STANFORD MEETS ARIZONA STATE IN REGULAR-SEASON FINALE

Winners of three of its last four, Stanford is in Tempe, Arizona, to face Arizona State Saturday at Wells Fargo Arena at 11:30 a.m. PT. It's the third time in the last four seasons the Cardinal is concluding the regular season in the Grand Canyon state, but the first time it will face ASU in the regular-season finale. The two other times, Stanford ended the regular-season in Tucson.

PAC-12 TOURNAMENT SEEDING SCENARIOS

Several Pac-12 Tournament seeding scenarios are in play for Stanford with one game remaining in the regular season. With a win against Arizona State, the Cardinal will be as high as the third seed and as low as the fifth seed. With a loss to the Sun Devils, Stanford will be anywhere from the No. 4 seed to the No. 6 seed. The top four seeds in the tournament receive a bye to the quarterfinal round. Stanford enters the regular-season finale in a four-way tie for third place in the standings with Utah, UCLA and Washington at 10-7.

CARDINAL IN CONFERENCE PLAY

Stanford's 10 conference wins so far are four more than its win total from all of last season's league slate. It's the most Pac-12 wins for Stanford in four seasons, equaling the 10 conference wins in 2014. The Cardinal has posted 10 or more conference wins just three times over the last 10 seasons. Stanford's last top-four finish in the conference was in 2008 (second, 13-5).

Stanford opened Pac-12 play with a 5-1 mark for the second time in the last 14 seasons. In January, the Cardinal won five consecutive conference games for the first time in 10 seasons and posted its first conference road sweep (Washington/Washington State) in eight seasons.

R2T2

Junior All-America candidate Reid Travis has established himself as one of the top players at his position in the nation. He ranks in the top-four of the Pac-12 in 10 different categories. The forward has four double-doubles in his last six games, coming off a 23-point, 10-rebound performance playing against Arizona's DeAndre Ayton on Thursday. In Travis' last four games, he is averaging 22.3 points and 10.0 rebounds in leading Stanford to 3-1 record during that span.

REID TRAVIS COLLECTS PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Junior Reid Travis was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Week after the forward averaged a double-double in leading Stanford to a sweep of the Washington schools last week. Travis averaged 26.5 points and 10.0 rebounds, while shooting 60 percent (18-of-30) from the field in the Cardinal's two wins. He scored a career-high 33 points and collected nine rebounds in the 16-point victory over Washington, posting 23 points in the first half against the Huskies. The forward recorded his 10th double-double of the season with 20 points and 11 rebounds in the win over Washington State. Travis, who ranks in the top-five in 10 different Pac-12 categories, is fourth in the conference in scoring (19.3 ppg) and fifth in rebounding (7.9 rpg).

AGAINST ARIZONA STATE

Stanford leads the all-time series against Arizona State, 49-37. The Cardinal snapped a four-game losing streak in the series with an 86-77 victory over No. 16 Arizona State on Jan. 17 at Maples Pavilion. Stanford has lost its last four games to ASU in Tempe. The Cardinal last defeated the Sun Devils on the road on Feb. 9, 2013 as double-doubles from Dwight Powell (22 pts., 10 rebs.) and Josh Huestis (13 pts, 12 rebs.) led the Cardinal to a 62-59 victory at ASU.

CARDINAL PLAYERS AGAINST ARIZONA STATE

Eight active Stanford players have faced Arizona State previously. Arizona natives Dorian Pickens (10.9 ppg in eight games) and Michael Humphrey (9.7 ppg in seven games) have played the Sun Devils the most of anyone on the current Cardinal roster.

TRAVIS AMONG NATION'S ELITE POST PLAYERS

Junior Reid Travis is fourth in the Pac-12 in scoring (19.4 ppg) and rebounding (8.0 rpg). Travis and Arizona's DeAndre Ayton are the lone players to rank in the top five of the conference in both scoring and rebounding. Travis ranks in the top-four in the Pac-12 in 10 categories overall. The junior posted a career-high 33 points in the win over Washington last week. He became the 45th member of Stanford's 1,000-point club earlier this year and enters Saturday's Arizona State game with 1,328 points and 692 rebounds in his 93-game career so far.

PICKENS NINTH ON CAREER THREE POINTERS LIST

Dorian Pickens, who missed 11 games with a foot injury, returned for the beginning of conference play. He ranks ninth in school history with 181 career threes and has totaled 49 threes in the last 16 games. He leads the Pac-12 in threes per game (3.0), is sixth in three-point percentage (.451) and 10th in scoring (15.7 ppg) during conference play. Despite missing nearly half the season, Pickens leads the team with 51 threes. Pickens, the 46th all-time and second active member of Stanford's 1,000-point club, enters the Arizona State game with 1,111 career points.

PICKENS VOTED TO CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

Senior Dorian Pickens was voted to the CoSIDA Academic All-District Team on Feb. 23. He is now a candidate for Academic All-America honors. Pickens, who owns a 3.42 cumulative grade-point average majoring in Communication, has been a member of the Pac-12 All-Academic Team the past two seasons. He was named to the NABC Honors Court following his junior season.

WINNING THE BATTLE OF THE BOARDS

Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey have helped Stanford win the rebounding battle in 23 of 30 games, including 19 of the last 23 contests. The Cardinal is second in the Pac-12 in rebounding at 37.8 rpg. Only three opponents (Arizona's DeAndre Ayton (12 pts. 10 rebs.), Washington's Noah Dickerson (14 pts., 13 rebs.) and USC's Chimezie Metu (12 pts., 10 rebs.)) have recorded a double-double against Stanford in the last 35 games.

LAST TIME OUT

Reid Travis had a game-high 23 points and collected his 11th double-double of the season with 10 boards, but Stanford came up short in a 75-67 defeat to No. 19 Arizona Thursday night at the McKale Center. Stanford trimmed a double-digit Arizona lead back to five on two separate occasions in the late in the contest, but could not get any closer in the eight-point setback. Dusan Ristic led the Wildcats with 21 points, while Allonzo Trier added 18.

LAST MEETING WITH THE SUN DEVILS

Oscar da Silva scored eight of his 14 points in the final four minutes and Stanford gave head coach Jerod Haase his first win over a ranked team at the helm of the Cardinal with an 86-77 victory over No. 16 Arizona State. Reid Travis had 18 points and 10 rebounds for the Cardinal, who nearly squandered a 15-point second half lead. Dorian Pickens added 19 points. Freshman Daejon Davis added 13 points and eight assists in the win. Romello White scored 19 points for the Sun Devils

YOUTH MOVEMENT

One of the top recruiting classes in school history has played a big role in its first season on The Farm. Each of the Cardinal's four freshmen have started at least one game and three - Daejon Davis, Oscar da Silva and Isaac White - started together in six games. At least two freshmen have started in 28 games and at least one freshman has started in all 30 games.

All four average at least 18 minutes per game. Davis leads the Cardinal in assists (5.0 apg), White is second on the team in three pointers (38) and da Silva is second on the Cardinal roster in blocks (27). KZ Okpala, who made his collegiate debut 18 games ago, is averaging 9.4 ppg in 27.4 mpg.

In the win in the first meeting with Arizona State, Stanford's final 16 points were scored by freshmen. In the victory at Washington State, Stanford's four freshmen scored the first 23 points of the second half during the Cardinal's 21-3 run to erase its deficit en route to the road win.

DAVIS DIRECTING THE OFFENSE

Freshman Daejon Davis has started all 28 games he has played in. In his last 16 games, Davis is averaging 12.3 points, 5.7 assists and 4.9 rebounds per game. He averaged 15.0 points, 6.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds during Stanford's five-game winning streak in January.

Davis' 139 assists so far are 11 shy of Brevin Knight's (1993-94) Stanford freshman record.

Highlighting his play during conference action is the 50-foot heave to win the game at the buzzer against USC. The freshman registered career-highs in points (23) and assists (10) against UCLA on Jan 27. Davis has posted two double-doubles this season with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the win at Washington and the 23-point, 10-assist performance at UCLA. The freshman recorded 22 points seven rebounds and five assists in the win at California.

POST PRESENCE

Stanford's starting post players, Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey, have combined to average 30.0 points and 15.1 rebounds per game. The duo is second in the conference among starting post players in combined rebounding and fourth in combined scoring. Travis is fourth in the Pac-12 in both scoring (19.4 ppg) and rebounding (8.0 rpg). Humphrey is ninth in the conference in rebounding (7.1 rpg).

OKPALA MAKING IMPACT IN CONFERENCE PLAY

Freshman KZ Okpala made his collegiate debut 18 games ago in Stanford's nonconference finale. The forward is fifth on the team in scoring at 9.4 ppg in 27.4 minutes per contest. Okpala, who has started 16 games, is averaging 11.3 ppg in the last four contests.

DAVIS FOURTH FRESHMAN ALL-TIME TO WIN PLAYER OF WEEK

Freshman Daejon Davis, who averaged 15.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists to lead Stanford to road wins at Washington State and Washington, was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Week Jan. 15. Davis was the fourth Stanford freshman to win conference Player of the Week honors in school history and the first since Jan. 29, 2007, joining Brook Lopez, Jason Collins and Howard Wright.

FLOOR BURNS STAT COMES TO THE FARM

During his standout collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program. Haase totaled 167 in the 1996-97 season. For the second season, Stanford is tracking floor burns as an official stat throughout the year.

DAVIS' BUZZER-BEATER WAS FIRST IN 14 SEASONS

Daejon Davis' 50-foot shot to defeat USC at the buzzer Jan. 7 was the first game-winning buzzer-beater for the Cardinal in 14 seasons. On March 3, 2004, Matt Lottich hit a desperation three-pointer as time expired to give No. 1 and undefeated Stanford a 63-61 victory over Washington State at Beasley Coliseum. Davis' buzzer-beater was the first for the Cardinal at Maples Pavilion since Nick Robinson connected on a 35-foot running jumper at the buzzer to give No. 2 Stanford an 80-77 victory over No. 12 Arizona on Feb. 7, 2004.

MOST POWER FIVE OPPONENTS IN FIVE YEARS

Stanford's challenging nonconference schedule included four opponents from power five conferences. The Cardinal played North Carolina (ACC), Florida (SEC), Ohio State (Big Ten) and Kansas (Big 12), with all but the UNC contest taking place away from Maples Pavilion. It's the most power five conference opponents in five years, since the Cardinal faced Missouri (SEC), Minnesota (Big Ten), NC State (ACC) and Northwestern (Big Ten) during its 2012 slate. Stanford went 1-3 in those games, defeating Northwestern (70-68) on the road.

WIN NO. 100 FOR HAASE

The Dec. 17 victory over San Francisco was head coach Jerod Haase's 100th career coaching victory. He is in his sixth season as a head coach and second with Stanford, following four successful seasons at UAB. He is 30-31 in his second season as head coach of the Cardinal.

WHITE POSTS BEST DEBUT MARK SINCE 1977

Freshman Isaac White's 17-point performance against Cal Poly in the season opener on Nov. 10 was the second-most points by a true freshman in his collegiate debut in the 103-year history of the program. White ranks sixth on the team in scoring at 6.1 ppg.

PETER SAUER CAPTAINSHIP

Jerod Haase announced the establishment of the Peter Sauer Captainship this season, naming Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens and Michael Humphrey captains. The three wear patches on their uniforms honoring the legacy of the late Peter Sauer, a team captain and leader of Stanford's 1998 Final Four team. Stanford celebrated the 20-year anniversary of the 1998 Final Four team in the home finale vs. WSU.

THE FOURTH-YEAR CLASS

The four members of Stanford's fourth-year class - Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens, Michael Humphrey and Robert Cartwright - accounted for 62.6 percent of the team's scoring and 55.4 percent of the team's rebounding last season. Pickens and Humphrey are true seniors, while Travis and Cartwright have each had their medical hardship waivers granted and are redshirt juniors with another year of eligibility remaining after this season. Cartwright missed the entire 2015-16 season with a compound fracture of his right forearm sustained in preseason practice on Nov. 2, 2015. Travis was forced to miss the final 22 games of the 2015-16 season with a right leg injury.

TOP-TIER RECRUITING CLASS

After signing a consensus top-25 national recruiting class last season, the Cardinal once again inked one of the nation's top classes for 2018. On Nov. 8, Stanford announced the signing of 6-5 guard Cormac Ryan from New York, New York, and 7-0 forward Keenan Fitzmorris of Overland Park, Kansas. Fitzmorris is the younger brother of Stanford women's volleyball All-American Audriana Fitzmorris.

FIFTH IN PAC-12 PRESEASON POLL

Stanford was selected fifth in the Pac-12 Conference media preseason poll. The Cardinal totaled 182 points to place fifth in a vote of the media members. Stanford was also picked fifth in the 2014-15 preseason poll. The Cardinal finished ninth in the conference last season.

SEEING DOUBLE

Stanford individuals have totaled 19 double-doubles in 30 games, with 11 from Reid Travis, four Michael Humphrey, two from Daejon Davis and one each from Dorian Pickens and Oscar da Silva.

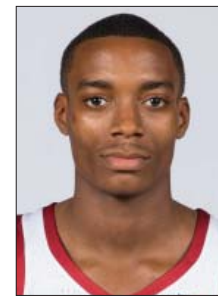

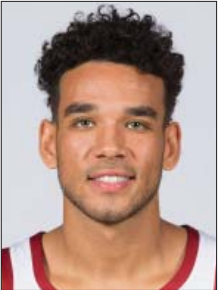

After being introduced as the Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir on March 25, 2016, Jerod Haase developed a strong relationship with his program and instilled an invested, tough and selfless attitude among his student-athletes.

In his first year at the helm of the Cardinal program, Stanford posted 14 wins against one of the toughest schedules in the nation. Redshirt sophomore Reid Travis earned First Team All-Pac-12 and NABC All-District honors, developing into one of the top players in the conference on both ends of the court. His program finished in the top-10 percent among men's basketball programs nationally in the classroom as well.

Haase and his staff signed a top-tier recruiting class that is rated as high as No. 10 nationally in the 2017 rankings, welcoming the four-member class to The Farm for the 2017-18 season.

Haase arrived on The Farm prior to the 2016-17 season after completing his fourth season as the head coach at UAB, where he led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase compiled an 80-53 overall record while improving the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in his final season at the helm of the Blazers, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25, while ranking among the nation's best in field goal percentage (.478 - 24th), assists per game (18.4 - 4th) and blocks per game (4th - 6.1).

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. More impressively, Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen - all players recruited by Haase and his staff - and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall while notching three victories against teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game.

During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games and collected a victory in the conference tournament.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003.

When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1997, Haase later earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000.

Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

In 2017, Haase joined the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance, the organization that uses the power of positive reinforcement to pursue winning and the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.

Haase, 42, and his wife, the former Mindy Meidinger, have three children: Gavin (11), Garrett (7) and Gabrielle (4).
