hitting 4 of 5 from 3-point range at Arizona. His recent success from 3-point range as

Joe Harrington Era Weekend

Colorado is honoring players and coaches from the Joe Harrington era this weekend. Harrington coached the Buffaloes from 1990-91 through the beginning of the 1995-96 season leading the program to 72 wins and two postseason appearances. His first Buffaloes' team was the program's most successful in over 20 years as Colorado won 19 games finished third in the 1991 Postseason NIT. He also led the 1994-95 squad to a winning record and a spot in the 1995 NIT. Although Harrington left Colorado midway through the 1995-96 season, he and his staff built a foundation that would lead to Colorado to its first NCAA Tournament berth in 28 years in 1996-97.

BOULDER — Earlier this week, **Tad Boyle** put the Colorado Buffaloes through a drill in which baskets didn't count unless they were assisted by a teammate.

The Buffs took the lesson to heart. Colorado recorded a season-high 25 assists Thursday night and rolled to a 91-72 win over Stanford at the Coors Events Center, a win that ended a two-game skid and provided Boyle with his 100th win at the Events Center.

Colorado improved to 17-13 overall and 7-10 in Pac-12 play while Stanford dropped to 14-15, 6-11. The win also means the Buffs can finish no lower than ninth in the Pac-12 Tournament seeding and still has a chance to finish as high as seventh.

"We really shared the ball tonight," Boyle said. "Togetherness on offense was big time. We still have some improvements to go defensively and rebounding the ball. But this team showed when we play together, and share it offensively and play with energy and passion defensively, this team can be as good as they want to be and beat any team in our league."

"The Buffs were as sharp as they've been all season offensively, with the 91 points a season high. The season-high assists also meant balanced scoring, with six different players in double figures. **Xavier Johnson**, **George King** and **Lucas Siewert** each tallied 15 points while **Wesley Gordon**, **Tory Miller** and **Deleon Brown** each added 10. **Derrick White**, meanwhile, had nine points, eight assists, two rebounds and two steals.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs broke open a close game with a 16-5 run to start the second half, expanding a six-point halftime lead into a 17-point margin, then continued to build the cushion.

The Buffs had an assist on each of their first seven baskets of the half as Stanford had no answer. **Dominique Collier** had three straight assists in the run, dishing to Gordon for a fast-break dunk, then to Johnson for a 3-pointer and finally to Johnson for another fast-break dunk.

"That was the best start of the second half we've had all year," Boyle said. "The credit goes to our players. Our fans are great. Our crowd is great, but they thrive off how we play. Our players came out and played with great energy, we got some stops and we got some transition."

The Buffs didn't let up on the gas after the early run. Instead, they continued to build the lead, expanding it to as much as 24, and the assists kept coming. When King scored inside to give CU a 79-56 lead with eight minutes to go, the Buffs had assisted on 13 of their 16 baskets of the half and they finished with 16 assists on 19 baskets after intermission.

Along with White's eight assists, the Buffs got five each from Gordon and Collier, as Colorado finished with 25 assists on 35 buckets — and just five turnovers, by far their best ratio of the year in that department.

"As a point guard, I have to do a better job of getting people the ball," White said. "I was trying to get people shots early. We did a good job of rolling hard on the ball screens and I was just trying to find the open man."

White, who is second in scoring in the conference in Pac-12 games, took just seven shots and made four.

After a back-and-forth first 15 minutes that featured eight lead changes and seven ties, the Buffs finally took control with an 11-2 run that produced a 39-31 lead with just more than two minutes left in the half. Brown started the burst with a 3-pointer, quickly followed by treys from King and Siewert before a White drive and bucket gave CU its 8-point lead.

Stanford finally ended the run with a 3-pointer from Robert Cartwright, then added another basket before King scored again to send Colorado into the locker room at halftime with a 41-35 lead.

given him Colorado's all-time best career 3-point percentage at .407.

King had back-to-back double-doubles on the Southern California trip. He had 21 points and 10 rebounds at USC and followed that up with a season-high 26 points and 10 rebounds at UCLA. King was 11 of 21 from 3-point range on the trip after putting in a career-best six 3-pointers at UCLA.

On the Pac-12 charts King is third in defensive rebounds (6.4 drpg), fourth in overall rebounds, 12th in 3-point percentage (.411), 13th in 3-pointers made (2.1 3mpg), 14th in offensive rebounds (1.8 orgp), and 18th in scoring.

Junior guard **Namon Wright** is third on the team in scoring at 11.1 points and is third in 3-point field goals (22) and assists (27) and fourth in steals (12). He has missed the last two games due to an illness.

Wright recorded his first double-double in a Colorado uniform with 16 points and 10 rebounds against Washington State. It was the second double-double of his collegiate career as he had 12 points and 12 rebounds for Missouri against Arkansas in February 2016.

Dominique Collier is averaging 7.4 points and is second on the team in assists (36) and 3-point field goals (29). He had a nice line in the win over Utah with eight points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals in 23 minutes. He backed that up with eight points, two assists and two rebounds against California.

Collier is second in the Pac-12 in 3-point shooting during conference games at 51.4 percent (19 of 37). He is averaging 8.6 points and 1.8 assists during Pac-12 play, while shooting 48 percent overall. Collier is averaging 9.7 points over his last six games.

Freshman **Dallas Walton** leads Colorado with 25 blocked shots and ranks 11th in the Pac-12 at 1.1 per game. Walton had a career and team season-high four blocks against Washington while pitching in 13 points and five rebounds. Eighteen of his blocks have come during conference play, ranking sixth in the league during that span (1.5 bpg).

Walton is averaging 5.1 points and 3.6 rebounds overall. He has nearly doubled that rebounding number to 6.7 boards over the last three contests.

Freshman forward **Tyler Bey** averages 5.7 points and is second on the team in rebounding at 4.8 a game. He had 11 points, seven rebounds and a career-high three steals at Arizona. Bey recorded his first career double-double with 14 points and a personal-best 11 rebounds against Washington. He is averaging 7.3 points and 5.5 rebounds during Pac-12 play while shooting 57 percent from the field.

Sophomore guard **Deleon Brown** is fifth on the team in steals (11) and sixth in assists (18) while pitching in 5.0 points an outing. Brown had six points and dished out a pair of assists at UCLA. He was 2 of 2 from downtown against the Bruins, marking his fifth game with multiple 3-point field goals.

Freshman forward **D'Shawn Schwartz** is averaging 3.3 points and 1.8 rebounds. Over the last three games he is averaging 7.0 points, hitting 7 of 11 from the field during that span (.636). He had eight points and a pair of rebounds against California. Schwartz was 3 of 6 from the field in that game, matching his career best for field goals made.

Sophomore forward **Lucas Siewert** had 13 points in the win over

Utah, scoring in double figures for the fourth time this season and sixth in his career. It marked the first time he had back-to-back double figure scoring games as he also had 10 points on 4 of 5 shooting at Arizona State. Siewert is averaging 7.5 points over the last six games.

Freshman guard **Lazar Nikolic** is averaging 2.3 points and 2.5 rebounds per game. He is fifth on the team in assists with 23. Nikolic had six points on 2 of 3 from 3-point range, and four rebounds, at Arizona State. He hit multiple 3-pointers in a game for the first time (entered the game 3 of 15 on the season). Nikolic had four points and three rebounds at Arizona.

THE CARDINAL: Stanford is 13-12 overall and in fifth place in the Pac-12 at 7-5. The Cardinal saw a two-game winning streak snapped with a 75-60 setback at Utah on Feb. 8. Stanford averages 75.5 points while shooting 47 percent from the field. The Cardinal are one of the top rebounding teams in the Pac-12 ranking second in rebounding margin at plus-5.2 per game. Defensively, Stanford gives up 74.6 points per game on 44 percent from the floor. The Cardinal are 2-7 away from home this season (0-4 in neutral site games) and has lost their last three.

Junior forward Reid Travis leads Stanford at 19.4 points and 7.8 rebounds while shooting 53 percent from the field, ranking in the top 15 of the Pac-12 in all three categories. Senior guard Dorian Pickens

averages 14.9 points and is hitting 40 percent from 3-point range. Senior forward Michael Humphrey is averaging 10.7 points and ranks second on the team in rebounding at 7.4 an outing. Freshman guard Daejon Davis averages 10.6 points while leading the Cardinal in both assists (112) and steals (25).

Jerod Haase is in his second season as the head coach of Stanford with a record of 27-29. He is 107-81 overall in his sixth season as a collegiate head coach, joining Stanford after a successful four-year run at UAB.

THE SERIES: This will be the 21st meeting between Colorado and Stanford with the Buffaloes holding an 11-9 series lead. The Buffaloes have won the last eight in the series and are 8-2 against the Cardinal since joining the Pac-12 for the 2011-12 season. Stanford's last win in the series was also its last in Boulder, a 74-50 decision on Feb. 23, 2012. Colorado has won the last four in Boulder and is 7-3 all-time against the Cardinal at home.

Tad Boyle is 8-2 against Stanford as a head coach. Jerod Haase is 0-2 against Colorado as a head coach. Boyle and Haase are both University of Kansas graduates. Boyle played for Larry Brown from 1981-85 while Haase played for Roy Williams from 1994-97.

BEY ATTACKING THE PAC: Freshman forward **Tyler Bey** has picked up his play since the start of the Pac-12 season. In 12 non-conference games Bey averaged 4.1 points and 4.2 rebounds while shooting 41.7 percent from the field (15 of 36) with four steals, three blocks and 17 turnovers.

Since the beginning of the Pac-12 season, Bey is averaging 7.3 points and 5.5 rebounds while shooting 57.4 percent (35 of 61). He has 10 steals, 10 blocks against 15 turnovers during that span.

Bey has started all 12 of Colorado's Pac-12 games (13 starts overall), leads the Buffaloes in field goal percentage and offensive rebounds (21) and ranks second in overall rebounding (5.5 rpg).

Bey ranks 15th in offensive rebounds (1.8 orgp) and 20th in rebounding in the Pac-12 during conference games.

HEATING UP ON THE ROAD: Colorado shot 55.8 percent at Arizona on Jan. 25, its second-best performance from the field of the season (.564 vs Drake). It was Colorado's best field goal percentage ever in a Pac-12 road game and best in any conference road game since shooting 61.7 percent at Texas A&M on Jan. 12, 2008.

Colorado is shooting 43 percent (25 of 58) from 3-point range in its last three road games. Buffaloes were 8 of 16 against Arizona after going 11 of 22 at UCLA on Jan. 13.

With the loss at Arizona, it marked just the third time in 61 games under Tad Boyle that the Buffaloes lost when shooting at least 50 percent from the field (59-3).

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado is 2-3 against ranked opponents this season highlighted by a sweep of No. 4 (AP)/6 (Coaches) Arizona State and No. 14/16 Arizona, January 4 & 6.

Colorado claimed wins over ranked teams in back-to-back outings for the first time since defeating #9 Missouri in Boulder and No. 21 Kansas State in Manhattan Jan 8 & 12, 2011. It's the first time in program history Colorado has defeated AP Top 15 teams in back-to-back games

Colorado's thrilling 90-81 overtime win Arizona State snapped a

three-game skid and was Colorado's highest AP ranked win since defeating No. 3 Texas, 93-80, in Boulder on Feb. 4, 2003.

Colorado's 17 wins over ranked opponents in Boyle's seven-plus seasons is by far the best streak in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 17-31, have accounted for 28 percent of wins over ranked opponents (61) since 1949-50.

CONFERENCE, NATIONAL RECOGNITION: Colorado's sweep of No. 4/6 Arizona State and No. 14/16 Arizona January 4 & 6 was recognized regionally and nationally on several fronts.

Colorado was named the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I Team of the Week. The Buffaloes earned the same honor from NCAA.com and Dick Vitale.

McKinley Wright IV picked up several honors. He was named National Freshman of the Week by Vitale, the Wayman Tisdale Freshman of the Week by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association and the Pac-12 Player of the Week.

It's the first Pac-12 weekly honor for Wright, and just the second conference Player of the Week award by a Colorado freshman, joining Chauncey Billups' Big Eight honor in December 1995. Overall, it's Colorado's ninth weekly honor since joining the Pac-12 for the 2011-12 season.

Wright averaged 17.5 points, 7.5 assists and 3.5 rebounds in the Buffaloes' wins over Arizona and Arizona State. He shot 50 percent from the field (13 of 26) and made 81.8 percent from the free throw line (9 of 11).

BENCH NUMBER 95?: Colorado produced one of oddest statistical numbers of the season anywhere when it scored 95 points off the bench against South Dakota State.

The circumstances? A perfect storm really. Colorado shook up its starting lineup to feature three freshmen and a senior walk-on along with a regular senior starter. Then add in a double-overtime classic with both teams reaching the century mark.

The change was a nod to that group for their effort and performance during practices leading up to that Dec. 15 game. The "gold" team had handily defeated the "black" team in a number of drills that week. Freshmen **D'Shawn Schwartz** and **Alexander Strating** made their first career starts, as did senior **Josh Repine**, who became the first walk-on in six seasons to start a game for Colorado.

After a formidable start, the regulars returned for a great game against the Summit League favorites. Six players scored in double digits led by freshman guard **McKinley Wright IV** who had 30 points in Colorado's 112-103 double-overtime win.

FRESHMAN 30: With his 30 points vs. South Dakota State, **McKinley Wright IV** became the fourth different freshman to score 30 points in a game joining Chauncey Billups, Emmett Lewis and Richard Roby. Billups scored a freshman-record 33 points at Colorado State on Dec. 6, 1995 and had four total during his rookie campaign.

HITTING THE CENTURY MARK: Colorado hit 100 points for the first time in four seasons during its 112-103 double overtime set against South Dakota State. The 112 points are the most in the Tad Boyle era at Colorado and tied for the 10th best figure in school history. Colorado improved to 39-2 all-time when scoring 100-plus points.

It also marked the fifth time in team history where both team have reached the century mark with the Buffaloes improving to 3-2 in

those games:

MILLER-STEWART OUT: Senior forward **Tory Miller-Stewart** sustained a foot injury during a practice session on Nov. 30 and is expected to be out for an indefinite period of time. Miller-Stewart was averaging 6.2 points and ranked third on the team in rebounding at 4.7 per game. Miller-Stewart had a season-high nine rebounds in the Paradise Jam win over Quinnipiac. He matched his season best of 11 points in the win over Drake, the 16th double-figure scoring game of his career.

START AMONG ALL-TIME BESTS: Colorado started the season with six straight wins for just the 11th time in team history (115th season) and its 6-0 start tied for the seventh best start overall. The Buffaloes started 6-0 for the first time since 2012-13.

WRIGHT IN DOUBLE FIGURES: Freshman **McKinley Wright IV** scored in double figures in each of his first 12 games after his 21 point performance against Iowa. During that span he hit the 20-point mark four times, including a team season-high 30 points against South Dakota State. Wright's string of double-figure games ended with only seven points at Oregon State.

His 12 double-figure games to begin his career are the most by a Buffalo since 2011 NBA lottery pick Alec Burks scored at least 10 points in his first 20 games in 2009-10.

PRESEASON TITLIST: Colorado claimed its seventh preseason tournament title with the 2017 Paradise Jam and just the third on a neutral court. It's the second time the Buffaloes have won a pre-season tournament with three games in three days, joining the 2002 Pepsi Classic in Charlotte, N.C. Overall, Colorado last won three games in three days, when it actually went four in four to win the 2012 Pac-12 Tournament.

M-IV-P PERFORMANCE: Freshman guard **McKinley Wright IV** was named the 2017 Paradise Jam Most Valuable Player by averaging 17.7 points and 6.0 rebounds while shooting 61 percent from the field (20-33). He had the game-winning 3-pointer at the buzzer in the first round vs. Quinnipiac, scoring a career-best 21 points. He matched that scoring effort in the semifinals against Drake while dishing out a team season-best nine assists against only one turnover. Wright had 11 points and dished out six assists in the championship game. He had 16 assists against just two turnovers in the final two games.

Wright is the first freshman to be named MVP in the 18-year history of the Paradise Jam.

HISTORIC COMEBACK: Colorado trailed Quinnipiac by 13 (60-47) with just under four minutes left before ending the game on a 23-9 run. It marked the largest comeback with under five minutes left in team history. The previous best was 10 coming against Wyoming on Dec. 10, 1981.

SENIOR EXPERIENCE vs. FRESH FACES: Colorado has nine players on its roster (eight active) that had never played a regular season minute in a Buffaloes uniform prior to this season. That list includes six true freshmen and three red shirts who spent 2016-17 with the program.

Colorado's three senior regulars - **George King**, **Tory Miller-Stewart** and **Dominique Collier** - have combined for 333 career games and 162 starts. The other 12 players on the roster (11 active) have a combined 88 starts and 275 career games. Out of those 275 games, 20 of those belong to senior walk-on **Josh Repine** accounting for a total of 27 career minutes played.

RIGHT AT HOME: Colorado has won 31 of its last 37 and 41 of 48 in the friendly confines of the Coors Events Center. In the **Tad Boyle** era, Colorado is a sparkling 111-21 at the Coors Events Center (.841). The Buffaloes are 424-172 (.711) all-time at the CEC.

KING'S COURT: Senior guard **George King** became the 34th player in Colorado history to reach 1,000 points during the loss at Xavier, hitting that milestone with a drive to the basket at the 8:29 mark of the first half. He is now 22nd in career scoring at 1,213 points. He is 20th in rebounding with 626.

King is tied with Askia Booker (2011-15) for fifth in career 3-pointers made with 170. His 40.7 percentage from 3-point would be first on CU's all-time list if the season was finished today.

DOM'S DIMES AND SWIPES: Senior guard **Dominique Collier** is 24th in career steals (94) and assists at (211). He is on pace to become the 16th Colorado player with 200 assists and 100 steals.

FOR OPENERS: Colorado improved to 91-24 all-time in home openers and has won its last 10, making Boyle a perfect 8-0 in home openers. The Buffaloes have won 15 of their last 16. Colorado is 80-35 (.696) in all-time season openers. The Buffaloes are 6-2 under Boyle. The Buffaloes are 33-5 in overall season openers since the 1980-81 season.

KOUNTZ, PARQUET TO JOIN BUFFS IN 2018-19: **Daylen Kountz** and **Elijah Parquet** signed National Letters of Intent to attend and play basketball at Colorado in 2018-19. Head coach Tad Boyle made the announcement on Nov. 8, the first day of the early NCAA signing period.

Kountz is a 6-foot, 4-inch, 180-pound guard from Denver's East High School. Parquet is a 6-3 185-pound combo guard out of West Brook

Kountz is rated as the No. 1 player in the state of Colorado by ESPN and 247Sports. He led the state in scoring as junior, helping the Angels to a spot in the 2017 Class 5A Great 8. He earned Class 5A All-State Second Team and All-USA Colorado Boys Basketball Second Team honors.

Parquet thrived on the summer circuit, helping Team S.T.A.G.E on deep tournament runs in Las Vegas, Houston and Dallas. He will be a key factor for West Brook in Texas Class 6A competition, the state's largest classification.

BATTEY TO REDSHIRT: Freshman forward **Evan Battey** will take an academic redshirt for the 2017-18 season.

A 6-8 forward from View Park, Calif., he will continue to practice and provide scout team duties for the Buffaloes for the duration of this season. He will have four years of eligibility beginning in 2018-19.

The NCAA mandated an academic redshirt for Battey after he did not meet the initial eligibility requirement of graduating from high school within four years – he repeated the ninth grade at the Los Angeles Center for Enriched Studies. Battey was not able to play basketball in 2016-17 as a senior at Villa Park High School, as the California high school governing body determined he had exhausted his eight semesters of high school eligibility.

Battey was an All-Orange County and All-Crestview League selection as a junior at Vila Park in 2015-16, averaging 24 points a game for the Spartans including a 44-point effort, second-best in a single game in school history.

Batthey stayed involved with the Villa Park team for in 2016-17, serving as a player-coach for the team's big men and junior varsity. He was part of the Spartans' team that placed second at the CIF Division III state championships. This spring, Batthey was recognized by the Orange County Athletic Directors Association with its Athlete of Character Award.

BUFFS NINTH IN PRESEASON POLL: Colorado was picked to finish ninth in the annual Pac-12 Conference Preseason Media Poll.

Colorado earned 112 points, 13 votes behind Oregon State for eighth place and well ahead of 10th place Washington (71). The Buffaloes finished in sole possession of seventh place in the 2016-17 race with a record of 8-10.

Arizona was picked as the favorite for the fifth time in the past six seasons with 273 points and 22 of 23 first place votes. USC was second with 251 points, picking up one first place vote. UCLA was third (223), defending league co-champion Oregon was fourth (203) followed by Stanford (182), Arizona State (146), Utah (129) and Oregon State (125).

After Colorado, Washington was 10th with California (46) and Washington State (33) rounding out the poll.

ITALY TOUR: Colorado played four exhibition games during a 10-day tour of Italy in August 2017.

It was the perfect mix of basketball and sightseeing for the Buffaloes, touring some of the most storied locales in Italy.

The Buffaloes started their trip with four days in Rome that included tours of the Roman Colosseum, Pantheon, Trevi Fountain and the Vatican. From there it was off to Siena, Florence, Venice, Treviso and finally Lake Como.

Along the way, the travel party visited the Academia Gallery which houses Michelangelo's David, toured St. Marc's square and the waterways of Venice, enjoyed a biking tour of Treviso and a boat ride on Lake Como.

On the court, Colorado won its first three games before finishing 3-1 on the tour, an admirable record considering the inexperience of the team and the unusual circumstances surrounding the contests. The Buffaloes rarely had time to relax during the excursion, mixing in a day's worth of sightseeing before game action later in the evening.

The trip came at a perfect time for the program. Colorado enters the 2017-18 season with nine student-athletes who haven't played a minute in a Buffaloes uniform, which includes six true freshmen and three redshirts. The NCAA allows 10 full practices during the

BOULDER — Colorado seniors **George King** and **Tory Miller-Stewart** did what freshmen are supposed to do Friday night.

CU freshman **McKinley Wright IV** did what Buffs fans were hoping he would do — and the combination of all three led the Buffs to a season-opening 66-51 win over Northern Colorado at the Coors Events Center.

After missing most of the first half with two fouls, King led the Buffs with 12 points — all in the second half — and nine rebounds. Miller-Stewart added 11 points and five rebounds while Wright added 10 points, four rebounds and three assists in his first game as a Buff.

All three were instrumental in a 12-0 run midway through the second half that broke open a tight game and helped Tad Boyle's crew to the double-digit win.

Andre Spight led UNC with 19 points, but was just 3-for-16 from 3-point range, part of a 6-for-37 night from long distance for the Bears.

HOW IT HAPPENED: After taking an 11-point lead into the locker room at the half, 35-24, Colorado led the Bears back in the game in a hurry after intermission. Sparked by five points from Spight, UNC went on a 13-0 run early in the half to tie the game at 37-37 barely four minutes in. The Bears, who held 21-16 rebounding edge at the half, boosted that margin to eight early in the half and with just more than 10 minutes to play, CU was clinging to a 45-44 lead.

But following a media timeout, the Buffs began to hit the boards, increase their defensive pressure and pull away. Sparked by four points from Miller-Stewart, three from King and a Wright driving layup, the Buffs carved out a 12-0 run that produced a 57-44 edge with just more than five minutes left in the game. UNC ended its drought with a Jordan Davis bucket, but King answered with a 3-pointer to bump the margin to 14, 60-46, with just more than four minutes to play.

Colorado then kept the lead in double digits for the remainder of the game, and finished with a 45-38 edge on the boards, including a 20-5 edge down the stretch.

King played just four minutes in the first half after two "silly fouls" and just one rebound to show for his effort. But he took control in the second half, finishing with 12 points on 4-for-7 shooting as well as a game-high nine rebounds, including three big boards in the decisive 12-0 run.

Wright had just four points and one rebound in the first half, but added six points and three rebounds to that total after the half, and also had a pair of big assists in the decisive run.

Colorado held double-digit leads at two different junctures in the first half but could not put the Bears away early.

CU jumped out to a quick lead, getting five quick points from Namon Wright and four from Miller-Stewart to go up 11-7 just six minutes in. CU then built the lead to double digits when **Dominique Collier** swiped a pass near midcourt and drove for a layup to bump the Buffs' edge to 23-13.

But the Buffs went cold and the Bears slowly chipped away. Spight hit five straight points in a 9-2 UNC run, and with just under four minutes to go, Colorado's edge had been cut to 25-22.

That forced a Boyle timeout and his words in the huddle evidently had an effect. The Buffs emerged to put together a 10-2 run over the final four minutes of the half, sparked by five points from **Deleon Brown**, including a 3-pointer, and a **Lucas Stewart** key from the top of the key. **McKinley Wright** closed the half with a driving layup on a nice halfcourt pass from **Lazar Nikolic** to give the Buffs a 35-24 lead heading into intermission.

WHAT IT MEANS: The Buffs got good performances from all four true freshmen, something Boyle had been hoping to see, as well as steady performance from the three senior starters.

BOULDER — Dominant rebounding and a strong perimeter game added up to Colorado's second win of the season Tuesday night as the Buffs dealt visiting Denver an 89-62 defeat at the Coors Events Center.

CU junior **Namon Wright** led the Buffs with 14 points, sophomore **Deleon Brown** scored 13 off the bench and freshman **McKinley Wright IV** added 12 in his second start for Colorado. **George King** chipped in 11 points and seven rebounds as Colorado improved to 2-0 while Denver fell to 0-2.

The Buffs dominated the Pioneers on the boards, finishing with a 46-23 rebounding edge, while also limiting the Pioneers to just 42 percent shooting (24-for-57) from the floor. But the Buffs didn't put the game away until midway through the second half, when they pushed the lead to double digits and never let the Pioneers back in the game after that.

"I like this team and I like our upside," head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "Right now we're functioning probably on a scale of 1 to 10, probably around a six, and that's exciting. ... This is going to be a fun team to watch"

Tuesday night's game also marked the return of Rodney Billups to the Coors Events Center. Now in his second year as DU's head coach, Billups served on Boyle's staff for six years.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs took the lead at the 17:09 mark of the first half and never trailed again, but couldn't shake the Pioneers until the second half. Denver managed to cut a 10-point CU halftime lead down to six, 51-45, four minutes into the second half before the Buffs took control for good with a 12-1 run that saw the Pioneers go without a field goal for almost four minutes.

McKinley Wright started the run with a driving layup before Lucas Siewert added a pair of free throws and Brown drove the lane on a fast break bucket, getting an assist from **Lazar Nikolic**.

The Buffs then finished the run in style, getting a thunderous alley-oop dunk from **Tyler Bey** on a beautiful feed from McKinley Wright. Bey then added a free throw and Colorado's lead ballooned to 63-46 with 12:20 still to go in the game.

In that stretch, the Pioneers missed six straight field goal tries, a major reversal from the 56 percent shooting from the floor they had produced up to that point.

"When we contest shots high, good things happen," Boyle said. "I thought our defense helped our offense get out and run. That lob from McKinley to Tyler was pretty special."

Namon Wright said the Buffs wore the Pioneers down.

"Our big guys did a great job rebounding and contesting shots tonight," Wright said. "Defense is always our first priority, and we have a lot of depth where we can get fresh minutes from to support it."

The Buffs then slowly built their lead the rest of the game, pushing it past the 20-point mark on a King bucket.

The Buffs slowly pulled away midway through the first half, breaking away from a 16-16 tie with 8:40 to go to carve out a 43-33 lead at the half.

Dominique Collier sparked the late-half run with seven points, getting two free throws early, then a short jumper at the 7:12 mark before hitting a long 3-pointer with 5:40 to go. Namon Wright added another key just 20 seconds later, followed by a Siewert three that bumped Colorado's edge to 35-27. Brown (nine points in the first half) then boosted the Buffs' edge to double digits, 39-29, with a driving layup and the Buffs held that cushion to the half, taking a 43-33 lead into intermission.

WHAT IT MEANS: The Buffs continue to get balanced scoring from a variety of sources and are also displaying good depth, something that will no doubt be a key this weekend when they travel to the Paradise Jam for three games in three days.

LYNCHBURG, Va. — One night after a furious comeback produced a buzzer-beating win over Quinnipiac, the Colorado Buffaloes withstood an opponent's rally to claim an 86-81 win over Drake on Saturday in the Paradise Jam semifinals.

The Buffs led by as many as 17 points the second half, but saw that lead whittled down to one before rebuilding their lead down the stretch.

Now 4-0, Colorado will meet 4-1 Mercer, a 78-59 winner over Drexel, in Sunday's 6:30 p.m. championship game.

CU freshman **McKinley Wright IV** just missed his first collegiate double-double, finishing with 21 points, nine assists and five rebounds. Junior **Namon Wright** added 19 points and three rebounds and senior **George King** added 14 points and seven rebounds.

Reed Timmer led Drake with 28 points, including a 16-for-18 night from the free throw line.

"Last night we didn't panic when we were down," head coach **Tad Boyle** said of his Buffs, who overcame a 13-point deficit in the final four minutes against Quinnipiac to collect a 70-69 win. "Tonight we were up and they made a run and we didn't panic. We stayed them off and I'm really proud of this team."

HOW IT HAPPENED: After taking an eight-point lead at intermission, the Buffs threatened to blow the game open early in the second half, jumping out to a 17-point lead after a Deleon Brown 3-pointer gave Colorado a 52-35 edge.

But the Bulldogs, much as they did one night earlier against Wake Forest, battled back. Drake put together a 23-7 run and with 7:54 to go in the game, the Bulldogs had cut Colorado's cushion down to one, 59-58, thanks in large part to regular trips to the free throw line. The Bulldogs were 25-for-31 from the free throw line, including 20-for-24 in the second half.

"In the second half they just started driving it and the whistles started blowing," Boyle said. "We have to do a better job with that. But it's hard to guard in college basketball now because any contact going to the rim seems like it's going to be on the defense."

The Buffs, however, regained their composure. After Drake had cut the lead to 59-58, Colorado went on an 18-9 run over the next five minutes to bump the cushion back to 10, 77-67, with just more than three minutes to go. McKinley Wright, who fouled out late in the game, had seven of the first eight points in the run, then finished it with a 3-pointer. Also getting key buckets in the surge were **Namon Wright** (five points) and **Tory Miller-Stewart**.

CU then kept the Bulldogs at bay down the stretch, getting buckets from **Dominique Collier** and **Miller-Stewart**, plus a handful of free throws in the final minute.

"They never gave up," **Namon Wright** said. "It was a great learning experience for us. We know how to play hard now."

Once again, the Buffs did not shoot the ball well from 3-point range. After going 4-for-20 from beyond the arc Friday, they hit just four of 17 tries Saturday. CU was also out rebounded, 32-30, but the Buffs outscored the Bulldogs 50-26 in the paint and also had an 8-0 edge on fastbreak points.

The Buffs finished with 15 assists after having just seven in Friday's 70-69 win over Quinnipiac.

Colorado led by as much as 15 in the first half when a **Namon Wright** layup gave CU a 31-16 edge with 6:28 to go. Colorado then went cold, going without a field goal over the last 5 minutes of the half, but still held a 39-31 edge at intermission thanks to hitting six of eight free throws in the final three minutes.

CU shot 14-for-27 from the field in the first half, but just 2-for-10 from 3-point range.

LYNCHBURG, Va. — A tournament that started Friday with a heart-stopping buzzer-beater for a win culminated Sunday with a championship, as the Colorado Buffaloes carved out a 79-70 win over Mercer in the Paradise Jam title game.

George King, named to the tourney's All-Star team, scored 25 points and grabbed eight rebounds to lead the Buffs to their third win in three nights as CU improved to 5-0 for the season. **Namon Wright** and **Deleon Brown** each added 13 points and Buffs freshman point guard **McKinley Wright IV** cemented his tournament Most Valuable Player award with 11 points, seven assists and four rebounds.

"These guys have unbelievable heart," head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "This guy (McKinley Wright) saved our bacon on Friday night and these guys have responded the next two games with unbelievable heart and desire. I've said I love this team's spirit from Day 1 and they showed it this weekend."

The Buffs indeed improved each day in the tournament. After erasing a 13-point deficit in the final four minutes Friday against Quinnipiac for a 70-69 win — capped by a McKinley Wright 3-pointer at the buzzer — they survived a Drake rally Saturday to claim an 86-81 semifinal win.

Sunday, they took the lead over Mercer for good with seven minutes to go in the first half and never trailed again.

HOW IT HAPPENED: After falling behind early by as many as seven, the Buffs slowly chipped away at Mercer's lead. Fittingly, it was a 3-point bucket from McKinley Wright at the 7:03 mark of the first half that gave them the lead for good. Colorado led by two at the half, 39-37, then slowly built a double-digit cushion, one that hit 13 points at the midway point of the second half, 64-51.

King put forth his best game of the season thus far, coming up with big baskets and rebounds and critical moments. He closed a 12-4 run that provided the big lead with a 3-pointer and a free throw, then came up with some crucial rebounds and baskets down the stretch when Mercer pulled back to within seven.

After the Buffs took their big lead, Mercer made a stab at a comeback, shaving the margin down to seven.

But with 3:34 to go, King drove inside for a basket to push the lead back to nine, 70-61. Less than a minute later, he grabbed an offensive rebound and converted it to a basket, draining a foul in the process and hitting the free throw to bump the margin to 73-61.

Then, with just more than a minute to go, King extended a CU possession with an offensive rebound, which **Namon Wright** then converted into a basket for a 77-68 lead, putting the game away.

At the same time, the Buffs kept up the defensive pressure on Mercer, refusing to allow easy baskets.

Wright also had his share of crucial plays while playing the point at a level far beyond that what would normally be expected of a freshman. After hitting the game winner Friday night (he had 21 points and five rebounds vs. Quinnipiac), he scored 32 points and dished out 16 assists in the next two games — and committed just two turnovers.

Sunday, he had three of his seven assists in a 13-6 Buffs run to start the second half.

But Sunday's win was by no means a two-man show. Along with **Namon Wright's** 13 points, the Buffs received another solid effort off the bench from **Brown**. The sophomore guard had six points in a CU run midway through the half, then drew a charging call that led to a King 3-pointer and the Buffs' big lead in the night.

CU also got a nice effort from redshirt freshman big man **Dallas Walton**, who had four points and a pair of rebounds.

FORT COLLINS — Call it a learning experience for the Colorado Buffaloes — a very painful learning experience.

Down by as much as 17 points in the second half Saturday at Colorado State, the Buffs rallied to cut the deficit to four in the final minute, but could never get over the hump in a 72-63 loss to the Rams.

The loss dropped Colorado to 6-1 while CSU improved to 4-4.

CU was without the services of senior center **Tory Miller-Stewart**, who suffered a foot injury earlier this week in practice and is out for an "indefinite" amount of time, according to head coach **Tad Boyle**.

McKinley Wright IV led CU with 19 points and eight rebounds while **George King** added nine points and seven rebounds — but King hit just 3 of his 13 field goal tries as the Buffs shot just 39 percent from the field (24-for-61).

The Rams also dominated the Buffs on the boards, 46-32, and blocked nine CU shots. Despite not recording a field goal in the final seven minutes of the game, CSU managed to hold on by hitting free throws down the stretch.

"CSU beat us at our own game," Boyle said. "We want to hold our opponents to less than 40 percent, they did that to us. We want to be plus eight on the boards, they did that to us. We want to make more free throws than our opponent shoots — they did that to us. They beat us at our own game. That's disheartening and hopefully it's a learning experience for our young guys."

HOW IT HAPPENED: It was the first true road game of the year for the young Buffs, and they played like it at times in front of a raucous Moby Arena crowd. Colorado played well in spurts — CU trailed just 38-35 at the half — but the Rams broke open a tight game after intermission with an 18-7 run in the first eight minutes to open up a 56-42 edge with 11:48 to go in the game.

CSU hit the Buffs from every position on the floor in the decisive run, getting an early 3-point bucket from Prentiss Nixon before going inside for six straight points. J.D. Paige pushed the CSU lead to double digits with three free throws — the result of King's third foul — and the deficit grew to 14 on a fast-break slam dunk, then as high as 17.

The Buffs, meanwhile, hit a cold stretch. Along with King's 3-for-13 day from the field (1-for-5 from 3-point range), **Dominique Collier** was just 4-for-10 and **Namon Wright** just 2-for-9. Overall, CU hit just eight of its 25 3-point tries.

"You go on the road, you know the 3s may or may not drop," Boyle said. "You know the free throws may or may not go in. You don't do either of those two things well, your margin for error goes down significantly. We didn't do anything well enough tonight to win this game."

But, the Buffs never quit. McKinley Wright scored 11 straight points in a 1:27 span to cut CSU's lead to six with 5:26 still to play and King's only 3-pointer of the night with 2:41 to go pulled the Buffs to within five, 65-60.

Wright was spectacular in the run, hitting a pair of 3-point shots, a conventional 3-point play and a driving layup.

The Rams went the last seven minutes without a field goal, but hit just enough of their free throws to keep the Buffs at bay. Colorado cut the CSU cushion to four, 67-63, with just under a minute to go when Collier hit one of two free throws, but that was as close as the Buffs would get. The Rams then hit five of six free throws in the final minute to salt away the win.

The Buffs trailed by as much as eight in the first half after an early CSU onslaught of 3-pointers helped spur an 8-0 Rams run. But the Buffs came back with a 9-2 run, sparked by a pair of McKinley Wright 3-pointers and a George King 3-point play. Colorado then took the lead momentarily on a Dominique Collier try, 33-32, but the Rams regained the lead just before intermission.

BOULDER — Colorado's young Buffs are growing up in a hurry.

CU's freshmen sparked a decisive 12-3 run Wednesday night that broke open a one-point game in the second half and the Buffs pulled away down the stretch for a 75-57 win over New Mexico at the Coors Events Center.

The Buffs also had plenty of help from their seniors.

Senior **Dominique Collier** led the Buffs with 16 points — 14 in the second half — while freshman **McKinley Wright IV** recorded his first career double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds. CU senior **George King** posted his ninth career double-double and second of the season with 10 points and 11 rebounds.

The Buffs won despite committing a season-high 23 turnovers that led to 28 New Mexico points. Colorado made up the difference by putting forth a dominant 58-31 rebound edge, as well as holding the Lobos to just 29.6 percent shooting (21-for-71) — including a 9-for-34 performance in the second half.

Colorado improved to 7-1 with the win while the Lobos fell to 3-6.

"Certainly not a thing of beauty," head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "If we were in a beauty contest I think we would have gotten fifth place. But we did what we had to do to get the win."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs knew the Lobos would apply pressure, and they did — to the tune of a season-high 23 Colorado miscues that led to 28 Lobos points. But CU held UNM to just 29.6 percent shooting (21-for-71) from the floor — including a 9-for-34 effort in the second half — while also posting a 58-31 edge on the boards to make the difference.

"I was really pleased with the second half," Boyle said. "We rebounded the ball well. If we'd rebounded like that last Saturday we'd be 8-0 right now instead of 7-1. But good bounce-back win. We have to keep getting better and learning."

The Buffs led by two at intermission before putting together their decisive 12-3 run midway through the second half, with freshmen providing the fuel for the burst. **Lazar Nikolic** scored the first five points, including a dunk on a beautiful alley-oop from **Deleon Brown**, McKinley Wright added four and **D'Shawn Schwartz** drained a 3-pointer to give the Buffs a 61-51 edge with 7:31 to go in the game.

"Laz is sneaky athletic," Wright said of his freshman classmate. "One of the guys with the most bounce on our team people don't know about yet. CU fans saw it tonight and they'll see more of it later in the season."

The Lobos briefly pulled back to within eight, but CU then produced a 7-0 run to take a 68-53 lead with 2:35 left to put the game away. Collier — the only Buff to have more assists than turnovers (2-0) — had four points in the run to help the Buffs seal the win.

"Dom was really good in the second half," Boyle said. "He played within himself. He didn't force the issue. He let the game come to him and I was really pleased with Dom's effort, especially in that second half."

The Buffs jumped out to an early lead in the first half, building the margin to as much as 11 midway through the period. But the Lobos refused to go away, staying in the game with 3-pointers, finally tying the game at 33-33 with 40 seconds to go. Colorado regained the lead on Schwartz drive with 25 seconds to go, taking a 35-33 lead into the locker room at the half.

The Lobos hit six 3-pointers in the first half, but managed to connect on just 3 of 15 tries from beyond the arc after intermission.

TURNING POINT: CU's 12-3 run broke open a tight game midway through the second half and the Lobos never threatened again. CU held the Lobos scoreless for a 3:42 stretch in the run.

WHAT IT MEANS: Although they improved to 7-1, the Buffs know they can't have another game with 23 turnovers if they want to be competitive Saturday when they play at No. 15 Xavier.

BOULDER — As the old saying goes, the Colorado Buffaloes could not buy a basket Tuesday night.

As a result, the ice-cold Buffs dropped a 69-59 loss to visiting San Diego, their third loss in their last four games.

Now 7-3, CU hit just 14 of its 54 field goal tries (25.9 percent), threatening for much of the night to break the CU record for fewest field goals in a game (12). The Buffs at one point missed 12 straight field goal attempts in the second half, but still managed to cut a 16-point deficit to five at one point before the Toreros pulled away down the stretch.

The 25.9 percent effort from the field, which included a 3-for-18 night from 3-point range, was CU's lowest percentage ever in the Coors Events Center, which opened in 1979.

"It was a rough night for us offensively, obviously we couldn't make a shot and that kind of got to us," CU head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "We got our heads hanging a little bit. ... San Diego came in here and beat us. We have to live with that. It's a bitter pill to swallow. I'm really disappointed."

CU's **George King** had a 14-point, 11-rebound double-double — his third of the season and 10th of his career — but shot just 4-for-16 from the field. **McKinley Wright IV** had 12 points on 3-for-10 shooting.

The Toreros, who shot a relatively respectable 20-for-49, including 9-for-23 from 3-point range, improved to 8-2. San Diego's Isaiah Wright led all scorers with 20 points.

HOW IT HAPPENED: After trailing by eight at intermission, 29-21, the Buffs saw that deficit doubled just four minutes into the second half as the Toreros built a 42-26 edge by knocking down three 3-pointers in the stretch.

CU, though, slowly climbed back into the game at the free throw line. Colorado put together an 18-7 run, with 14 of the points coming from free throws, to narrow USD's lead to just five, 49-44, with 7:10 to play.

"I thought we did a really good job of getting back in the game in the second half by getting to the foul line, which is what you have to do when your shots aren't falling," Boyle said.

With 5:30 to go, Colorado once again pulled to within five on a pair of King free throws. But the Buffs then proceeded to miss their next seven field goal tries and the Toreros kept the Buffs at bay with a 7-0 run, rebuilding the margin to 58-46 with three minutes to go.

Colorado finally ended its six-minute drought from the field when **Deleon Brown** banked in a 3-pointer with 2:28 to play, but the Toreros hit their free throws down the stretch when the Buffs were forced to foul to secure the win.

Only two Buffs, **Dallas Walton** (1-for-2) and **Lazar Nikolic** (2-4), managed to hit at least half their shots from the field. Colorado's three leading scorers — McKinley Wright, King and **Namon Wright** — combined for 33 points while shooting just 9-for-31.

The Buffs opened the game by hitting just one of their first 10 field goal tries, but the Toreros weren't much better, as both teams hit just six of their first 20 tries from the field.

Still, San Diego built an early lead before CU finally tied the game at 17-17 with 5:35 left in the half, then momentarily took a 19-18 lead on a pair of Lucas Siewert free throws a minute later.

But the rest of the half belonged to San Diego, as the Toreros outscored Colorado 11-2 over the final four minutes, including a 7-0 run to end the half, giving USD a 29-21 lead at intermission.

BOULDER — Colorado's freshmen are growing up in a hurry. Friday night, they needed every bit of maturity they could muster — and they had just enough, leading **Tad Boyle's** Buffaloes to a 112-103 double-overtime win over South Dakota State at the Coors Events Center.

"Huge win for us," Boyle said. "We needed that bad for our confidence level. We had some guys really grow up out there tonight and overcame some things even though we're playing at home. We beat a really really good team."

Once again, it was CU freshman **McKinley Wright IV** leading the way. Wright just missed his first career triple-double, but still finished with 30 points, 11 assists and nine rebounds for his second double-double of the season.

But Wright had plenty of help. Fellow freshman **Tyler Bey** finished with 12 points and nine rebounds — including eight points and three rebounds in the second overtime — while senior **George King** chipped in 17 points and sophomore **Lucas Siewert** added 14.

Bey also played a huge role in defending South Dakota State's Mike Daum. The SDSU star finished with a game-high 37 points, but had just four in the two overtime periods. David Jenkins added 31 for the Jackrabbits, including 21 from 3-point range.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs, who led by seven in the second half and trailed by six in the first overtime before rallying to force a second extra period, took charge in the final five-minute period.

Wright gave CU a 95-94 lead with one of two free throws early in the period before Bey hit two free throws with 3:51 to go, then added a short jumper to bump Colorado's lead to 99-96 at the three-minute mark.

SDSU then tied the game one more time on a long Jenkins 3-pointer, but Wright then drove the lane for a bucket with 2:09 left to give CU the lead for good, 101-99. Bey added another jumper from the wing 30 seconds later and he and Wright each hit a pair of free throws in the ensuing minute, giving CU a 107-101 lead with just 37 seconds remaining.

The Buffs then kept the Jacks at bay at the foul line over the final seconds, as SDSU shot just 3-for-12 from the field in the second overtime.

Colorado tried a variety of defenders on Daum all night, including King, **Lazar Nikolic** and Siewert.

But in the overtime periods, it was Bey who made the difference — particularly in the second OT. Bey forced a Daum miss at the rim, then drew a foul on the rebound that resulted in his first two free throws; then forced another miss and collected another rebound with 37 seconds left, resulting in two more free throws and a 107-101 lead.

Wright, meanwhile, was spectacular in the two overtimes, scoring 13 points on a variety of drives, short jumpers and trips to the free throw line. Wright helped bring Colorado back from a six-point deficit in the first overtime with back-to-back buckets in the lane, then hit five free throws and a basket in the second extra period.

The Buffs' comeback in the first overtime was also aided by a pair of missed free throws from Daum in that stretch.

Colorado led by seven at the half and still had a seven-point cushion with just more than 11 minutes to play.

But the Jacks put together a 13-5 run, sparked by a pair of 3-pointers from Reed Tellinghuisen, to take their first lead of the game with 7:26 to go. Colorado quickly regained the lead on a King 3-pointer before the Jacks tied the game at 68-68 with 6:44 to go.

That set up a frantic final six minutes. Colorado managed to regain the lead eight times down the stretch, but each time the Jackrabbits answered, with a Jenkins 3-pointer with 40 seconds to go tying the game at 84-84.

Colorado then got an offensive rebound and bucket from Wright with 27 seconds remaining in regulation for an 86-84 lead, but Daum drew a foul on the other end and hit a pair of free throws to tie the game again with just 6.5 seconds remaining.

A last-second attempt by Wright at the free throw line was then partially blocked, sending the game into overtime.

In the first overtime, the Jacks pulled out to a six-point lead with two minutes to go. But Colorado answered with a Wright floater in the lane before Daum missed two free throw attempts. Wright then hit another jumper to pull the Buffs to within two, and following a Jenkins miss, Deleon Brown connected on a fastbreak layup on an assist from King to tie the game again at 94-94 with 26 seconds to go.

Following a Jackrabbits timeout, Jenkins missed at the buzzer to send the game into a second extra period.

CORVALLIS, Ore. — The road continued to be an unfriendly place for the Colorado Buffaloes on Friday.

Haunted by turnovers in the first half, spotty defense in the second half and cold shooting all night, CU dropped a 76-57 loss at Oregon State in the Pac-12 opener for both teams.

The Buffs, whose last road win came last February at Oregon State, dropped their third road game in as many tries this season to fall to 8-5 overall while the Beavers improved to 9-4.

Colorado shot just 34.5 percent from the field (20-for-58), including just 28 percent from 3-point range (7-for-25). The Beavers shot 51 percent from the field for the game, including a blistering 16-for-26 in the second half.

Colorado also committed 18 turnovers, which the Beavers converted into 28 points.

CU freshman **Tyler Bey** finished with 14 points, the only Buff in double figures. Buffs freshman **McKinley Wright IV**, who had scored in double figures in his first 12 games, saw the streak come to an end when he finished with just seven points on 3-for-14 shooting.

Stevie Thompson Jr. scored 24 for OSU and Tres Tinkle added 23.

"A little bit of an embarrassment in terms of how our team played both offensively and certainly defensively in the second half," CU coach **Tad Boyle** said. "We've talked about our lack of consistency and it was evident. We have these lapses both offensively and defensively that we can't have if you're going to win in this league. The second half our defense was non-existent. They just punked us."

HOW IT HAPPENED: With two minutes left in the first half, the Buffs looked ready to seize control. CU had overcome an eight-point deficit to take a 23-22 lead on a pair of **Dominique Collier** free throws and momentum seemed ready to shift to the Buffs bench.

But the Beavers, who had opened the game with an 8-0 run, put together a 10-0 burst over the final two minutes of the half to take a 32-23 lead at intermission. The Beavers took advantage of three CU turnovers in the stretch and the Buffs never recovered.

"They got hot, our defense took a nosedive and that can't happen, especially on the road," said CU senior **George King**, who finished with five points and a team-high eight rebounds. "They went on a 10-0 run ... and we just didn't guard. We allowed their guys to get hot, they started attacking us and we started turning the ball over more."

Fueled by brothers Stevie and Ethan Thompson, the Beavers came out on fire in the second half. OSU pushed its lead to 15 early in period, then expanded the cushion to as much as 23 with just under 10 minutes to play.

The Buffs managed to keep the deficit from growing any larger, but never threatened to come within striking distance over the final 10 minutes.

"We're not a tough team," Boyle said. "Our guys compete. They're competing. But they're not tough enough. That shows up in a lot of different areas. Eighteen turnovers against 40 minutes of zone is a lack of toughness. Just taking care of the ball and passing and catching cleanly. ... Just a really frustrating night for us offensively and certainly defensively in the second half."

Oregon State shot 61.5 percent from the field in the second half (16-for-26) and outscored Colorado 40-26 in the paint.

"We have to be better in so many different areas," Boyle said. "Offensively it starts with just passing and catching the ball. We have some open looks and we're not making them. They get some open looks, they make them. We have to have somebody produce for us."

EUGENE, Ore. — Another slow start, turnovers and poor shooting in crucial moments sent the Colorado Buffaloes home with another road loss Sunday night, this time a 77-62 defeat at Oregon.

The Buffs shot just 42 percent from the floor (25-for-59) and just 31 percent from 3-point range (7-for-22), and also committed 20 turnovers, which the Ducks converted into 18 points. Oregon also shot 51 percent from the field (26-for-51).

Colorado dropped to 8-6 overall and 0-2 in Pac-12 play while Oregon improved to 11-4 and 1-1. The loss was CU's fourth in as many road games this season and sixth overall in the last eight games.

Namon Wright led Colorado with 20 points while **McKinley Wright IV** added 13. Oregon's Troy Brown scored 21 points and Elijah Brown added 17.

But despite the outcome, CU head coach **Tad Boyle** said he was far more encouraged than he was after Friday night's 76-57 loss at Oregon State.

"I thought our guys really battled and they really competed," Boyle said. "I can't ask for anymore from them than that. ... I told our guys I have a totally different feeling in my gut right now than I did Friday night. Friday night I was sick to my stomach because of our effort, our lack of concentration, that sort of thing. We didn't take care of the ball and we couldn't get to the free throw line, but it wasn't because we weren't trying. I like the spirit, I like the fight, I like the competitiveness of the group tonight."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Once again, the Buffs were plagued by a slow start. The Ducks jumped out to a 13-2 lead and maintained that cushion through the midway point of the first half, thanks to a bundle of early CU turnovers.

But, Colorado managed to cut the deficit to four late in the period with a 6-0 run, getting a pair of baskets from **McKinley Wright** and a **Lazar Nikolic** layup to pull to within 29-25. Oregon, though, promptly responded with an 8-3 run over the final four minutes to take a 37-28 lead at intermission, getting a 3-pointer from Payton Pritchard just before the buzzer.

"Obviously the area that hurt us were turnovers, on the road," Boyle said. "Twenty, and that was the key. That was our offensive key to the game, was not turning it over, and it was our defensive key to the game, not turning it over. You get them in transition and they can make plays. They've got great athletes and they get downhill."

The Buffs also faced a rather large disparity at the free throw line all night. Oregon connected on 19 of its 22 tries from the line while CU hit five of its eight free throws.

"Physical game both ways, but when you lose a game by 15 and you get outscored 14 at the free throw line, it's a little frustrating," Boyle said. "We have to figure out what's a foul and what's not a foul. Now sometimes a foul on one end is not a foul on the other end. That gets confusing for our players and certainly for me — but we have to do a better job of not fouling."

The second half was much like the first. The Buffs briefly cut the deficit to four early in the period when Dallas Walton hit a long 3-pointer and McKinley Wright banked in a floater from the lane to pull out Oregon's lead to 39-35.

But that was as close as Colorado could come. Oregon answered with a 13-2 run to build a 15-point cushion, 52-37, thanks in part to six Buffs turnovers in the first 5:30 of the half.

Oregon then maintained control for the rest of the game, building its lead to as much as 16. The Buffs did manage to hold Oregon without a basket for a six-minute stretch, helping them narrow the deficit to 10 with just under five minutes to go on a Namon Wright three-point play. But that was as close as CU could come and Colorado never mustered a serious threat down the stretch.

BOULDER — New year, new team.

2018 seems to suit the the Colorado Buffaloes quite well. Saturday, for the second time in as many games, **Tad Boyle's** Buffs knocked off a top-20 team at the Coors Events Center, sending No. 14 Arizona back to Tucson with an 80-77 loss. The win, coming on the heels of Thursday's 90-81 win over No. 4 Arizona State, improved the Buffs to 10-6 overall and 2-2 in Pac-12 play while Arizona fell to 12-4, 2-1.

Just like the win over ASU, Saturday's win was a complete team effort. Five Buffs scored in double figures. Freshman **McKinley Wright IV** led CU with 16 points and 10 assists (his third double-double this year), **Dallas Walton** added 15 points, **Namon Wright** and **Dominique Collier** each scored 14 and **D'Shawn Schwartz** added 10. **George King**, meanwhile, led CU on the boards with 11 rebounds.

Arizona freshman Deandre Ayton led all scorers with 26 points, Arizona's Allonzo Trier finished with just eight points, 12 under his season average.

"The difference between our team now and a week ago (when CU lost at Oregon State and Oregon) is number one that we believe," Boyle said. "Number two, we're playing together and we're playing with great energy. We have good moments, we have bad moments. We showed that today but we have a toughness that we didn't show in Corvallis. ... At some point when you're on a slide, your players have to see that they're sick and tired of this and it's time to turn it up. Players win games. I haven't changed anything other than my little bit of zone between the Oregon trip and this trip."

But that "little bit of zone" has definitely made a difference. The Buffs stymied ASU on Thursday with their new-look defense and appeared to catch Arizona by surprise as well. The Wildcats shot just 38.4 percent from the floor (28-for-73), including just 7-for-25 from 3-point range. Colorado, meanwhile, once again found its shooting eye, hitting 54.7 percent of its field goal tries (29-for-53), including a respectable 7-for-16 afternoon from 3-point range.

HOW IT HAPPENED: Unlike the last five games, the Buffs jumped out to a big lead early. Colorado led by as much as 20 in the first half and still led by 16 at intermission, 45-29.

But the Wildcats came back with a vengeance in the second half, outscoring Colorado 17-4 over the first eight minutes to cut CU's lead to three, 49-46. After having just two turnovers in the entire first half, the Buffs had eight turnovers in the first eight minutes of the second half.

The run sent a palpable shiver through the Events Center crowd of 8,519, and a sizable UA group into delirium.

Colorado, though, didn't fold. With a lineup on the floor that included four freshmen and senior Collier, the Buffs regrouped and slowly rebuilt the lead.

Schwartz ended the Arizona rally with a long 3-pointer, followed by a Collier drive to the hoop. Walton then scored on a jump hook over Ayton, Schwartz hit a pair of free throws and Collier drained a three to push the margin back to nine with a 3-pointer.

A minute later, Collier scored on another drive to the hoop, followed by a McKinley Wright transition layup and another Collier 3-pointer that gave CU a 68-58 lead with 4:33 to play.

From that point on, the Buffs protected their lead. Walton hit another big hook shot with 1:58 remaining, then had two blocks on one UA possession that led to a McKinley Wright slam dunk for a 74-65 CU lead with a minute to go.

The Buffs then hit six straight free throws in the final 40 seconds to clinch the win.

LOS ANGELES — Colorado couldn't shake the turnover bug on the road Wednesday night and the Buffs' miscues paved the way for a 70-58 Southern California win at the Galen Center.

The loss, Colorado's fifth in as many tries on the road this year, dropped the Buffs to 10-7 overall and 2-3 in the Pac-12. USC improved to 12-6, 3-2.

The Buffs committed 22 turnovers, which led to 25 USC points. **George King** led Colorado with 21 points, 15 coming in the first half, and **Namon Wright** added 10. **Tyler Bey** added eight points and seven rebounds for the Buffs.

CU's **McKinley Wright IV**, the reigning Pac-12 Player of the Week, struggled all night. The freshman finished with just seven points on 2-for-9 shooting and had five turnovers and just four assists.

"I'm extremely disappointed, obviously, because this was a winnable game," CU head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "In the first half we showed glimpses of things, and we talked about turnovers at halftime. You don't have to look at anything else in this one other than that."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs played a solid first half and led, 34-33, with just more than a minute to play in the period. CU shot 13-for-29 in the opening period, including 6-for-11 from 3-point range.

But USC scored the last five points of the half to take a 38-34 edge at intermission and Colorado never regained the lead.

While the Buffs turnover problems followed them into the second half, their good shooting didn't, as they hit just two of their first 11 field goal tries of the half. Colorado did manage to cut USC's lead to one, 40-39, early in the period, but USC answered with a 14-4 run and with 10:47 to play, the Trojans has stretched their lead to double digits, 54-43.

The Buffs did manage to reduce the deficit to nine, 59-50, with 5:45 left to go on a 3-pointer from McKinley Wright IV, but they could never come any closer down the stretch.

CU shot just 7-for-26 from the field in the second half, including only 4-for-12 from 3-point range. USC finished 24-for-55 from the field, including 9-for-17 from beyond the arc.

Jordan McLaughlin scored 20 points for USC and Chimezie Metu scored 14 points and had six of USC's 10 blocked shots.

"They had 10 blocked shots against us, which tells us we're not making good decisions at the rim when we're penetrating," Boyle said. "We made some bad decisions offensively. Not just our turnovers, but you add 10 blocked shots with that and that's 32 times you have the ball and it doesn't get to the rim. So you have no chance for offensive rebound, no chance for a bucket. You give it to them 22 times and they block 10 shots, you're not going to win that game."

In three Pac-12 road games — all losses — the Buffs have committed 60 turnovers.

Colorado trailed by four at the half, 38-34, despite shooting 6-for-11 from 3-point range as turnovers once again plagued the Buffs on the road. Colorado committed 13 miscues in the first half and the Trojans turned them into 16 points, including a basket in an 8-2 run to end the half.

King had 15 of his points in the first period and Namon Wright added eight for Colorado.

BOULDER — Prosperity was almost too much for the Colorado Buffaloes to handle Thursday night.

But when push came to shove, the Buffs had enough push to claim an 82-73 win over Washington State at the Coors Events Center. Colorado built a 26-point lead early in the second half, then held off a furious WSU rally before finally regaining control to come away with its fourth win in the last five games and fourth straight win at home.

The Buffs improved to 12-7 overall and 4-3 in Pac-12 play — their first time over .500 in Pac-12 play since late in the 2015-16 season — while the Cougars fell to 9-9, 1-5.

Junior **Namon Wright** led Colorado with his first double-double as a Buff, a 16-point, 10-rebound effort. CU freshman **McKinley Wright IV** scored 17 points — 13 in the second half — to go with five assists and four rebounds.

CU senior **George King**, meanwhile, continued his stretch of solid play with 16 points and nine rebounds. **Dominique Collier** contributed 13 points and five boards and **Lucas Siewert** had 11 points and four rebounds.

Vionte Daniels led WSU with 18 points on six of the Cougars' 15 3-pointers.

"That was a good win," head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "We made it interesting there in the second half, but hopefully we can learn from the lapses we had both offensively and defensively. We got a little complacent there in the second half, but we got the game back under control."

HOW IT HAPPENED: After leading by 15 at intermission, the Buffs built their cushion to 26 just five minutes into the second half and appeared ready to blow WSU out of the gym. King had two 3-pointers in the opening minutes and Namon Wright added one to put WSU on the ropes.

But the Washington State punched back, responding with a 26-5 run that finished with a 12-0 burst to shave Colorado's lead to just five, 63-58, with 8:13 left to play. The Cougars, who lead the Pac-12 in 3-pointers, hit only five treys in the first half but fueled their comeback with 10 after intermission.

"Lack of focus, lack of defense," McKinley Wright said. "The biggest thing was letting their 3-point shooters loose. Letting them hit 10 in the second half hurt us."

But with the once-comfortable Events Center crowd again on edge, the Buffs regained their composure following a media timeout. King ended the Cougars' run with an offensive rebound and bucket, the beginning of a 12-0 CU burst that pushed the Buffs' lead back to 17, 75-58, with 3:30 to play. McKinley Wright had seven points in the run while Colorado forced seven straight missed shots from the Cougars, holding them scoreless for 4:35 in the stretch.

CU then held the Cougars at bay over the final three minutes for the win.

It was the second straight game the Buffs repelled a big second-half rally from an opponent. Last weekend at UCLA, the Buffs saw the Bruins cut a 14-point second-half lead to four before regaining control.

"It takes mental toughness to handle that," Boyle said. "But we've got to figure out why our 26-point lead became a five-point lead and we have to eliminate that." The win was big for the Buffs in a number of ways. Most importantly, it kept alive their momentum from the UCLA win, setting up a key meeting with Washington on Saturday at the Events Center. A win would put the Buffs solidly in fifth place in the Pac-12 standings.

Colorado led by just two against the Cougars, 19-17, midway through the first half, but closed the period with a 23-10 run to take a 42-27 lead at halftime. Collier was perfect from the floor in the first half, hitting all four of his field goal tries — including a pair of 3-pointers — for 12 points. Namon Wright added nine points and five rebounds and King chipped in six points and four rebounds.

BOULDER — Every loss hurts, but conference home losses are especially damaging — and the Colorado Buffaloes will be feeling this hurt for a while.

The Buffs had all kinds of momentum heading into Saturday's matchup with Washington, a game head coach **Tad Boyle** called a "separation game." CU had won two in a row and four of its last five, and had a chance to hold onto at least a tie for fourth in the conference standings.

But the Huskies provided their version of separation, dominating the Buffs on the boards and walking away from the Coors Events Center with a 72-62 win.

Colorado fell to 12-8 overall and 4-4 in Pac-12 play. Washington improved to 14-6, 4-3.

"I can't tell you how disappointed I am," Boyle said in his postgame press conference. "We had put ourselves in position to do something special — I'm not saying we still can't — but this is a blow to the gut."

Washington entered the game last in the conference in rebounding margin and last in offensive rebounds but owned the glass against the Buffs. The Huskies outrebounded Colorado 50-34, including 16 offensive boards, which they converted into 20 points.

"When you get outrebounded by 16 in your own building, something is wrong," Boyle said. "We got out-toughed, we got punked, we got manhandled — you can name the adjective you want to name. All those fit today. This is not a hard game to analyze. Not a difficult game to break down. We lost by 10, they got 20 second-chance points and they outrebounded us by 16. Ballgame."

CU freshman **Tyler Bey** was one of the few bright spots for Colorado, finishing with his first collegiate double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds. CU freshman **Dallas Walton** had 13 points, five rebounds and four blocked shots; and senior **George King** had 13 points and six rebounds. **McKinley Wright IV** and **Dominique Collier** added 10 points each, with Wright also grabbing five rebounds and handing out five assists.

Jaylen Nowell led UW with 19 points and Matisse Thybulle added 18 points and 10 rebounds.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs actually started off well, jumping out to an 18-9 lead 12 minutes into the game.

But when the momentum changed, it changed in a hurry. After hitting just four of their first 20 shots from the field, the Huskies proceeded to connect on nine of their next 13, sparking a 14-0 run that gave them a lead they would never relinquish. Washington took a 36-27 lead into the locker room at halftime and Colorado never came closer than seven again.

The Huskies scored on eight straight possessions in the final eight minutes of the half, including six in a row in the 14-0 burst. Washington also had 10 second-chance points from offensive rebounds in the first half.

Colorado did manage to pull within seven several times in the second half and get the Events Center crowd behind them. But each time, the Huskies answered with buckets — three times after offensive rebounds.

The Buffs didn't help themselves with their shooting. CU finished just 23-65 from the field (35.4 percent), including a dismal 6-for-22 effort from 3-point range. The Huskies, meanwhile, shot 25-for-59 and 8-for-19 from beyond the arc.

Washington stretched its lead to as much as 13 late in the game before the Buffs made one final run. A Walton free throw and bucket and McKinley Wright three point pull CU to within 63-56 with 3:39 still to play.

But the Huskies answered with a Nowell bucket on each of the next two possessions to basically put the game away. The Buffs pulled back within seven on two more instances but could never come closer.

TEMPE, Ariz. — A flurry of Arizona State 3-pointers and another big discrepancy at the foul line put the Colorado Buffaloes in a hole from which they could not escape Saturday, as the Buffs dropped an 80-66 decision at Wells Fargo Arena. Colorado rallied from an 8-point deficit in the first half to tie the game at intermission, 32-32, then scrapped to a 51-47 lead with 10:52 to go.

But the No. 21 Sun Devils, who had hit just three of their 21 3-pointers up to that point, rattled in six of their next seven, including five in a row, to build a 10-point lead with 6:37 remaining. The Buffs managed to briefly cut the lead back to seven, but the Sun Devils stayed hot down the stretch to collect the win.

After missing all 10 tries from beyond the arc in the first half, ASU finished the night 10-for-31 from 3-point range.

The loss, Colorado's third in a row, dropped the Buffs to 12-10 overall and 4-6 in Pac-12 play while the Sun Devils improved to 16-5, 4-5.

Dominique Collier led CU with 11 points while **Lucas Siewert** and **Namon Wright** each chipped in 10.

ASU's Tra Holder led all scorers with 22 points, including four 3-pointers after halftime.

"This is an explosive Arizona State team that we saw tonight," CU head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "We hold them to zero threes in the first half and they come out and make 10 of them in the second. We had too many defensive breakdowns."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Along with ASU's 3-point barrage in the second half, the Buffs also found themselves on the short end of a big difference at the foul line for the second game in a row.

In Thursday's loss to Arizona, the Wildcats shot 23 free throws while the Buffs shot eight. Saturday, the Sun Devils attempted 22 free throws and the Buffs nine — a 45-17 difference over the two games. It is the fewest number of free throws ever attempted in a two-game Pac-12 road swing by the Buffs, easily surpassing the 27 they shot on the same road trip three years ago.

"We have to figure out a way to get to the foul line," Boyle said. "For some reason we are not getting to the foul line. We have eight free throw attempts against Arizona, we have nine tonight. We have to figure out offensively a better way."

But even with the difference at the foul line, the Buffs managed to stay in the game until midway through the second half. CU overcame an eight-point deficit to tie the game at halftime, 32-32, then took its first lead of the game early in the second half on a **George King** basket, 36-35. The two teams then traded the lead five times before Colorado extended its margin to three, 48-45, on a King 3-pointer, then to four on a **D'Shawn Schwartz** trey, 51-47.

"I really felt like we could battle ourselves back in this game and we did early in the second half," Boyle said. "But we let them get going from three."

Indeed, the Sun Devils found their shooting eye after Schwartz's 3-pointer. Arizona State hit five straight 3-pointers and six of its next seven to forge a 65-55 lead with 6:37 to play. Holder had three in the surge and Shannon Evans hit a pair, fueling a 20-7 ASU run.

Colorado did manage to cut the deficit to seven twice in the ensuing minutes, but could never come closer and the Sun Devils slowly built their lead over the final few minutes.

Colorado's two leading scorers also struggled in the game. CU point guard **McKinley Wright** finished with just two points on 1-for-10 shooting, but he did have seven assists. King finished with eight points and 10 rebounds and **Dallas Walton** had eight boards.

Thanks to 11 turnovers and foul trouble early for starters **Tyler Bey** and King, the Buffs fell behind by as much as eight in the first half. But the Sun Devils, who missed all 10 of their 3-point shots in the opening half, could never pull away. Colorado slowly chipped away at the ASU lead and a Schwartz layup with 44 seconds left in the half sent the two teams into intermission tied at 32-32.

BOULDER — Heading into Friday night's game, Colorado senior **George King** was the only player on CU's roster who had ever played in a win over Utah.

King did his best to make sure there would be more Buffs who know what that is like, and he and his teammates did it in style. King recorded a 12-point, 10-rebound double — his sixth of the season — and the Buffs played stifling defense all night to produce a 67-55 win over the Utes, ending a seven-game losing streak to their Pac-12 rival.

Colorado improved to 13-10 overall and 5-6 in Pac-12 play while the Utes dropped to 13-9, 5-6.

While a number of the games in the recent series have been close, the Buffs didn't allow Friday's game to go down to the wire. Colorado overcame an early deficit to forge a seven-point lead at the half, then built the margin into double digits early in the second half and maintained the cushion for the remainder of the game.

CU freshman **McKinley Wright IV** led all scorers with 21 points and sophomore **Lucas Siewert** chipped in 13, his second straight game in double figures.

But the biggest impact for the Buffs came on the defensive end of the floor as they held Utah to a season low in points. The Utes, who entered the game with four players averaging double-figure scoring, did not have a single player score in double digits. Utah shot just 20-for-57 from the field, including just 7-for-23 from 3-point range, and David Collette led Utah with eight points.

Colorado also held a 36-34 rebounding edge.

"Obviously it was a great win for our program," CU coach **Tad Boyle** said. "I have great respect for Utah and the job that Larry's done there since he's been there is remarkable. A lot of people forget that when he took that thing over it wasn't in the best of shape. I have a lot of respect for how they do their business and how they play. They went to Arizona last weekend and beat Arizona State in overtime, had a shot to beat Arizona at the buzzer. They're a good team."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado started slowly and trailed for much of the first half.

But a King basket with 4:07 remaining in the period — part of a 10-0 CU run leading into halftime — gave the Buffs a 22-20 lead and they never trailed again.

"We just had a lot of energy and effort," King said. "We had a sense of urgency tonight. I think that when we got stops it ignited us offensively as well."

Indeed, after leading by seven at halftime, 27-20, the Buffs quickly bumped the margin to double digits in the second half. A pair of Siewert 3-pointers pushed Colorado's edge to 40-27 with 13:43 to play, and not even a Krystkowiak timeout could halt the surge. The Buffs continued to build the cushion and with just more than four minutes to play, a King basket pushed CU's edge to 63-42.

The Utes never threatened again as Colorado's defense took care of business down the stretch.

"We did a good job of taking away their strengths," King said. "The scouting report the coaches had for us did a really good job of pointing out their strengths and keeping it simple. They just made sure we knew their strengths and what they look to do."

The Utes entered the game as one of the Pac-12's best 3-point shooting teams in conference play. But guard Justin Bibbins — the Pac-12 leader in 3-pointers per game — was 0-for-5 from beyond the arc and finished with just seven points. Utah guard Sedrick Barefield, another long-distance ace, hit just one 3-pointer and finished with just seven points.

Along with three players in double figures, the Buffs also got key contributions from senior **Dominique Collier** (eight points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals), **Tyler Bey** (6 rebounds) and **Dallas Walton** (5 rebounds).
