

Stanford Postgame Notes

No. 5/5 Stanford (4-0, 2-0) 55 Washington State (3-2, 1-1) 17

- Stanford improved to 4-0 overall and 2-0 in Pac-12 Conference play
 - It is the program's seventh 4-0 start to a season since World War II
 - 2013, 2011, 2010, 1986, 1952, 1951, 1950
- With the game tied at 3-3, Stanford posted 45 unanswered points before Washington State's Gabe Marks broke the streak with a fourth-quarter score
- Stanford improved its winning streak to 12 games
- Stanford is 16-2 during the month of September dating back to 2009
- Stanford's last Pac-12 road opener resulted in a loss to Washington in a game played at CenturyLink Field on Sept. 27, 2012. It was the last Pac-12 loss for the Cardinal
 - Stanford is now 9-1 in Pac-12 road games under head coach David Shaw
- Stanford extended streak of consecutive games with a takeaway to 28 with junior SS Jordan Richards' third-quarter interception return for a touchdown
 - Missouri leads the nation with at least one forced turnover in 34 straight games
- Stanford snapped its streak of 36 straight trips to the red zone with a score (nation's second longest) on junior QB Kevin Hogan's second-quarter interception
 - Previously, Stanford's last trip to the red zone without a score came at Cal on Oct. 20, 2012
- Stanford has scored at least 30 or more points in each of its four games this season
- Stanford's 55 points were the most by the Cardinal since a 56-48 win at USC on Oct. 29, 2011
- In last season's meeting with the Cougars, Stanford recorded a school-record 10 sacks and 15 tackles for loss. Washington State was also held to minus-18 rushing yards.
 - Tonight, Stanford recorded two sacks and four tackles for loss while holding the Cougars to 51 rushing yards
- Stanford record a season-high 311 first-half yards
 - 258 first-half yards vs. Arizona State, 223 at Army and 186 vs. San Jose State
- Stanford recorded a season-high 222 yards passing in the first half
 - 128 first-half passing yards vs. Arizona State, 18 at Army and 94 vs. San Jose State
- Through four games in 2013, Cardinal receivers have caught nine touchdown passes
 - Stanford receivers accounted for six receiving touchdowns in 2012
- The Cardinal has won the last six games in its series with Washington State, and during that span, Stanford has averaged 43 points per game
- Stanford is 25-1 under head coach David Shaw when out-rushing an opponent
- Junior QB Kevin Hogan is the only active FBS quarterback to lead his team to nine straight wins in as many consecutive starts

Junior QB Kevin Hogan

- Finished 16 of 25 passing for a career-high 286 yards and three touchdowns
- Career-long 57-yard touchdown strike to Devon Cajuste late in first quarter
- 48-yard completion to Michael Rector in first quarter
- 4 of 5 passing with 118 yards and one touchdown pass in first quarter
- First-quarter completions of 48 and 57 yards
- Opened second quarter with 33-yard touchdown pass to Devon Cajuste

Sophomore WR Michael Rector

- Washington native made first career start
- Career-long 48-yard catch in first quarter
- 45-yard touchdown catch in third quarter to help give Stanford a 31-3 lead

Junior K Jordan Williamson

- 28-yard field goal in first quarter
- 27-yard field goal in fourth quarter

Junior WR Devon Cajuste

- Finished with four yards receiving on 115 receptions with two touchdowns
- Second career touchdown catch came in first quarter on career-long 57-yard strike from Kevin Hogan
- 33-yard touchdown reception in second quarter to help give Stanford 17-3 lead

Sophomore RB Barry Sanders

- First career catch was a 16-yarder in second quarter
- First career touchdown run – 22-yarder – in fourth quarter

Junior SS Jordan Richards

- First interception on the season returned 30 yards for third-quarter score
 - Fourth career interception

Fifth-Year Senior OLB Trent Murphy

- 30-yard interception return for a touchdown in third quarter
 - It was his second career interception return for a touchdown at CenturyLink Field

Sophomore OG Joshua Garnett

- Made first start on the season
 - Second career start (first came against Washington State in 2012)

Junior RB Remound Wright

- Career-high 56 yards rushing with one touchdown
- Career-long 53-yard touchdown rush to put Stanford ahead in fourth quarter, 48-3

Sophomore K Conrad Ukropina

- First career point with a fourth-quarter extra point to put Stanford ahead, 55-10

Sophomore CB Alex Carter

- Team and career-high eight tackles (seven solo)
